# DEREK MASON TAKES THE HELM

Welcome to Vanderbilt Spring Practice 2014 – and the first directed by new Commodore Head Coach **Derek Mason**.

The Commodores' first practice will be held Tuesday, March 11 at 3:50 p.m. With a spacious indoor practice facility now available on campus, Mason expects to hold practices each Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday until April 12 when the squad stages its annual Black & Gold Spring Game.

Local media outlets will be allowed to shoot the first 15 minutes of each practice. The rest of practice will be closed. Interviews with Mason, assistant coaches and Vanderbilt student-athletes will be available at the conclusion of practice.

## THE DEREK MASON ERA BEGINS IN NASHVILLE

As defensive coordinator at Stanford from 2010-13, Derek Mason helped guide the Cardinal to a 45-8 overall record and four straight BCS postseason games, including appearances in the last two Rose Bowls.

Named as the 28th head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history on Jan. 17, Mason expects to bring similar experiences to a Commodore program that is in the midst of unprecedented modern-day success.

Mason will welcome about 75 prospects, including 43 letterwinners from the 2013 squad, to his first spring practice on campus March 11.

"I want to say to Vanderbilt Nation, we are going to do two things here. We will educate and graduate young men who are going to change the world," Mason told an introductory audience Jan. 18. "On the football side - SEC East title, here we come. Make no bones about it,

because if you can't talk about it, you can't be about it."

Mason, 44, replaces James Franklin, who went 24-15 over three years on the Vanderbilt campus. He also guided the Commodores to three straight bowls.

Mason guickly went to work after accepting the Vanderbilt post. In less than three weeks, Mason made the most of National Signing Day, securing signatures from 22 prep standouts from across the nation. Since then, Mason has attracted a stellar coaching staff, and worked diligently to build relationships within the Vanderbilt and Nashville communities.

At Stanford, Mason coordinated an attacking Cardinal defense that ranked among the nation's best in an array of statistical categories, from scoring defense and total defense to quarterback sacks and tackles for

## MASON TIES TO COORDINATORS DATES TO PLAYING DAYS, EARLY COACHING ROLES

Vanderbilt coordinators Karl Dorrell and David Kotulski played influential roles in the early coaching development of Derek Mason.

The relationship between Mason and Dorrell dates to the early 1990s when both were at Northern Arizona University – Mason as a cornerback practicing daily against receivers coached by Dorrell.

Much of Mason's expertise on the 3-4 defensive scheme came in 1999-2000 when Kotulski hired him to coach defensive backs at Bucknell University. More than a decade later, Mason repaid Kotulski by bringing him to Palo Alto to mentor Stanford inside linebackers.

Mason also has long ties with new offensive assistants Gerry Gdowski and Keven Lightner. Ten years ago, Mason, Gdowski and Lightner were members of the offensive staff at New Mexico State, then joined Frank Solich's Ohio University staff for the 2005-06 seasons.

### MAXIE JOINS VANDERBILT OFF TITANS' TENURE

Defensive secondary coach **Brett Maxie** joined Mason's staff without leaving Nashville. Maxie, who played 13 years as a safety in the NFL, spent the last two years mentoring Tennessee Titans' defensive backs. After spending 16 years in the NFL coaching ranks, this marks Maxie's first season as a collegiate coach.

## SQUAD RANKED IN FINAL 2013 POLLS BY COACHES & ASSOCIATED PRESS

For the second straight year, the 2013 'Dores were ranked among the Top 25 teams in the coaches' and sportswriters' ballots.

After the 9-4 season, the Commodores received 180 votes in the coaches' final ballot and 117 votes in the last sportswriters' poll. Vanderbilt ended the year ranked No. 23 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll and No. 24 in the Associated Press.

In 2012, Vanderbilt was ranked No. 20 by coaches and No. 23 by the AP.

## **Q&A WITH COACH MASON**



## MASON: "OPEN COMPETITION AT EVERY POSITION"

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

Head Coach Derek Mason conducted a lengthy interview with Tennessean beat reporter Jeff Lockridge 10 days before the start of spring drills on campus. Segments of the interview with Lockridge follow.

Is this spring more about implementation or evaluation for you and your staff?

Mason: The focus is definitely about implementation, seeing what their process is. Evaluation is always taking its course. We started that as soon as we stepped in here in terms of who we are, really just trying to put the pieces together and figure out where they fit, what our depth looks like, what bodies we need to move around. It will definitely be about the evaluation process, too, as we see what we can do offensively, defensively and on special teams.

Did you come here with an offensive playbook, or did offensive coordinator Karl Dorrell come here with one? How will it work with the plays and where they come from?

Mason: It's easy to say what you're going to play defensively. But it's harder to say what you're going to be offensively because offenses are so geared toward what your quarterback can do and how good you are up front.

Will we be similar to Stanford? Yeah. But it will also be different because I don't think we can just line up and bully people because our personnel doesn't say that across the board. Our offense will be multiple. It will be flexible. It will be in the vein of what's considered West Coast, with a twist ... with a Vanderbilt twist.

Anytime you go to a new staff or bring in a new staff, is verbiage the biggest hurdle for players and coaches?

Mason: Verbiage is always the biggest hurdle to get over. Even within the same systems. there are so many versions of the West Coast and what it looks like - or spread and what it looks like. Everybody wants to make it their own, so they add their own words to it and it grows this way or that way. Obviously, I started out as an offensive guy and I was steeped in the West Coast terminology. But as it's grown over the years and I moved away from it (to the defensive side).

