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Case Narrative Ofc. Morris

Narrative: On 3/16/14 at approximately 11:41PM while on routine patrol for the Carmel Police department, I was traveling west bound on W. Main Street west of Ditch road. I observed a vehicle (Silver Toyota Highlander bearing IN registration 452APF) traveling east bound that appeared to be traveling at approximately 10mph in a 35mph zone. As I passed the vehicle I continued to observe it in my side view mirror. I observed the vehicle come to a complete stop on W. Main Street for no apparent reason. I turned my squad car around and began to drive to the vehicle's location. As I was approaching the vehicle it began to slowly move east bound and came to another complete stop in the lane of travel for no apparent reason. The vehicle then began moving again and I observed the driver make a right hand turn on to Horseferry Road without using a turn signal.

I initiated a traffic stop and approached the driver's side window. As I began to speak with the driver, James Steven Irsay (06-13-1959, SSN: _____) I asked him if he knew why I had pulled him over. Irsay advised that he was trying to

find his house and gets confused with what road it is located on. I advised Irsay that I had pulled him over for failing to use a turn signal when he was turning right onto Horseferry Road. I asked Irsay if he had his driver's license with him. He then began to open a brief case which was located on the passenger seat. As Irsay searched through the brief case for his driver's license I observed a prescription bottle in the briefcase next to his wallet. I then observed an Indiana driver's license inside the wallet that Irsay currently had his hand on. I advised Irsay that I saw his driver's license in the wallet that his right hand was on. Irsay still continued to search through the brief case and eventually removed his wallet and driver's license.

As I was speaking with Irsay his speech was very slow and slurred and Irsay appeared to be disoriented. I also observed that his eyes were red and watery. He also displayed poor manual dexterity. Irsay advised that the vehicle was his but that it was not registered in his name. I advised that I could continue the process without his registration and I returned to my patrol car. I requested a second unit come to my location to assist with field sobriety as Irsay demonstrated behavior of being intoxicated. I also contact Sergeant C. Dunlap (Carmel PD) come to the scene in a supervisory capacity due to Irsay's public profile. Officer R. Thomas (Carmel PD) arrived to assist and I went back to speak to Irsay. Sergeant Dunlap arrived at this time.

I asked Irsay if he had anything to drink tonight and he advised that he had not. I asked him if he had taken any prescription medication and he advised several medications that he had taken during the day. I began pre exit testing and asked Irsay if he was familiar with the English alphabet. Irsay advised that he was at which point I asked him to recite the alphabet starting at the letter C and ending with the letter N. Irsay began at the letter C and stopped at the letter M. Irsay then started over at the letter C and continued though the entire alphabet until the letter Z. After reciting the letter Z, Irsay recited the letters I, N, and G. I then asked Irsay if he was able to count. Irsay advised that he was at which point I asked him to count backwards starting at the number 103 and ending with the number 78. Irsay began at the number 103 and counted backwards to the number 49. I had to interrupt Irsay once he reached the number 49 and I advised him that he could stop counting.

I asked Irsay to exit the vehicle and he did. We walked to the back of his vehicle at which point I began to explain the instructions for the horizontal gaze nystagmus test. During the instruction phase, Irsay was not able to stand with his feet together. Irsay continuously fell off balance to the point that Officer Thomas had to remain very close to Irsay to ensure he did not fall. I asked Irsay if he had any medical conditions at which point he advised that he had received _____ in the recent past, as well as _____ over a year ago. While Irsay struggled to stand still with his feet together I

asked him if he could see the tip of my pen. Irsay advised that he could and I asked him to reach out and touch the tip of my pen with his finger. Irsay began reach out to touch my pen and continued to fall backwards and off balance. Irsay eventually touched my pen but on the bottom 1/3 of the pen. After several unsuccessful attempts to have Irsay stand still with his feet together, I asked Irsay to sit on the hood of my squad car.

