» Noteworthy

- The SEC has now sent 58 teams to the College World Series since 1990. That has been accomplished despite no SEC teams making the field in 1992. LSU has been to Omaha 15 times in that stretch, Florida 11 times, South Carolina six times, Georgia and Mississippi State five times, Arkansas four times, while Alabama, Tennessee and Vanderbilt have been three times each, and Auburn twice. Texas A&M is making its first appearance as a member of the Southeastern Conference.
- The SEC leads all conferences with three teams in the College World Series.
- SEC teams have won 10 of the last 27 national championships, with LSU winning six (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009), South Carolina winning two (2010, 2011), Vanderbilt taking home the title in 2014 and Georgia claiming the 1990 title. The SEC has finished runner up nine times in that span, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.
- SEC teams are 113-99 in Omaha since 1990, a 53.3 winning percentage.
- The SEC has played 55 games in the “Final Four” of the College World Series since 1990. Only six times, 1992, 1994, 2003, 2006, 2007 and 2016 has the SEC failed to get a team to the “Final Four” of the CWS.
- In 2015, an SEC team played in each of the 16 games of the CWS. In 2004, 12 of the 15 games played in Omaha involved a SEC team. In 1997, the SEC had a team in 13 of the 14 games played in the CWS. Since 1990, an SEC team has played in 187 of the 393 games. The SEC had a team in the CWS final each season from 2008-2015.
- The SEC tied its own national record with six teams in the NCAA Super Regionals. Six teams from the SEC also advanced to Super Regionals in 2004. No other conference had more than three representatives in the Super Regionals.
- The SEC led all conferences with its eight selections to the NCAA Baseball Tournament.
- Four SEC schools were selected as NCAA Regional host sites, and two - Florida and LSU - earned national seeds.
- Florida and LSU claimed a share of the SEC regular season title, while LSU won the SEC Tournament title.
- Total attendance for the 2017 SEC Tournament was 127,479.
- SEC players among the nation’s leaders: Mississippi State’s Brent Rooker is first in doubles (30), first in RBI (82), first in slugging (.827), second in total bases (201), second in hits (96); LSU’s Kramer Robertson is first in runs scored (79); Florida’s Jackson Kowar is second in wins (12), and Florida’s Michael Byrne is first in saves (16)
- SEC teams have combined for a 283-112 (.716) non-conference record, which is best among all conferences.
- Total home attendance for all 14 SEC teams passed the two million mark for the seventh consecutive season. The top-five national attendance leaders are all from the SEC (LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Arkansas and South Carolina).

» SEC Baseball On 2017 MLB Opening Day Rosters

Sixty-eight baseball players formerly from Southeastern Conference institutions were on 2017 Major League Baseball Opening Day active rosters. Every SEC institution was represented on MLB Opening Day rosters, with each team boasting at least two former SEC players on MLB active rosters.

» Setting The Standard

The Southeastern Conference, with its storied 83-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of intercollegiate competition in baseball of any league in the country since its inception in 1933.

An SEC squad has now appeared in the College World Series 31 of the last 32 years, including appearances by 15 teams in the last six years. Seven SEC teams were selected for NCAA Regional play with five advancing to NCAA Super Regionals.

The SEC has sent 55 teams to the College World Series since 1990. That was accomplished despite no SEC teams making the field in 1992. In that stretch, LSU has been to Omaha 14 times, Florida has now been 10 times, South Carolina six times, Georgia and Mississippi State five times, Arkansas four times, while Alabama, Tennessee and Vanderbilt have been three times each. Auburn has been twice. SEC teams are 113-97 in Omaha since 1990, a 53.8 winning percentage.

SEC teams have won 10 of the last 27 national championships, with LSU winning six (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009), South Carolina winning two (2010, 2011), Vanderbilt taking home the title in 2014 and Georgia claiming the 1990 title. The SEC has finished runner up nine times in that span, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

Total attendance for the 2016 SEC Tournament was 150,064, which broke the previous record by nearly 17,000. Two of the two-five highest attendance marks for a single session were set in 2016. The event has become the Birmingham metro's highest attended sporting event annually, second in the state only to NASCAR races at Talladega. Birmingham Magazine named it the top sporting event annually in the Birmingham area. The entire SEC Baseball Tournament was broadcast live on national television for the second consecutive year.

» 2017 SEC Baseball Awards Announced

The Southeastern Conference announced its 2017 Baseball Awards and All-SEC Teams, recognizing standout performances from this season.

Mississippi State's Brent Rooker was named the SEC Player of the Year, Kentucky's Sean Hjelle is the SEC Pitcher of the Year, Texas A&M's Braden Shewmake is the SEC Freshman of the Year, Kentucky's Nick Mingione is the SEC Coach of the Year and Kentucky's Zach Logue is the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Rooker leads the SEC in several offensive categories, including batting average (.415), hits (85), RBI (73), home runs (20), doubles (28), slugging percentage (.873) and total bases (179). He is the first Mississippi State player to reach 20 home runs, 20 doubles, 70 RBI, and the first SEC hitter to do so since 2000.

