The Southeastern Conference Baseball Tournament returns for a 20th consecutive year to the Hoover Metropolitan Complex in the south-Birmingham city of Hoover, Ala., May 23-28.

The 2017 SEC Baseball Tournament will continue to feature 12 teams and will remain set to begin on Tuesday, May 23. Seeds 5-12 will meet in a single elimination format on the opening day of the tournament, followed by traditional double-elimination play Wednesday-Friday. The tournament will return to single elimination play on Saturday. A total of 17 games will be played throughout the tournament.

The 12 teams are seeded 1-12 with the two divisional champions and top four seeds guaranteed opening-round byes, with the possibility of earning another later in the bracket. The tournament field will include the top teams from the SEC's Eastern and Western Divisions plus 10 at-large bids seeded 3-12 based on conference winning percentage. In 2016, Texas A&M defeated Florida 12-5 in a championship game that featured the top-two ranked teams in the country.

The Hoover Met formerly served as home of the Double-A Birmingham Barons (Chicago White Sox) of the Southern League. The stadium also has served as host of the NCAA Men's Soccer Final Four, as well as home to the nationally renowned Hoover Buccaneer high school football program.

Located eight miles south of Birmingham, the Hoover Met seats 10,800 for baseball, but can accommodate over 16,000 when the patio, banquet and side grassy areas are used. The stadium also houses 12 suites and state-of-the-art dressing and training rooms. Construction of a new \$83 million sports complex and a 155,000-square foot indoor event and performance center began in 2016. Plans for the enhancements to the facility include a player lounge in the stadium, new playing surface, including turf and sub-surface and irrigation, and five NCAA regulation-sized baseball fields at the outdoor sports complex. The project consists of two phases: one to be completed for the 2017 SEC Tournament, and the other to be completed in 2018.

Media Will Call

Credentials can be picked up at The Hoover Met starting on Monday, May 22 from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. CT. It is recommended that if you are in the Hoover area on Monday, that you pick up your credentials then. Credential pick-up is also open one hour before and one hour after the beginning of each game of the tournament with the exception of the first game on Tuesday, when credential pick-up will open at 7:30 a.m. CT. Any changes or late requests must be made via e-mail to Ben Beaty at bbeaty@sec.org or Chuck Dunlap at cdunlap@sec.org. Requesting a parking pass does not guarantee being issued one.

Press Seating

Upper and lower level seating is available in the main baseball press box (located behind home plate). However, there will be other seats available in the football press box lower level (located on the first base line). Wireless highspeed internet hubs will be located in both press boxes and the media patio as well for those with wireless capabilities. Wireless accessories will not be available. Shared lines are not available to use for live radio remotes or broadcasts - private lines must be ordered for that purpose.

SEC Network/ESPN2 Television Coverage

All games of the SEC Baseball Tournament will be televised live nationally. The SEC Network will air games 1-16 played Tuesday-Saturday, while ESPN2 will televise the championship game.

2017 SEC Baseball Tournament on Satellite Radio

All games of the 2017 SEC Baseball Tournament will air nationwide on SiriusXM. Day Session Tuesday-Thursday will air on Sirius 137 / XM 190. Night Session Tuesday-Thursday will air on College SportsNation Channel 84. Friday and Saturday sessions will air on Sirius 137 / XM 190. The Championship game will air on College SportsNation Channel 84.

Photo Work Area

A photographer work room, complete with wireless internet, wired internet lines and televisions for live game viewing, will be made available downstairs on the field level of The Hoover Met in the visiting team clubhouse. The media patio will not be available as photo/video work space.

Video Distribution

The SEC will employ Hammond Communications (on site for SEC football and basketball conference championships) to assist the media and schools in the recording of live game action as well as post-game press conferences. The system feeds will be available in both HD and SD options. It can accommodate up to 32 separate media outlets at once via a direct feed from the truck of the television broadcasts for the SEC Tournament and the post-game news conferences. A technician will be on site at all times to assist.

This service will be available downstairs in the press conference area (home team locker room) the entire tournament for any television media or school personnel that may not want to manually record the game from the television deck behind first base. Network TV will not be responsible or required to make recordings for the teams involved in the various games, so please utilize this service as well if you intend on recording any games.

Audio molt boxes will be available for all post-game press conferences for those who wish to record their own video, but media are encouraged to plug into the post-game press conference video distribution system, as well as the live game feed, being made available by the SEC.

» 2017 SEC Tournament

Years: 41st tournament in 2017

Games played: 500

Site: This marks the 20th consecutive year Hoover, Ala., has hosted the tournament and the 22nd overall. (1990, 1996, 1998-present)

Tournament Notes:

- A Western Division team has won 17 of the last 21 tournaments. Only Florida 2011 & '15, Vanderbilt 2007 and South Carolina 2004 from the Eastern Division have won in that span.
- The last repeat champion was LSU in 2013-14.
- The last two champions both lost their first game (Florida 2015, Texas A&M 2016). It has only happened seven times.
- There have been 17 undefeated champions with the last being LSU in 2014.
- Only three regular season champions have won the tournament in the last 20 years (Vanderbilt 2007, LSU 2009, Florida 2011).
- The last tournament champion with a losing league record was LSU (14-16) in 2010.
- The tournament champion has advanced to the College World Series 10 times the past 21 years.
- LSU (6), Alabama (5), Mississippi State (3) have combined to win 14 of the last 21 tournaments.
- LSU has the most tournament titles with 11, while Alabama, Florida and Mississippi State are tied for second with seven each.
- The last time a No. 1 seed won the tournament was LSU in 2009.
- Umpire Tony Walsh is working his 21st consecutive tournament and 27th of the last 29.
- Alabama is missing the tournament for the first time since 2012 and Tennessee failed to make the field for the first time since 2013.
- Since moving to a 12-team field in 2013, the No. 10 and 12 seeds have not won a game. In 2015, Alabama became the only No. 11 seed to win a game as it finished 2-2.
- The No. 8 seeded team has not won a tournament game since 2010 (0-8) when LSU went undefeated at 4-0.
- Last year's tournament drew a record 150,064 fans.
- 40 Years Ago: The first SEC Tournament was held May 13-16, 1977, in Oxford, Miss., with the homestanding and top-seeded Ole Miss Rebels winning the title.
- 35 Years Ago: Tennessee's Ted Carson became the only pitcher to make five appearances in the tournament as the Volunteers reached the title game in their first tournament trip in 1982. Carson made one start and four relief appearances, going 2-1 with one save.
- 30 Years Ago: The tournament expanded to six teams for the first time in 1987 and the No. 6-seed Mississippi State Bulldogs went undefeated en route to the title in Athens, Ga.
- 25 Years Ago: The Superdome in New Orleans hosted the 1992 tournament. It is the only time it has been played indoors. Florida defeated LSU, 6-2, in the title game.
- 20 Years Ago: Alabama won the 1997 tournament at Golden Park in Columbus, Ga. It was the last time the tournament was not played in Hoover. It was the second of three-straight tournament titles for the Crimson Tide.
- 15 Years Ago: In 2002, Alabama's Jeffrey Norris won the first of his two tournament title games, defeating South Carolina 6-2. He posted a win in 2003, as the Crimson Tide downed LSU, 10-3, for their last tournament title.
- 10 Years Ago: In 2007, Vanderbilt won its first tournament title since 1980, defeating Arkansas 7-4.
- 5 Years Ago: In 2012, Mississippi State won the tournament as a No. 7 seed, marking the second time the Bulldogs won the tournament as a seven-seed (2005).
- Alabama's Jim Wells was the last first-year coach to win the tournament in 1995. The only others were Florida's Joe Arnold in 1984 and Florida's Jack Rhine in 1982. This year's first-year coaches to make the tournament are Kentucky's Nick Mingione, Mississippi State's Andy Cannizaro and Missouri's Steve Bieser.

