MIZZOU SPRING MEDIA POLICIES

PRACTICE INFORMATION – MARCH 11-APRIL 19

All Mizzou spring camp practices (March 11-April 19) are open to media for a specified period of time (approximately the first 30 minutes of individual drills – no team periods), with most practices likely to take place at Faurot Field. In the case of inclement weather, please check with Media Relations for a location update, as practices could be moved indoors.

PRACTICE CONTENT

Content of what takes place during practice is not allowed to be reported on, whether in traditional forms of media, or on social media. This includes, but is not limited to: plays, formations, strategies, personnel moves, injuries, depth chart changes, etc. All injury information will come from Coach Pinkel or a designee.

SCRIMMAGE ACCESS

Scrimmages set for April 5, 12 and 19 are open to media in their entirety. Photography will be limited to a set amount of time (approximately the first 30 minutes of the scrimmaging). Reporting on the content of scrimmaging results is permitted, and the Media Relations Office will keep stats and disseminate those following each scrimmage.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

Select Mizzou coaches and student-athletes are available for interviews after each camp practice, with interviews being conducted on the field post-practice. Please see the tentative schedule which follows. Media will be escorted from practice after the initial open period, and can come back once practice is over to conduct interviews.

PHOTOGRAPHY POLICIES

All Mizzou Football spring camp practices are open for photography purposes for media outlets. The photography period is limited to approximately the first 30 minutes, however, and photographers/videographers will be escorted from practice after that period.

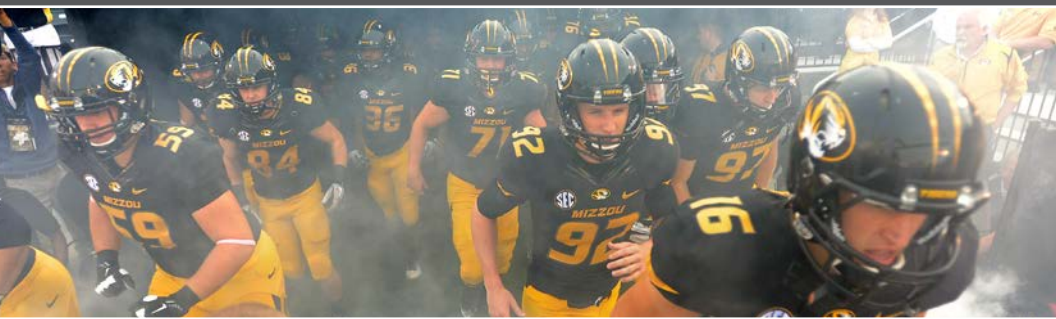

2014 MIZZOU FOOTBALL SPRING PREVIEW

What a difference a year makes.

Left for the scrap heap by pundits after a disappointing 5-7 debut season in the Southeastern Conference in 2012, the Missouri Tigers turned the national narrative around 180 degrees with a comeback season for the ages in 2013. After receiving nary a single vote in the pre-season top-25 polls, while being predicted to finish sixth in the SEC East Division, Head Coach Gary Pinkel's squad turned in one of the best seasons in Mizzou's history, going 12-2 overall, 7-1 in SEC play, winning the SEC East title along the way, while reaching the SEC Championship Game in only its second year in the league.

After a thrill-a-minute SEC title game loss to Auburn which kept Mizzou out of the BCS National Championship Game, the Tigers closed out their magical season in exciting fashion – with a 41-31 win over former Big 12 rival Oklahoma State in the 2014 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic.

That win put the cap on an amazing season, and it also secured Pinkel's 102nd win as Mizzou's head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history.

Now that the Tigers are no longer under the radar anymore, just what will they do for an encore in 2014? Questions will begin to be answered when spring practice opens March 11th, leading up to the annual Black & Gold Spring Game on April 19th.

As always, this spring will be all about competition. That's a word you will hear Coach Pinkel repeat early and often in any conversation regarding his team. That's always been the case in his program, whether it was his first year of a rebuilding project or after a 12-win season.

"The foundation of our program is competition," said Pinkel. "It always has been, and it always will be, there are no guaranteed positions on the team. Everyone has to go out there and earn their spots, earn their playing time. If a young guy beats a veteran out, they beat them out, it's for the good of the team. There's a lot of examples over the years, but one I always point to is when Brad Smith won the quarterback job as a redshirt freshman. He beat out a senior who had been a starter for a couple of seasons," he said.

The 2014 Mizzou Tigers will return a solid mix of proven veterans, experienced underclassmen, and talented newcomers who will look to keep the momentum rolling.





Twelve position starters return in 2014 for Mizzou, with five each on offense and defense, in addition to both specialists. It's also important to note that there are 19 Tigers in all with starting experience under their belts (10 on offense, 7 on defense and the 2 specialists), so this squad has a seasoned feel to it entering spring.

Here's a look at the position breakdown heading into spring camp:

OFFENSE

Mizzou enjoyed one of the most improved offensive attacks in the nation in 2013, thanks to a bunch of talented skill players and a much more healthy group from the previous season. The Tigers ranked 13th nationally in scoring at 39.1 points per game (after ranking 80th in 2012), and improved to 16th nationally in total offense (490.7 yards per game) a year after ranking just 96th nationally in 2012 (356.4 yards per game).

"I thought our offensive staff did a really good job last season," said Pinkel. "Philosophically we changed in a lot of ways, we threw the ball downfield as much as any team I've ever been around, and I think it was a great change. We were really balanced and that's difficult to defend. We're looking at a lot of different things, little things to tweak and make it better, and we'll see where that goes. We're pleased with what we're doing on offense, but we're always looking for ways to make ourselves better," he said.

A lot of the playmakers from that accomplished group have moved on, including three-year starting QB James Franklin, and four other NFL hopefuls in TB Henry Josey, RT Justin Britt, and receivers L'Damian Washington and Marcus Lucas. There's no question they'll be missed, but the five starters who return bring plenty of high-level play with them, and there are five others in tow who have previous starting experience as well.

"Every year we have some turnover, and that provides opportunities for other players, and that's the way we look at it," said Pinkel.

QUARTERBACK

Gone is three-year starter James Franklin, who when healthy, was one of the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the nation. The battle to find his replacement will be the most heavily-watched one this spring, and there should be several talented players taking aim.

Mizzou is in the unique position of having lost a three-year starter at quarterback, yet they have two players coming back with at least four games of starting experience. Sophomore Maty Mauk and junior Corbin Berkstresser both filled in for Franklin when he was out for stretches over the past two seasons, and they both helped the Tigers win games. Mauk was especially effective last year in his relief appearances, as he guided MU to a 3-1 mark against Florida, South Carolina, Tennessee and Kentucky. Mauk had an outstanding 11-to-2 TD-to-INT ratio, including a school-record tying five TD tosses in the win at Kentucky.

Mauk will have the inside track to the starting job, but Pinkel reminds everyone that nobody has won anything at this point.

"Maty certainly played well with his opportunities last year, and we're excited about what he did for us, he's got a lot of talent," said Pinkel. "He'll have to win the job still, that's how we do things here, he's got to compete to get the job just like every position. We've got guys like Corbin Berkstresser who has won games previously, and then some very talented young guys in Eddie Printz and Trent Hosick and Marvin Zanders who is a true freshman. I'm excited to see what everyone can bring to the table this spring, we'll have a lot to look at," he said.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The Tigers stayed healthy up front in 2013, losing only two total starts to injury by the starting five in 14 games. The cohesion and consistency developed by the line was unquestionably key to Mizzou's offensive success. The Tigers were among the nation's most balanced attacks a year ago, averaging 252.9 yards per game passing and 237.9 yards per game rushing.

Three stalwarts from that front five return in 2014, including junior all-SEC candidate center Evan Boehm, senior Mitch Morse and junior Connor McGovern. Boehm will be in his third year as a starter, including his second at center, while Morse has started 25-of-26 games the past two seasons and he'll move to left tackle after manning the right tackle spot a year ago. McGovern made 14 starts a year ago at right guard, and he might also get a look at right tackle this spring as coaches determine who will be the best fit at each spot.

Candidates to step in to starting jobs include senior Anthony Gatti at left guard, where he started twice a year ago in place of Max Copeland, and junior Mitch L. Hall, who got good reserve experience a year ago in his first action as a Tiger since transferring from Ole Miss. Junior Brad McNulty also has five starts in 2012 at center and guard, and he could factor into the rotation at a couple of spots going forward.

Others looking to establish themselves in the depth include junior tackle Taylor Chappell, sophomore guard Jordan Williams, redshirt freshman Clay Rhodes (tackle) and Alec Abeln (center), in addition to true freshman Mike Fairchild, who graduated from high school in time to enroll at Mizzou this semester.

"We played very, very well on the line last year," said Pinkel. "We have three guys back who are very good players, so that's something to build around. We'll take a look at a couple of things during the spring, and that's what it's for, we just have to find the five best guys and build the depth around that lineup," he said.





TAILBACK

Mizzou has the reputation of slinging the ball all over the field with its fast-paced spread offense, but its run game had just as much to do with its overall success in 2013 as anything. The Tigers ran for 3,330 yards, and showed an ability to run successfully even when the opposing defense knew it was coming.

Henry Josey was the top gun a year ago, rushing for 1,166 yards and 16 touchdowns, but after a three-touchdown night in MU's Cotton Bowl win, the senior-to-be declared himself eligible for the 2014 NFL Draft, meaning the second two-time 1,000 rusher in school history will need to be replaced.

For a lot of programs, that might mean dire circumstances, but not at Mizzou. Waiting in the wings looking to step up will be a pair of proven veterans in senior Marcus Murphy and junior Russell Hansbrough. Murphy ran for 601 yards and 9 touchdowns in 2013, averaging 6.5 yards per carry, while Hansbrough totaled 685 yards, 4 touchdowns and averaged 6.0 yards per attempt. Sophomore Morgan Steward will also look to step up his role, after a freshman season that saw him carry 21 times for 84 yards and one score.

"With the loss of Henry Josey, it also creates bigger opportunities for guys like Russell Hansbrough and Marcus Murphy, I know they're really excited about having the chance to get more carries," said Pinkel. "They are good friends with Henry, and they'll miss him, but they're also competitors who want the ball in their hands, so they're both happy about getting that chance," he said.

"We've got a really talented young guy in Morgan Steward who didn't get many chances last year because we were so deep, but now he's got a chance to show what he can do. I really feel good about the depth we have here, and that's crucial because it's a position where you have to have four guys ready to play who can get the job done," Pinkel said.

RECEIVERS

Much like the tailback position, Mizzou's wideouts lose some big production with the graduation of L'Damian Washington and Marcus Lucas, but the talent pool is still filled with plenty of ability. Junior Dorial Green-Beckham is back for his third year with the team, and if he follows his progression from the previous two years, the sky is the limit. Green-Beckham really came into his own a year ago, as he caught a team-high 59 passes for 883 yards and 12 touchdowns – the 2nd-most receiving TDs in the SEC in 2014.

But he's not the only weapon returning for the Tiger offense. Seniors Bud Sasser (26 catches, 361 yards, 1 TD in 2013) and Jimmie Hunt (22 catches, 253 yards, 1 TD) are back to provide further downfield reinforcements for the Tiger attack, and to provide leadership for a group of youngsters looking to make their mark as well.

Senior Darius White is ready for his chance to win a starting job, a year after he caught 7 passes for 76 yards in reserve action. The former Texas transfer played in all 14 games in 2013, and will be a prime contender to start in 2014. Others who the coaching staff expect to challenge for playing time this spring include junior Wesley Leftwich, sophomore Levi Copelin (3 catches for 61 yards in 14 games in 2013), senior walk-on Gavin Otte and redshirt freshman J'Mon Moore, among others.

"We lost a couple guys who will be playing in the NFL, but certainly we've got a lot of talent coming back," said Pinkel. "Dorial had a great year, Bud Sasser had a heck of a year and Jimmie Hunt did great, he'll have a lot more opportunities. Darius White has had a great off-season, Levi Copelin is a good young player, Wesley Leftwich is a guy who's got a chance to play, Gavin Otte is a really talented walk-on who wants to earn some opportunities, and we've got a young guy who is really talented in J'Mon Moore. We have talent there, it's going to be real important for the experienced guys to get better, but then the young guys really need to mature fast and get ready," he said.

TIGHT END

The tight end position has transitioned in the Mizzou offense, going from a pass-catching bigger wide receiver in essence that saw three first-team All-Americans in four years from 2007-10 to a spot that wasn't much of a factor in the passing game the past two seasons.

The tight ends were utilized more often in 2013 as they became a much more important part of the pass protection and run blocking efforts, the duo of Eric Waters and Sean Culkin caught a combined total of 9 passes for 78 yards.