What are your thoughts on two position groups as the spring starts: wide receiver (losses of Jordan Matthews and Jonathan Krause) and secondary (four graduated starters)?

Mason: I come from the philosophy of putting young people in stressful situations so that they become reactive and learn how to play the game fast. From a receivers' standpoint, what you're looking for is who can digest the information - take it from the class to the grass. Anytime, you have youth, generally there's talent. You're looking to see where those guys'

skill sets are. Some guys are going to be asked to take a bigger role, and they will.

When you flip over to defensive backs, I'm confident in what Brett Maxie (secondary coach) is going to pull out of those guys. We want safeties that cover like corners, but hit like safeties. We want corners that can move on a platform and mirror the great skill in this conference, but who can also tackle.

There are some guys back there who have a little moxie. I'll tell you this: I played with young secondaries when I was at Stanford. As long as they play together and understand how to communicate and play top-down and keep us out of harm's way, we'll be as good as anybody else in our conference.

Will you wait until after spring to come up with a depth chart?

Mason: It will be after spring. It won't even be close. We're going to let guys play themselves into positions. It's about open competition at every position. I don't care if you were a starter a year ago. This spring will be about solidifying our depth and seeing where we need to plug in our freshmen when they hit our campus this summer.

During Spring Practice, do you expect much tackling and taking guys to the ground, or do you back off that except for the scrimmages? Mason: We have a tempo structure in practice. There is what we call 'whiz,' which is palms up and a way to protect one another while still playing fast. It's more of a pro-style mentality. There's 'thud,' which is wrap and drive and let a guy go. And then there's 'live.' When we go live, those will be situational. You try to keep the live contact to scrimmages or situational ball short yardage, goal line - those periods are live because you need to have live reps to simulate what that looks like.

Another big emphasis in spring training is making sure we understand any new rules and how we're tackling in terms of the targeting rule: eyes up and making sure we're running our feet to, through and beyond contact. Just making sure we make the game safe, but we play the game hard from a defensive perspective. Offensively, it's trying to dial back with the penalties. We haven't been a heavily penalized team, but we want to make sure we're about the things that allow us not to beat ourselves.

Do you plan to split your time evenly among the position groups in practice, or will you spend more time with the defense?

Mason: I'm split up. I trust our coaches. That's why you hire a good staff and try to put together a good staff and make sure those guys are competent. I want to get a chance to know our (players). I need to get around our guys and see where they're at and be able to give them an accurate assessment, because when we

conclude, we'll have spring evaluations. We'll sit down with the strength and conditioning coach, the academic liaison, their position coach and the coordinator, and just talk about where they are so we can give them a big picture of what they look like.

You have to dig a little deeper as they look to transition into the summer in terms of where they're at, what they need to do and where they need to be going into fall camp. That will be what we do the first week after (spring practice), so we can give them structure heading into the summer.

How do you look to develop leadership? Will leaders rise to the top through the spring and summer, and are you that concerned about it? Mason: Leaders aren't born. Leaders are made, especially in football. Some players have a strong propensity towards it, but what you're trying to look for is guys who lead by what they do – not by what they say. The speaking part is great, but right now we have to assume they need to be led and then let our leaders slowly start to show themselves. Sometimes leaders try to lead when what they really need to be doing is falling in line. There's a time to lead and there's a time to follow. If you're ever going to lead, you have to be willing to follow.

We've got to make sure guys are all invested in the same process. Then as we get through (spring practice), those guys will start to show themselves. From one year to the next it changes. You have guys in mind. But it's always the same way. Those guys that you think are going to be the best leaders, it doesn't always turn out that way, because leadership is definitely about what you do and not what you say.

One area of strength for the Commodores should be an offensive line unit that features four returning starters and a fifth player with previous starting experience.

The corps features four returning starters: senior center Joe Townsend, junior guards Jake Bernstein and Spencer Pulley, and sophomore tackle Andrew Jelks. Also back is senior Andrew Bridges, who has 17 career starts at tackle in his Commodore career.


Collectively, the five returnees have combined for 82 career starts, third highest total in the Southeastern Conference behind only South Carolina (90) and Texas A&M (87).

This spring, new position coach **Keven Lightner** must find a replacement for **Wesley Johnson**, the All-SEC left tackle who finished his career by setting team records with 51 career and consecutive starts. Either Jelks, who earned nine starts in 2013 at right tackle, or

Bridges, a 17-game career starter also at right tackle, are the most likely candidates to protect the blindside of Vanderbilt quarterbacks.

With Townsend, Bernstein and Pulley, the Commodores are veteran interior blockers who have experienced plenty of success. The trio has combined for 56 career starts at center and guard.

The corps also feature quality depth, with four sophomores –**Blake**Fromang (OT), **Barrett Gouger** (OG),
Will Holden (OG-OT) and Kevin McCoy (OG) – getting valuable snaps in 2013.

Since October, 2012, the Commodores sport one of the Southeastern Conference's best records.

Vanderbilt owns a 16-4 overall record in its last 20 games dating back to a victory over Auburn on Oct. 20, 2012.

Vanderbilt's successful stretch includes a five-game win streak in 2013 capped by a victory in the BBVA Compass Bowl and a seven-game win streak to end the 2012 regular season.

Among SEC teams, the Commodores' record during its last 20 games is tied for second with South Carolina. The only conference member with a better record over the span is 2012 BCS national champion Alabama (18-2).