Arkansas Notes:

- The Razorbacks are back after missing the 2016 tournament, snapping a seven-year run of appearances.
- Arkansas is a No. 4 seed for the first time since 2010 and the fourth time in its history. It reached the tournament finals as a four seed in 1999.
- Arkansas has won at least two games in each of its last three tournaments (2013-15).
- Former Arkansas 1B Rodney Nye is the last tournament MVP (1998) not to play on the championship team.

Auburn Notes:

- Auburn is making its sixth appearance in the last eight years after missing the tournament for six straight years (2004-09).
- Auburn is making back-to-back appearances for the first time since 2012-13.
- The Tigers haven't won two tournament games since going 2-2 in reaching the semifinals in 2003.
- Auburn is an eight seed for the fifth time in its history and the first time since 2011. It reached the semifinals in 1999 as an eight seed.

Florida Notes:

- The Gators are making their 11th consecutive tournament appearance and have appearance in the last three tournament finals, going 1-2 (2014: L 2-0 vs. LSU; 2015: W 7-3 vs. Vanderbilt; 2016: L 12-5 vs. Texas A&M).
- It's been 97 games since Florida's Brian Johnson hit the last grand slam of the tournament.
- Florida has only missed four tournaments in its history (1986, 1999, 2003, 2006).
- The Gators are the No. 1 seed for the 10th time, trailing only LSU's 11, for the second-most in tournament history. It lost in the 2014 finals to LSU the last time it was the No. 1 seed.

Georgia Notes:

- Georgia is making back-to-back appearances in the tournament for the first time since 2011-12.
- The Bulldogs are looking to snap a five-game tournament losing streak. (Last win May 28, 2011 vs. Florida, 4-3).
- Georgia last played for a tournament title in 1989, the longest span of any league team.
- The Bulldogs are the 12th seed for the second time (2014).

Kentucky Notes:

- The Wildcats are making their sixth straight appearance, the longest stretch in school history.
- Kentucky is looking to snap a three-game tournament losing streak. (Last win May 22, 2014 vs. Miss. State, 7-6 (12))
- Former UK pitcher Aaron Lovett threw the second-most pitching in a game since 2001, logging 144 in a complete game 9-3 win versus Alabama, May 21, 2008.
- Kentucky is a three seed for the first time. It's the highest seed for the Wildcats since No. 2 in 2006.

LSU Notes:

- Head coach Paul Mainieri has the highest winning percentage of any coach in tournament history at .818 (27-6).
- Mainieri has won five tournament titles and can tie Alabama's Jim Wells and LSU's Skip Bertman for first with his next one.
- The Tigers have reached at the least the semifinals for the last four tournaments.
- LSU is No. 2 seed for the ninth time and the first since 2013 when it won the tournament.

Ole Miss Notes:

- The Rebels are making their sixth consecutive appearance and 14th in the last 15 years.
- Ole Miss reached last year's semifinals for the first time since 2010.
- Ole Miss made seven tournament appearances and played 22 games before head coach Mike Bianco came aboard in 2001 and guided the Rebels to 24 wins in 14 trips.

- The Rebels are the No. 9 seed for second time (2012).

Mississippi State Notes:

- The Bulldogs are making their sixth appearance in the last seven years.
- Mississippi State owns a 7-2 mark in extra-inning games in the tournament, including a 17-inning 2-1 victory over Missouri in 2013.
- The Bulldogs also own a tournament-best seven walk-off wins among their 63 tournament victories.
- Mississippi State is the No. 5 seed for the fifth time. It was the fifth seed in 2013 (semifinals) and 2014 (quarterfinals).

Missouri Notes:

- The Tigers are making their third straight appearance.
- Three of Missouri's four tournament losses have been by one run.
- Missouri played Mississippi State in the longest tournament game in 2013, covering 17 innings.
- The Tigers are the 10th seed for the first time.

South Carolina Notes:

- The Gamecocks are making their 21st consecutive appearance in the tournament. It is the longest active streak and the second-longest in tournament history, trailing only LSU's 22 straight from 1985-2006.
- South Carolina is seeking its first tournament win since May 24, 2012 (def. Auburn 5-3). It has lost its last eight tourney games.
- Former Gamecock pitcher Aaron Rawl holds the tournament record for most pitches in a game with 145 done in eight innings vs. LSU, May 25, 2001.
- South Carolina is the No. 11 seed for the first time.

Texas A&M Notes:

- The Aggies are appearing in their fifth straight tournament since joining the SEC for the 2013 baseball season.
- Texas A&M has won at least two games in three of its four tournament trips and has at least reached the semifinals the past two years.
- The Aggies have played six of their 13 tournament games against Vanderbilt, going 3-3.
- Texas A&M is the No. 7 seed for the first time.

Vanderbilt Notes:

- With one win, head coach Tim Corbin will tie Alabama's Jim Wells for third in tournament victories with 35. Corbin is 34-21 in 13 appearances, while Wells was 35-18 in 13 trips.
- The Commodores are making their 12th consecutive tournament appearance which ties Florida (1987-98) for the fourth-longest streak in SECT history.
- Vanderbilt has reached the finals in five of the last eight years and has won at least one game in the last 11 tournaments.
- The Commodores are the No. 6 for the ninth time and the second straight year. It reached the 2006 finals as the six seed.

Seeding

The two division champions shall be automatically seeded number one and number two based on winning percentage in conference competition. The rest shall be seeded numbers three through 12 based on winning percentage without regard to division. Ties will be broken in the following manner:

1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:
 - A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
 - B. If two-teams are divisional opponents:
 - (1) Won-lost percentage within their division (over the 18-game SEC division schedule).
 - (2) Won-lost percentage of the two teams versus the No. 1 team in their division (and proceeding through the No. 7 team, if necessary).
 - C. If two teams are not divisional opponents:
 - (1) Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed using common opponents only (and proceeding through the No. 12 seed, if necessary).
 - (2) Coin flip by the Commissioner

2. Three-Team Tie (or more). The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken: (Note: If the three tied teams have three different records against each other, they shall be seeded in best-percentage order.) Otherwise, once the tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker procedure will be used.
 - A. If all three teams are common opponents: Total won-lost percentage of games played among the tied teams.
 - B. Won-lost percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed and proceeding through the No. 12 seed, if necessary, using common opponents only.
 - C. If three or more teams still are tied, the Commissioner will conduct a draw.

» SEC Baseball On 2017 MLB Opening Day Rosters

Sixty-eight baseball players formerly from Southeastern Conference institutions were on 2017 Major League Baseball Opening Day active rosters. Every SEC institution was represented on MLB Opening Day rosters, with each team boasting at least two former SEC players on MLB active rosters.

» Setting The Standard

The Southeastern Conference, with its storied 83-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of intercollegiate competition in baseball of any league in the country since its inception in 1933.

An SEC squad has now appeared in the College World Series 31 of the last 32 years, including appearances by 15 teams in the last six years. Seven SEC teams were selected for NCAA Regional play with five advancing to NCAA Super Regionals.