Somewhere in the middle is a balance that Tiger coaches are looking to strike. They'll be looking to do that with Culkin, a sophomore who played in all 14 games a year ago, making one start along the way. With another year of seasoning under his belt, Culkin should be a bigger part of the downfield attack in 2014. He'll be joined by junior Clayton Echard and a promising prospect in redshirt freshman Jason Reese and others who will enter the fray.

"It's a position we'd like to use more this year," said Pinkel. "Sean Culkin is a good young player who is a good athlete and we'll look for him to mature. Clayton Echard is an asset here, and we're definitely excited about Jason Reese and his potential. Hopefully that position will continue to mature, we've got some good athletes here and now we just have to get them ready and get them involved," he said.

DEFENSE

Mizzou's defense in 2013 probably didn't get the accolades their offensive counterparts got for the Tigers' 12-2 championship season, but make no mistake, it was an excellent unit which was a big factor in MU's success. In 12 regular-season games, the most points allowed to an opponent was 28, and the final rankings showed Mizzou 34th nationally in scoring defense (23.1 ppg), an improvement from 68th in 2012.

Perhaps most importantly was the ball-hawking aspect of the defense which led to 32 takeaways (20 interceptions, 12 fumbles) that helped MU rank 5th in the nation (1st in the SEC)





in turnover margin (+1.10 per game). Mizzou will enter the 2014 season with an active streak of 44 games with a turnover gained, the longest in the nation. Perhaps no single play better signified a microcosm of the Tigers' defensive season than the one that clinched the bowl win. With MU clinging to a 34-31 lead in the final minutes, DE Michael Sam burst around the edge to sack Oklahoma State's Clint Chelf, knocking the ball loose. Fellow DE Shane Ray picked up the ball on the Mizzou 27-yardline and raced unencumbered 73 yards for a score with just :55 seconds left to clinch the win. When plays had to be made, the defense was there to do it.

"We had a really outstanding year defensively overall, I was really pleased with how we competed," said Pinkel. "I really liked our scheme a year ago. Take away the SEC championship game, and we played really outstanding against the run consistently. We were really physical, really good with turnovers and that's one of the most important factors in winning, so we need that to continue," he said.

Like the offense, Mizzou will return five starters from a year ago, including senior tackles Matt Hoch and Lucas Vincent, to go along with junior LB Kentrell Brothers, senior safety Braylon Webb and junior safety Ian Simon.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Mizzou is quickly becoming known as a defensive lineman factory, having produced NFL talent to the tune of Ziggy Hood, Aldon Smith and Sheldon Richardson (all 1st-round draft picks) in recent years. That theme continued in 2013, and then some, as both Michael Sam and Kony Ealy won 1st-Team All-SEC honors, with Sam eventually going on to win unanimous 1st-Team All-American honors and SEC Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

Both are gone, however, as Sam graduated, while Ealy chose to bypass his final year of eligibility in 2014 to enter the NFL Draft, where both are expected to be chosen this May.

Waiting to step into their footsteps is a pair of very talented ends in senior Markus Golden and junior Shane Ray. Even though both played reserve snaps, they were perhaps even more productive than their more well-known counterparts, as Golden led all MU linemen with 55 tackles, including 13 TFLs, 6.5 sacks and 8 QB pressures. Ray was 2nd on the team with 11 QB pressures, and got loose for 9 TFLs and 4.5 sacks, including a jarring hit of Georgia's Aaron Murray that forced a fumble which was scooped up and ran back for a touchdown by Sam which keyed MU's first road win at a top-10 opponent since 1982.

The middle is where the Tigers have the most experience returning, and it starts with seniors Matt Hoch and Lucas Vincent. Hoch had 41 tackles, 4 TFLs and 3 sacks in 13 games a year ago, while Vincent had 34 tackles, 5 TFLs and 1.5 sacks of his own in 14 games (9 starts). Sophomores Harold Brantley (30 tackles, 5 TFLs) and Josh Augusta (9 tackles, including 3 TFLs and 2 sacks) also gained valuable playing time a year ago and look to increase their role going forward.

Other contenders for playing time include a group of very talented youngsters. Redshirt freshman Marcus Loud and Charles Harris drew rave reviews a year ago while working on the scout teams, and they'll look to earn snaps at defensive end. Likewise, sophomores Rickey Hatley and Evan Winston will join redshirt freshmen Nate Crawford, Dequinton Osborne and A.J. Logan in the mix of those working to push for snaps in the fall.

"We've got some pretty big losses to fill, when you lose two 1st-team SEC players, NFL-bound defensive ends, it's challenging but we feel good about who we have," said Pinkel. "Shane Ray is a great player, and Markus Golden also turned into a heck of a player a year ago. I think Markus has a chance to be just as good, if not better, than Michael, if he can continue to push himself and work every day like Michael did to turn himself into the player he became," he said.

"I'm excited about our young talented guys like Marcus Loud and Charles Harris, and a guy



like Rickey Hatley could play either inside or outside,” he said. “Inside, we’ve got everybody back, and Matt Hoch, Lucas Vincent and Harold Brantley are proven guys who we feel really good about. We have a lot of stability there, and I’m looking forward to seeing the competition between them and some other really good young players like Josh Augusta, Nate Crawford, Dequinton Osborne, Evan Winston and A.J. Logan who have a chance to make us even better,” Pinkel said.

LINEBACKERS

The middle level of the Tiger defense was very solid in 2013, and junior Kentrell Brothers is back after a standout season that saw him rank fourth on the team with a career-high 70 tackles and 3 interceptions. Brothers played the weakside mostly a year ago, and the plan this spring is to give him a look at the middle linebacker spot that has been vacated by standout Andrew Wilson, who led Mizzou in tackles for the past three seasons.

Brothers leads a group that is pretty young overall, with senior Darvin Ruise (44 tackles in 2013, 1 interception) being the only other upperclassman in the mix for playing time this year. Sophomore Michael Scherer (14 games in 2013, 6 tackles) is in line to challenge for a starting job at the strongside spot, while Ruise is working to win the starting weakside role. Sophomore Donavin Newsom (10 games, 5 tackles in 2013) and junior Clarence Green will also look to factor into the depth, while redshirt freshmen Joey Burkett and Eric Beisel will take to the field this spring hoping to establish themselves as playmakers who can be counted on.

“We lost a couple of really good players at linebacker, but we’ve got Kentrell Brothers coming back and he did some great things last year, he’s got great potential. Michael Scherer is a good young player competing in there, and Darvin Ruise has a lot of experience and has done good things. With all of the younger guys there’s talent, so there’s going to be a lot of competition which will be good,” Pinkel said.

CORNERBACKS

Perhaps no position group was hit hardest by graduation than the cornerbacks, which lose the services of all-SEC E.J. Gaines (37 career starts) and Randy Ponder (19 career starts). While those two will surely be missed, there are some very talented youngsters waiting to step in and make their mark. The good news for Tiger coaches is that they aren’t completely wet behind the ears.

Sophomores Aarion Penton and John Gibson both got extensive snaps in 2013 and while they aren’t considered returning starters, they have been battle-tested. Penton started two games in place of Gaines in 2013 when Gaines was lost with a leg injury. Penton did very well in his time on the field, and in 14 games overall, he made 16 tackles and grabbed an interception. Gibson made 14 stops in 12 games, and added an interception and 3 pass break ups of his own. That duo will head into spring ball looking to lock down starting spots, but they’ll be pushed by a group which includes juniors David Johnson (12 games, 3 tackles in 2013) and Ernest Payton. Payton was slated to be a significant contributor in 2013, only to see his season ended early due to a knee injury in September. He’ll be limited this spring, but will be fully cleared in time for August camp.

They’ll be joined by newcomers Kenya Dennis, Anthony Sherrils and Logan Cheadle. Sherrils is a redshirt freshman who is one of the better overall athletes on the team, while Dennis and Cheadle are brand new to Mizzou this semester. Both were members of Mizzou’s 2014 recruiting class, and both are enrolled and taking part in spring drills, where they hope to make immediate impressions.

“You talk about rotating guys in to get experience, and it should pay off this year, since we lose both starters from a year ago, real high-quality guys, but we’ve got John Gibson and Aarion Penton





who both really played well as freshmen,” said Pinkel. “David Johnson has been around here a long time, Ernest Payton is coming along extremely well, but he probably won’t be full go in the spring. And then we’re excited to see our new guys get out there and see what they can do,” he said.

SAFETIES

The last line of defense will benefit by the return of senior all-SEC candidate Braylon Webb. Webb really emerged in 2013 as a playmaker, as evidenced by his career-best numbers which included 89 tackles (2nd-most on the team) and 3 interceptions. As the most experienced player among MU’s secondary, he’ll be looked to not only step up his play on the field, but to be a leader off of it.

Trying to lock down a starting job at strong safety will be junior Ian Simon, who is counted as a returning starter from 2013 due to his 8 starts when the Tigers employed a nickel package. Simon made 42 tackles a year ago, grabbed one interception and broke up 5 passes in all. Senior Duron Singleton (23 tackles in 12 games in 2013) is a junior college transfer who will challenge for playing time as well, and is someone who came on strong late last season. Junior Cortland Browning (14 games, 4 tackles), sophomore Chaston Ward and redshirt freshman Shaun Rupert will also look to play their way into the rotation.

“Braylon Webb is a really high-level SEC player, the guy is just a heck of a player, with his maturity and leadership, he’s got an awful lot going for him,” said Pinkel. “Cortland, we expect him to be in the mix and you’ve got Chaston in there too. Ian Simon had a real good year, and Duron Singleton is a second-year junior college guy who came on late in the season and you typically see a big jump in the second year with the program.

KICKERS

The kicking game is intact from a year ago with the return of starting junior PK Andrew Baggett, senior P Christian Brinser and sophomore snapper Jake Hurrell. While the expectations are for that trio to continue to improve, their return is a comfort for Tiger coaches and the all-important special teams.

Baggett finished the 2013 season 18-of-25 in field goals, and 66-of-69 in extra points, and his 120 points scored were the 4th-most in Mizzou single-season history. Interestingly, five of his seven misses on the year were from 39 yards or less, so that’s an area where he’ll look to improve. His leg

strength has never been in question, as he went 6-of-8 from 40 or out, and he finished the year strong by making five of his last six kicks, including a key 46-yarder midway through the 4th quarter of the Cotton Bowl win which broke a tie at the time. He also was a huge weapon in the field position battle, with his 62 touchbacks ranking as 2nd-most in the nation.

Brinser was solid in his first year as a starter, averaging 41.0 yards per punt, while placing 26 of them inside the opponents' 20-yardline.

Hurrell took over the long snapping duties as a redshirt freshman, and was superb, meaning that spot should be worry-free for Tiger coaches for a long time.

"I thought Andrew Baggett finished the year really strong, so we expect him to carry that forward this year," Pinkel said. "He's been our guy there for two years now, so he's a veteran and we feel like he can be one of the best in the SEC, which means he can be one of the best in the country," he said.

"Christian Brinser did some good things in his first year as a starter," said Pinkel. "Now that he's got the game experience, I think you'll see him take a step up, and that's what we need to happen certainly," he said.

Camp gets started on March 11th, and the Tigers will hold 14 practices in preparation for the annual Black & Gold Game, to be held April 19th at 1 p.m. at Faurot Field. Be sure to stay tuned to www.mutigers.com for updates and further coverage of Mizzou Football spring camp 2014!

In 13 years at the University of Missouri, Gary Pinkel has meticulously built a previously downtrodden program into one of the most successful in the nation, and after a thrilling 2013 season, he will take the field in 2014 as the winningest coach in Mizzou history.

Pinkel got the record-breaking win thanks to a thrilling 41-31 win over Oklahoma State in the 2014 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic. The win was the 102nd at MU in his 13 years patrolling the sidelines, and that broke a tie he held going into the game with Tiger legend Don Faurot, who won 101 games in 19 seasons from 1935-42 and 1946-56.

That victory also put the cap on a storybook season which saw Mizzou storm to a 12-2 record and a Southeastern Conference Eastern Division championship (MU's 4th division title in the last seven seasons).

Tiger supporters are proud to tout this amazing fact: Since 2007, Mizzou is the only program in the nation to rank in the top-10 among BCS-AQ leagues in wins, while also ranking in the top-5 in Academic Progress Rate, as well as in the top-5 in most NFL first-round draft picks.

The 2013 season will go down in the record books as one of the best seasons in Mizzou Football history, thanks to an outstanding job turned in by Pinkel and his staff. Mizzou began the season with little outside fanfare, and in fact was picked to finish 6th in the SEC East. All they did was burst to a 7-0 start, rise to as high as fifth in the rankings, win the East Division outright with a 7-1 SEC record, and reach the SEC Championship Game in only the program's second year in the nation's premier football league.