More impressively, the Commodores' margin of victory in the 16 wins has been 18.1 points.

Twelve of Vanderbilt's victories have come against members of BCS-affiliated

conferences: Auburn, Kentucky (twice), Ole Miss, Tennessee (twice), Georgia and Florida from the SEC, Wake Forest (twice) and N.C. State from the ACC, and Houston from the American Athletic Conference.

Vanderbilt is also 17-5 in its last 22 games.

# TWELVE STARTERS RETURNING FROM COMMODORES' 2013 9-4 SQUAD

Though Derek Mason's staff will open up competition for every starting position, the Commodores' spring roster includes a dozen players that started at least six games in the team's 9-4 2013 campaign.

The list includes four players that started every game last year: **Darreon Herring** (Jr., LB), **Spencer Pulley** (Jr., OG), **Joe Townsend** (Sr., center) and **Kyle Woestmann** (Sr., DE/OLB).

Besides Pulley and Townsend, other offensive players that enjoyed at least six starts last year were **Jake Bernstein** (Jr., OG), **Jordan Cunningham** (So., WR), **Andrew Jelks** (So., OT), **Steven Scheu** (Jr., TE) and **Jerron Sevmour** (Jr., RB).

In addition to Herring and Woestmann, **Adam Butler** (So., DT), **Jake Sealand** (Jr., LB) and **Vince Taylor** (Sr., DT) also started at least six games on defense.

## RB CORPS FEATURES SEYMOUR, KIMBROW

Vanderbilt's returning offensive backfield includes two of the team's top rushers from a year ago, juniors **Jerron Seymour** and **Brian Kimbrow**.

In 2013, Seymour was superb as a first-year starter. He matched the team record of 14 rushing touchdowns set in 2011 by current St. Louis Rams' starter **Zac Stacy** while producing 716 rushing yards (No. 2 all-time by Vanderbilt sophomore) and 14 touchdowns.

Kimbrow closed 2013 on a high note with 75 rushing yards and a score in the team's BBVA Compass Bowl win. He ended the season with 341 yards and three TDs on just 81 carries.

Junior **Derek King** and redshirt freshman **Ralph Webb** are expected to get plenty of spring repetitions. Former linebacker Kellen Williams is expected to work at fullback during spring drills.

# QUARTERBACK COMPETITION LOOMS AS COMMODORES OPEN DRILLS

Two young Commodores, sophomore **Patton Robinette** and redshirt freshman **Johnny McCrary**, are expected to compete this spring for the team's quarterback vacancy left by the graduation of **Austyn Carta-Samuels**.

Robinette and McCrary also enter spring drills facing the task of mastering a new offensive scheme from a new position coach. Former UCLA head coach **Karl Dorrell** moves into the dual role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Robinette has the most collegiate experience, having started three games and playing a key role in a fourth contest late in the 2013 season. After guiding the 'Dores to 17 second half points in an upset over Georgia, Robinette also started in Vanderbilt's November win at Florida and the BBVA Compass Bowl victory over Houston. He completed 52.3 percent of his passes and accounted for 11 touchdowns.

Though McCrary redshirted last year, he displayed a strong arm in an impressive Black and Gold Spring Game last April.

Junior **Josh Grady** is a third quarterback prospect on the Vanderbilt spring roster, but he is expected to take few snaps this spring as he returns from injury.

#### Additional Offensive Battles Expected...

While the Quarterback Watch will command plenty of attention, the Commodores need to identify potential new starters at several other offensive positions, including wide receiver, fullback and left tackle.

At wide receiver, the Commodores must replace one of the SEC's most potent receiving duos in **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**. The graduated pair accounted for 154 catches, 2,191 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns in 2013. Sophomore **Jordan Cunningham** is the most experienced returnee.

Graduation also took **Wesley Johnson**, an All-SEC performer and three-year starter at left tackle, and primary fullback **Fitz Lassing**.

Vanderbilt's nine-win November streak is a rarity for the program. It was last accomplished during the 1903-05 seasons.


From 2001-10, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in games played during November.

Woestmann, junior Caleb Azubike and sophomore Stephen Weatherly – could move to outside linebackers in the new scheme. With Woestmann and Weatherly limited, other former defensive ends such as junior Jimmy Stewart and redshirt freshmen Landon Stokes and Jonathan Wynn should get repetitions at the OLB position during spring drills.

Stanford's outside linebackers were regarded as aggressive playmakers, frequently causing havoc for Cardinal opponents.

### REPLACING COMMODORE SECONDARY

Starting positions in the Vanderbilt secondary are up for grabs this spring after the graduation losses of both starting cornerbacks and safeties.

As a first-year starter in 2013, Herring finished the season with career highs in solo tackles (47), total tackles (84) and defensed passes (11). He tops all active Commodore defenders in the three defensive categories.

#### CALEB AZUBIKE (Defensive End) DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK - FLORIDA, Nov. 9, 2013

Azubike earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors after registering two QB sacks, four tackles and a pair of hurries in Vandy's 34-17 win over Florida. It was Azubike's first SEC weekly recognition.

#### PARIS HEAD (Cornerback) CO-FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - TENNESSEE, Nov. 23, 2013

Forced into the lineup due to injuries, Head responded by picking off two Tennessee passes. One of Head's picks came on a Volunteer fake field goal deep in Vanderbilt territory.