The SEC has sent 55 teams to the College World Series since 1990. That was accomplished despite no SEC teams making the field in 1992. In that stretch, LSU has been to Omaha 14 times, Florida has now been 10 times, South Carolina six times, Georgia and Mississippi State five times, Arkansas four times, while Alabama, Tennessee and Vanderbilt have been three times each. Auburn has been twice. SEC teams are 113-97 in Omaha since 1990, a 53.8 winning percentage.

SEC teams have won 10 of the last 27 national championships, with LSU winning six (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009), South Carolina winning two (2010, 2011), Vanderbilt taking home the title in 2014 and Georgia claiming the 1990 title. The SEC has finished runner up nine times in that span, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

The SEC has averaged nearly eight games played per year in the College World Series since 1990. In 2015, an SEC team played in each of the 16 games of the CWS. In 2004, 12 of the 15 games played in Omaha involved a SEC team. In 1997, the SEC had a team in 13 of the 14 games played in the CWS. Since 1990, an SEC team has played in 187 of the 393 games.

The SEC has played 55 games in the "Final Four" of the College World Series since 1990. Only six times, 1992, 1994, 2003, 2006, 2007 and 2016 has the SEC failed to get a team to the "Final Four" of the CWS.

Total attendance for the 2016 SEC Tournament was 150,064, which broke the previous record by nearly 17,000. Two of the two-five highest attendance marks for a single session were set in 2016. The event has become the Birmingham metro's highest attended sporting event annually, second in the state only to NASCAR races at Talladega. Birmingham Magazine named it the top sporting event annually in the Birmingham area. The entire SEC Baseball Tournament was broadcast live on national television for the second consecutive year.

» 2017 SEC Baseball Awards Announced

HOOVER, Ala. (May, 22, 2017)—The Southeastern Conference on Monday announced its 2017 Baseball Awards and All-SEC Teams, recognizing standout performances from this season. The 2017 SEC Baseball Tournament will be played Tuesday through Sunday at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium.

Mississippi State's Brent Rooker was named the SEC Player of the Year, Kentucky's Sean Hjelle is the SEC Pitcher of the Year, Texas A&M's Braden Shewmake is the SEC Freshman of the Year, Kentucky's Nick Mingione is the SEC Coach of the Year and Kentucky's Zach Logue is the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Rooker leads the SEC in several offensive categories, including batting average (.415), hits (85), RBI (73), home runs (20), doubles (28), slugging percentage (.873) and total bases (179). He is the first Mississippi State player to reach 20 home runs, 20 doubles, 70 RBI, and the first SEC hitter to do so since 2000.

Hjelle is 9-2 this season with a 3.17 ERA, including a 7-1 mark in SEC action with a 1.90 ERA. His nine wins this season move him into a tie for 6th place on Kentucky's single-season wins list. Hjelle has allowed one earned run or less in six of his last seven starts and has given up six or fewer hits in his last 12 starts.

Shewmake is a two-time SEC Freshman of the Week honoree, and he is batting .342 with 39 runs, 16 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs and 64 RBI. He ranks second in the SEC in RBI, fourth in hits and fourth in total bases.

Mingione was named SEC Coach of the Year in his first season at the helm of the Wildcats. Kentucky's 38 wins on the season are the most since 2012, and 38 wins are the most for a first-year Kentucky head coach. Kentucky finished second in the Eastern Division and earned the No. 3 seed in the SEC Tournament.

Logue has earned a 3.96 GPA in Chemical Engineering at Kentucky. He is a

two-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, and he is 6-5 with a 5.03 ERA and has 76 strikeouts in 77.0 innings this season.

» SEC In The MLB Draft

A total of 14 SEC student-athletes were selected on the first day of the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft. Seven were selected in the first round/lottery round A, including two in the top-10. Tennessee's Nick Senzel was selected second overall by the Cincinnati Reds, while the Oakland Athletics took Florida's A.J. Puk with the sixth overall pick. The SEC's four first round picks represented three different schools. The SEC has now had a first-round MLB selection each year since 1991 and 109 total in the first round during that time. Among the top-two picks in each of the last two MLB Drafts, three have been from the SEC. Vanderbilt's Dansby Swanson and Arkansas' Andrew Benintendi were taken 1-2 in the 2015 draft.

» SEC Baseball Attendance

2017 Attendance Leaders

Year after year, the SEC continues to be the benchmark in paid college baseball attendance. The SEC and its member schools own virtually all regular season, conference tournament, NCAA Regional and Super Regional attendance records. The SEC and one of its institutions have led the NCAA in total and average attendance for the last 16 seasons in a row, and 21 of the last 27 years. The 2017 season marks the 14th year in a row the SEC has topped the one million mark in attendance, leading the nation once again in that category by a wide margin. The first weekend of the 2017 season drew more than 220,00 fans to SEC ballparks with eight crowds of more than 10,000.

The SEC Baseball Legends Presented by AT&T, featuring former standouts from Southeastern Conference member institutions, will once again be honored at the 2017 SEC Baseball Tournament May 23-28 at the Hoover Met in Hoover, Ala.

The 2017 class features LSU's Ben McDonald, Ole Miss' Don Kessinger, Missouri's Dave Silvestri and South Carolina's Earl Bass. Four legends are recognized each year.

"The Southeastern Conference has a rich tradition in the sport of baseball," SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey said. "Through our legends program, we are pleased to honor the individuals who have helped establish a foundation for the current and future success of our programs and the opportunities available to our student-athletes today."

This marks the sixth consecutive year that the SEC has recognized a class of baseball legends. The 2016 class featured Norm DeBriyn, Arkansas; Gabe Gross, Auburn; Cris Carpenter, Georgia and Scott Downs, Kentucky, while the 2015 class featured Andy Phillips, Alabama; David Eckstein, Florida; Mark Johnson, Texas A&M and Larry Schmittou, Vanderbilt, and the 2014 class featured Phil Garner, Tennessee; Jake Gibbs, Ole Miss; Jay Powell, Mississippi State and Bobby Richardson, South Carolina.

The 2013 class honored Hal Baird, Auburn; Terry Shumpert, Kentucky; Skip Bertman, LSU; and Gene McArtor, Missouri, and the inaugural class in 2012 included: Dr. Jeffrey Laubenthal, Alabama; Kevin McReynolds, Arkansas; Brad Wilkerson, Florida and Rev. Reggie Andrews, Georgia.

"These SEC Baseball Legends are among the best to play the college game," said Jamie Kerr, Director, AT&T Corporate Sponsorships. "We're proud to help honor them for their successes on the field and beyond."

Each legend will be recognized individually throughout the two quarterfinal matchups on Friday and will have on-field recognition and an awards presentation by Commissioner Sankey on Saturday, May 27 during the semifinals of the SEC Tournament. Fans will have an opportunity for autographs and photos with the honorees at the AT&T Legends Pavilion immediately following. Several legends will also participate in the annual SEC Youth Clinic on Friday morning.