Hjelle is 9-2 this season with a 3.17 ERA, including a 7-1 mark in SEC action with a 1.90 ERA. His nine wins this season move him into a tie for 6th place on Kentucky's single-season wins list. Hjelle has allowed one earned run or less in six of his last seven starts and has given up six or fewer hits in his last 12 starts.

Shewmake is a two-time SEC Freshman of the Week honoree, and he is batting .342 with 39 runs, 16 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs and 64 RBI. He ranks second in the SEC in RBI, fourth in hits and fourth in total bases.

Mingione was named SEC Coach of the Year in his first season at the helm of the Wildcats. Kentucky's 38 wins on the season are the most since 2012, and 38 wins are the most for a first-year Kentucky head coach. Kentucky finished second in the Eastern Division and earned the No. 3 seed in the SEC Tournament.

Logue has earned a 3.96 GPA in Chemical Engineering at Kentucky. He is a two-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, and he is 6-5 with a 5.03 ERA and has 76 strikeouts in 77.0 innings this season.

» SEC In The MLB Draft

A total of 11 SEC student-athletes were selected on the first day of the Major League Baseball Draft on Monday. Eight were selected in the first round/ competitive balance round A, including four in the top-18. Vanderbilt's Kyle Wright was selected fifth overall by the Atlanta Braves, South Carolina's Clarke Schmidt was taken 16th by the New York Yankees, Kentucky's Evan White was chosen by the Seattle Mariners with the 17th overall pick, and Florida's Alex Faedo was taken 18th by the Detroit Tigers. The SEC's eight first round picks represented seven different schools. The SEC has now had a first-round MLB selection each year since 1991 and 117 total in the first round during that time.

The SEC and its member schools own virtually all regular season, conference tournament, NCAA Regional and Super Regional attendance records. The 2017 season marks the 14th year in a row the SEC has topped the one million mark in attendance, leading the nation once again in that category by a wide margin. The first weekend of the 2017 season drew more than 220,00 fans to SEC ballparks with eight crowds of more than 10,000.

» 2017 SEC Baseball Legends

The SEC Baseball Legends Presented by AT&T, featuring former standouts from Southeastern Conference member institutions, will once again be honored at the 2017 SEC Baseball Tournament May 23-28 at the Hoover Met in Hoover, Ala.

The 2017 class features LSU's Ben McDonald, Ole Miss' Don Kessinger, Missouri's Dave Silvestri and South Carolina's Earl Bass. Four legends are recognized each year.

"The Southeastern Conference has a rich tradition in the sport of baseball," SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey said. "Through our legends program, we are pleased to honor the individuals who have helped establish a foundation for the current and future success of our programs and the opportunities available to our student-athletes today."

This marks the sixth consecutive year that the SEC has recognized a class of baseball legends. The 2016 class featured Norm DeBriyn, Arkansas; Gabe Gross, Auburn; Cris Carpenter, Georgia and Scott Downs, Kentucky, while the 2015 class featured Andy Phillips, Alabama; David Eckstein, Florida; Mark Johnson, Texas A&M and Larry Schmittou, Vanderbilt, and the 2014 class featured Phil Garner, Tennessee; Jake Gibbs, Ole Miss; Jay Powell, Mississippi State and Bobby Richardson, South Carolina.

The 2013 class honored Hal Baird, Auburn; Terry Shumpert, Kentucky; Skip Bertman, LSU; and Gene McArtor, Missouri, and the inaugural class in 2012 included: Dr. Jeffrey Laubenthal, Alabama; Kevin McReynolds, Arkansas; Brad Wilkerson, Florida and Rev. Reggie Andrews, Georgia.

"These SEC Baseball Legends are among the best to play the college game," said Jamie Kerr, Director, AT&T Corporate Sponsorships. "We're proud to help honor them for their successes on the field and beyond."

Each legend will be recognized individually throughout the two quarterfinal matchups on Friday and will have on-field recognition and an awards presentation by Commissioner Sankey on Saturday, May 27 during the semifinals of the SEC Tournament. Fans will have an opportunity for autographs and photos with the honorees at the AT&T Legends Pavilion immediately following. Several legends will also participate in the annual SEC Youth Clinic on Friday morning.

2017 SEC Baseball Legends

Ben McDonald, LSU

Ben McDonald, a native of Denham Springs, La., capped a magnificent 1989 season by receiving the Golden Spikes Award, given by the United States Baseball Federation to the nation's most outstanding amateur player. McDonald, who was also named National Player of the Year by Baseball America, The Sporting News and Collegiate Baseball, was the first player chosen in the free-agent amateur draft and made his major league debut with the Baltimore Orioles in September, 1989. McDonald, who set an LSU career mark with 373 strikeouts, established Southeastern Conference standards for single-season strikeouts (202), innings pitched (152.1) and consecutive scoreless innings (44.2). A two-time All-American and a 1988 Olympic gold medalist, he finished his LSU career with a 29-14 record and a 3.24 ERA. He was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. McDonald, who enjoyed an excellent 10-year major league career with the Orioles and Milwaukee Brewers, also lettered as an LSU basketball player. He was a member of the 1986-87 Tiger hoops squad which advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. McDonald currently serves as a baseball analyst for the SEC Network.