Even with the Championship Game defeat to Auburn, the Tigers turned heads nationally with their 12-2 record and final ranking of 5th in the season-ending polls (the 2nd-highest in school history). For his efforts, Pinkel received numerous national accolades, including being named a finalist for both the Eddie Robinson and Walter

Camp Football Foundation national coach of the year honors. He was also named the AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year.

Coming off an injury-riddled 2012 season that saw the Tigers go 5-7 overall, pundits seem to have quickly forgotten just how successful the Tigers have been in the last decade under Pinkel's watchful eye.

Mizzou has now won division titles and posted double-digit win totals four times in the past seven years (2007, 2008, 2010, 2013), making it one of the more consistent programs in the nation.

The Cotton Bowl berth marked the ninth bowl game for Pinkel in his 13 years at Mizzou. Included in that was a seven-year streak of bowl appearances (2005-2011) which was the longest in MU history.

Pinkel's leadership played a crucial role in the University of Missouri being in position to join the vaunted Southeastern Conference in November of 2011.

His vision for the future was stamped for approval in June of 2012, when the Missouri Board of Curators okayed a \$200-million construction project master plan – the majority of which will go to improving and expanding football facilities.

Mizzou's first year in the SEC certainly didn't go as planned in 2012, as the Tigers faced what was ranked as the nation's toughest schedule (Sagarin). Injuries which decimated the usually-potent Tiger offense took their toll and factored heavily into MU's 5-7 season.

Mizzou played in a school-record seventh-straight bowl game in 2011, and ended with an 8-5 record after a dominating 41-24 win over North Carolina in the Independence Bowl. The final record was impressive considering it came in a year in which the Tigers were challenged with key injuries while facing a schedule that was ranked as the seventh-toughest in the nation (Sagarin). Pinkel led his team to wins over three bowl teams in the regular season (Texas, Texas A&M, Iowa State), while all five of MU's losses came at the hands of bowl-bound opponents.



A testament to the consistency that Pinkel and his staff have developed at Mizzou is the fact that MU was one of only six schools in BCS-AQ conferences to have posted at least eight wins each season from 2006-11. The others in that very select group included: LSU, Oklahoma, USC, Virginia Tech and West Virginia.

In 2010, Mizzou posted its third 10-win season in four years under Pinkel, as MU went 10-3 overall, including a 6-2 mark in Big 12 Conference play that earned them a spot atop the North Division rankings for the third time since 2007. Included among those 10 wins was a watershed moment for the program, and for Tiger Nation overall – a 36-27 win over top-ranked Oklahoma on Homecoming, which marked the first-ever win by Mizzou over a #1-ranked team.

A sign of growing respect for the work that Pinkel and his staff has done to build the program came along with that win over Oklahoma. That week, Mizzou was the focal point of the entire college football universe, as ESPN sent its wildly popular traveling show, “ESPN GameDay,” to the MU campus. A record crowd of an estimated 18,000 Tiger fans packed the picturesque Francis Quadrangle for the Saturday morning show, and made everyone associated with the school glow with pride. A national audience watched the GameDay program, and then the nation promptly watched the Tigers pull away in the fourth quarter against the Sooners to move to 7-0 on a season for only the third time in school history.

Pinkel is in a select group of MU coaches that includes College Football Hall of Famers Don Faurot and Dan Devine, as well as Warren Powers, as the only coaches to have an MU record above .500 dating back to 1935.

Pinkel has guided Mizzou to nine bowl games, surpassing the previous MU record of six he previously held along with Dan Devine. With wins in the 2008 AT&T Cotton Bowl (38-7 over Arkansas) and in the 2008 Valero Alamo Bowl (30-23 over Northwestern), Pinkel became the first coach to lead the Tigers to bowl victories in consecutive seasons since Powers did the trick in 1981 and 1982.

Over the past 11 seasons, Pinkel has led Missouri to a 93-49 record (65.5%) and to bowl games in 2003, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2013. Dating back to the 2005 Independence Bowl, Pinkel has won 74 of his last 107 games overall (69.2%). He is the first coach in school history to earn seven straight bowl berths.

His success has led to an increased commitment to the Tiger Football program from the University, as Pinkel was awarded with a two-year contract extension in April of 2011 that will keep him on the Tiger sidelines through the 2017 season. With nine winning seasons, Pinkel has directed MU to nine of the 11 winning campaigns the school has had overall since the 1983 season.

Pinkel’s 13-year record at Mizzou stands at 102-63, and in his 23 years overall as a head coach, his teams have a 175-100-3

overall mark (63.5%).

With a school-record 12 wins in 2007 and 10 more in 2008, MU's two-year win total of 22 was third-most in the nation during that stretch, trailing only USC (23) and Oklahoma (23). The back-to-back 10-win seasons marked the first such occurrence in Mizzou history, and Pinkel has now directed four of the five double-digit win seasons in school annals.

In 2007, Pinkel guided Mizzou to arguably the greatest season in school history. Among the myriad achievements that year included a school-record 12 wins, claiming MU's first New Year's Day bowl victory since 1966, winning the program's first-ever Big 12 North Division crown, and earning a No. 1 Associated Press national ranking for the first time since 1960 and coming up one win shy of playing for the national championship.

To simply list the highlights surrounding Pinkel's renaissance in Columbia would not do his body of work justice. It has all

been the culmination of hard work and determination that began after his hiring on Nov. 30, 2000.

In achieving the program's first No. 1 national ranking since 1960, Missouri raced to a 5-0 start in 2007, including wins over a Rose Bowl bound Illinois team and perennial nemesis Nebraska. The Tigers averaged nearly 42 points per game in those five wins and only a late flurry of points by the Fighting Illini kept any of those games in doubt.

While eventual Big 12 Champion Oklahoma was the lone stumbling block for Pinkel's squad in 2007, the Tigers set numerous school records, including school marks for wins (12), points per game (39.9), total points (558) and total offense (6,864 yards). Most of the offensive records were broken again one year later, as the Tigers' potent spread attack topped those marks to 42.2 points per game, 591 total points in 2008.

For his outstanding achievements both on and off the field in 2007, Pinkel was a



finalist for several national coach of the year awards, including the Robinson, Bryant and Munger awards. He also was named the National Coach of the Year by FieldTurf in 2007.

In winning a school-record 12 games in 2007, Mizzou clearly caught the attention of the national football community, as the Tigers began the season unranked but quickly darted up the charts with wins over bowl teams such as Illinois, Texas Tech and Colorado. And after the Tigers defeated arch rival and 2nd-ranked Kansas on Nov. 24th, Mizzou stood atop the college football world, ranked number one for the first and only time since 1960.

While the 2007 Tigers cashed in on the steady growth of the program over the previous six seasons, the Tigers also enjoyed an exciting 2006 campaign that saw them win eight regular-season games for just the 10th time in school history, and Missouri's appearance in the Brut Sun Bowl marked MU's third bowl game in four seasons - the first time in 25 years that Mizzou had reached three bowls in four years.

Pinkel and his program successfully built on the momentum created from a scintillating 38-31 win over South Carolina in the 2005 Independence Bowl that saw his Tigers overcome a 21-point deficit. The thrilling win marked the largest come-from-behind win in school history.

After taking over a program that had fallen on hard times in 2001, Pinkel had increased success in each of his first three seasons, improving from four wins in 2001 to five wins in 2002, to the 2003 squad which went 8-5 and made the school's third bowl appearance since 1983.

Long considered a "sleeping giant" of a program, Mizzou had a breakthrough 2003 season under Pinkel's guidance.

The list of accomplishments turned in by the 2003 team was impressive:

The eight regular-season wins marked the first time since 1980 - and only the 4th time since 1960 - that MU had amassed that many wins in the regular season. The team became only the 9th in MU's history to accomplish the feat.

Mizzou's 41-24 win over #10 Nebraska on Oct. 11th was one for the history books, as it broke a 24-game losing streak to the Huskers for MU, making Pinkel the first Tiger coach to beat Nebraska since Warren Powers in 1978.

The Nebraska win also marked MU's first win over a top-10 opponent since 1981, breaking a string of 45 straight losses to top-10 foes for the school.

The 31st head coach in the program's history, Pinkel was hired on Nov. 30, 2000, and began immediately to prove to his colleagues, alumni, fans and student-athletes that Tiger Football could be a national player.

After a rebuilding year in 2001, Pinkel had Mizzou much improved in his 2nd campaign -- and playing for bowl eligibility entering the Tigers' final game of the season.

Pinkel opened the 2002 campaign by leading MU to one of the program's most impressive season-opening wins in recent history when Mizzou dismantled Illinois -- the defending Big Ten champions and a 2001 BCS Bowl team -- 33-20 in St. Louis, Mo. He later defeated Mizzou's rival, the Kansas Jayhawks, as MU downed Kansas 36-12 to give him a 2-0 record vs. KU -- making him only the third coach in school history to win his first two encounters against Kansas.

Pinkel came to Missouri after spending 10 very successful years as head coach at Toledo, where he amassed an impressive 73-37-3 record (65.9%) and left as UT's all-time winningest coach.

For his accomplishments at Toledo, Pinkel was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in February of 2009.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Pinkel learned the trade from one of the all-time great coaches, the legendary Don James. For 12 years as an assistant under James at Washington (1979-90), Pinkel helped guide the Huskies to a combined record of 104-37-2 (73.4%) and three Pac-10 Conference titles. He served as UW's offensive coordinator for seven seasons (1984-90), and helped mold one of the nation's most potent offensive attacks.

Pinkel played under James at Kent State University, where he was an all-conference and honorable mention All-American tight end. He graduated in 1973.

Pinkel received his bachelor of science degree in education from Kent in 1973. He did post-graduate studies at Kent and Bowling Green, and in 1997 was inducted into the Kent Athletic Hall of Fame.

Dave Steckel is in his 14th season at Missouri as the Tigers' linebacker coach, and the 2013 campaign was his fifth with the added duties of defensive coordinator. In 2011 he also was awarded with the title of associate head coach in the fall.

Mizzou's big-play defense turned heads in 2013, and was a key to the Tigers' storybook 12-2 season. Steckel's defense ranked 5th nationally in interceptions (20), 8th in total turnovers forced (32), 9th in tackles for loss (7.7 per game) and 12th in quarterback sacks (2.93 per game) – all of which were SEC-leading figures.

His linebackers were again a steady presence patrolling the middle of the field, and were led in 2013 by senior Andrew Wilson, who won 2nd-Team All-SEC acclaim by the Associated Press as he led MU in tackles for the third straight year, with 113.

Mizzou's defense was a bright spot in the Tigers' first year in the Southeastern Conference. The 2012 season saw MU hold six opponents to 20 points or less on the year, and an aggressive, hard-hitting style of play had the Tiger defense ranked 1st in the nation with 21 forced fumbles (1.75 per game).

Steckel's linebackers battled through injuries in 2012, but they still played a lead role in MU's defensive success. Junior Andrew Wilson led the team with 79 tackles, and his four forced fumbles (tied with fellow LB Donovan Bonner) ranked as 8th-most in the NCAA. Senior Will Ebner closed out his Tiger career with 75 tackles, to rank 3rd on the squad. Senior Zaviar Gooden missed two games due to injuries, but still managed to notch 61 tackles (7th on the team), and was eventually drafted by the NFL's Tennessee Titans.

The Tiger defense played a big role in Mizzou's overall success in 2011, as it ranked 4th in the offense-happy Big 12 Conference in total defense, allowing 380.00 yards per game. The Tiger defense came up big in wins over Texas (247 yards allowed) and Kansas (137), while closing the season in impressive fashion against North Carolina in the Independence Bowl. In MU's 41-24 bowl win, the Tiger defense shackled the Tar Heels and held them to just 36 yards rushing – some 120 yards below their average.

In 2010, Steckel's defense emerged into one of the most improved in the nation last season. Mizzou led the Big 12 Conference, and ranked 6th in the nation, in scoring defense, allowing only 16.08 points per game in the high-scoring Big 12.

Steckel's linebacking corps was decimated by injuries throughout the 2010 season, but that didn't stop his troops from turning in big performances each week. Senior Andrew Gachkar developed into one of the top linebackers in the league, and he was named a 1st-Team All-Big 12 performer, giving Steckel a 1st-Team All-Big 12 linebacker for the fifth-straight year (Sean Weatherspoon – 2007, 2008, 2009). Gachkar ranked second on the team with 84 tackles, just one shy of fellow linebacker Zaviar Gooden, a sophomore who was named honorable-mention All-Big 12 for leading MU with 85 stops in his first year as a starter.