2017 SEC Baseball Legends

Ben McDonald, LSU

Ben McDonald, a native of Denham Springs, La., capped a magnificent 1989 season by receiving the Golden Spikes Award, given by the United States Baseball Federation to the nation's most outstanding amateur player. McDonald, who was also named National Player of the Year by Baseball America, The Sporting News and Collegiate Baseball, was the first player chosen in the free-agent amateur draft and made his major league debut with the Baltimore Orioles in September, 1989. McDonald, who set an LSU career mark with 373 strikeouts, established Southeastern Conference standards for single-season strikeouts (202), innings pitched (152.1) and consecutive scoreless innings (44.2). A two-time All-American and a 1988 Olympic gold medalist, he finished his LSU career with a 29-14 record and a 3.24 ERA. He was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. McDonald, who enjoyed an excellent 10-year major league career with the Orioles and Milwaukee Brewers, also lettered as an LSU basketball player. He was a member of the 1986-87 Tiger hoops squad which advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. McDonald currently serves as a baseball analyst for the SEC Network.

Don Kessinger, Ole Miss

Don Kessinger was a two-sport All-American at Ole Miss before becoming a six-time All-Star in Major League Baseball. Kessinger excelled in both basketball and baseball for the Rebels from 1962-64, earning All-SEC and All-America honors in both sports. Kessinger's .400 career batting average still remains No. 1 in the Ole Miss record book, an effort which is also sixth on the SEC career chart. His best year at the plate came in 1964 when he led the SEC by hitting .436, a performance which remains as the best single season effort in Rebel baseball history. His nine career triples and 44 career steals place him 10th on each Ole Miss all-time list. Following a successful collegiate career, Kessinger moved on to Major League Baseball where he put together an impressive 16-year career. He started with the Chicago Cubs in 1964 and played at Wrigley Field until 1975. During that time as the Cubs' starting shortstop, Kessinger played in six All-Star Games, earned two Gold Glove Awards and set a then-Major League record for consecutive errorless games at shortstop with 54 in 1969. In his last season in MLB, 1979, Kessinger served as a player-manager for the White Sox. In 1991, he returned to his alma mater to become coach of the Ole Miss baseball team, taking over for legendary Rebel Jake Gibbs. Kessinger won 185 games over six seasons and even had the opportunity to coach his sons Kevin.

Dave Silvestri, Missouri

Dave Silvestri is one of the greatest shortstops ever to play for the Missouri Tigers during his career from 1986-88. A native of St. Louis (Parkway Central), Silvestri was a first-team all-American in 1987 and '88, and was a member of the U.S. Olympic team that won the gold medal at the Seoul Summer Games in 1988. He was also all-Big Eight and all-District V in 1987-88, and was named to the Big Eight all-Tournament team in 1988. Silvestri appears in the top-10 of 29 all-time statistical categories at MU, and his career batting average of .379 is fourth in school history. He still holds 10 game, season or career records for the Tigers. Drafted by the Houston Astros, he's played at the major league level with the New York Yankees, Montreal Expos and the Texas Rangers. His first National League hit was a run-scoring pinch-hit single against his hometown St. Louis Cardinals, at Busch Stadium, in 1995. He was inducted into the Mizzou Athletics Hall of Fame in 1997.

Earl Bass, South Carolina

Earl Bass was an outstanding pitcher for the Gamecocks and compiled a win-loss record of 34-3, despite missing most of the 1973 season with an arm injury. A first-team All-America selection in 1974 and 1975, Bass had a 12-1 mark in 1974 and was 17-1 in 1975. He set a then national record by winning 23 consecutive games over two seasons, a feat that still ranks second. Bass holds school records for shutouts (10), earned run average (1.34), and strikeouts (392). He was runner-up in balloting for the Lefty Gomez Plate, symbolic of the top amateur baseball player in the United States, in 1975 when he pitched the Gamecocks to within one game of the NCAA championship at the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

» Team Notes

Alabama

Alabama closed out its regular season in Nashville, falling in the first two games to Vanderbilt before the series finale was a rain-shortened tie to close out the Crimson Tide's 2017 campaign. UA finished its first season under head coach Greg Goff with a 19-34-1 overall record and a 5-24-1 mark in Southeastern Conference play. The Tide suffered an 18-1 loss to Vanderbilt on Thursday evening. The Commodores gained an early 5-0 lead after the first, then put up eight runs in the fourth to make it a 13-0 contest. Vandy added one in the fifth and four in the seventh with Alabama scoring its lone run in the top of the eighth on a Chandler Avant solo home run. Alabama fell behind early and could not recover, eventually falling by a score of 13-1 to Vanderbilt on Friday. The Commodores plated eight in the first inning, only two of which were earned as errors plagued the Tide defense. UA scored one in the second on an Alex Webb RBI-double, but was held scoreless the rest of the way. VU added one in the third and two apiece in the fifth and seventh innings for the series-clinching win. The regular-season finale between Alabama and Vanderbilt finished in a 3-3 tie in eight innings of play on Saturday afternoon. Garrett Suhey was dominant for the Crimson Tide, making his first career start and lasting a season-long 105 pitches. The junior allowed two runs on six hits and a pair of walks while striking out a season-high seven batters. Suhey gave up an RBI-triple and then allowed a solo homer to account for his only two runs of the day. The Tide's trio of Chandler Taylor, Cody Henry and Sam Finnerty each finished 1-for-3 with a run scored, while Taylor added his team-leading 16th home run of the season. Henry and Finnerty tallied a double on the day, with Connor Short also doubling as part of his 1-for-3 day that included an RBI.

Arkansas

Arkansas went 2-1 on the week with a series win over No. 22 Texas A&M in College Station to finish off the regular season. The series win was its sixth of the year and helped the Hogs earn the No. 4 overall seed in next week's SEC Tournament. The Razorbacks ended the regular season with a 39-15 record and an 18-11 mark in SEC play to finish second in the SEC Western Division and fourth overall. It's a 13-game turnaround from a year ago that saw the Hogs finish 26-29 and miss the postseason for the first time in 14 years. The fourth-place finish is also its highest since finishing third in 2013 with an 18-11 record in SEC play. Of its six conference series victories, two were in the form of sweeps against Mississippi State and Georgia, one of which will face the Hogs in their first game of the conference tournament on Wednesday. In its six series wins, Arkansas went 14-4 and hit .298 as a team with 27 home runs and 109 runs scored. Sophomore Eric Cole led all Hog hitters over that span with a .367 average (18-of-49) with four doubles and a .456 on-base percentage. Jax Biggers, Luke Bonfield, Dominic Fletcher, Chad Spanberger, and Carson Shaddy all hit over .300 during that same span, combining for 22 home runs and 75 RBIs. Arkansas will be in search of its first SEC Tournament championship when it takes the field Wednesday at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium and is making its eighth appearance in the last nine years and 22nd overall. The Razorbacks have made three SEC Tournament championship game appearances in their history, finishing runner-up in 1998 to Auburn, in 1999 to Alabama, and in 2007 to Vanderbilt. The team's last appearance in the tournament field came in 2015 when the Hogs won their first two games against Tennessee and Florida, reaching the quarterfinals. Arkansas used a strong finish to the regular season to earn the high seeding, going unbeaten in its final three SEC series against Tennessee, Vanderbilt, and Texas A&M. Arkansas won six of its last nine contests, including its third extra-inning win on Thursday in College Station. Spanberger's 10th inning home run was the final blow No. 16 Arkansas needed to take the series opener over No. 22 Texas A&M. The Aggies had already forced the game into extras with a single run in the bottom of the ninth, but Spanberger's 12th home run of the year silenced the Aggie crowd in the 10th to give the Razorbacks their 13th series opening win this season. The home run for Spanberger was his only hit of the night as he went 1-for-4 at the plate. Coming into the game, he only had three hits in 21 at-bats, one of those hits being a home run. However, Thursday night's homer might have been his most clutch hit of the year. Arkansas had allowed Texas A&M to tie the game at 4-4 in the ninth after Jake Reindl couldn't close out the game, allowing a lead-off walk to Hunter Coleman and a double to Cole Bedford. Jorge Gutierrez followed Bedford with a deep sacrifice fly to right field to tie the game and send it to extras. Two quick outs started the top of