## SIGNATURE WINS IN 2013: UT, FLORIDA, GEORGIA & HOUSTON

For the first time in Vanderbilt history, the Commodores defeated SEC East rivals Georgia, Florida and Tennessee in the same season in 2013.

The signature wins started during a furious, double-digit Commodore comeback at home against Georgia, Vanderbilt's first against the Bulldogs in Nashville since 1991. Three weeks later, the Commodores went on the road to claim their first victory in Gainesville since the World War II era. Two weeks after the Florida win, Vanderbilt went to Knoxville and won in dramatic fashion on a touchdown in the final minute.

Here's more on each of the signature wins:



#### GEORGIA, Oct. 19 31-27, in Nashville

- ★ The victory over No. 15 Georgia marked Vanderbilt's first against a ranked opponent since the Commodores defeated BCS No. 24 Boston College 16-14 in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl.
- ★ The win was Vanderbilt's first in Nashville against Georgia since a 27-25 victory in 1991.
- ★ Sparked by reserve QB Patton Robinette, 'Dore rally from 27-14 deficit after three quarters to outscore the Bulldogs 17-0 in final stanza.

#### FLORIDA, Nov. 9 34-17, in Gainesville

- ★ It marked Vanderbilt's first victory on the Florida campus since a 7-0 shutout in 1945. That game, held just months after World War II ended, was Vanderbilt's first visit to Gainesville. Until the win, the Commodores were 0-19-1 in the Swamp since the 1945 win.
- ★ The victory also ended years of Commodore frustration in the series. The win was Vanderbilt's first over the Gators
- ★ The win was sparked by a defense that limited Florida to 39 rushing yards and forced four Gator turnovers.



#### **TENNESSEE**, Nov. 23 14-10, in Knoxville

- ★ Following a 41-18 triumph in Nashville last year, the 14-10 win in Knoxville marked Vanderbilt's first back-to-back victories over the Vols since the 1925-26 seasons.
- ★ It was Vanderbilt's first victory in Neyland Stadium since Jay Cutler engineered a game-winning, fourth quarter drive in 2005.
- ★ It marked the 'Dores' fifth road win in SEC play in the last two years.



#### **HOUSTON**, Jan. 4 (BBVA Compass Bowl) 41-24, in Birmingham

- ★ For the first time in team history, the Commodores made a postseason appearance for the third consecutive year, facing Houston from the American Athletic Conference in the 7th Annual BBVA Compass Bowl.
- ★ The Commodores' 41-24 victory over the Cougars marked another program first - victories in consecutive bowl games.
- ★ Vanderbilt's 41-point offensive explosion represents the team's highest point total in a bowl game.
- ★ The victory gives Vanderbilt its ninth win for the second straight year. The win total also ties a team single-season record.

The four Commodore participants at the Combine - Andre Hal (CB), Wesley Johnson (OL), Kenny Ladler (safety) and WR Jordan Matthews (WR) – could be joined at Pro Day by Karl Butler (LB), Chase Garnham (LB), Steven Clarke (CB), Jonathan Krause (WR), Javon Marshall (safety), Walker May (DE), Jared Morse (DT), Carey Spear (PK) and Wesley Tate (RB).

The on-campus Pro Day features the same tests as the Combine, including official height and weight measurements, 225-lb. bench press repetitions, 40-yard dash, standing broad jump, vertical jump and position drills.

## HEAD COACH DEREK MASON

Derek Mason, regarded as one of the nation's top coordinators, is the new head coach for the Vanderbilt Commodores

Mason, who served as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and Willie Shaw Director of Defense for the 2013 Pacific 12 champion Stanford Cardinal, was introduced as the Commodores' 28th head coach by Vanderbilt Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos and Director of Athletics David Williams II at a press conference Jan. 18 at McGugin Athletics Center.

"Derek Mason is the leader we trust to continue the challenging but exciting work that has elevated the Vanderbilt football program to unprecedented heights," Zeppos said. "He embodies integrity, strategic thinking and a demonstrated commitment to success. He understands the important role that athletics plays in the life of a vibrant university, and that outstanding scholarly pursuits and top-notch sports are integral parts of the Vanderbilt experience. We are thrilled to welcome him to the Vanderbilt community."

"We are very pleased with our search. It was evident that the football world is aware of the tremendous progress our program has made and that was reflected by the deep pool of talent that showed an interest in our position," Williams said. "We talked to outside experts and did our own evaluations and the person that always seemed to be in the spotlight was the same person that was at the top of our list and that was Derek Mason.

"We are so excited to be introducing him as our head football coach because we are confident he can build upon our successes on and off the field and that he will take us to the next level. Derek will be an asset to our university," Williams added.

Mason becomes head coach of a Commodore program that has enjoyed consecutive nine-win seasons and postseason Top 25 rankings for the first time in team history. The 2013 Vanderbilt squad finished 9-4, capped by a 41-24 victory over Houston in the BBVA Compass Bowl.

"I am so excited to be at Vanderbilt," Mason said. "This university combines the best of what's good about college athletics and academics. We expect to be competitive and look forward to competing for an SEC East crown."

Since arriving on campus, Mason quickly put together an outstanding signing class of 22 prospects, hired a highly qualified coaching staff, helped oversee winter conditioning of the Commodores' returning players, and been visible at an array of Nashville social and sporting events.