Once Irsay was sitting on the hood of my squad car I asked him if he could still see the tip of my pen. Irsay advised that he could at which time I repeated the instructions for the horizontal gaze nystagmus test. Irsay advised that he understood and I began the test. Irsay demonstrated equal tracking and equal pupil size in both eyes. As I continued through the test I had to remind Irsay several times to follow the tip of my pen with his eyes only and to stop moving his head. Irsay demonstrated the lack of smooth pursuit as well as distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes. Irsay also demonstrated the onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees.

I then asked Irsay to walk back towards the rear of his vehicle. Once there, I asked Irsay to stand with his right foot in front of his left with his right heel touching the front of his left foot. Irsay was unable to stand in this position and continuously fell to the side and backwards. Officer Thomas and I continuously had to support Irsay in order to prevent



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him from falling over. Concerned for Irsay's safety I determined that he was not able to complete the 9 step walk and turn, as he could barely stand up without Officer Thomas and I supporting him.

I then asked Irsay if he felt he would be able to stand on one foot for a short period of time. Irsay then advised that he could and immediately lifted his right foot off the ground and bent it backwards at a 45 degree angle. I asked Irsay to put his foot back down while I explained the instructions for the one leg stand test. I then asked Irsay to stand with his feet together and his arms down to his side. As I was explaining the test Irsay continued to fall off balance and could not remain in the starting position. After I explained the test, Irsay began the one leg stand exercise. Irsay was not able to remain standing on one foot for more than a couple of seconds and continued to fall off balance. Concerned for Irsay's safety, I terminated the exercise.

I then offered Irsay a portable breath test on which he tested a . I then asked Irsay to stay with Officer Thomas. I met with Sergeant Dunlap behind my patrol vehicle and advised him that I believed Irsay to be intoxicated on a substance other than alcohol. Sergeant Dunlap contacted Officer Z. Batic (Carmel PD) a certified drug recognition expert (DRE) and I returned to Irsay. I then read Irsay Indiana implied consent and he asked what that entailed. I explained that we would go to another location to perform a certified test. I then placed Irsay in handcuffs and placed him in the back of my patrol car. Due to Irsay's recent I handcuffed him with his hands in front of him. I then transported Irsay to the Hamilton County Jail where Officer Batic performed a DRE evaluation. Prior to the DRE evaluation, Officer Batic administered a certified breath test to Irsay. Prior to the beginning of the certified test, Irsay asked what this test would find. Officer Batic advised that the test was looking to see if there was alcohol in Irsay's system. Irsay asked if the test would see anything else in his system besides alcohol and Officer Batic advised that this test was only looking for alcohol. Irsay then requested that I read him the Indiana implied consent again and I did. Irsay performed the certified test on which he tested at

Irsay was then taken to a private interview room in the jail where Officer Batic performed the full DRE evaluation. Irsay was offered a blood draw to which he refused. Irsay was reminded of Indiana implied consent and confirmed that he refused to voluntarily allow a blood draw. I then contacted headquarters and requested the on call prosecutor call my cell phone. I was contacted by Joshua Kocher from the Hamilton County Prosecutors office. I advised him of the information and sent him a completed affidavit for probable cause requesting a warrant to draw Irsay's blood. I received the warrant after it had been signed by Judge Hughes.

An RN at the Hamilton County Jail drew Irsay's blood at 2:40am. The blood was secured in two grey topped vials lot number 327043, expiring 2015-08. The vials of blood have been secured in Carmel Police evidence. I was contacted by Sergeant Dunlap who advised that during the vehicle inventory prior to it being towed, he and Officer Thomas had recovered numerous prescription medication bottles containing pills Irsay was booked in to the jail for operating while intoxicated and four counts of possession of a controlled substance.