Under Steckel, the Missouri defense followed the fire of its new coordinator in 2009 with an attacking style of play. The Tiger rush defense excelled, thanks to his linebackers and a stout defensive line, and ended the season ranked 26th in the NCAA against the run (118.62 avg.) – that figure is the lowest rushing average allowed in a season by a Tiger defense since the 1983 squad ranked 5th nationally with an average of 97.70 per game.

Sean Weatherspoon concluded his stellar Tiger career by winning 2nd-Team All-American honors, as well as being named a 1st-Team All-Big 12 performer for the third straight year – making him the first Tiger in the Big 12 era to achieve 1st-Team all-league status three times. Weatherspoon ended third on MU's career tackles chart, and was eventually a first-round selection by the Atlanta Falcons in the 2010 NFL Draft (number 19 overall selection). Sophomore Will Ebner also emerged as a steady force in the middle of the field, as he earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors for his play, which featured 78 tackles to rank him 3rd on the squad in 2009.

Steckel's group helped lead the Tiger defense in 2008, with junior Sean Weatherspoon commanding the lion's share of attention. "Spoon" turned in a very impressive season that saw him earn 1st-Team All-Big

12 acclaim, as well as 3rd-Team All-American honors, based on his 155 tackles. He was also named a finalist for the prestigious Butkus Award, and he repeated in 2009 as a finalist for the award again.

Weatherspoon was joined in the 100-tackle club in 2008 by senior Brock Christopher, who totaled a career-high 105 stops in his final season in a Tiger uniform. Christopher won honorable-mention All-Big 12 honors for his play for a second straight year in 2008.

Steckel returned to Gary Pinkel's coaching staff in 2001 after spending five seasons as the linebacker and defensive line coach at Rutgers University.

Steckel helped mold James Kinney into a prolific tackler, as he ended his Tiger career by breaking the MU career tackles record (434) during his senior season of 2004. Kinney led MU in stops in 2004, with 112, making him the first player in school history to record three consecutive seasons of 100 or more tackles. He earned 1st-Team All-Big 12 honors for his efforts, and signed a free-agent deal with the Jacksonville Jaguars after the 2005 NFL Draft.

In his 13 seasons at Mizzou, Steckel has had at least one of his linebackers earn all-league recognition in all but one year, including two each in the 2001, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.

The 2006 season featured stellar play from senior standouts Marcus Bacon and Dedrick Harrington. Bacon earned 1st-Team All-Big 12 acclaim for his play that featured a team-best 112 tackles. He became MU's first linebacker to win the Big 12 defensive player of the week award since 1997, when he won the award for his play in week two against Ole Miss. Harrington had his best season as a Tiger, as he totaled a career-high 100 stops.

One of MU's top recruiters, Steckel has helped land numerous all-stars for Mizzou, primarily out of the state of Texas. He was

responsible for the successful recruitment of Southlake Carroll High School quarterback Chase Daniel, who was named the EA Sports National High School Player of the Year. Daniel lettered as a true freshman at MU in 2005 and just two years later was a Heisman Trophy finalist, finishing fourth in the 2007 Heisman voting. Steckel was able to attend the prestigious ceremony in New York City that December.

Two of Steckel's stars were honored for their play in 2003, as Kinney was named 2nd-Team All-Big 12 by the Associated Press, while Barnes earned Honorable Mention acclaim by both league coaches and media. Barnes impressed enough people that he eventually signed a free agent contract following the 2004 NFL Draft with the Baltimore Ravens, and later played for the Washington Redskins.

At Rutgers, Steckel coached two all-conference defensive linemen from 1996-99, both of whom went on to play in the NFL. In 2000, Steckel moved to coach the linebackers. He served as one of Rutgers' chief recruiters, signing 14 players in his first three seasons.

Before Rutgers, Steckel coached the defensive line for Pinkel at Toledo from 1992-95. He was the defensive line coach during the 1995 undefeated season that went on to win the Las Vegas Bowl. Steckel helped coach a defensive unit that ranked No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference and 12th nationally. One of those players, Dan Williams, was the 11th overall selection in the 1993 NFL Draft.

Steckel served in the United States Marine Corps from 1975-78. He then went on to graduate from Kutztown State College and earned a master's from Miami (Ohio) in 1982.

He is married to the former Mary Beth Thomas of Floyd's Knob, Ind. They have one beautiful daughter named Amanda.

Josh Henson joined the University of Missouri football coaching staff in February of 2009 as the first new hire to join Gary Pinkel's staff since he came to Mizzou in 2001. Henson came aboard as co-offensive line coach, and after four seasons in that role, he was promoted to offensive coordinator in December of 2012.

That decision to promote internally by Pinkel paid off handsomely in 2013, as Henson oversaw an offense which was undoubtedly one of the most improved in the nation, and which played a critical role to Mizzou's 12-2 championship season.

Henson made subtle tweaks to Mizzou's spread offense after taking over the reins, and it led to the Tigers posting one of the most balanced and potent attacks in the country. Just a few of MU's national ranks in various categories included: 13th in scoring (after ranking 80th in 2012) at 39.1 points per game, 16th in total offense (96th in 2012) at just under 500 yards per game, 16th in rushing (88th in 2012) and 34th in passing efficiency, a year after ranking just 103rd nationally in that category.

The Tiger offensive line made huge strides in 2013, and that certainly was a key to Mizzou's success. Senior LT Justin Britt won 1st-Team All-SEC honors by the Associated Press, becoming the first MU tackle to win A.P. first-team conference honors since Rob Droege in 2003. Senior LG Max Copeland became a finalist for the Burlsworth Trophy, given annually to the nation's top player who began his career as a walk-on.

Henson has had seven of his linemen at Mizzou earn all-conference honors 10 times in his tenure, including true freshman guard Evan Boehm, who was named a 1st-Team Freshman All-American by College Football News in 2012. Boehm moved to center for 2013, and despite that being the first time he'd played the position at length, he did a masterful job of leading the front five.

A former standout offensive lineman at Oklahoma State, Henson spent four years as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana State University, where he developed the reputation as being a tremendous on-field teacher of the game, while also leading

the charge for LSU's recruiting classes which ranked among the top 10 in the nation four times - including a 2009 class which ranked as No. 2 in the nation according to Rivals.com.

Henson has provided a measurable impact for the Tiger football program, both on and off the field. In 2011, the Tiger offensive line - despite the pre-season loss of All-Big 12 left tackle Elvis Fisher to a season-ending injury - developed into a stout unit that paved the way for a Big 12 team rushing title that year. The Tigers ranked 9th nationally, and led the Big 12 in rushing (244.00 avg.) and also ranked 12th nationally in total offense (475.54 avg.), despite featuring a first-year starter at quarterback.

In 2009, he helped coach a trio of Tiger offensive linemen - senior Kurtis Gregory (2nd-Team), and sophomores Elvis Fisher (Hon. Men.) and Dan Hoch (Hon. Men.) to All-Big 12 honors. The offensive line helped protect first-year starting quarterback Blaine Gabbert well enough so that MU ranked 14th in the nation in passing, while allowing only 20 sacks in 13 games and 467 passing attempts.

It was more of the same in 2010, as the offensive line was a key element to Mizzou's 10-win season (only the fourth double-digit win season in school history), as four of Henson's five starters won some level of all-conference honors. Senior center Tim Barnes established himself as one of the top centers in the nation, and he took home 1st-Team All-Big 12 honors for his outstanding play. Also earning all-conference acclaim were juniors Dan Hoch (2nd-Team), Elvis Fisher (Hon. Men.) and Austin Wuebblers (Hon. Men.), .

In the recruiting battles, Henson quickly helped MU establish ties to areas in which it had little success in recent years, and his efforts helped the Tiger 2010 class to a No. 21 national ranking by Rivals.com - marking the highest ranking ever for an MU recruiting class.

Prior to Mizzou, Henson spent 10 years as a player and coach at Oklahoma State, prior to his successful stint as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator at LSU. He replaced former Tiger coach Dave Christensen, who was the first assistant to leave Pinkel's staff since coming to MU in 2001. Christensen was named

the head coach at Wyoming in December of 2008.

In 2007, Henson's coaching efforts helped LSU sophomore tight end Richard Dickson put together one of the most productive seasons at the position in school history. Dickson turned in the third-highest single-season reception total by a Tiger tight end in school history, and he capped the 2007 season by catching a pair of touchdown passes in LSU's 38-24 win over Ohio State in the 2008 BCS National Championship Game.

The Tiger tight ends played a key role as LSU's offense set a total of 10 school records in 2007, including points in a season and total yards in a season. Following the 2007 season, LSU tight end Keith Zinger was selected in the seventh round of the NFL Draft by the Atlanta Falcons.

As LSU's recruiting coordinator, Henson's abilities made an immediate impact on the Tiger roster as LSU had the nation's No. 2-ranked signing class in 2007 after a consensus top 6 national rating in 2006. For his efforts, Henson was ranked as one of college football's top 25 recruiters in 2006 and 2007 by Rivals.com.

At Oklahoma State, Henson was instrumental in the development of Billy Bajema, who was a three-year starter for the Cowboys. As a senior in 2004, Bajema was one of the top tight ends in the country, earning first-team All-Big 12 honors. Bajema was picked in the seventh round of the 2004 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers.

Henson also played a vital role in OSU's offensive development as the Cowboys ranked among the top 15 scoring teams in the nation for three consecutive years. The Cowboys averaged over 34 points per game from 2002-04, which

included 35.9 points per game in 2003 and 34.5 points a game in 2004.

As Oklahoma State's recruiting coordinator, Henson played a key role in OSU's 2003 signing class being ranked No. 15 in the nation by Rivals.com. A year earlier, Rivals.com rated the Cowboy class as the 26th-best in the country.

As a player, Henson was a four-year letterwinner with 40 career starts for Oklahoma State from 1993-97. He was a starter on the offensive line as well as team captain for Oklahoma State's 8-4 team in 1997, a squad that played in the Alamo Bowl against Purdue. He was a second-team All-Big 12 selection as a senior, in addition to being an honorable mention All-Big 12 pick as a junior. Off the field, Henson was named the recipient of the L.L. Boger Award as a senior, an honor that recognizes a student-athlete's achievement both on the field and in the classroom.

Henson graduated from Oklahoma State with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1998. Upon graduation, he went straight into coaching, serving as a high school football coach in Kingfisher, Okla. In one season at Kingfisher, he helped guide the Yellowjackets to the state semifinals.

Henson returned to Oklahoma State as a graduate assistant in July of 1999, spending one year with the Cowboy offensive line before taking a full-time position with OSU as tight ends coach in 2001.

Henson is a native of Tuttle, Okla. He and his wife Shauna have a 9-year old son, Will, and a 5-year old daughter, Kate. Henson lists golf, fishing and hunting as his hobbies in his spare time.

Andy Hill has coached 13 seasons under Gary Pinkel and 18 seasons overall at the University of Missouri, making him the longest tenured coach on the Tiger football staff. In fact, only three other assistant coaches in MU football history have enjoyed longer tenures at Mizzou: Clay Cooper (29 seasons), Chauncey Simpson (21) and John Kadlec (19).

The 2013 season marked an exciting shift in duties for Hill, as the Mizzou grad took over quarterback responsibilities, after working with Tiger receivers since he joined the staff in 1996. He was also awarded in December of 2012 with a promotion to Associate Head Coach.

Hill's work with the Tiger signal callers was outstanding in 2013, as he helped guide senior James Franklin and redshirt freshman Maty Mauk to stellar play which keyed MU's run to the SEC Eastern Division championship.

Franklin was one of the top producers in the country as he averaged just under 300 yards of total offense in his 10 starts which saw him post a 9-1 record. Mauk took over the reins for a crucial four-game stretch in the heart of SEC play when Franklin went out with a shoulder injury sustained in a win at 7th-ranked Georgia in October. Despite his inexperience, Mauk helped navigate Florida, South Carolina, Tennessee and Kentucky to the tune of a 3-1 record in those starts. Mauk earned SEC All-Freshman honors for his inaugural season, which included an 11-to-2 TD-to-INT ratio.

Regarded as one of the top recruiters in the country, Hill also has a long-standing track record of coaching success at Mizzou, as he helped develop three 1st-Team All-Americans in a span from 2007-2010 -- WR Jeremy Maclin, WR Danario Alexander and TE Michael Egnew.

Seven of Hill's receivers caught double-digit passes in 2012, and they were led by junior wideout Marcus Lucas, who had a team-high 46 catches for 509 yards, while adding three touchdowns. Freshman WR Dorial Green-Beckham showed flashes of why he was considered one of the top recruits in the entire nation in 2012, as he ended with 28 receptions for 395 yards and a team-best five TDs.

