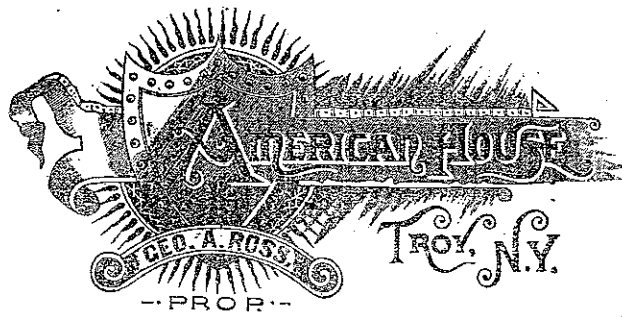

Dear Joe;

We arrived in Buffalo yesterday morning about 12 o'clock we are stopping at the Stafford House we were beat by the Buffalo team 5 to 3 I was playing short I made 4 putouts & one assist I had 1 hit and one error.