I returned to the Carmel Police department and met with other officers who were assisting with this case. Officer Thomas advised that during the vehicle inventory he had also recovered \$29,029 in cash. Officer Thomas and Sergeant Dunlap advised that they had used the Drug Identification Bible to identify what the pills were

On March 16th, 2014, I responded to a traffic stop in the Village of West Clay in a supervisory capacity. Officer Morris had stopped a vehicle driven by Jim Irsay, who was suspected as driving under the influence of an intoxicating substance. Upon arrival, I noticed Officer Morris at the driver's window. I entered Officer Morris' patrol vehicle and listened to the traffic stop through the in-car camera system. I could hear Officer Morris tell the driver he could stop the test because he had counted down to a number in the 40s. A few moments later, The driver, Mr Irsay was asked to exit the vehicle to complete SFSTs. Mr Irsay exited the vehicle and had immediate poor balance. He was stumbling continuously from that point forward. So much so, that Officer Thomas had to move close to be near in the event Mr Irsay fell.

Officer Morris offered all three standard tests, but was only able to complete gaze nystagmus. It should be noted, due to Mr Irsay's poor balance, he had to sit on the hood of Officer Morris' vehicle to complete gaze nystagmus. After gaze, Mr Irsay about fell on the ground as he was stood up from the police vehicle hood. A portable alcosensor was offered with a Officer Morris met with me in private and discussed the situation. It was determined a DRE eval and OWI investigation would continue. Officer Morris went back to Mr Irsay and read him Implied Consent. Mr Irsay stated he had recently had a Due to these reasons, Officer Morris handcuffed Mr Irsay up front and placed him in the back of his patrol vehicle. Officer Thomas and I remained on scene with the defendant vehicle, as Officer Morris left for the jail.

Officer Thomas and I began an inventory of the defendant vehicle. Inside the vehicle was a metal briefcase containing a great deal of items. Among those items was a large amount of loose US currency. Officer Thomas obtained an envelope and began collecting up all the currency in the vehicle. In the briefcase were pill bottles with various color and kinds of pills. Located on the floorboard of the passenger front seat were two bags. Inside the bags were pill bottles with an assortment of pills.

They were placed into one of the bags that was in the front floor board and brought back to the police department by Officer Thomas.

I remained at the scene awaiting the tow truck. Paddacks arrived a while later and took custody of the defendant vehicle. I made my way back to the police department, where I noticed Officer Thomas and Sgt Tilson counting out all the US Currency for placement into the evidence system. Officer Brian Hood and I began processing the assortment of pill bottles. Using a drug identification bible, we began looking at all the pills individually from the bottles, one bottle at a time.

This concluded my involvement in this case.

On March 16, 2014, at approximately 11:47pm, I responded to assist Officer J. Morris with a possible intoxicated driver from his traffic stop. When I arrived, Officer Morris informed me the driver was James Irsay and he believed Mr. Irsay had been driving under the influence. Officer Morris re-approached Mr. Irsay's vehicle and had Mr. Irsay complete a set of pre-exit tests and then had Mr. Irsay step out of the vehicle and walk to the rear of his vehicle. Mr. Irsay was unable to keep his balance long enough for Officer Morris to start the test, so Officer Morris had Mr. Irsay sit on the hood of his squad car. Officer Morris completed the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test with Mr. Irsay sitting on the hood of his squad car. Officer Morris attempted to have Mr. Irsay complete the 9 Step Walk-and-Turn and the One Leg Stand tests, but Mr. Irsay was not able to complete the tests. Officer Morris had Mr. Irsay complete a PBT and then read him the Indiana Implied Consent Warning. Officer Morris secured Mr. Irsay in handcuffs, placed him in the back of his squad car, and transported Mr. Irsay to the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office for further testing and evaluation. After Officer Morris left, I began to inventory Mr. Irsay's vehicle. During the inventory I located a black travel bag in the back seat of Mr. Irsay's vehicle.