Hill coached several of the most prolific pass catchers in the nation, as well as in Mizzou history. In 2010, junior TE Michael Egnew emerged as the nation's most productive

receiving tight end, as he won consensus 1st-Team All-American honors, and was a Mackey Award finalist, for a year that saw him catch 90 passes for 762 yards and five touchdowns. That was an astounding progression for Egnew, who caught a combined seven passes in his first two years as a Tiger. Another great story in 2010 was the development of sophomore WR T.J. Moe into one of the nation's most prolific receivers as well. Moe burst onto the scene by catching 92 passes for 1,045 yards and six touchdowns, a year after he caught two passes as a true freshman in 2009. Moe's play won him 2nd-Team All-Big 12 honors.

Danario Alexander's 2009 season saw him lead the NCAA in receiving (137.0 yards per game), as he shattered school records for receptions (113), receiving yards (1,781) and receiving touchdowns (14). Alexander twice won Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors during his incredible 2009 season -- making him the first receiver in the talent-rich tradition of the Big 12 Conference to win the honor twice in the same season. Alexander won 1st-Team All-American honors for his efforts in 2009, and he ended his career holding the MU career record for receiving yards (2,778).

The 2009 season saw senior punter Jake Harry IV turn in an outstanding season which included honorable mention All-Big 12 honors. Harry ranked 29th nationally in punting average (42.77), and he helped Mizzou rank 4th in the country in team net punting (40.48) -- the highest MU has ever finished in the national standings in the category.

The 2008 season saw Hill work to develop sophomore Jeremy Maclin into arguably the most dynamic player in the nation. Maclin set an MU single-season record with 102 catches, 1,260 yards and 13 touchdowns receiving, and he also led the NCAA in all-purpose yardage, with his per-game average of 202.4 yards. The game-changer won consensus 1st-Team All-American honors for his play, as well as being named a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the nation's top receiver. Maclin chose to bypass his final two years of eligibility at Mizzou, and was taken with the 19th overall selection in the 2009 NFL Draft by the Philadelphia Eagles.

Hill's group produced in record numbers during the Tigers' 10-4 season in 2008. As

a team, Mizzou's passing attack shattered school records for receptions (404), receiving yards (4,625) and receiving touchdowns (41). Mizzou's passing attack ranked 4th in the NCAA in 2008, with a per-game average of 330.36 yards. In addition to Maclin's many exploits, another pupil of Hill's had a strong close to his Tiger career. Former walk-on Tommy Saunders developed into one of the Big 12's most underrated receiving threats, as he caught 72 passes for 833 yards and seven scores in 2008, and he ended his career ranked among MU's top-10 in both receptions and yardage.

Thanks in no small part to Hill's work with the receivers, Mizzou's offense set myriad records in 2007, as the passing attack ranked 9th in the NCAA, averaging 314.07 yards per game. Two of his pupils, senior Will Franklin and freshman Jeremy Maclin, earned all-league honors for their outstanding play in 2007, including Maclin, who was a consensus 1st-Team All-American for his exploits as both a receiver and return man, in addition to being named 1st-Team All-Big 12 and Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year.

Under Hill's tutelage in 2006, the Tiger receiving corps was instrumental in helping Mizzou develop into a passing attack that ranked 10th in the country, averaging 276.15 yards per game. Four Tiger wideouts had 25 or more catches, including Franklin (48), Perry (37), Brad Ekwerekwu (32) and Tommy Saunders (25). Franklin earned honorable mention All-Big 12 status for his breakout year. Perry, a true freshman, developed quicker than anticipated, as Hill coached him to honorable mention freshman All-American honors.

Hill also doubles as a highly-successful recruiter, primarily in the Kansas City and mid-Missouri areas. He was named by Rivals.com as one of the top-10 recruiters in the Big 12 Conference for 2007.

Hill helped develop Gage into one of the top receivers in the Big 12 Conference and one of the premier wide outs in the country. After converting from quarterback in the spring of 2000, Gage caught 200 passes for 2,704 yards and 18

touchdowns in three seasons – all MU career receiving records. Gage left after 2002 holding virtually every game, season and career receiving mark on the Mizzou books, and made an impact professionally, where he was the Tennessee Titans' leading receiver in 2007 and 2008.

Five of Hill's receivers are among 12 Tigers all-time to accumulate over 160 receiving yards in a single-game, with Gage holding the school record of 236 yards (accomplished twice). Missouri has had 16 different receivers go over 100 yards in a single game during Hill's tenure.

Previous to Missouri, Hill was the head football coach at Hutchinson (Kan.) Junior College. Hutchinson went 18-6 under Hill, including a 10-2 record in 1995 when it won its first Conference title since 1969 and ranked ninth in the final NJCAA national poll. He was named the conference Coach of the Year. Hill was the offensive coordinator at Hutchinson in 1992 and 1993 after serving as a graduate assistant at SMU in the spring of 1992.

Hill is a Mizzou grad who walked on the Tiger football team in 1980 and eventually earned a scholarship. He lettered in 1980, '81, '83 and '84 and played on Missouri teams that earned trips to the Liberty, Tangerine and Holiday Bowls. In his career, Hill caught 51 passes for 946 yards and scored seven touchdowns. As a senior, he caught 25 passes for 445 yards and three scores. Following his playing days at Missouri, he spent time in the training camps of the Kansas City Chiefs and Calgary Stampeders in 1985 and '86.

Andy and his wife Sarah are the parents of a daughter, Patricia Ryan, and son Andrew. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in economics from MU in 1985.

Cornell Ford is in his 20th season as a valuable member of Coach Gary Pinkel's staff, including his 14th at Mizzou working with the Tiger secondary. Since the 2004 season, Ford has coached the Tiger cornerbacks, after he focused on MU's outside safeties his first three years. Ford is also the Tigers' chief recruiter in St. Louis, where he has signed some of the very best players in the state who have been critical to Mizzou's success over the years.

Mizzou's secondary was one of the most impactful in the nation in 2013, as the Tigers led the SEC and ranked 5th nationally with 20 interceptions. Ford's corners tallied nine of those picks, including five by senior E.J. Gaines, who won 1st-Team All-SEC honors. Fellow senior Randy Ponder had a pair of interceptions, and freshmen Aarion Penton and John Gibson both grabbed one apiece, and gained valuable experience that bodes well for the future when Gaines was lost for two games to a leg injury sustained in a win at 7th-ranked Georgia in October.

In 2011, Ford oversaw the development of Gaines into one of the nation's top young cover men. Gaines set a Mizzou record with 16 pass break ups in his first year as a starter, and tied for 5th nationally with 18 passes defended overall (including 2 interceptions). Gaines had a solid junior season in 2012, when he made 74 tackles, and led the Tigers with 11 pass breakups.

Both of Ford's starting cornerbacks earned All-Big 12 status for three straight seasons (2008-10), including Carl Gettis and Kevin Rutland both in 2009 and 2010. The Tiger pass defense was a large reason for Mizzou's much-improved play in 2010, as MU led the Big 12 and ranked 6th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 16.08 points per game. The Tigers also ranked 11th nationally in pass efficiency defense, with an opponent passer rating of 108.45.

Rutland's development earned him an invitation to the 2011 NFL Combine, and while he went undrafted, he was signed immediately by Jacksonville, and in the 2011 season made his first career NFL start for the Jaguars.

In 2009, Gettis and Rutland were named honorable mention all-league by league coaches

for their play. Gettis ranked 6th on the team in 2009 with 61 tackles, and led the team with 5 pass break ups, to go with having a hand in 4 turnovers in his third year as a starter. Rutland, in his first year as a starter, developed into MU's top corner, as he won honorable-mention all-league status and was named the team's cornerback of the year for his season, which included 47 tackles and a team-high 2 interceptions.

Both of Ford's starting cornerbacks earned All-Big 12 mention in 2008, with senior Castine Bridges and sophomore Carl Gettis winning honorable mention all-league acclaim for their play on the Tigers' 10-4 squad. Gettis further established himself as one of the top young defensive backs in the Big 12 Conference as he ranked 5th on the Tiger squad with 78 tackles, 4 pass break ups and 1 interception. Bridges closed out his Tiger career with 69 tackles and 1 interception, plus a team-high 7 pass break ups.

Mizzou's cornerbacks turned in a solid 2007 season overall, and were a definite reason that the Tiger defense was one of the best in the Big 12 Conference. True freshman Carl Gettis blossomed under Ford's coaching, as he became a starter early in the year and eventually won 2nd-Team Freshman All-American honors for his play. Senior Darnell Terrell was invited to the NFL Combine in the off-season, and later signed a free-agent contract with the Cleveland Browns.

The Tiger secondary was instrumental in MU's defensive improvement in 2006, and Ford's cornerbacks were a big reason why. Led by junior Darnell Terrell, who earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors from league coaches, the Tigers ranked 2nd in the Big 12 Conference, and 37th nationally, in pass defense, permitting 185.69 yards per game on average. That fact was even more impressive, considering that sophomore starting CB Domonique Johnson missed five games due to a knee injury midway through the season.

After losing his top performer from 2004 in Shirdonya Mitchell, Ford helped develop his cornerback unit into one that was dependable and steady in 2005. Mizzou ended the 2005 regular season ranking 4th in the Big 12 in pass

defense, allowing an average of 212.55 yards per game.

Senior Marcus King blossomed into a big-play performer for the Tiger secondary in 2005, as he led the team with a career-high 13 passes broken up – including a record-breaking 99-yard interception return for a TD in the Independence Bowl win. King earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors by both league coaches and media for his efforts, and he teamed with fellow senior A.J. Kincade to give the Tigers a dependable tandem. King later went on to earn a free agent contract with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys following the 2006 NFL Draft, and another Ford protégé, Calvin Washington, was invited to the rookie minicamp with Washington following the draft as well.

Just about every one of Ford's cornerbacks had career years under his coaching in 2004, and that performance was instrumental in Mizzou's substantial improvement in defense. Thanks in large part to his cornerbacks, Mizzou led the Big 12 Conference, and ranked 3rd nationally in pass defense in 2004, allowing an average of just 149.27 yards per game. His corners grabbed 8 of MU's 15 interceptions in 2004, which was a nice team improvement from a total of 9 in 2003 (including 3 from cornerbacks that year).

Senior Shirdonya Mitchell blossomed into a high-level cornerback in 2004 under Ford's direction, as he ranked 5th in the Big 12 Conference, and 33rd nationally, with his 4 interceptions. Mitchell earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors for his play, in only his second year playing defense, and signed a two-year free agent deal with the Miami Dolphins following the 2005 NFL Draft. Juniors Marcus King and A.J. Kincade also had big years, as King tied for the team lead with four turnovers gained (2 interceptions and 2 fumbles) and led the team with 7 pass break ups, while Kincade had a career-high 2 interceptions, including a game-winning pickoff in overtime of the season finale at Iowa State.

In addition to his coaching duties, Ford has worked hard to earn a reputation as one of the most well-trusted recruiting presences in his area of St. Louis. His hard work and straightforward approach has paid off recently, as he has successfully attracted stars such as Will Franklin, Jeremy Maclin and 2008 signees Blaine Gabbert and Wes Kemp to Mizzou. In 2009, he landed Gateway Tech superstar Sheldon Richardson, who was one of the nation's top overall prospects, and this past February, MU signed a class which ranked 21st-best in the nation according to Rivals.com, and that was the highest ranking ever for a Tiger recruiting class. Ford was also successful in getting Missouri's foot in the door in other St. Louis schools where there hadn't been much Tiger success in recent years.

Ford spent five seasons at Toledo coaching the wide receivers. Toledo graduate Mel Long pulled in 175 receptions in his four-year career, 21 of those for touchdowns. He also held the longest active streak in NCAA Division I for consecutive games with a reception. Under Ford, Long became Toledo's all-time leading receiver.

Before Toledo, Ford coached at Marietta College where he coached the quarterbacks, running backs and receivers, while also serving as the team's strength and conditioning coach. Marietta led the conference in rushing offense in 1994 and 1995 and owned the league's top running back both seasons.

Prior to joining the Marietta staff, Ford served two seasons as a graduate assistant at Toledo. He helped with the offensive line in 1992 and the secondary in 1991.

Ford holds a bachelor's degree (1991) in physical education and a master's degree (1993) in sports administration from Toledo.

He and his wife, Dawn, are the parents of a son, Devin, and a daughter, Taylor.

In his third year as a full-time member of the Mizzou coaching staff is Assistant Coach Alex Grinch, who was hired in January of 2012 as safeties coach. Grinch returned to Mizzou after serving as part of Gary Pinkel's staff from 2002-04 in a graduate assistant role, and he came to the Tiger staff after a very successful run with other programs.

The 2013 season saw improved play from the Tiger safeties, which helped Mizzou's defense be one of the most disruptive units in the country. Grinch's safeties combined for five interceptions, including three from junior Braylon Webb and one each from senior Matt White and sophomore Ian Simon.