#### **COACHED IN FOUR CONSECUTIVE BCS BOWLS**

Since being hired by then-Stanford Head Coach Jim Harbaugh prior to 2010 season, Mason has been a key leader in arguably the greatest era of Cardinal football. In the last four years, Stanford has played in four straight BCS bowl games: the 2011 Orange Bowl, 2012 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, 2013 Rose Bowl and 2014 Rose Bowl. Alabama is the only other team that can make the same claim. During the four-year period, Stanford owns an overall record of 45-8.

## COACHED BACK-TO-BACK PAC-12 CHAMPION TEAMS TO ROSE BOWL APPEARANCES

Mason's last two years at Stanford with Head Coach David Shaw concluded with appearances in the Rose Bowl. The consecutive appearances in Pasadena, by way of earning Pac-12 titles, ranks as a modern-day first for the Cardinal program.

#### 2012 BROYLES AWARD FINALIST

Mason's contributions to Stanford's 12-1 overall campaign that was capped by a Rose Bowl victory over Wisconsin is acknowledged by national panel that selects him as a finalist for the Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top assistant coach.

## REGARDED AMONG THE NATION'S BRIGHTEST DEFENSIVE COACHES

Mason has changed the perception of Stanford Cardinal defense during his time on campus. The 3-4 scheme Mason has helped develop at Stanford is now viewed among the most aggressive and innovative in college football.

Defensive coordinator at Stanford since 2011. Mason has helped take the Cardinal to Rose Bowl appearances in 2013 and 2014, and consecutive Pac-12 titles with one of the nation's top defensive units. Under Mason, the Cardinal ranked among the NCAA national Top 15 in defensive efficiency for three consecutive years.

While facing seven ranked opponents and one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2013, Mason's defense ranked third in the NCAA in rushing defense (89.4 yards), 10th in scoring defense (19.0 points) and 16th in total offense (343.1 yards).

The Cardinal was one of only five teams last year to allow less than 100 rushing yards per game. The team was also among the best nationally in producing stops for negative yardage, ranking fifth with 44 sacks and seventh with 109 tackles for loss. The defense was also superb on third downs, holding opponents to a 32 percent conversion rate.

Off the field, the Cardinal ranks among the nation's best with a football graduation rate of 95 percent. Stanford University was ranked No. 5 by U.S. News & World Report among national universities in 2013.

In 2012, the 44-year-old Mason was a finalist for the Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top assistant coach, after directing a defense that ranks among the best in the nation and finest in Stanford history. The 2012 unit broke Stanford's

single season record for quarterback sacks and topped the Pac-12 in numerous categories, including scoring defense and total defense, helping the Cardinal to a 11-2 season capped off with a Rose Bowl crown.

Mason's leadership paved the way to a historic defensive output in 2012, breaking Stanford's single-season sacks record (57) and pacing the Pac-12 in scoring defense (17.2 points), total defense (336.2 yards) and rushing defense (97.0 yards). In 11 of 14 games in 2012, Stanford held its opponent to 20 or fewer points, including a 14-point effort in the overtime win at topranked Oregon, who led the FBS with a 54.8 scoring average.

The 2012 Stanford defense held eight of 13 opponents under 100 yards rushing in 2012, and in a string of three consecutive games, the Cardinal

> recorded three of its top-10 single-game rushing defense performances in school history.

In 2011, Mason's first year as co-defensive coordinator, he teamed with Jason Tarver to mold Stanford into one of the Pac-12's top defensive units. That season, the unit ranked either first or second in the Pac-12 in six defensive categories, including rushing defense, third-down conversion defense, scoring defense, total defense, sacks and opponent first downs. Stanford finished third nationally in rushing defense. Mason joined the Cardinal staff in 2010, serving as secondary coach under then-Stanford coach Jim Harbaugh. Mason's 2010 secondary, which featured three players now in the NFL, was one of the team's most improved units, posting 18 interceptions.

Prior to his arrival in Palo Alto, Mason served as an assistant defensive

backs coach for the Minnesota Vikings from 2007 to 2009, playing a vital role in the team ranking sixth in total defense in 2008 and 2009 as the Vikings won NFC North titles each season. Mason was introduced to the NFL coaching circles through the Minority Fellowship program in 1996 with the St. Louis Rams and also spent time with the coaching staffs of the New York Giants and Oakland Raiders. He joined the Vikings staff in 2007, where he worked with defensive backs coach Joe Woods.


Before joining the Vikings, Mason tutored wide receivers at Ohio University under head coach Frank Solich, helping the Bobcats improve from 4-7 in 2005 to a 9-5 campaign the following year that ended with an appearance in the GMAC Bowl. Mason spent the 2004 season as the wide receivers coach at New Mexico State, where he helped the Aggies lead the conference in passing.

During the 2002 campaign, Mason mentored the receivers and assisted with the special teams at Utah. The Utes also featured the NFL Draft's No. 1 overall pick in quarterback Alex Smith and eventual 7th round pick receiver Paris Warren,.

Mason's early stops in his coaching career included assignments at San Diego Mesa College (1994), Weber State (1995-96), Idaho State (1997-98) and Bucknell (1999-2001).

As a player, Mason was a two-year starter and four-year letter winner at Northern Arizona.

A native of Phoenix, Ariz., Mason attended Camelback High School. Derek and his wife, Leighanne, have two daughters, Makenzie, 14, and Sydney, 13.

# **Dorrell**

#### Offensive Coordinator • QBs 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

Karl Dorrell enters his first season at Vanderbilt as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

With 26 years of coaching experience at the college and professional level, Dorrell brings a strong pedigree with him to the

Vanderbilt position.