the 10th for the Hog bats and looked as if there would be no response. Fortunately, Jake Arledge came through with a big two-out single to put a runner on and then Spanberger unloaded an opposite field home run that appeared to fly over the Texas A&M video board in left field. On the mound, junior pitcher Trevor Stephan threw another gem of a game, even after giving up a home run to Braden Shewmake in the third inning that, at the time, gave Texas A&M the 3-2 lead. After the long ball, Stephan allowed just two hits over the next four innings, striking out six in the process before running into trouble in the eighth. Stephan had to settle for the no-decision, finishing with 7.2 innings pitched, three runs allowed, and 10 strikeouts with only one walk. It was his third-straight start of seven innings or more and 10 or more strikeouts. Reindl corralled the victory, his third of the year after coming in to pitch in the ninth inning. Even though he gave up the game-tying run, he was able to come back and finish off the 10th with a 1-2-3 inning, needing just 14 pitches. Offensively, the Razorbacks didn't struggle at the plate as they knocked out 15 hits compared to only six by the Aggies. Jax Biggers led all hitters, going 3-for-5 with three RBIs and a run scored. He was just a triple short of the cycle as his eighth inning two-run home run was his fourth of the year. Biggers continues to be one of Arkansas' most consistent hitters this year as he is hitting a team-leading .335 on the year and .340 against SEC opponents. He has at least one hit in eight of his last nine games and now has 19 multi-hit games, five of three hits or more. On Friday in game two against the Aggies, the Hogs suffered a setback, not getting the key hits it needed to allow Texas A&M to even the series with a 5-2 win. Senior starting pitcher Dominic Taccolini had one bad inning that included a three-run home run in the third, but settled in to throw three scoreless innings after the homer, striking out three. That homer for the Aggies came off the bat of Hunter Coleman, part of a four-run inning, which was really the only blemish on Taccolini's performance. The Sugar Land, Texas native was penciled into the starting spot for Friday's game after scheduled starter Blaine Knight was pushed to Saturday due to light arm soreness. This was the second consecutive week that Taccolini found himself in the starting role and for the second-straight week, he was up to the challenge as he looked strong over six innings, giving up five runs, four in the third inning, while walking just four and throwing 93 pitches. Arkansas came out blazing on Saturday in the regular-season finale, winning comfortably, 8-0 over the Aggies, for its 18th SEC win of the year. Arkansas got stellar performances from Spanberger at the plate and Blaine Knight on the mound. Spanberger hit a career-high two home runs in the game, part of a 2-for-5 day with two runs scored and two RBIs. He finishes the weekend with three home runs against the Aggies and now has 14 for the year, which takes over the team lead and puts him in the top five in the SEC. With the strong offensive output by the Hogs, Knight was able to go out and throw comfortably for six innings, allowing just three hits with no walks and two strikeouts. He earned his seventh win of the year and first since April 13 against Georgia. Knight was seemingly locked in from the first pitch as he retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced and never let a runner get past first. Kevin Kopps followed Knight to pitch the final three innings and picked up his second save of the season after allowing just two hits and striking out four. It was the fourth shutout for Razorback pitchers this season and second in conference play, the last coming against Tennessee (May 6) in Trevor Stephan's seven-inning shutout. Arkansas now sets its sights on the SEC Tournament and will play either Mississippi State or Georgia on Wednesday as part of the double elimination rounds. First pitch is slated as TBA, but is scheduled to be the last game of the day and will be televised on the SEC Network.

Auburn

Auburn finished the regular season 34-22 and 16-14 in the SEC. It is the 11th time in program history the Tigers have won 16 SEC games and the first time since winning a program-record 20 games in 2010. JR OF Jonah Todd was named second-team All-SEC and was selected to the SEC All-Defensive team. Todd is third in the SEC with a .385 BA and 82 hits this season and second w/ .404 BA in SEC play. IF Dylan Ingram is currently on a 12-game hitting streak. During the stretch, he is 19-of-49 (.388) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 10 RBI and 11 runs scored. C Damon Haecker is 13-of-30 (.433) with 2 2B, 1 3B, 3 RBI, 2 SB and a .564 OB% in 10 career games vs. Ole Miss. The Tigers are 11-5 on the season in one-run games after going 1-11 in those games in 2016. Auburn has won 11 of 14 series in 2017, its most series wins since 2003. The Tigers have hit 17 home runs in their last 22 games after recording only 10 in their first 34 contests RHPs Casey Mize (1.97-3rd) and Keegan Thompson (2.30-6th) are

the only teammates who rank in the top six in the SEC in ERA. With 34 wins (16 SEC) on the season, Auburn has surpassed its overall and conference win totals from 2016.

Florida

The Gators battled back this weekend after dropping Thursday night's series opener vs. No. 7 Kentucky to win the final two games and clinch the 2017 SEC Championship, the fourth title in 10 years under head coach Kevin O'Sullivan...Florida improved to 40-15 on the season, reaching the 40-win mark in the regular season for the sixth time in 10 seasons under O'Sullivan...The Wildcats offense exploded on Thursday night to beat UF 12-4 but Brady Singer quieted the UK bats on Friday as the Florida offense bounced back in a 14-3 win to even the series...Jackson Kowar had perhaps the best start of his career with the title on the line as the Gators defeated Kentucky 6-4 on Saturday to win the SEC title and clinch the No. 1 overall seed for the 2017 SEC Tournament...On Friday night, Singer took a no-hit bid into the sixth inning before allowing a leadoff double to Tristan Pompey...He finished the night with three runs allowed in seven innings to improve to 7-3 on the season...Mark Kolozsvary (3-4, 5 RBI) and Deacon Liput (4 RBI) powered the offense in the win...On Saturday, Kowar had a championship-type performance, limiting the league's top offense to two runs through 6.1 innings to improve to 10-0 on the season, the best record in the SEC...Sophomore Nelson Maldonado hit a three-run home run in the fourth inning to erase a 2-0 deficit and give the Gators a one-run lead, which it would not relinquish...Jonathan India continued to swing a hot bat, going 7-for-13 (.538) over the weekend with three runs scored...JJ Schwarz and Kolozsvary each went 4-for-10 (.400) over three games...Schwarz increased his team-best hitting streak to nine games.