Don Kessinger, Ole Miss

Don Kessinger was a two-sport All-American at Ole Miss before becoming a six-time All-Star in Major League Baseball. Kessinger excelled in both basketball and baseball for the Rebels from 1962-64, earning All-SEC and All-America honors in both sports. Kessinger's .400 career batting average still remains No. 1 in the Ole Miss record book, an effort which is also sixth on the SEC career chart. His best year at the plate came in 1964 when he led the SEC by hitting .436, a performance which remains as the best single season effort in Rebel baseball history. His nine career triples and 44 career steals place him 10th on each Ole Miss all-time list. Following a successful collegiate career, Kessinger moved on to Major League Baseball where he put together an impressive 16-year career. He started with the Chicago Cubs in 1964 and played at Wrigley Field until 1975. During that time as the Cubs' starting shortstop, Kessinger played in six All-Star Games, earned two Gold Glove Awards and set a then-Major League record for consecutive errorless games at shortstop with 54 in 1969. In his last season in MLB, 1979, Kessinger served as a player-manager for the White Sox. In 1991, he returned to his alma mater to become coach of the Ole Miss baseball team, taking over for legendary Rebel Jake Gibbs. Kessinger won 185 games over six seasons and even had the opportunity to coach his sons Kevin.

Dave Silvestri, Missouri

Dave Silvestri is one of the greatest shortstops ever to play for the Missouri Tigers during his career from 1986-88. A native of St. Louis (Parkway Central), Silvestri was a first-team all-American in 1987 and '88, and was a member of the U.S. Olympic team that won the gold medal at the Seoul Summer Games in 1988. He was also all-Big Eight and all-District V in 1987-88, and was named to the Big Eight all-Tournament team in 1988. Silvestri appears in the top-10 of 29 all-time statistical categories at MU, and his career batting average of .379 is fourth in school history. He still holds 10 game, season or career records for the Tigers. Drafted by the Houston Astros, he's played at the major league level with the New York Yankees, Montreal Expos and the Texas Rangers. His first National League hit was a run-scoring pinch-hit single against his hometown St. Louis Cardinals, at Busch Stadium, in 1995. He was inducted into the Mizzou Athletics Hall of Fame in 1997.

Earl Bass, South Carolina

Earl Bass was an outstanding pitcher for the Gamecocks and compiled a win-loss record of 34-3, despite missing most of the 1973 season with an arm injury. A first-team All-America selection in 1974 and 1975, Bass had a 12-1 mark in 1974 and was 17-1 in 1975. He set a then national record by winning 23 consecutive games over two seasons, a feat that still ranks second. Bass holds school records for shutouts (10), earned run average (1.34), and strikeouts (392). He was runner-up in balloting for the Lefty Gomez Plate, symbolic of the top amateur baseball player in the United States, in 1975 when he pitched the Gamecocks to within one game of the NCAA championship at the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

» Team Notes

Alabama

Brad Bohannon was formally introduced as head baseball coach at The University of Alabama by Director of Athletics Greg Byrne at a press conference on June 5. Bohannon, the 2015 American Baseball Coaches Association and Baseball America National Assistant Coach of the Year, brings 14 years of Southeastern Conference coaching experience to Alabama after having served as an assistant at Kentucky from 2004-15 and, most recently, Auburn from 2016-17. Regarded as one of the best recruiters in the nation, he was responsible for signing 13 Wildcat student-athletes that went on to play professional baseball, including 2014 Golden Spikes Award winner A.J. Reed, while his first recruiting class at Auburn was ranked No. 9 by Collegiate Baseball and includes six current starting position players.

Arkansas

The 11th-ranked Razorback baseball team saw its amazing turnaround season come to a close, falling 3-2 to Missouri State in the NCAA Fayetteville Regional championship game at Baum Stadium. Coming off a 26-29 season in 2016 and missing the postseason for the first time in 15 years, the Hogs not only got back to the postseason, but posted 45 wins, its seventh 40-win season in the last 10 years, and hosted an NCAA Regional for the sixth time in its history, first since 2010.

Auburn

Auburn's baseball season came to an end in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional final as host Florida State defeated the Tigers 6-0. The Tigers (37-26) made their farthest advance in a postseason since the 2010 season, earning their 20th all-time regional bid and playing in a winner-take-all game on the final day of the regional. The Tigers finished the season hitting .274 as a team. Jonah Todd led the offense on the year with a .374 average. Auburn hit .260 in the regional, led by Jay Estes at .455. On the mound, the Tigers had a season ERA of 4.36, led by Casey Mize's 2.06.