A former head coach at UCLA from 2003-07 where he was named the 2005 Pac-10 Conference Co-Coach of the Year, Dorrell has spent the previous six seasons in the NFL. His last two seasons were in Houston where he coached Texans' quarterbacks.

In addition to having head coaching experience, Dorrell has seven years of experience as a collegiate offensive coordinator. He was the offensive coordinator at Washington in 1999 and also served in the same capacity at Colorado (1995-98) and Northern Arizona (1990-91). Dorrell has coached on the collegiate level for 17 years and has been on the staffs of 12 teams that enjoyed postseason appearances.

In his two seasons with the Texans, Dorrell helped the team reach the playoffs in 2012, where he tutored QB Matt Schaub to his second career Pro Bowl. Schaub tossed for 4,008 yards and completed 64.3 percent of his passes in 2012.

In 2011, Dorrell mentored Dolphins quarterback Matt Moore to a career season. Moore took over the reins in midseason and promptly career highs in completions, yards and touchdowns.

From 2008-10, Dorrell was wide receivers coach with the Dolphins. In that role, Dorrell saw Brandon Marshall and Davone Bess combine for the fourth-most receptions of any duo in the NFL.

Before returning to the NFL, Dorrell served as head coach at UCLA for five years, guiding the Bruins to five bowl games and a 35-27 overall record. In 2005, Dorrell led UCLA to a 10-2 record and No. 13 national ranking in the Coaches' Poll.

Dorrell's first full-time stint in the NFL came from 2000-02 when he served as wide receivers coach for Denver. Dorrell helped Rod Smith eclipse 1,000 receiving yards three times and a pair of Pro Bowl selections. In 2000, Ed McCaffrey posted 101 receptions for 1,317 yards.

A native of San Diego, Calif., Dorrell began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at UCLA. His first full-time position was as wide receivers coach at Central Florida in 1989. Dorrell also coached at Northern Arizona as offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach from 1990-91.

Dorrell coached wide receivers at Colorado from 1992-93 and Arizona State in 1994 before returning to Colorado to serve as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach of the Buffaloes from 1995-98. Dorrell also served as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach at Washington in 1999.

A graduate of UCLA in 1986, Dorrell played wide receiver for the Bruins from 1982-86, where he helped lead the team to three Rose Bowls.

Dorrell and his wife, Kim, have two children, Chandler and Lauren.

### David **Kotulski**

#### Defensive Coordinator •Inside LBs 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

David Kotulski, who worked with Vanderbilt Head Coach Derek Mason during the 2012-13 seasons as a Stanford defensive assistant, will serve as the Commodores' defensive coordinator under Mason.

Kotulski mentored two highly productive inside linebackers during his two-year tenure with Stanford, Shayne Skov and A.J. Tarpley.

In 2012-13, Kotulski's interior linebackers helped produce one of the nation's top defense for a Stanford program that captured back-to-back Pac-12 crowns and made consecutive Rose Bowl appearances.

In 2013, the Cardinal defense was one of five nationally to allow opponents less than 100 rushing yards per game, ranking third in the NCAA with a 89.4-yard rush defense average.

The 2013 unit also ranked 10th in scoring defense (19.0 points) and 16th in total defense, and was among the nation's best in producing plays for negative yardage with 44 quarterback sacks and 109 tackles for loss. In 2012, Kotulski's linebackers were key to Stanford's 57 quarterback sacks, a school record. That season, the Cardinal also paced the Pac-12 in scoring defense (17.2 points), total defense and rushing defense. Skov was Kotulski's most decorated player at Stanford, becoming a two-time All-America recipient, two-time All-Pac-12 honoree and 2012 Butkus Award finalist. Tarpley earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention recognition in 2013.

Skov and Tarpley also paced the 2013 Cardinal defense statistically, contributing 109 and 93 tackles, respectively. Skov also produced 13 tackles for loss, 5.5 guarterback sacks and 10 hurries.

Prior to joining the Stanford staff, Kotulski served six years directing one of the Patriot League's top defense at Lehigh University. In 2011, Lehigh ranked in the top three in six Patriot League defensive categories, including total defense (315.7 yards), rushing defense (102.8 yards), interceptions and sacks. The Mountain Hawks also finished in the Top 20 nationally in both total defense and rushing defense.

After winning its second straight Patriot League title in 2011, Lehigh defeated Towson in the second round of the Football Championship Series (FCS) playoffs before falling to eventual national champion North Dakota State in the quarterfinals. In 2009, Kotulski's Lehigh unit led the nation with 39 sacks.

Before joining Lehigh, Kotulski was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Holy Cross in 2005 and Utah State in 2003-04.

Kotulski's familiarity with Mason dates back to a seven-year tenure at Bucknell University where Mason served as a defensive assistant.

Kotulski also has collegiate experience as the defensive coordinator at Utah State University (2003-04) and linebackers/defensive line coach at Saint Mary's University (1990-94).

An Illinois native, Kotulski earned a bachelor's in physical education in 1974 from New Mexico State, where he lettered as a linebacker and center. Kotulski and his wife, Cissy, are the parents of two children, David and Carey.

## Charles **Bankins**

#### Special Teams Coordinator • RBs 4th year on Vanderbilt staff

Charles Bankins enters his fourth season at Vanderbilt as special teams coordinator. He will coach running backs for the first time as a Commodore assistant under Mason.