Georgia

Georgia is 25-31 overall and 11-19 in the SEC and enters the SEC Tournament having won its last three SEC series, all over ranked teams including two on the road. Georgia's run to qualify for the tournament in this span featured series wins at No. 4 Kentucky, versus No. 6 Miss. State in Athens and at No. 30 South Carolina, going 6-3 in this stretch. The 2001 season marked the last time Georgia had posted three consecutive SEC series wins over ranked teams, that year they came over #23 Florida (2-1), #16 South Carolina (2-1) and #14 Tennessee (3-0). Georgia opens the SEC Tournament against No. 13 Miss. State. Georgia claimed the regular season series over then No. 6 MSU 2-1 in Athens two weeks ago. In SEC Tournament meetings, the Bulldogs are 4-8 against MSU with the last matchup in 2014, a 5-4 MSU victory in 10 innings. Sophomore C/DH Michael Curry (.298-10-46) is aiming to capture the team's Triple Crown, leading the squad in home runs and RBI and third in batting. He has started all 56 games this year at either catcher or designated hitter. Also an excellent student, Curry has made the CoSIDA Academic All-District team as a Dean's List student majoring in Computer Science major. He is on the national ballot for Academic All-American. Freshman SS Cam Shepherd (.303-5-28) ranks among the SEC leaders with 72 hits. He has started all 56 games at shortstop and leads the team with 20 multi-hit games. He has 16 doubles including 12 in SEC action where he is batting .310-2-11. Freshman RF Tucker Bradley (.322-0-10) leads the team in batting and has the highest SEC batting average for the Bulldogs at .349. Senior LHP Andrew Gist (3-4, 3.80 ERA) matched his career high of eight innings pitched with an outstanding series opening road win over No. 30 South Carolina Thursday. He carried a shutout to the seventh and ended up allowing just one run on three hits with a walk and five strikeouts in leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 win. It clinched Georgia's spot in the SEC Tournament. In his last three SEC starts, all against ranked opponents, sophomore LHP Kevin Smith is 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA, beating No. 4 Kentucky in Lexington, No. 6 Miss. State in Athens, and No. 30 USC in Columbia. For the year, Smith is 5-5 with a 5.03 ERA and two saves in 19 appearances including 12 starts. For the season, Georgia is batting .259 with an ERA of 5.04 and a fielding percentage of .961. Georgia is 6-11 in one-run games this year including 0-3 in extra innings. In SEC action, Georgia is batting .241 with 5.46 ERA and a .966 fielding percentage. The Bulldogs are 2-5 in one-run SEC games.

Kentucky

Kentucky's bid for its second regular season Southeastern Conference championship came up just short, as the No. 6 Wildcats fell 6-4 to No. 5 Florida at McKethan Stadium in the regular season finale. The Cats finished the regular season with 38 wins, the most since the 2012 team won a school-record 45. Their 19-11 mark in league play represents the second-most SEC wins in school history, one short of the 20 the 2006 club had when it won the conference. UK earned the No. 3 seed in next week's SEC Tournament in Hoover, Ala. and will open play at 10:30 a.m. ET on Wednesday, May 24 in the double elimination portion of the bracket. The Cats got off to a hot start on Saturday, scoring a run on back-to-back doubles in the first inning and tacking on another in the third. But Florida managed to wriggle out of several jams early in the game and escaped a pair of bases loaded situations in the middle innings while building a 6-2 lead on the strength of Nelson Maldonado's opposite field home run tucked just inside the right field pole. Marcus Carson's two-run homer to right field in the eighth inning drew the Cats within two but a pair of line drives nestled right into the gloves of the third baseman and second baseman to end the rally.

LSU

LSU won its 17th Southeastern Conference championship Saturday night with an 11-7 victory over Mississippi State at Dudy Noble Field ... LSU, which claimed the SEC Western Division championship on Friday night with a win over MSU, will share the overall title with SEC Eastern Division champion Florida ... the Tigers, who won 11 of their final 12 SEC games, improved to 39-17 overall and 21-9 in conference play, marking LSU's 11th 20-win season in SEC games, the most 20-win seasons in league history ... LSU has now won 21 of its last 27 SEC road series, dating back to the 2012 season ... junior right-hander Alex Lange turned in a brilliant effort on Thursday, defeating ninth-ranked Mississippi State by working seven innings and allowing just one run on six hits with 11 strikeouts ... Lange's victory in Game 1 of the series sparked LSU's three-game sweep of Mississippi State, and the Tigers earned a share of the 2017 SEC regular-season championship ... he allowed a solo homer to the MSU lead-off hitter in the bottom of the first inning, but then recorded 21 outs without allowing another run ... Lange increased his season strikeouts total to 111, which leads the SEC, and his career strikeouts total to 367, which ranks No. 3 all-time at LSU ... senior shortstop Kramer Robertson batted .526 (10-for-19) in the Tigers' four wins last week, and he helped lead LSU to a three-game sweep of Mississippi State and a share of the 2017 SEC regular-season championship ... Robertson, LSU's lead-off hitter, recorded two doubles, one triple, one homer, three RBI, eight runs and a .591 on-base percentage ... Robertson batted .429 (6-for-14) in the Mississippi State series with one triple, two RBI, five runs and a .529 on-base percentage ... Robertson has been instrumental in LSU's late-season surge, batting a team-best .367 (22-for-60) in the Tigers' last 14 games (12 wins) with three doubles, one triple, two homers, eight RBI, 20 runs and a .435 on-base percentage ... freshman right-hander Zack Hess made two appearances in LSU's three-game sweep of Mississippi State, working a combined 4.2 shutout innings with two hits, one walk and eight strikeouts ... he earned the save in LSU's Game 2 victory, which clinched the SEC Western Division title for the Tigers ... Hess fired 3.2 innings in Game 2, allowing two hits with one walk and six strikeouts ... Hess entered the game in the sixth inning with one out and the tying run on deck, and he fired consecutive strikeouts to retire lead-off hitter Ryan Gridley and SEC batting leader Brent Rooker to end the inning ... he then began the seventh inning with consecutive strikeouts of MSU No. 3 hitter Jake Mangum and clean-up hitter Cody Brown ... Gridley, Rooker and Mangum all entered the game in the Top 10 in the SEC in base hits ... Hess worked the eighth inning in Game 1 of the series, retiring all three batters he faced with two strikeouts to hold a 3-1 LSU lead.

Ole Miss

Ole Miss went 1-3 over the past week, playing all four away from Swayze Field. The Rebels fell in a midweek contest to Arkansas State before dropping two of three games at No. 23 Auburn. Entering SEC Tournament play, Ole Miss holds a 32-24 record with a 14-16 mark in conference games. Pitching continues to be the team's strength, ranking top 25 nationally in five different categories. Ole Miss leads the SEC in strikeout-to-walk-ratio (3.19), which also ranks third in the country. Individually, senior Colby Bortles paces the conference and ranks 16th nationally with seven sacrifice flies. Against the Tigers, Tate Black-

man went 6-for-11 throughout the weekend series with team highs in runs (3) and RBI (4) as well. The Rebels suffered setbacks in the first three games of the week before winning the series finale versus Auburn. In Friday's loss, sophomore Connor Green had his best outing of the year, pitching 3.1 scoreless innings. Ole Miss finished the week on a positive note with an 8-4 win. Blackman led the way, going 4-for-5 with three RBI and two runs. Ryan Olenek added a three-hit performance which included two doubles to bring his season total to 17 which ranks fourth in the SEC. Nick Fortes went 3-for-5 as well. On the mound, David Parkinson recorded eight strikeouts before giving the ball to junior Will Stokes, who pitched a season-high 4.1 innings of relief and did not give up a run to earn the win. The victory was the Rebels' 17th over a ranked team this season. Up next, as the No. 9 seed in the SEC Tournament, Ole Miss will face Auburn once again on Tuesday. First pitch is slated for 4:30 p.m. CT from the Hoover Met in Hoover, Alabama. The game will be broadcast on SEC Network. The Rebels are expected to start redshirt-sophomore Brady Feigl, who retired all six batters he faced in Thursday's game versus Auburn.