Florida

Florida (47-18) shut out the potent Wake Forest (43-20) as three pitchers combined to limit the Demon Deacons to just four hits in UF's 3-0 win on Monday night. With the win, the Gators advance to the College World Series for the third year in a row and sixth time in the past eight seasons. This will be UF's 11th trip to the CWS in school history with the past six coming under head coach Kevin O'Sullivan. TCU, Florida's next opponent (Sunday, 7 p.m. ET), has made five CWS appearances since 2010. No other team in the nation has made more than three trips to Omaha in that span.

Georgia

Bolstered by an impressive finish against some of the league's top teams, Georgia went 8-3 over the final 11 games of the regular season to qualify for the SEC Tournament. The Bulldogs claimed a road series over then No. 4 and Eastern Division leading Kentucky, captured a series over No. 6 Miss. State and then won a road series over No. 30 South Carolina. Overall, Georgia concluded the 2017 season with a 25-32 overall mark (11-19 in the SEC). Going in as the 12th seed, the Bulldogs faced 13th-ranked MSU and saw their season end after a 3-0 defeat. Also for the first time since 1984, Georgia swept the season series over rival Georgia Tech. The Bulldogs won the on-campus meetings, posting a 5-1 win in Athens and a 7-5 victory in Atlanta. Then, they posted an 8-7 win at SunTrust Park in the 15th annual Spring Baseball Classic For Kids that benefits Children's Healthcare of Atlanta (CHOA). The game at the Atlanta Braves new home drew 23,737 fans, which was among the largest to see a regular season college baseball game in 2017. Georgia actually played the first game open to the public at SunTrust Park to benefit CHOA when it faced Missouri on April 8. The crowd of 33,025 at SunTrust was the second biggest in college baseball history. The Bulldogs started as many as six freshmen in 2017 and 10 newcomers saw action on the mound. Georgia should return eight starting position players and several key components of the pitching staff. Georgia batted .257, hit 40 home runs, posted a 5.02 ERA and a .962 fielding percentage. At the end of the season, the team batting average ranked 13th in the SEC while the ERA and fielding percentage ranked 14th. Shortstop Cam Shepherd was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball. Shepherd was named to the Freshmen All-

SEC team. He started all 57 games at shortstop and led the team with 74 hits including 16 doubles while batting .307-5-28. He posted a .953 fielding percentage in 277 total chances. Junior outfielder Keegan McGovern earned a spot on the SEC Community Service Team for his outstanding efforts off the field. On the field, he batted .291-2-21, seeing action in 56 games with 54 starts.

Kentucky

Kentucky's historic 2017 season came to a close with a 6-2 loss to Louisville at Jim Patterson Stadium, ending a run that saw the program reach the Super Regional round for the first time and post the fourth-most wins in school history under first-year head coach Nick Mingione. The Wildcats finished 43-23 despite beginning the season 2-5, playing for the regular season Southeastern Conference championship on the final day of play, reaching the top five of the national rankings and winning three elimination games in two days in the Lexington Regional, just the second time the program has hosted postseason play. Having not reached the postseason since 2014, UK put itself within two victories of making the College World Series with a mix of strong pitching and one of the nation's top offensive clubs. The Cats won 19 SEC games – the second most in school history – won 17 games against ranked teams and played a schedule that ranked among the nation's top 10 most difficult.

LSU

For the 18th time in program history, the LSU Baseball team is Back Home in Omaha. LSU (48-17) scored six runs in the fifth inning to break open a close game and complete a two-game NCAA Super Regional sweep of Mississippi State, 12-4, early Monday morning at Alex Box Stadium, Skip Bertman Field. The Tigers will take a 16-game winning streak to the 2017 College World Series. No. 4 national seed LSU will face Florida State (45-21) in its CWS opener on either Saturday or Sunday in Omaha's TD Ameritrade Park. Game dates and times are expected to be announced Monday. The winner of the Tigers and Seminoles will face either No. 1 Oregon State or Cal State Fullerton.

Ole Miss

After waiting over three hours to start its SEC Tournament game, the Ole Miss baseball team jumped out to an early 2-0 lead. However, the top two starting pitchers in its rotation helped Auburn eliminate the Rebels (32-25) from the conference tourney with a 5-4 win Tuesday night. Auburn (35-22) used its best starting pitchers to sneak by Ole Miss. The Rebels scored two runs on four hits in 3.0 innings off Keegan Thompson before plating two more off Casey Mize (7-2). Will Golsan paced the Ole Miss bats by recording a pair of hits and runs in the setback. Starting at shortstop, fellow junior Kyle Watson added an RBI single. In an effort to spark the Rebels in the ninth, Ryan Olenek hit his third home run of the season. Making his first start since March 18 versus Vanderbilt, redshirt-sophomore Brady Feigl allowed three runs on five hits over 3.2 innings. Two runs were issued to Feigl after he left the game. Since he made the move to the bullpen during the middle of the season, tonight was Feigl's longest outing since pitching 4.1 frames against Mississippi State (March 31). Jonah Todd, Conor Davis and Blake Logan tallied two hits apiece to lead the Tigers. Todd's two-RBI triple and Logan's solo home run gave Auburn its two leads throughout the night. The Rebels struck first thanks to a pair of hits in the opening frame. Golsan ripped a single up the middle before scoring on a double to left field by Nick Fortes. One inning later, Ole Miss used another two-hit combination to double its lead. Cooper Johnson doubled off the 405-foot mark in dead center field. The catcher did not remain on second for long as Watson's single brought him home.