Since 2011, Bankins has brought superb

special teams to Vanderbilt last year. Bankins' special teams unit was a huge contributor to the Commodores success in 2013.

Carey Spear led the kicking unit last year by converting 15-of-19 field goals and going 2-for-2 in field goals of 50+ yards, including a careerlong of 54 yards at South Carolina. The senior captain booted three field goals to match a career-best in the season-ending victory against Wake Forest, including the game-winner from 38 yards. First-year punter Taylor Hudson averaged 42.9 yards, landing 11 of 48 punts inside the 20-yard line. Darrius Sims emerged as the go-to-guy for the Dores on kickoff returns with an average of 22.8 yards per return.

Bankins coached tight ends from 2011-13. In 2013, tight ends Kris Kentera and Steven Scheu each set career-highs in receiving yards and each caught touchdown passes.

In 2012, Bankins continued his remarkable job with Vanderbilt special teams, helping Spear and punter Richard Kent both earn All-SEC recognition as the 'Dores put together arguably the finest combined special teams effort in school history. Spear was sensational, setting school records with 20 field goals and 87 points scored by a kicker. Kent averaged 44.9 yards, the fourth highest average ever by a Commodore.

Bankins coached tight ends and special teams at Maryland from 2009-10. In 2010, Maryland punt returner Tony Logan earned first team All-ACC honors after leading the ACC with a 18.8-yard punt return average. In 2009, another Bankins' standout at Maryland, Torrey Smith, earned All-ACC honors by breaking the conference single-season record for kickoff return yards. Bankins also groomed Nick Ferrara to freshman All-America honors as a placekicker in 2009.

Prior to working at Maryland, Bankins enjoyed success as an assistant at the University of Richmond from 2007-08. In Bankins' final game as a Richmond coach, the Spiders claimed the 2008 NCAA FCS national title with a victory over Montana.

Bankins had two stints at Hampton University (2000-04; 2006) and spent 2005 with the St. Louis Rams. He also coached a year at Indiana (Pa.) University and James Madison.

Bankins played running back for James Madison, where he earned a bachelor's degree in speech communications in 1994. He earned a master's from Eastern Kentucky in 1998.

Bankins and his wife, Katrina, are the parents of a daughter, Ashley, and son, William.

#### Tight Ends Coach 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

Gerry Gdowski comes to Vanderbilt after spending nine years at Ohio. He will coach the Commodores' tight ends after mentoring quarterbacks at Ohio, where he also held the titles of Assistant Head Coach

and co-Offensive Coordinator.

During his tenure at Ohio, Gdowski helped mold Tyler Tettleton into one of the greatest quarterbacks in Bobcats' history. Under Gdowski's tutelage, Tettleton set Ohio career records in passing yards and touchdowns, and became the only quarterback in school history to post three straight seasons of at least 2,500 yards passing. In 2013, the Bobcats averaged nearly 27.4 points and 380 yards of total offense, including 245.4 passing yards.

Gdowski's 2011 offense was the most productive unit in modern Ohio University history, totaling 427 points and 6,241 total yards. In all, the Bobcats' offensive unit set eight program records during the year.

Other standout quarterbacks mentored by Gdowski at Ohio were Boo Jackson, (38 career touchdown passes, Theo Scott (20 tocuhdown passes in 2009), Brad Bower and Austen Everson (ranks among team's all-time Top Ten passers in several categories.

Gdowski went to Ohio after eight seasons at New Mexico State. He was the Aggies' recruiting coordinator and quarterbacks coach until 2003 when he took over as offensive coordinator. The Aggies ranked second in the Sun Belt Conference in 2004 in scoring offense and passing offense.

Gdowski began his coaching career at Nebraska, working with the quarterbacks, tight ends and receivers as a graduate assistant from 1991 to 1993. He then moved to South Dakota State, where he coached for three seasons. After two years as quarterbacks and wide receivers coach, Gdowski was promoted to offensive coordinator.

As a player, he earned three letters at Nebraska under legendary coach Tom Osborne. Gdowski was the starting quarterback and team captain for the Cornhuskers in 1989 and was named to the All-Big Eight First Team. He was an eighth round draft choice of the New Orleans Saints that spring.

Gdowski excelled off the field at Nebraska as well. He earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors in 1989 and was awarded the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame Postgraduate Scholarship as well as the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship. A 1990 graduate of Nebraska with a bachelor's in business administration, Gdowski also went on to earn his master's from the school in 1996.

A Fremont, Neb., native, Gdowski and his wife, Sam, have three sons – Isaac, Luke, and Thomas.

### Keven **Lightner** Offensive Line

1st year on Vanderbilt staff

Keven Lightner enters his first season at Vanderbilt as offensive line coach. Lightner and Derek Mason have known each other for more than a decade, working together previously at Ohio U. and New Mexico State.

Lightner spent the last nine seasons mentoring the offensive line at Ohio. Mason was Ohio's wide receivers coach in 2005-06.

Thirteen linemen earned All-Mid-American Conference accolades, including five repeat selections, under Lightner's tutelage. In 2013, the New York Giants took guard Eric Herman in the seventh round of the NFL Draft. He was the first Ohio offensive lineman to be drafted since 1972.

In 2012, Lightner's line paved holes for running back Beau Blankenship, who rushed for a school record 1,604 yards and 15 touchdowns. During his time at Ohio, Lightner saw the Bobcats set single-season records for total offense, scoring, yards per game, passing, touchdowns, completions, first downs and plays. The Bobcats also won the MAC East title three times and played in six bowls.