Webb had a career year, as he ranked second on the team with 89 tackles, while ranking second with seven pass break ups. White also had a career-high 61 tackles (ranking sixth on the team) for the cause.

Grinch's first year at Mizzou saw him get solid play from his starting safeties Kenronte Walker and Braylon Webb. Walker finished the 2012 season with 71 tackles (5th-most on the team) and won the first-ever SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for a Tiger, when he claimed the award for a big performance in a win over Arizona State in week three. Webb ranked 6th on the squad with a career-best 64 tackles.

Prior to joining on at MU, Grinch spent three seasons coaching the Wyoming secondary for former Mizzou assistant Dave Christensen. Three of his Cowboy defensive backs earned postseason honors in 2011, as Wyoming reached a bowl game for the second time in three seasons. Senior free safety Tashaun Gipson and junior strong safety Luke Ruff both earned Second Team All-Mountain West honors in 2011. True freshman cornerback Blair Burns was named First Team Freshman All-American by CBSSports.com and Honorable Mention Freshman All-American by CollegeFootballNews.com. Burns was also an Honorable Mention All-Mountain West honoree.

Wyoming concluded the 2011 regular season ranked No. 34 in the nation in pass defense, allowing only 202.2 yards passing per game. The Cowboys ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and tied for No. 5 in the NCAA in most turnovers gained (31 total). UW's defense also led the MW and ranked No. 4 nationally in most fumbles recovered (18) and was No. 3

in the conference and No. 32 in the nation in most passes intercepted (13 total). Individually, Burns tied for No. 2 in the Mountain West and No. 23 in the nation in interceptions (4). Gipson tied for No. 4 in the conference and No. 65 in the NCAA in interceptions (3), and Ruff ranked No. 5 in the conference and tie for No. 77 in the nation in tackles (8.1 per game).

In 2011, Wyoming ranked among the Top Five most-improved teams in the nation, and its eight wins were the most by the Cowboys since 1998. UW finished in sole possession of third place in the Mountain West behind only Top 25 teams TCU and Boise State. Wyoming's eight wins included key conference road victories over Air Force and San Diego State. The only two conference losses for the Cowboys came at the hands of the Horned Frogs and the Broncos.

In Grinch's first two seasons, he coached former Cowboy free safety Chris Prosinski, who was drafted in the fourth round of the 2011 NFL Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars. Prosinski was the 121st overall pick in the draft and also earned Second Team All-Mountain West honors his senior season of 2010. For the second consecutive season, Prosinski recorded over 100 tackles and led Wyoming in tackles. He was credited with 108 tackles in his senior season, and concluded his career ranked No. 4 in career tackles at UW with 373.

Grinch joined the Cowboy coaching staff in December of 2008 from the University of New Hampshire. He will be entering his 10th season as a college coach in 2012. In his previous nine seasons coaching at the college level, he helped guide seven of those teams to postseason play, including Wyoming's victory in the 2009 New Mexico Bowl.

Only one starter returned to the Wyoming secondary in 2011, senior cornerback Tashaun Gipson, who earned Honorable Mention All-Conference honors in 2010. Gipson ranked No. 2 in the conference and No. 26 in the nation in passes defended in 2010, averaging 1.00 per game. He also ranked No. 4 in the MW and No. 87 in the NCAA in interceptions, with three picks his junior season.

In 2010, all four starters returned to the Cowboy secondary. That group included 2009 Second Team All-Mountain West free safety Prosinski, Gipson and his older brother Marcell at cornerback and 2009 Freshman

All-American Shamiel Gary at strong safety. Proinski ranked 10th in the NCAA in tackles in 2009, averaging 10.8 per game. His 140 total tackles in '09 ranked as the fourth best single-season total in school history. Gary earned First Team Freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) in '09. He became the first Wyoming Cowboy to earn that honor since the FWAA established the team in 2001. Gary was one of only 28 freshman in the nation to receive the honor. Of those 28 freshman honored, he was one of only 14 true freshmen named to the team.

Grinch coached at New Hampshire for four seasons from 2005 through 2008. His first two seasons at New Hampshire, he coached the cornerbacks before being promoted to secondary coach and recruiting coordinator for the 2007 and 2008 seasons. In Grinch's final season at New Hampshire, the Wildcats concluded the season ranked No. 7 in the nation in the final Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Coaches' Poll and were ranked No. 8 in the final Sports Network Rankings. UNH advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2008 FCS Playoffs, defeating Southern Illinois, 29-20, on the road in the first round before losing at Northern Iowa, 34-36, in the quarters.

During Grinch's four seasons at New Hampshire, the Wildcats posted records of 11-2 in 2005, 9-4 in 2006, 7-5 in 2007 and 10-2 in 2008. UNH advanced to the FCS Quarterfinals in 2005, 2006 and 2008. The Wildcats also made it to the First Round of the Playoffs in 2007. The 2005 squad was the No. 1 seed entering the FCS Playoffs after capturing the Atlantic 10 Conference Co-Championship. In 2006, UNH defeated Northwestern of the Big Ten in the season opener. The following season, New Hampshire defeated another Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team in Marshall.

Grinch coached two Second Team All-CAA defensive backs in 2008. Senior John Clements was named Second Team at safety and sophomore Dino Vasso earned Second Team honors at cornerback. In 2007, Grinch coached First Team All-Conference senior safety Jeff Pammer and Second Team All-Conference junior cornerback Clements. The

2006 season saw Clements earn Third Team All-Conference honors as a corner. His first season at New Hampshire, Grinch tutored Second Team All-Conference honoree Corey Graham, a cornerback, who was drafted in the fifth round of the 2007 NFL Draft by the Chicago Bears. Graham was selected to play in the 2012 NFL Pro Bowl as a special teams ace. As recruiting coordinator his final two seasons at New Hampshire, Grinch oversaw all of the Wildcats' recruiting efforts.

Prior to his four seasons as an assistant coach at UNH, Grinch was the defensive graduate assistant coach at Missouri for the 2003 and 2004 campaigns, and was an administrative graduate assistant at Mizzou for the 2002 season. The Tiger defense ranked No. 2 in the Big XII Conference in total defense in 2004 and was No. 1 in pass defense. The 2003 season saw Mizzou post an 8-5 record and advance to the Independence Bowl.

Grinch enjoyed an outstanding college playing career at Mount Union College in Alliance, Ohio. He was a member of three NCAA Division III National Championship teams at Mount Union in 1998, 2000 and 2001. Over his four-year career, Grinch's Mount Union teams posted a 54-1 record and won four consecutive Ohio Athletic Conference Championships.

His senior season of 2001, he was named a Third Team All-America safety by D3football.com. He also earned National Defensive Player of the Week honors twice during his career from Don Hansen's National Football Gazette. Not only did he receive All-America honors on the field, but Grinch was a First Team Academic All-Conference selection his senior season.

He completed his bachelor's degree in sports management with a focus in marketing and a minor in business administration from Mount Union in May 2002, and earned a master's degree in educational leadership and policy analysis from Mizzou in December 2004.

Grinch was married to the former Rebecca Blaser of Alliance, Ohio on June 28, 2003. Their first child, son Tyler, was born during the Grinches' first year at Wyoming on Nov. 23, 2009. Their second child, daughter Corbi Elaine Grinch, was born on July 8, 2011.

Brian Jones has been a member of Gary Pinkel's coaching staff since 1992. He has coached an excellent running game for the last 19 seasons, after initially coaching wide receivers from 1992-94.

While Mizzou's spread offense has a reputation as a wide-open attack, Jones has helped produce a very productive run game which has resulted in 1,000-yard rushing seasons by Tiger tailbacks in six of the last eight years.

He oversaw a potent trio of backs in 2013 that guided Mizzou to a national rank of 16th in rushing, averaging 237.4 yards per game. Jones' three-headed monster was led by junior Henry Josey, who was one of the top comeback stories in all of college football last year. After missing all of 2012 with a severe knee injury suffered late in the 2011 season, Josey returned last season to gain 1,166 yards and 16 touchdowns, averaging a salty 6.7 yards per carry. He became only the second running back in Mizzou history to achieve two 1,000-yard rushing seasons (Tony Temple is the other).

Giving the Tigers a great 2-3 punch were junior Marcus Murphy and sophomore Russell Hansbrough. Murphy gained 601 yards and ran for 9 TDs, while Hansbrough posted 685 yards and 4 scores of his own.

The 2012 season was more of the same, as senior Kendial Lawrence worked behind an offensive line wracked with injuries, but still managed to turn out a 1,025-yard and 12-touchdown season. Lawrence ranked 6th in the Southeastern Conference in rushing.

In 2011, Jones oversaw the transformation of the Tiger offensive attack into one of the nation's most balanced, as Mizzou was one of just two schools nationally to average at least 230 yards rushing and passing.

His tailbacks carried a big load in 2011, as the Tigers won the Big 12 Conference team rushing title, averaging a league-best 244.00 yards per game (ranking them 9th in the NCAA). Led by super sophomore Henry Josey, who ranked 2nd in the Big 12 (12th nationally), averaging 116.80 yards a game before ending his season early in game #10 against Texas. Despite his early end to the season, Josey earned unanimous 1st-Team All-Big 12 honors after beginning the year at No. 3 on the depth chart.

Jones and his troops also rose to the challenge in 2010, as a talented group of tailbacks combined in committee style to rush for over 1,500 yards and 19 touchdowns as the Tiger run game ranked sixth in the Big 12 overall, averaging 156.38 yards per game (2,033 yards all told on the season).

In 2008, Jones took a first-year starter with limited prior experience, in true sophomore Derrick Washington, and helped mold him into one of the Big 12 Conference's top running backs. Washington became only the eighth running back in Mizzou history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, as he tallied 1,036 on 177 carries (5.9 avg.) in 2008. He added 17 rushing touchdowns in his first year as a starter, which was just one shy of the school single season record.

The 2009 season saw the Tiger run game contribute with 1,651 yards, of which 1,342 came from the trio of junior Derrick Washington, sophomore De'Vion Moore and true freshman Kendial Lawrence. Washington earned honorable mention All-Big 12 acclaim for his season, which included 865 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns, to go with 26 receptions out of the backfield.

Of the nine Tiger running backs with 1,000-yard seasons, Jones has coached four of them in his time on the Mizzou sideline, including one each in three consecutive years, from 2006-08.

Jones helped develop Tony Temple into one of the top ball carriers in the Big 12 Conference in recent years, as the Kansas City, Mo., native ranked second in the league in rushing in 2006, with a career-high 1,063 yards and seven touchdowns, and followed with a 1,039-yard, 12-touchdown campaign in 2008, becoming the first running back in Mizzou history to claim multiple 1,000-yard seasons.

Temple closed his Tiger career in illustrious fashion, as he broke a 52-year old record by rushing for a Cotton Bowl-record 284 yards and four touchdowns in Mizzou's rout of Arkansas. The yardage total was also the second-most in the history of Division I-A bowl games.

With Mizzou's high-flying passing game getting most of the headlines, it's easy to overlook the fact that the Tigers also run the ball very well and very often. Mizzou ran for just under 2,500 yards in 2007 (2,467), and amassed 29 rushing touchdowns as well,

providing a nice compliment to the air game. They followed with 2,153 yards and 28 rushing scores in 2008.

Temple earned honorable mention All-Big 12 status by league coaches in both 2006 and 2007. He also ran for 194 yards and two touchdowns in the 2006 Sun Bowl.

Despite their overall youth, and some injury problems for each one throughout the year, Jones' group made steady progress in 2005, and contributed heavily to MU's rushing attack, which ranked 3rd in the Big 12 Conference, and 17th in the NCAA, averaging 205.25 yards per game. Mizzou's tailbacks combined to rush for more than 1,100 yards and tallied 8 TDs in 2005, averaging a healthy 5.6 yards per carry. In May of 2006, Jones was one of only 25 coaches selected to participate in the prestigious NCAA Expert Coaches Academy.

Jones' backs rushed for over 1,200 yards and had 9 of MU's 13 rushing TDs on the season in 2004. They were led by junior Damien Nash, who had 792 yards and 7 TDs, and redshirt freshman Marcus Woods, who had 428 yards and 2 scores. Woods was named 1st-Team Freshman All-Big 12 for his efforts in 2004. Nash was a 5th-round draft pick by the Tennessee Titans in the 2005 NFL Draft.

Mizzou had one of the nation's most potent rushing attacks in 2003, as the Tigers pounded their way to 3,087 yards, good for a per-game average of 237.46 yards that ranked MU 1st in the Big 12 Conference and 6th in the NCAA statistics. It marked the first time since 1960 that MU won a conference rushing championship, when the Tigers led the old Big Eight with a mark of 249.3 yards per game. Missouri rushed for 38 touchdowns on the year, on the way to scoring a school single-season record 399 points.

