Dear Joe;

We arrived in Buffalo yesterday morning about 12 o'clock we are stopping at the Stafford House we were beat by the Buffalo team 5 to 3 I was playing short I made 4 putouts & one assist I had 1 hit and one error. I was down to see the Niagara falls this morning its is the greatest sight you ever saw in your life it is only about an hour ride from where we are it cost me about three dollars to see it all we were on the Canadian side and ^{all} over we were taken all over in the Maid of The Mist it cost 1\$ to go on that. The Manager wanted me to sign for \$110 this morning but I would not do it. Mike L'ham told me not to sign for any less than \$150 but I will sign if he gives me \$125

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I got a letter from Tee Kay saying I could go back with him any time I wanted to he feel awful bad about it he offered me \$10 more to go back I was thinking whether I would or not. this manager is a striker we got to be in at 11 O'clock every night Mike Lehan Mike Slattery Billy Hale and myself was out looking at the sights the other night until about 12 O'clock you ought to have seen the look he gave us when we came in. we go to Rochester tonight there in another fall there called the Genesee Irish you or Tom was with me you ^{would} see something that would surprise you. Dont mention what Tee Kay said to any one. I hope Mom & Pop dont worry about me your as ever