Also located inside the vehicle was a metal briefcase sitting on the front passenger seat. Inside the briefcase I found

Also in the briefcase I found a brown leather wallet

Also located in the briefcase were a large number of various prescription medicine bottles. Located in the front passenger floorboard of Mr. Irsay's vehicle were 2 cloth laundry bags. Inside the laundry bags were miscellaneous personal articles along with a larger number of various prescription bottles. I collected all the cash and prescription bottles that were located inside Mr. Irsay's vehicle and transported them back to the Carmel Police Department to be entered into evidence. Sgt. Dunlap stayed with Mr. Irsay's vehicle until Paddock's Towing arrived. Once at the Carmel Police Department I separated the currency into separate quantities by the different locations from where the currency was located in the vehicle. After which, Officer Hood took pictures of the separate currency quantities. After Officer Hood took pictures I counted each of the separate quantities.

After I finished my count, Sgt. Tilson recounted all the currency and came to the same totals as I did. I then entered all the cash into evidence by denomination.

All the currency that was collected from Mr. Irsay's vehicle totaled \$29,029. Sgt. Tilson and I placed all the currency into evidence locker 1. I also entered a plastic bag (item 007) containing the bank envelope, the currency binders, and other miscellaneous items that were located with the currency that was collected from Mr. Irsay's vehicle. I also entered a paper bag (item 008) into evidence

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Case Narrative Sgt. Tilson

On Monday morning 3-17-14 I was notified by Sgt. Dunlap that Officer Thomas was headed to the police department with a large amount of prescription drugs and cash from a traffic stop initiated by Officer Morris. Dunlap requested that I meet with Thomas to assist in counting the money. I radioed to Officer Bryan Hood and requested he also meet at the police department as he is a trained field evidence technician. I arrived at the police department at the same time as Thomas which was recorded as 0107hours. Thomas had a white laundry bag and a large case folder with money inside. I escorted him to the squad room where the money was counted.

Thomas had the money divided into 3 separate groups. Thomas stated the money was found in 3 areas of the vehicle/person. Those areas included the briefcase, the wallet and the travel bag. The money was photographed by Hood as it was organized on a table. Thomas counted the money and came up with totals for each. I then recounted the money. I found that the briefcase money totaled \$14,516. The wallet money totaled \$2,513 and the travel bag money totaled \$12,000. This was totaled to be \$29,029. The money was recounted by denominations and was totaled to be \$29,029. This was the same count that Thomas had come up with. The money was separated by denominations due to the large amount and heat sealed into plastic bags. Thomas and I both initialed each bag. The money was entered into the evidence computer system. I then escorted Thomas to the Property Lockers located on the first floor where it was secured. The money was entered as a means of safe keeping.

Thomas and I then returned to the squad room, where Sgt. Dunlap and Officer Hood were working on separating and identifying the pills.

I had no other involvement in this event.

On 3/17/14, at approximately 1:00, Sgt. Tilson contacted me on the police radio and asked me if I would meet with him at the Carmel Police Department to assist with collecting evidence. I am a certified evidence technician for the Carmel Police Department, and my assistance was needed to photograph items collected from a traffic stop involving a silver Toyota Highlander. Officer Morris had arrested the driver of the vehicle, James Irsay, for operating a vehicle while intoxicated. Officer Thomas had assisted him at the scene of the traffic stop, and had collected a large amount of U.S. currency and a large amount of narcotics in the form of prescription medication. I arrived at the Carmel Police Department at approximately 1:15 and met with Officer Thomas and Sgt. Tilson in the squad room upstairs. Officer Thomas was in the process of organizing a large amount of U.S. currency on one of the tables in the squad room. Prior to his initial count I photographed the money, which was in various denominations. He then counted the money, and determined that there was \$29,023 total. Sgt. Tilson then counted the money to attempt to obtain an accurate count of how much money was present. Sgt. Tilson determined that there was actually \$29,029 present. Both officers agreed on that amount so I photographed the money again. After photographing the money I then photographed a white laundry bag, which was lying on another table. I emptied the bag and photographed its contents.