Jones' workhorse from 2001-03 was tailback Zack Abron. Abron thrived under Jones' coaching and turned himself into one of the top backs in the Big 12 Conference. Abron rushed for a career-best 1,155 yards in 2003, making him only the 7th 1,000-yard rusher in MU history.

Abron set numerous career records in 2003, as he left MU holding the standard in rushing yards (3,198), touchdowns (42) and points (252). He improved his average yards per rush from 3.6 as a freshman in 2000 to a healthy 5.3 in 2003, and also worked with Jones to develop himself into a pass-catching threat out of the backfield. Abron was named 2nd-Team All-Big 12 in 2003 for his work, and went on to sign a free agent contract with the Atlanta Falcons following the 2004 Draft.

During Jones' last two seasons at Toledo, UT's running attack was ranked in the top-10 in the country. In 2000, the Rockets' running game ranked ninth in the country, racking up 253.8 yards per game. UT compiled 2,792 yards on the ground and averaged 5.43 yards per carry. In 1999, Toledo ranked 10th in the country in rushing, compiling 239.2 yards per outing and ranked No. 1 in the nation in yards per attempt (5.35).

In 1995, Toledo led the league and ranked fifth in the nation in rushing, averaging 244.5 yards per game. The Rockets' starting tailback that season, Wasean Tait was named the MAC Player of the Year and garnered second team All-America honors ranking second in the nation in rushing and third in scoring.

Jones came to Toledo from Lafayette College where he served as the wide receivers coach for one season. Prior to that, Jones served three years each as an assistant coach with Massachusetts (1988-91) and Villanova (1984-87).

Jones was an offensive lineman at the University of Connecticut, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in marketing in 1980. He also holds a Master of Science degree in administration and physical education from Norwich (1983).

Jones was born in Jamaica and raised in New York City. He and his wife, Mary Kay, are the parents of sons Grant and Brandon, and daughter Audrey. Grant was a member of Mizzou's 2014 recruiting class, and will join the team this summer.

Craig Kuligowski is in his 23rd season alongside Gary Pinkel, including his 19th season coaching the defensive line. One of the more accomplished assistant coaches in the nation, Kuligowski has coached eight Tigers to 1st-Team All-Conference honors, including seven overall in the last seven seasons – Lorenzo Williams in 2007, followed by Ziggy Hood in 2008, Aldon Smith in 2010, Dominique Hamilton in 2011, Sheldon Richardson in 2012, and two more in 2013 – Michael Sam and Kony Ealy.

Sam was one of the more compelling stories of the 2013 season, as he rose from little pre-season fanfare to become one of the top rush ends in the nation. He led the SEC in both sacks (11.5) and tackles for loss (19.0) and became MU's first defensive 1st-Team All-American since former great Justin Smith in 2001. Sam was a finalist for the Nagurski, Lombardi and Hendricks awards as well.

Ealy also turned in an outstanding season (9.5 sacks, 14.5 tackles for loss) which culminated with him winning 1st-Team All-SEC acclaim by the Associated Press.

Kuligowski's defensive line was arguably the most disruptive and deepest in the nation in 2013, as it was responsible for 39 of Mizzou's 41 season sacks (which led the SEC and ranked 12th nationally), while notching 73.5 of the team's 107 tackles for loss.

Reserve junior DE Markus Golden won honorable-mention All-SEC honors from the Associated Press for his play, while sophomore DE Shane Ray and junior DTs Matt Hoch and Lucas Vincent, combined with freshmen tackles Harold Brantley and Josh Augusta to give Mizzou high-impact capabilities every snap.

Sheldon Richardson developed into one of the top defensive tackles in the nation in 2012, and claimed 1st-Team All-SEC honors for his play, which included leading all SEC linemen in tackles (75). Richardson went on to become the 13th overall selection in the 2013 NFL Draft by the New York Jets, and later won NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors for his outstanding play.

Hamilton was an anchor on the line for Mizzou in 2011, as he led all Big 12 interior linemen with his 56 tackles, and he also helped clinch a pair of dramatic wins at Texas A&M and against Texas Tech when he deflected passes to end each game.

The 2010 season saw Smith earn 1st-Team

All-Big 12 honors despite missing three games with a broken leg early in the year. Following his sophomore season, Smith chose to bypass his final two years of eligibility and was a first-round draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers, where he blossomed into one of the league's top defensive rookies in 2011. Smith amassed 19.5 sacks in 2012, and earned All-Pro acclaim while helping lead the 49ers to the Super Bowl.

Smith wasn't the only Kuligowski protégé to earn acclaim in 2010, as five linemen in all took home honors, including sophomore end Brad Madison (2nd-Team), junior end Jacques Smith (Hon. Men.), junior tackle Terrell Resonno (Hon. Men.)

Coach "Kool" debuted a star pupil in 2009 – redshirt freshman end Aldon Smith – who turned out to be one of the top freshmen in the entire nation. Smith was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Freshman/Newcomer of the Year, in unanimous fashion, and he also earned 3rd-Team All-American honors, as well as 1st-Team Freshman All-American honors for his outstanding play in 2009.

Smith broke the MU single-season quarterback sacks record in 2009, with 11.5 to surpass the old mark of 11 set in 2000 by former All-American Justin Smith. Aldon Smith also had 19 tackles for loss in his first year on the field for Mizzou, and he led all of the nation's freshmen in both sacks and tackles for loss a year ago. Smith was joined by senior Jaron Baston (2nd-Team All-Big 12) in receiving all-conference honors in 2009.

Kuligowski's defensive line was stout against the run in 2009, as it helped the Tiger defense to a national ranking of 26th against the run (allowing 118.62 yards per game). The ranking and yards allowed were the lowest by any Mizzou defense against the run since the 1983 team ranked 5th in the country with an average of 97.70 yards per game.

Hood, and another star disciple, defensive end Stryker Sulak (who earned 2nd-Team All-Big 12 mention in both 2007 and 2008) were invited to participate in the 2009 NFL Combine, and both were eventually taken in the 2009 NFL Draft, with Hood going in the first round with the 32nd overall pick by the defending Super Bowl

Champion Pittsburgh Steelers, with Sulak going in the 6th round to the Oakland Raiders. Sulak ended his career tied for second on Mizzou's quarterback sacks list, with 22.5, while Hood finished 10th with 15.5 for his career.

In 2007, Kuligowski coached all four of his starters on the Tiger defensive line to at least honorable mention All-Big 12 honors, including Lorenzo Williams, who claimed 1st-Team mention for his outstanding play.

The 2006 season also saw Kuligowski's pupils succeed at a high level, as he coached standout defensive ends Brian Smith, Xzavie Jackson and tackle Lorenzo Williams to All-Big 12 honors, with Smith earning 2nd-Team mention, while Jackson and Williams won their first-ever honorable mention acclaim.

Despite being hurt severely by injuries in 2006, the Tiger defensive line was a disruptive force early and often, as they amassed 28 combined sacks of MU's overall 36 sacks on the season which were the second-most in school history (41 sacks in 1982 is the MU record). Smith was a catalyst, as he broke MU's career sack record before breaking his hip in game eight against Kansas State. Jackson and Williams stepped up in Smith's absence, and rank on MU's alltime career top-10 in sacks.

Facing arguably the biggest rebuilding job at any position on the team in 2005, Kuligowski oversaw a defensive line that grew into a solid unit, despite losing three starters from 2004 to the NFL. Junior DE Brian Smith blossomed into an every-down player, and had a monster year, ranking among the best in the Big 12 Conference with 9 QB sacks, 17 tackles for loss and 12 QB hurries, to go along with his career-high total of 66 tackles. Smith earned 2nd-Team All-Big 12 accolades for his performance.

Kuligowski's line was a focal point for the Tiger defense in 2004, and a major reason for the overall improvement of the defense. Three of his pupils – tackles Atiyyah Ellison and C.J. Mosley, and end Brian Smith – earned various All-Big 12 honors for their play in 2004, with Ellison and Mosley pulling in 1st-Team distinction. Redshirt freshman Lorenzo Williams also earned

1st-Team Freshman All-Big 12 honors by The Sporting News.

Two of Kuligowski's protégés were drafted as part of the 2005 NFL Draft, as tackles Atiyyah Ellison (3rd round) and C.J. Mosley (6th round) were picked by the Carolina Panthers and Minnesota Vikings, respectively. Later, defensive end Zach Ville signed a free agent deal with the Kansas City Chiefs.

Under Kuligowski's leadership, the Tiger defensive line proved to be the strength of MU's defense in 2002. Led by senior tackle Keith Wright and senior end Antwaun Bynum, the Tiger front four was a constant disruptive force for opposing teams. Wright led the Big 12 Conference, and ranked in the top-10 nationally, with 23 tackles for loss in 2002, while Bynum ranked among conference leaders in sacks, fumbles forced and tackles for loss.

Bynum earned first team All-Big 12 honors in 2002, and was named an honorable mention All-American by CNN.com, while Wright was a first team All-Big 12 pick by various outlets. Wright's development led to him being a 6th-round selection by the Houston Texans in the 2003 NFL Draft.

Kuligowski was credited with building one of the top defensive lines in the MAC during his tenure at Toledo. In 2000, the Rockets were ranked fifth in the country in rushing defense, allowing just 81.5 yards per game and 2.46 yards per carry. They were ranked third in the country in scoring defense, third in total defense and No. 1 in turnover margin.

Kuligowski was a four-year standout at Toledo (1987-90) as an offensive tackle. He was named first team All-MAC two straight years and helped lead UT to the MAC title his senior year. He was an integral part of the 1990 offense that turned in totals of 135 rushing first downs, 2,474 rushing yards and 4,335 total yards, all top five marks in Toledo history.

Kuligowski earned a bachelor of business administration degree from Toledo in 1991. He and his wife Mary have two daughters: Peyton and Madeline, and son Max, who was born in March of 2005.

Bruce Walker made a move in 2009 to serve as co-offensive line coach, a position he had assisted with for the previous 13 seasons under Gary Pinkel, while also being in charge of the tight ends. He made a name for himself as one of the top tight ends coaches in the nation prior to that, as he helped develop Martin Rucker and Chase Coffman into two of the most accomplished players in the nation. Each won consensus 1st-Team All-American honors in 2007 (Rucker) and 2008 (Coffman), and Coffman capped his record-breaking career by winning the John Mackey Tight End Award, given annually to the nation's top player at that position. Coffman became the first Tiger in history to win a national individual honor that is specific to a position group.

In 2013, the Tiger offensive line made huge strides, and that certainly was a key to Mizzou's success. Senior LT Justin Britt won 1st-Team All-SEC honors by the Associated Press, becoming the first MU tackle to win A.P. first-team conference honors since Rob Droege in 2003. Senior LG Max Copeland became a finalist for the Burlsworth Trophy, given annually to the nation's top player who began his career as a walk-on.

Walker has had his linemen at Mizzou earn all-conference honors 22 times in his tenure, including true freshman guard Evan Boehm, who was named a 1st-Team Freshman All-American by College Football News in 2012. Boehm moved to center for 2013, and despite that being the first time he'd played the position at length, he did a masterful job of leading the front five.

The 2012 season saw the Tiger offensive line dealt setback after setback with decimating injuries. None of the five anticipated starters was able to play in all 12 games, and at one point in the season, Mizzou was faced with starting a true freshman, a redshirt freshman and a former walk-on in the heat of SEC action.

A bright spot for the line in 2012 was the development of true freshman guard Evan Boehm. Boehm was the only lineman to make all 12 starts, and his solid play eventually landed him 1st-Team Freshman All-American honors from College Football News.

In Walker's first year as co-offensive line

coach in 2009, his group excelled at protecting first-year starting quarterback Blaine Gabbert. Thanks to the line's work, Mizzou ranked 14th in the nation in passing while allowing only 20 sacks in 13 games. Three of Walker's linemen – senior Kurtis Gregory (2nd-Team), and sophomores Elvis Fisher (Hon. Men.) and Dan Hoch (Hon. Men.) – all earned Big 12 award status. Gregory eventually earned an invitation to the NFL Combine for his stellar play.

It was more of the same from Walker's group in 2010, as the Tiger offensive line helped pave the way for an attack that ranked 35th in the nation, averaging 409.62 yards per game as Mizzou won 10 games for only the fourth time in school history. Four of Walker's starting five on the line earned some level of all-conference honors, including senior center Tim Barnes (1st-Team), junior tackle Dan Hoch (2nd-Team), junior tackle Elvis Fisher (Hon. Men.) and junior guard Austin Wuebbsels (Hon. Men.).

