2 A. Yes, ma'am.

3 Q. Okay. And the fact that you had sexual intercourse, however
4 brief, with a woman to whom you were not married in July of
5 2003, that would be publicly embarrassing for you if that
6 information got out, wouldn't it?

7 A. Beyond anyone's dreams.

8 Q. All right. And it has been embarrassing for you, hasn't it?

9 A. Well, yes, it has been extremely embarrassing, but the most
10 difficult thing was telling my wife and family more so than the
11 embarrassment here today or yesterday.

12 In telling my wife, who didn't deserve this and who's been
13 through enough pain in her life -- she did not deserve this, nor
14 did my family. And the biggest disappointment of it all for me
15 in all the pain, and humiliation, and the fact that I let them
16 down greatly, is the fact that I had to suggest to my son -- my
17 son, who was my assistant basketball coach. And I think the
18 best two years I've had probably in 35 years of coaching, or
19 whatever number I've been coaching pro or college, is the two
20 years I've worked with him. That was the best. Every day to
21 wake up with your son at a 6:45 meeting and go to practice with
22 your son and -- it was a dream come true. And when I had to
23 suggest to him to move on to another job, because I didn't want
24 him to go through the humiliation and embarrassment, was very
25 difficult.