Mississippi State

For the Mississippi State baseball team, the clock finally struck midnight early Monday morning. Playing in the seventh super regional in program history, the MSU season ended with a 14-4 loss to No. 4 national seed LSU in second game of the Baton Rouge Super Regional played at Alex Box Stadium. LSU (48-17) won its 16th straight game to advance to the College World Series. MSU (40-27) capped a memorable season, which included 25 come-from-behind wins, 19 wins against Southeastern Conference opposition and a Hattiesburg Regional championship. First-year MSU coach Andy Cannizaro became just the second Bulldog skipper to win 40 or more games in his first season. After suffering a heart-breaking 4-3 defeat in the super regional opener, MSU again showed its mettle by erasing a 3-0 deficit to take a brief 4-3 lead before



being undone by six runs in the LSU fifth inning.

Missouri

South Carolina hit four homers as it eliminated Mizzou Baseball from the SEC Tournament with a 10-2 win at Hoover Met Stadium. With Mizzou trailing 3-0 in the fourth inning, junior Alex Samples (Bridgeport, Texas) just missed a game-tying homer off the top of the wall for an RBI double. South Carolina's Carlos Cortes then hit a three-run homer in the top of the fifth inning to sink the Tigers. Mizzou sits at 36-23 on the year, winning its most games since 2008, and will now await its NCAA Tournament fate. The selection show is Monday (May 29) at 11 a.m. Mizzou junior RHP Cole Bartlett (Williamsburg, Ind.) took the loss, pitching on short rest. He allowed six runs (five earned) on eight hits with four strikeouts and two walks. He surrendered three homers, including the Cortes shot that put the game away. South Carolina's Will Crowe earned the win, improving to 6-5 on the year. Cortes was the story for the Gamecocks, hitting a pair of three-run homers in the game. After Mizzou failed to take advantage of a two-base error in the bottom of the first, Carolina drew first blood, getting a solo shot from DH Alex Destino on a 3-2 pitch that went over the home bullpen in right field. It was Destino's 10th homer of the year. The Tigers then botched a double-play ball with one out, putting runners on second and third after the error. That led to an RBI infield single to give the Gamecocks a 2-0 lead early. After Crowe retired the first two batters in the third inning, Mizzou mounted a rally that was sparked by a Connor Brumfield (Columbia, Mo.) walk. Trey Harris (Powder Springs, Ga.) singled and Robbie Glendinning (Scarborough, Australia) walked to load the bases for Brett Bond (St. Louis, Mo.). Crowe got Bond to go 0-2 and then struck him out two pitches later to strand the bases loaded. South Carolina carried the momentum from escaping that jam into the fourth inning as Jonah Bride hit a one-out solo homer to give the Gamecocks a 3-0 lead. Mizzou got on the board and nearly tied the game in the bottom of the fourth as Samples hit a 1-2 pitch off the top of the wall in left field, missing a game-tying three-run homer by inches. It turned out to be an RBI double as Kameron Misner (Poplar Bluff, Mo.) scored from third on the play. Brumfield then struck out to strand a pair as Mizzou left six men on base through six. Cortes then delivered the big blow, a three-run homer to right field, putting the Gamecocks on top, 6-1. That turned out to be the decisive homer as South Carolina hung four more runs in the sixth as it advanced to the next round to face either Kentucky or LSU in an elimination game. Junior Nelson Mompierre (Miami, Fla.) hit a ninth-inning pinch-hit homer for the second consecutive game.