In 2011, the Tiger offensive line – despite the pre-season loss of All-Big 12 left tackle Elvis Fisher to a season-ending injury – developed into a stout unit that paved the way for a Big 12 team rushing title in 2011. The Tigers ranked 9th nationally, and led the Big 12 in rushing (244.00 avg.) and also ranked 12th nationally in total offense (475.54 avg.), despite featuring a first-year starter at quarterback.

From 2004-08, Walker had the luxury of working with the best pair of tight ends in the nation, in Martin Rucker and Chase Coffman. Rucker culminated his outstanding Tiger career with an award-winning season in 2007, as he was a consensus 1st-Team All-American, becoming MU's first All-American tight end since the great Kellen Winslow in 1978. Rucker caught an MU-record 84 passes in 2007 for 834 yards and 8 touchdowns, while also being a finalist for the John Mackey Tight End Award. Rucker was selected in the fourth round of the 2008 NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns.

Coffman caught 90 passes for 987 yards and 10 touchdowns in 2008, despite missing two games due to injury, and he ended his career with school records of 247 receptions and 30 touchdowns, to go with the 2nd-most receiving yardage in MU history (2,659). He was a third-round NFL Draft pick in 2009 by the Cincinnati Bengals.

Each player won 1st-Team All-Big 12 honors in 2006 (Rucker from coaches, Coffman from media), and Coffman was a semi-finalist for the John Mackey Award. The duo combined to catch 111 passes for 1,149 yards and 14 touchdowns in 2006.

In 2005, Rucker earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors after leading MU with 47 catches for 567 yards and 1 TD, with his catches ranking 1st among Big 12 tight ends in 2005, and 2nd-most in MU single-season history for the position. Coffman, despite being a true freshman, was nothing but impressive from day one in fall camp, as he tied Rucker with 47 catches for 503 yards and 4 TDs. Those numbers ranked at the time as the 3rd-best single-season performance in MU tight end history, and earned the rookie a spot on the Rivals.com Freshman All-American 1st-Team.

In 2004, the tight ends were instrumental in MU's passing attack, with the primary weapons being senior Victor Sesay and redshirt freshman Martin Rucker. The duo combined for 50 catches, 577 yards and 6 touchdowns on the season. Rucker earned 2nd-Team Freshman All-American honors for his standout rookie year that saw him grab 19 balls for 263 yards and 4 TDs.

In 2001, Missouri tight ends combined for 50 receptions, 484 yards and eight touchdowns. Dwayne Blakley was tabbed honorable mention All-Big 12 after pulling in 34 receptions for 362 yards and four touchdowns. He went on to sign a free agent contract with the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs, and started multiple games during the 2007 season.

Walker has successfully recruited some of the best high school players out of the state of Texas while at Mizzou. Walker signed highly-regarded all-state defensive end Brian Smith (Denton) in 2002. Smith went on to become Mizzou's alltime career quarterback sacks leader and was drafted by the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars. Walker more recently

signed Jacquies Smith of Dallas, who made big impressions while earning significant playing time in 2008 as a true freshman defensive end. His recruiting bounty of several stars in 2010 helped the Tiger recruiting class garner a national ranking of 21st-best in the nation – the highest a Tiger class has ever been ranked.

While at Toledo, Walker coached some of the best tight ends to ever wear a Rockets' uniform, including All-MAC tight end Mike Bilik, who finished his career with 75 receptions.

In 1993, behind Walker's offensive line, the Central Washington led all NAIA schools in total offense, averaging 517 yards per game. CWU also ranked first in the NAIA in rushing, averaging 198.5 yards per game. In 1995, the Wildcats earned a share of the NAIA national title, tying Findlay (OH) in the title game.

The quarterback of that team, Jon Kitna, finished his career with 12,907 yards in total offense and 12,353 passing yards, the best and second-best, respectively, in NAIA Division II history.

Walker graduated from Eastmont High School in East Wenatchee, Wash., where he earned All-Mid Valley League honors at linebacker and center. He played two seasons at Yakima Valley College before Central Washington.

A 1983 graduate of CWU, where he earned a bachelor of science degree in business administration, Walker was a two-year starter for the Wildcats at center. He earned a Master of Science degree in physical education in 1989.

Walker and wife, Sharryn, are the parents of Natalie and Maggie.

Pat Washington, a long-time coach and former player in the Southeastern Conference, joined the University of Missouri football coaching staff in January of 2013 as the Tigers' new receivers coach.

Mizzou's wideouts enjoyed a banner year in 2013, and played a critical role as the Tigers became one of the most improved offensive attacks in the nation.

Leading the way was sophomore standout WR Dorial Green-Beckham, who earned 2nd-Team All-SEC honors by the Associated Press after catching 59 passes for 883 yards and 12 touchdowns – the latter of which tied for most in the SEC in 2013.

Washington's deep and talented group also featured game-breaking play from senior WR Marcus Lucas (58 catches, 692 yards, 3 touchdowns) and senior WR L'Damian Washington (50 catches, 893 yards, 10 touchdowns). His group's solid downfield blocking also helped spring the Tiger ground game for a 3,000-yard season and a national rushing ranking of 16th as part of MU's 12-2 campaign.

Washington, a 27-year collegiate coaching veteran, has 17 years of experience under his belt on four different SEC staffs, including an 11-year stint as wide receivers coach at Tennessee (1995-2005), which included an undefeated 1998 season and a national championship for the Volunteers.

Washington, 49, has also coached in the SEC at Mississippi State (2007-08) and Kentucky (2012), and he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for two years (1987-88) at his alma mater, Auburn, where he was a successful starting quarterback for the Tigers previously.

Washington has enjoyed success all

throughout his career, as he's coached on teams which have reached bowl games 18 times. Tennessee posted a sterling 105-31 record in his tenure there which featured 10 bowl appearances - including three Citrus Bowls, two Fiesta, Peach and Cotton Bowls, and one Orange Bowl. The Volunteers also reached the SEC Championship Game four times with Washington on staff. A win in the 1998 title game vaulted UT to the 1999 Fiesta Bowl, where the Vols downed Florida State, 23-16, to cap an undefeated season and a national championship.

During his tenure at Tennessee, Washington developed a line of standout receivers, including Peerless Price, Donte Stallworth, Joey Kent, Marcus Nash, Robert Meachem and Cedrick Wilson, among others. Nash, Stallworth and Meachem were National Football League first-round draft picks, and all six enjoyed NFL careers.

"We are very pleased to have someone of Pat's caliber and experience join our team," said Pinkel, who will enter his 13th year at Mizzou in 2013. "Pat knows the SEC very well, he's been a coach and player in the league for two decades in total, and the success he's had on the field and in developing players is very impressive," said Pinkel.

"I am really excited about the opportunity to join the family at Mizzou," said Washington. "I've admired their program over the years and the success that Coach Pinkel and his staff have had. The SEC is such a great conference, and I look forward to stepping in and helping move the program forward. I believe the receiving group here is a highly-talented group of young men. It's a group that can make a difference and help us win football games, and I'm eager to get to work

with them and to help mentor them and develop them on and off the field into the best receiving group in the SEC," he said.

Washington's coaching career began at Auburn, where he served his alma mater as a graduate assistant coach from 1987-88. After the Tigers reached bowl games both years, Washington landed his first full-time position in the industry, as the receivers coach at Louisiana-Lafayette (1989-91), and that was followed by a two-year stop at TCU (1992-93) as receivers coach. He spent one year at Baylor (1994) as running backs coach, and the Bears reached the 1994 Alamo Bowl during his time there, before he left to join Tennessee the next year.

Following his time at UT, Washington coached receivers at Kansas State in 2006, helping the Wildcats to a berth in the Texas Bowl. Two of his wideouts, Jordy Nelson and Yamon Figurs, went on to play in the NFL.

Washington returned to the SEC next, as the receivers coach at Mississippi State from 2007-08. The Bulldogs broke a six-year postseason drought during his time there, as MSU won the 2007 AutoZone Liberty Bowl. From 2009-11, Washington coached running backs at Southern Mississippi, and his backfield played an integral role in Southern Miss'

Conference USA Championship in 2011. He spent the 2012 season at Kentucky as wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator.

A native of Mobile, Ala., Washington played quarterback at Auburn from 1982-85, with the Tigers reaching bowl games all four years. He was the starter his final two seasons, and guided Auburn to a combined 17-8 record in those years and to 1984 Liberty Bowl and 1986 Cotton Bowl appearances. His backfield mate, Bo Jackson, won the Heisman Trophy in 1985. Washington, who earned a management degree from Auburn in 1987, and his wife, Claudette, are the parents of sons Tyson and Justin.

In his 11th year as part of the Tiger coaching staff – and eighth in his title of director of football recruiting – is Nick Otterbacher. He assumed those duties after serving as an offensive graduate assistant coach for the 2006 season, when he helped coach a Tiger offense that broke numerous school records and ranked eighth in the nation in total offense (425.62 yards per game).

In his current role, Otterbacher oversees organizational efforts of virtually all aspects of MU's extensive recruiting program operations, such as coordinating on-and-off campus visits, mailings and other logistical arrangements. Mizzou's 2010 recruiting class was ranked 21st-best in the nation according to Rivals.com, which marked the highest-ever ranking for a Tiger class of recruits. The 2012 class was ranked as high as No. 20 by ESPN.com, and featured the nation's No. 1 overall prospect in Dorial Green-Beckham from Springfield, Mo..

Otterbacher served as an offensive graduate assistant coach for the 2005 and 2006 seasons, after serving on staff as an administrative graduate assistant in 2004.

A native of Tampa, Fla., Otterbacher was a four-year starter at center for the

University of Toledo, where he played under Tiger Head Coach Gary Pinkel through the 2000 season. In his four-year playing career, Otterbacher was part of Toledo teams that went a combined 34-13 from 1998-2001, and won or shared three Mid-American Athletic Conference championships, while playing in the Motor City Bowl in 2001.

After graduating from Toledo with a degree in business management in May of 2002, Otterbacher got his start in coaching at Duquesne University, where he served as the tight ends and assistant offensive line coach for the 2002 season which saw Duquesne post an 11-1 record and claim the Metro Atlantic Conference championship.

He then went to West Virginia Tech as an assistant coach, and was the offensive line coach and run game coordinator and recruiting coordinator for the 2003 season, prior to joining the Mizzou staff in July of 2004.

He and his wife, Jessica, have a daughter, Reagan, and a son, Kaine Charles Cotton Otterbacher, who was born in Dallas, Texas, the week of MU's 2008 Cotton Bowl victory over Arkansas.

Justin Kramer is in his third year at Mizzou in his role as assistant director of recruiting. He came to Mizzou from Southeast Missouri State, where he coached for six seasons (tight ends/offensive tackles), while also serving as the Redhawks' recruiting coordinator.

Kramer is responsible for many facets of Mizzou's extensive year-round recruiting operation, as the Tiger coaching staff looks to extend its presence in the southeast region of the country following MU's move to the SEC.

At SEMO, Kramer coached four First-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference offensive linemen in 2010. Evan Conrad, who is rated among the Sports Network's Top-10 Football Championship Subdivision players at his position this year, was the only non-senior offensive lineman to earn First-Team All-Conference honors for the Redhawks a year ago. Conrad is a Pre-season All-OVC pick entering the 2011 campaign. Kramer also coached 3 All-Americans and 1 Rimington Award winners which goes to the nations top center every year.

Kramer's offensive line paved the way for the nation's No. 3 rushing offense in 2010. The Redhawks averaged 265.1 yards per game. The offensive line also led the nation in fewest sacks allowed, giving up just six in 12 games.

As SEMO's recruiting coordinator, Kramer had a big hand in assembling this year's 25-member class which rates as the second-largest under head coach Tony Samuel.

Kramer initially joined the Southeast coaching staff as a graduate assistant in 2006, where he worked with the defensive line and coached current Kansas City Chief, Edgar Jones. He also served as the team's director of football operations for a year and a half.

A native of Liberty, Mo., Kramer played four years on the offensive line at Southern Illinois University. He was part of a remarkable turnaround at SIU, which saw the Salukis win three-straight conference titles and make the NCAA Playoffs on three occasions.

He is married to Killian Kramer and lives in Columbia.

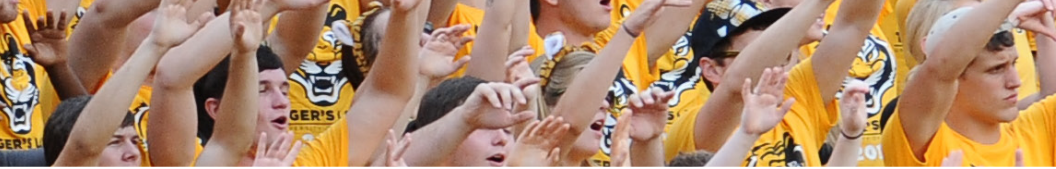