Mississippi State

A trio of Mississippi State baseball players earned All-Southeastern Conference honors on Monday. Having produced one of the most impressive offensive regular seasons in Southeastern Conference history, MSU's Brent Rooker was named SEC Player of the Year in addition to being named First Team All-SEC. Ryan Gridley joined Rooker as a first-team selection. Jake Mangum was voted Second Team All-SEC in addition to finding his name on the All-Defensive Team. Rooker is the first MSU player to ever be named SEC Player of the Year, while he is the second Diamond Dawg first baseman in as many seasons to be named First Team All-SEC after Nathaniel Lowe earned the honor in 2016. The junior from Germantown, Tennessee has hit at a .415 clip with 85 hits, a school-record and NCAA-leading 28 doubles, 20 home runs and 73 RBIs. He leads the conference in 10 offensive categories and his batting average currently ranks second in the nation. Gridley became the first Bulldog shortstop since Thomas Berkery in 2006 to be named First Team All-SEC and the third shortstop to be named to the first team under Andy Cannizaro in as many seasons. The Milton, Georgia native has tallied career-best numbers in his junior season for the Bulldogs, hitting .326 at the plate with 73 hits, 12 doubles, six homers and 38 RBIs. Mangum has now been named All-SEC for the second time in as many seasons (First Team in 2016), along with being the first Diamond Dawg named to the SEC All-Defensive Team since Brett Pirtle in 2014. Mangum also became the first MSU outfielder to be named to the All-Defensive Team since Hunter Renfroe in 2013.

Missouri

Mizzou Baseball closed the regular season on a six-game win streak while winning its final two SEC series to finish the season 35-21 and 14-16 in league play ... The 35 wins are Mizzou's most since 2009 and the most in the regular season since 2008 ... The 14 SEC wins are Mizzou's second-most ever since joining the SEC ... The Tigers close the season winning seven of 10 games and went 10-5 on the road in SEC play this season ... The Tigers won nine games vs. RPI top-50 teams and 13 against RPI top-100 teams ... Head coach Steve Bieser now has more wins than any first-year head coach in the history of Mizzou's program ... Mizzou allowed just 10 hits over three games in Knoxville over the weekend to earn a series sweep over Tennessee ... Mizzou got back-to-back complete game shutouts from freshman LHP T.J. Sikkema and junior RHP Cole Bartlett in the first two games of the series, the latter of which was a one-hitter fired by Bartlett ... Mizzou now has three pitchers in the top 10 of the SEC in ERA as Sikkema ranks fourth, Bartlett eighth and Tanner Houck 10th ... Mizzou finishes the regular season ranked second in the SEC in ERA, second in opponent batting and second in hits allowed ... Only Texas A&M and Vanderbilt allowed fewer hits than Mizzou in the regular season despite Mizzou ranking second in the league in innings pitched ... Mizzou's 3.43 ERA is the best at Mizzou since 2006 when it posted a 3.36 mark with guys like Max Scherzer and Aaron Crow on the team ... Mizzou drew the No. 7 seed in this week's SEC Tournament and will play Texas A&M at approximately 1 p.m. (CT) Tuesday in game two of the tourney ... Mizzou is 1-4 all-time in SEC Tournament action and 26-26 in conference tournament action dating back to when Mizzou joined the Big 12 in 1997 ... Mizzou and Texas A&M have met five times in conference tournament action with the Aggies winning three of the five games ... Mizzou won the last meeting in 2012, 5-2, en-route to claiming the Big 12 Tournament title ... Mizzou lost the season series with the Aggies

as they swept the Tigers in Columbia in late April.

South Carolina

South Carolina (32-23) is the No. 11 seed at the 2017 SEC Tournament and will face the No. 6 seed Vanderbilt (33-21-1). First pitch is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. ET. The game will be televised on the SEC Network and is available on the Gamecock IMG Network including flagship 107.5 "The Game." Carolina won one of three games vs. Vanderbilt this season in a three-game series at Founders Park. South Carolina is 25-44 (.362) in all-time SEC Tournament history dating back to its first appearance in the 1992 season, also South Carolina's first official year in the Southeastern Conference. The Gamecocks have twice played for the SEC Tournament Championship, winning in 2004 and finishing second in 2002. The Gamecocks went 4-0 in 2004 on the way to the tournament championship including a 3-2 victory over Vanderbilt in the title game. South Carolina is 32-23 and went 13-17 in the SEC. The Gamecocks have played 22 of 55 games this year vs. RPI Top 50 teams with seven Top 50 RPI wins and own 19 Top 100 RPI victories as well. South Carolina is 24-10 on the year when scoring first in a game and 25-6 when entering the seventh inning with a lead and 31-3 when entering the ninth inning with the lead. The Gamecocks are 18-3 when scoring six or more runs and 30-12 when allowing five runs or less. South Carolina is 17-19 in games decided by three runs or less. South Carolina is 11-3 in five-plus run games. The South Carolina pitching staff ranks seventh in the SEC in earned run average. The Gamecocks own a 3.65 team ERA with 232 runs allowed, 201 earned, on 432 hits in 496.0 innings pitched. The Gamecocks have struck out 522 batters to 200 walks. Opponents are batting .235 against the Gamecocks. Carolina leads the SEC in strikeouts as a staff and rank fourth in opposing batting average. South Carolina's 3.85 ERA in SEC games is third in the conference as well. The Gamecocks have 225 strikeouts in 243.0 innings during conference play. South Carolina is hitting .264 (490-for-1856) for the season with a .347 on-base percentage and a .402 slugging percentage. The Gamecocks have 50 homers on the year. South Carolina has equaled or out-hit its opponent in 37 of 55 games this year. South Carolina is fielding .977 for the season with 24 games without an error. South Carolina is 17-7 when not committing an error. South Carolina ranks fifth in the SEC in fielding.

Tennessee

The Tennessee Volunteers went 1-3 on the week, finishing their 2017 season with a 27-25 overall record, including a 7-21 mark in Southeastern Conference play, after dropping three games to the Missouri Tigers in Knoxville... With a loss to Mizzou on Thursday and Georgia's win over South Carolina, the Vols were eliminated from SEC Tournament contention for the first time since 2013... Saturday marked Head Coach Dave Serrano's final game on Rocky Top, as he announced on Wednesday his plans to resign following the conclusion of the 2017 season... Serrano completed his Tennessee head coaching stint with a 157-163 overall record from 2012-17... The Vols' finish 2017 with a .258 team batting average, ranking 13th in the league... The Vols combined for 123 extra-base hits this year, including 33 home runs (surpassing 2016's complete season total 21)... As a team, UT ranks 10th in on-base percentage (.352), tied for third in triples (13), eighth in walks (212), fourth in hit-by-pitch (54) and seventh in stolen bases (55)... Tennessee's staff combined for a 3.98 ERA (10th in the SEC) and allowed 168 walks, the third-fewest among SEC teams... UT picked off seven baserunners from the mound, tied for seventh-best in the league.... UT's 36 home runs allowed were the sixth-fewest among SEC staffs... The Vols' .973 overall fielding percentage also ranks ninth in the league... Pete Derkay ranks eighth in the SEC with 37 walks and 10th with a .440 OBP... Jeff Moberg finished his UT career ranking tied for seventh with three triples this year and tied for 10th with 10 HBP... Senior Hunter Martin (5-7, 3.59 ERA) finished the season ranking second in the SEC with 92.2 innings pitched, following his fourth complete game of the year on Thursday vs. Mizzou... He ranks tied for eighth in strikeouts (89) and second in the SEC with 33 batters struck out looking... Martin is the first UT pitcher to record multiple complete games (4) in a single season since Zack Godley did so in 2013 (6)... His 16 walks allowed tied for the eighth-fewest in SEC... Jon Lipinski (6-1, 2.10 ERA) finished 17 games in 2017, fifth-most among SEC pitchers... Will Neely (3-1, 3.43 ERA) held opponents to a .213 average, the 13th-best mark in the SEC... He allowed just 45 hits and 25 runs, sixth-fewest among league pitchers in those categories, while his 13 walks are tied for the second-fewest in the SEC... Zach Linginfelter held opponents to 48 total hits, tied for sev-