South Carolina

South Carolina finished the season 35-25 with a 13-17 record in the SEC. Carolina advanced to the semifinals of the 2017 SEC Tournament, the school's first appearance in the semifinals since the 2007 season. South Carolina went 26-11 on the year when scoring first in a game and 27-6 when entering the seventh inning with a lead and 33-3 when entering the ninth inning with the lead. The Gamecocks were 20-3 when scoring six or more runs and 33-12 when allowing five runs or less. South Carolina finished 19-19 in games decided by three runs or less. South Carolina was 12-5 in five-plus run games. The South Carolina pitching staff had a 3.72 team ERA with 257 runs allowed, 223 earned, on 470 hits in 540.0 innings pitched. The Gamecocks struck out 563 batters to 219 walks. Opponents hit .233 against the Gamecocks. South Carolina's 3.85 ERA in SEC games was third in the conference as well. The Gamecocks had 225 strikeouts in 243.0 innings during conference play. South Carolina hit .260 (524-for-2019) for the season with a .343 on-base percentage and a .401 slugging percentage. The Gamecocks hit 58 homers on the year, the most in school history since the BBCOR era began in 2011. South Carolina has equaled or out-hit its opponent in 40 of 60 games this year. South Carolina fielded .974 for the season with 26 games without an error. South Carolina was 18-8 when not committing an error. Freshman outfielder Carlos Cortes broke out during the midway point of the season and was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. Cortes finished his first season in the Garnet & Black with a .286 average (48-for-168) 27 runs scored, nine doubles, a triple, a team-high 12 homers and tied for a team-high in RBIs with 41 for the season. Seven of his 12 homers came in SEC play with three of the 12 in the 2017 SEC Tournament as he also earned SEC All-Tournament Team accolades. Cortes was South Carolina's top hitter in conference play with a .327 average (32-for-98) in SEC contests with seven homers and 23 RBIs. In SEC play, he was seventh in the league with a .622 slugging percentage, ranked

tied for ninth in homers and 13th in RBIs. Junior right-hander Will Crowe finished the 2017 season 6-5 with a 3.41 ERA in 15 starts. Crowe struck out 90 and walked 31 in a team-high 92.1 innings pitched. Opponents hit .247 against him. Crowe was named to the 2017 SEC Baseball Community Service Team. This past year, Crowe participated in an event with Special Olympics at Founders Park that included baserunning, throwing, hitting, autographs and a tour of the facility with the athletes. Crowe visited with kids of Epworth Children's Home and also participated in a baseball game with the City of Columbia Youth Program. In addition, Crowe attended Arden Elementary School and participated in "Reading Is Fun Day," activities. Crowe also assisted in coach a little league team with the Lexington County Youth Baseball league. Sophomore outfielder Jacob Olson was South Carolina's leading hitter with a .294 average (65-for-221) with 37 runs scored, 10 doubles, a triple, six homers and 27 RBIs. Olson owned a team-high 20 multi-hit games and Carolina's longest reached base streak for the season when at one point he reached base 25 consecutive games. Sophomore right-hander Adam Hill gave South Carolina quality starts throughout the 2017 season. For the season, Hill was 3-6 with a 3.04 ERA in 14 starts. He struck out 87 batters to 39 walks in 77.0 innings pitched with opponents batting .205 against him. Sophomore infielder LT Tolbert finished third on the team in hitting with a .284 average (58-for-204) with 24 runs scored, six doubles, a triple, three homers and 32 RBIs. Tolbert had 18 multi-hit games on the year and was third on the team with nine multi-RBI games. Tolbert was also South Carolina's second-best hitter in conference play with a .287 average (31-for-108) in league play with 12 runs scored and 19 RBIs in league contests. South Carolina has had a tough slew of injuries. South Carolina junior right-hander Clarke Schmidt was lost for the season after undergoing surgery after the Florida series to repair torn ulnar collateral ligament to his right elbow. Freshman right-hander Sawyer Bridges had a torn rotator cuff and missed the last month. On May 16 it was announced that sophomore catcher Chris Cullen would miss the remainder of the year after undergoing surgery on his left knee to remove torn cartilage. In addition, junior infielder Madison Stokes was out in six to eight weeks after breaking his right wrist on a hit by a pitch on May 13 at Missouri. Senior right-hander Colie Bowers was 5-1 on the year with four saves and a 1.74 ERA in 25 relief appearances. He had 48 strikeouts in 41.1 innings with opponents batting .137 against him. Junior infielder Jonah Bride was the only Gamecock to start all 60 games. All 60 starts came at third base. Bride was fourth on the team in hitting with a .282 average (61-for-216) with 33 runs scored, 12 doubles, a pair of triples and five homers. He also had 32 RBIs and a team-best .371 on-base percentage. Bride, along with Cortes, was named to the 2017 SEC All-Tournament Team. Bride homered twice and scored a pair of runs to go along with three RBIs in the tournament. Bride homered in the 7-4 win vs. Vanderbilt and added a solo homer as well in the 10-2 victory vs. Missouri. Junior outfielder/designated hitter Alex Destino tied for the team lead with 41 RBIs on the year. Destino hit 10 homers and batted .255 (52-for-204) with 31 runs scored and eight doubles as well. Destino set a school record with five walks and also scored a pair of runs in 10-7 win vs. Liberty. Sophomore outfielder TJ Hopkins was fifth on the team in hitting with a .258 average (49-for-190) with 37 runs scored, 11 doubles, two triples, five homers and 20 RBIs. Hopkins won the Tom Price Award as MVP for the Gamecocks in the Clemson series. His top game of the series was game three when he went 3-for-5 with his second triple of the season and a pair of runs scored. He also had a key diving catch to record the final out in a 2-0 win at Clemson. Junior infielder Justin Row gave the Gamecocks a boost late after Justin Row went down with an injury. Playing both second base and shortstop, Row hit .290 (20-for-69) with 17 runs scored, four doubles, a triple, two homers and nine RBIs. He was the team's top hitter at the SEC Tournament as he hit .368 (7-for-19) with five runs scored, a double, a homer and a pair of RBI. Senior left-hander Josh Reagan led South Carolina in appearances with 27 on the year. He was 6-2 with a 2.72 ERA and a pair of saves. Reagan allowed 21 runs, 17 earned, on 49 hits in 56.1 innings with 19 walks to 51 strikeouts and opponents batting .238 against him. Reagan is now ninth in all-time appearances at Carolina with 85 in his career. Reagan won a team-high four games in SEC play. Senior right-hander Reed Scott is now fourth on the all-time list for career appearances at South Carolina. Scott finishes his career with 89 appearances only behind Tyler Webb, Matt Price and Michael Roth. Scott finished his senior year 1-2 with a 3.91 ERA in 24 appearances with three saves. He started three games as well. Scott struck out 43 in 53.0 innings with opponents batting .240 against him. Junior right-hander Tyler Johnson was 1-2 with a 2.39 ERA and 10 saves