enth-fewest among league pitchers... He allowed just 23 earned runs (T-10th in SEC) while his three home runs allowed are tied for ninth-fewest among SEC pitchers... Jordan Rodgers leads the Volunteers with 18 multi-hit games and 35 RBI this season... Rodgers and Jeff Moberg shared the team in home runs, each with nine on the year as part of UT's 33 total homers... Pete Derkay led the Vols with 37 walks and a .440 OBP... Justin Ammons and Andre Lipcius co-own the team lead each with 11 doubles on the year... Freshman Andre Lipcius was the lone Tennessee player to start each of the Vols' 52 games this year, serving as UT's primary first baseman... LAST WEEK: A sacrifice fly from third baseman Brandon Chineia in the 11th inning lifted Tennessee past Morehead State, 4-3, as the Vols held off the Eagles to claim the Tuesday-night win... With the victory, the Volunteers improved to a 20-4 mark in non-conference play and a 6-1 record in extra-inning games this year... On the mound, Will Neely got the nod for UT, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings and striking out a career-high six batters in the no-decision... Jon Lipinski fired five strikeouts through 3.2 scoreless innings to pick up his sixth win of the season... The Vols' pitching staff threw 17 strikeouts on Tuesday, marking a season-high count for UT... Tennessee scattered four hits against Missouri on Thursday night, but struggled to find a rhythm as the Tigers held on to a 5-0 lead to take Game One of the final regular-season series at Lindsey Nelson Stadium... Right-handed pitcher Hunter Martin retired 12 straight batters to start the game, not allowing a run until the fifth inning... He allowed five runs on five hits and struck out nine batters, tying a career-high, in his fourth complete game of the season for the loss... Martin entered Thursday's matchup tied for second in the SEC with 31 batters struck out looking as well as fifth with 83.2 innings pitched on the year... With his complete game effort in the series opener, Martin posted his fourth complete game of the year... He is the first UT pitcher to record multiple complete games in a single season since Zack Godley did so in 2013 (6)... Tennessee was held without a hit over the final eight innings on Friday night as it fell to Missouri, 2-0... Friday's game lasted just 1:57, marking the shortest game of the season for the Vols... Garrett Stallings took the loss despite a solid outing on the hill... The freshman struck out a season-best five batters and walked just one in 7.2 innings – also a season-high... After Tennessee led off the game with a two-run first inning, Missouri responded with eight unanswered runs to fend off the Volunteers, 8-2, in Saturday's 2017 season finale... Prior to the game, the Volunteers recognized student assistant coach and recent Tennessee graduate Steven Gruver as well as eight seniors as Max Bartlett, Eric Freeman, Jon Lipinski, Hunter Martin, Jordan Rodgers, Quint Robinson, Reggie Southall and Matt Waldren each dressed out in the Orange and White for their final game as a Volunteer on Saturday... With the loss, the Vols finish the regular season with a 27-25 (7-21 SEC) record while Mizzou now stands at 35-21 (14-16 SEC)... Senior Jon Lipinski made his first career start for UT on Saturday... He tossed a career-long 5.0 innings in the outing... In relief, redshirt junior Quint Robinson finished his career on Rocky Top having not allowed a run... Jeff Moberg, also playing his final game on Rocky Top, blasted his ninth homer of the season over the left field wall to put the Vols up in the first inning, 1-0... MORE FROM 2017: The Vols' 2017 roster boasted 17 newcomers including 14 true freshmen, two JUCO transfers and one graduate transfer... Announced in May, Tennessee Baseball recorded its highest-ever multi-year APR score with a 979... That stands as a 14-point improvement from the previous year and a 45-point improvement from three years ago, when it was at 934... Knoxville native Eric Freeman earned his fourth-consecutive SEC Baseball Community Service Team nod on the heels of his Brad Davis SEC Community Service Leader of the Year Award nomination... Freeman was also named 2016-17 CoSIDA Academic All-District in May.

Texas A&M

The Texas A&M Aggies enters the 2017 SEC Baseball Tournament (May 23-28) in Hoover, Alabama as the No. 7 seed, drawing Missouri as their first round opponent. Texas A&M is looking to defend their 2016 SEC Tournament title. The Aggies and Tigers are the second game slated for Tuesday's action at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium. The game will begin approximately 30 minutes after the completion of the day's initial contest between No. 6 seed Vanderbilt and No. 11 seed South Carolina which begins at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday's action is an elimination round with the winners advancing to a double-elimination portion that begins Wednesday. The winner of the Texas A&M-Missouri contest faces No. 2-seed LSU in Wednesday's second game. In their regular-season series, Texas A&M swept Missouri by a combined tally of 25-4 in Columbia. Texas A&M entered the SEC Tournament as the No. 3 seed in both 2015 and

2016. The Aggies were seeded No. 9 in 2013 and No. 10 in 2014. The Aggies are 1-1 in SEC Tournament first round games. In 2013, the Maroon and White toppled Florida, 6-3, behind a complete-game effort by Daniel Mengden and four RBI by Hunter Melton. In 2014, Texas A&M lost a 4-0 decision against Arkansas. All of the games will be televised nationally. The championship game will air on ESPNU at 3:30 pm on Sunday, May 28. All other games will be televised on SEC Network.

Vanderbilt

Vanderbilt wrapped up the regular season with a 3-0-1 week against Middle Tennessee and Alabama... The Commodores pounded the Blue Raiders for the second time this season Tuesday in a 17-7 victory... Will Toffey and Jeren Kendall each hit home runs in the win with Toffey driving in three runs with a two-hit game... Matt Ruppenthal earned his first win as a starter with six solid innings of work... The Dores won the series-opener in an 18-1 blowout of Alabama on Thursday night... VU scored five in the first then added eight more in the fourth in the team's biggest inning of the season... Jason Delay drove in four runs with three hits as part of the Dores' season-best 21-hit attack... Patrick Raby tossed seven scoreless innings despite walking a career-high five in his team-leading ninth win... Kyle Wright was magnificent again on Friday night, punching out 11 –including the final six he faced – over 7.1 innings in the Commodores' 13-1 victory... Jeren Kendall drove in a season-best five runs with three hits, including his 15th homer of the year... Will Toffey matched career-bests with four hits and four runs... Vandy battled back to tie Alabama 3-3 in a rain-shortened, eight-inning game on Saturday afternoon... Jeren Kendall scored the tying run on a balk in the eighth before a storm forced the end of the game... Drake Fellows struck out a career-high 10 batters over 6.2 innings in Vanderbilt's first tie since 1993... The Commodores travel to Hoover, Ala. this week for as the No. 6 seed in the SEC Tournament... VU is set to play South Carolina Tuesday morning in the first game of the tournament at 9:30 a.m. in an elimination game.