in 26.1 innings pitched with 40 strikeouts. He now owns 19 career saves, tied for eighth all-time in school history.

Tennessee

The Tennessee Volunteers went 1-3 on the final week of the regular season, finishing their 2017 season with a 27-25 overall record, including a 7-21 mark in Southeastern Conference play, after dropping three games to the Missouri Tigers in Knoxville... With a loss to Mizzou on Thursday and Georgia's win over South Carolina, the Vols were eliminated from SEC Tournament contention for the first time since 2013... Saturday marked Head Coach Dave Serrano's final game on Rocky Top, as he announced on Wednesday his plans to resign following the conclusion of the 2017 season... Serrano completed his Tennessee head coaching stint with a 157-163 overall record from 2012-17... The Vols' finish 2017 with a .258 team batting average, ranking 13th in the league...

The Vols combined for 123 extra-base hits this year, including 33 home runs (surpassing 2016's complete season total 21)... As a team, UT ranks 10th in on-base percentage (.352), tied for third in triples (13), eighth in walks (212), fourth in hit-by-pitch (54) and seventh in stolen bases (55)... Tennessee's staff combined for a 3.98 ERA (10th in the SEC) and allowed 168 walks, the third-fewest among SEC teams... UT picked off seven baserunners from the mound, tied for seventh-best in the league... UT's 36 home runs allowed were the sixth-fewest among SEC staffs... The Vols' .973 overall fielding percentage also ranks ninth in the league... Pete Derkay ranks eighth in the SEC with 37 walks and 10th with a .440 OBP... Jeff Moberg finished his UT career ranking tied for seventh with three triples this year and tied for 10th with 10 HBP...

Senior Hunter Martin (5-7, 3.59 ERA) finished the season ranking second in the SEC with 92.2 innings pitched, following his fourth complete game of the year on Thursday vs. Mizzou... He ranks tied for eighth in strikeouts (89) and second in the SEC with 33 batters struck out looking... Martin is the first UT pitcher to record multiple complete games (4) in a single season since Zack Godley did so in 2013 (6)... His 16 walks allowed tied for the eighth-fewest in SEC... Jon Lipinski (6-1, 2.10 ERA) finished 17 games in 2017, fifth-most among SEC pitchers... Will Neely (3-1, 3.43 ERA) held opponents to a .213 average, the 13th-best mark in the SEC... He allowed just 45 hits and 25 runs, sixth-fewest among league pitchers in those categories, while his 13 walks are tied for the second-fewest in the SEC... Zach Linginfelter held opponents to 48 total hits, tied for seventh-fewest among league pitchers... He allowed just 23 earned runs (T-10th in SEC) while his three home runs allowed are tied for ninth-fewest among SEC pitchers... Jordan Rodgers leads the Volunteers with 18 multi-hit games and 35 RBI this season... Rodgers and Jeff Moberg shared the team in home runs, each with nine on the year as part of UT's 33 total homers... Pete Derkay led the Vols with 37 walks and a .440 OBP... Justin Ammons and Andre Lipcius co-own the team lead each with 11 doubles on the year... Freshman Andre Lipcius was the lone Tennessee player to start each of the Vols' 52 games this year, serving as UT's primary first baseman... LAST WEEK: A sacrifice fly from third baseman Brandon Chineia in the 11th inning lifted Tennessee past Morehead State, 4-3, as the Vols held off the Eagles to claim the Tuesday-night win... With the victory, the Volunteers improved to a 20-4 mark in non-conference play and a 6-1 record in extra-inning games this year... On the mound, Will Neely got the nod for UT, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings and striking out a career-high six batters in the no-decision... Jon Lipinski fired five strikeouts through 3.2 scoreless innings to pick up his sixth win of the season... The Vols' pitching staff threw 17 strikeouts on Tuesday, marking a season-high count for UT... Tennessee scattered four hits against Missouri on Thursday night, but struggled to find a rhythm as the Tigers held on to a 5-0 lead to take Game One of the final regular-season series at Lindsey Nelson Stadium... Right-handed pitcher Hunter Martin retired 12 straight batters to start the game, not allowing a run until the fifth inning... He allowed five runs on five hits and struck out nine batters, tying a career-high, in his fourth complete game of the season for the loss... Martin entered Thursday's matchup tied for second in the SEC with 31 batters struck out looking as well as fifth with 83.2 innings pitched on the year... With his complete game effort in the series opener, Martin posted his fourth complete game of the year... He is the first UT pitcher to record multiple complete games in a single season since Zack Godley did so in 2013 (6)... Tennessee was held without a hit over the final eight innings on Friday night as it fell to Missouri, 2-0... Friday's game lasted just 1:57, marking the shortest game of the season for the Vols... Garrett Stallings took the loss despite a solid outing on the hill... The freshman struck out a season-best five batters and walked just one in 7.2 innings – also

a season-high... After Tennessee led off the game with a two-run first inning, Missouri responded with eight unanswered runs to fend off the Volunteers, 8-2, in Saturday's 2017 season finale... Prior to the game, the Volunteers recognized student assistant coach and recent Tennessee graduate Steven Gruver as well as eight seniors as Max Bartlett, Eric Freeman, Jon Lipinski, Hunter Martin, Jordan Rodgers, Quint Robinson, Reggie Southall and Matt Waldren each dressed out in the Orange and White for their final game as a Volunteer on Saturday... With the loss, the Vols finish the regular season with a 27-25 (7-21 SEC) record while Mizzou now stands at 35-21 (14-16 SEC)... Senior Jon Lipinski made his first career start for UT on Saturday... He tossed a career-long 5.0 innings in the outing... In relief, redshirt junior Quint Robinson finished his career on Rocky Top having not allowed a run... Jeff Moberg, also playing his final game on Rocky Top, blasted his ninth homer of the season over the left field wall to put the Vols up in the first inning, 1-0... MORE FROM 2017: The Vols' 2017 roster boasted 17 newcomers including 14 true freshmen, two JUCO transfers and one graduate transfer... Announced in May, Tennessee Baseball recorded its highest-ever multi-year APR score with a 979... That stands as a 14-point improvement from the previous year and a 45-point improvement from three years ago, when it was at 934... Knoxville native Eric Freeman earned his fourth-consecutive SEC Baseball Community Service Team nod on the heels of his Brad Davis SEC Community Service Leader of the Year Award nomination... Freeman was also named 2016-17 CoSIDA Academic All-District in May.

Texas A&M

The Texas A&M Aggies made a late charge Saturday evening on Olsen Field at Blue Bell Park to dispatch of the Davidson Wildcats, 12-6, and earn their sixth College World Series appearance. Trailing 6-2 going into the top of the eighth, things looked bleak for the Aggies. Nick Choruby gave the Aggies some life with a leadoff single to centerfield and with one out, Braden Shewmake reached on a fielding error by shortstop Max Bazin. Hunter Coleman roped a double to left-center knocking in Choruby and driving Davidson starter Evan Roberts from the contest. Reliever Austin Leonard plunked Cole Bedford with a pitch to fill the bags with Ags and Blake Kopetsky slapped a single up the middle to knock in two runs and cut the Wildcats' lead to 6-5. After Walker Pennington swung and missed at strike three for the second out of the inning, George Janca was issued a seven-pitch walk to reload the bases. The Aggies sent pinch-hitter Jorge Gutierrez to the mound and Davidson responded with a pitching change, bringing in Barry Allen. Allen got Gutierrez to pop up behind the mound, but second baseman Alex Acosta was unable to hang on to the ball after being leveled by third baseman Eric Jones. Texas A&M scored two runs on the miscue to take a 7-6 lead and in his second at-bat in the frame, Choruby bounced a two-run single up the middle to inflate the cushion to three runs. Pennington put the dagger in with a three-run home run to leftfield in the top of the ninth.

Vanderbilt

A big two-out rally in the third inning was too much for Vanderbilt to overcome on the road at top-ranked Oregon State in a season-ending 9-2 loss at Goss Stadium. With the Commodores (36-25-1) as the home team Kyle Wright had breezed through the first two innings before giving up a leadoff single to Adley Rutschman to open the third. Wright bounced back to get the next two Beavers (54-4) but the lineup turned over to leadoff hitter Steven Kwan, who smashed a single to center field to score the game's first run. Nick Madrigal kept the inning alive with a single to put two runners aboard for KJ Harrison and just like Friday night the junior delivered with a big three-run homer out to left field for a 4-0 Oregon State lead. The Commodores wrap up Tim Corbin's 15th year as head coach with their seventh trip to NCAA Super Regionals after the program's fourth NCAA Regional title in five seasons.