Prior to working at Ohio, he spent two seasons at New Mexico State, where Mason was the wide receivers coach in 2004.

Together, Lightner and Mason helped New Mexico State lead the Sun Belt Conference in passing and total offense, and ranked second in scoring offense. In 2003, New Mexico State ranked 12th nationally in rushing offense and led the Sun Belt. One of Lightner's top pupils with the Aggies was guard Steve Subia, an Outland Trophy candidate.

Lightner coached the offensive line and served as co-offensive coordinator at Western Kentucky for the 2001 and 2002 seasons. In two years, the Hilltoppers were 20-7 overall, made the I-AA playoffs twice and won the 2002 national championship. Lightner coached three All-Americans and five all-league players at WKU.

Lightner served as an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha for three seasons (1998-2000). The Mavericks won their conference and made the playoffs twice. Lightner also coached two-time All-American guard Chris Bober, who played seven seasons in the NFL.

Prior to UNO, he also served as an assistant coach for two years at Division II Northern (S.D.) State, where he helped the Wolves produce their first 1,000-yard rusher in 25 years.

Before coaching at the college ranks, Lightner spent five years at two Nebraska high schools (Lincoln Northeast and Hastings) coaching the offensive and defensive lines.

Lightner played collegiately at Nebraska, where he earned first team All-Big Eight honors as an offensive tackle in 1987 and participated in the 1988 Hula Bowl. He briefly played professionally in three leagues - the NFL (Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 1988), the CFL (Hamilton Tiger Cats, 1990) and World League of American Football (Montreal Machine, 1991-92).

A native of National, Calif., Lightner earned a bachelor's in secondary education from Nebraska in 1996.

He and his wife, Erin, have a son, Kade, and a daughter, Alexis.

## Marc **Lubick**

#### Wide Receivers Coach 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

Marc Lubick is in his first season at Vanderbilt after serving as an offensive assistant coach with the NFL's Houston Texans. Lubick will mentor Commodore wide receivers.

Lubick served four years with the Texans, including the last two seasons as assistant wide receivers coach. While in Houston, he also served with current Vanderbilt offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Karl Dorrell.

In Houston, Lubick worked with likely future Hall of Famer Andre Johnson, who continued to post stunning receiving statistics. In 2013, Johnson registered 1,407 receiving yards on 109 catches. In 2012, he recorded a benchmark season earning his sixth Pro Bowl trip and All-Pro recognition posting 112 passes and 1,598 receiving yards. It marked the second time in NFL history a player recorded more than 100 receptions and 1,500 yards in his 10th season or later.

In 2010-11, Lubick was part of a staff that guided the Texans' offense to several franchise records, including points scored and total yardage.

Lubick has 14 seasons of coaching experience, including eight seasons collegiately at Colorado State. He served as CSU's tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator from 2008-09 and wide receivers coach from 2005-07. During that time, he coached seventh-round pick and former Texans receiver David Anderson, along with former free agent signee Dustin Osborn.

Lubick launched his coaching career in 2000 as a defensive student assistant at CSU. Lubick spent the 2002 season was an academic graduate assistant coach at CSU, working with wide receivers. After the 2002 campaign, Lubick joined the St. Louis Rams for two years.

Lubick comes from a family of successful coaches.

His father, Sonny, is considered the most successful head football coach in Colorado State history. In addition to the tenure at CSU, his father served three years as head coach at Montana State, and also was a successful defensive coordinator at Miami (Fla.) and Stanford.

Marc's brother, Matt, serves as wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator at the University of Oregon. He was the 2012 FootballScoop.com Wide Receivers Coach of the Year in 2012.

Lubick earned his bachelor's degree in Health and Exercise Science from CSU in 2001 after playing collegiately as a defensive back at Montana State University from 1997-99.

### Frank **Maile** Defensive Lin

#### Defensive Line Coach 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

Frank Maile enters his first year on the Commodore staff, contributing his efforts as defensive line coach.

Maile served the last six seasons at his alma mater, Utah State, including the last three as defensive line coach.

During the last three years, Utah State has enjoyed virtually unparalleled success. Like Vanderbilt, the Aggies just played in their third straight postseason game for the first time in school history and has a combined 28-13 over the three-year span.

In 2013, Maile's defensive line helped Utah State to a 9-5 overall record, capped by a 21-14 victory over No. 24 Northern Illinois and Heisman Trophy candidate Jordan Lynch in the Poinsettia Bowl. The USU unit held NIU's high-powered offense in check, and limited Lynch to just 39 rushing yards.

Utah State's 2013 defense ranked seventh in the nation in scoring defense (17.1 pts.), 8th in rushing defense, 12th in total defense and 15th in pass defense efficiency.

During the 2012 season, Maile helped Utah State's defense rank first in the Western Athletic Conference and seventh in the nation in scoring defense and sixth nationally in sacks. The unit also paced the WAC in total defense, passing defense and pass efficiency defense, and ranked second in the conference in rushing defense.

### MAILE'S COACHING CAREER

Utah State's 2012 defense also led the WAC and ranked second in the nation in red zone efficiency after allowing just 13 touchdowns and 15 field goals on 44 trips inside the 20-yard line.

In 2012, Maile coached three defensive linemen to

All-WAC honors: senior Al Lapuaho, redshirt freshman Jordan Nielsen and junior Connor Williams.

As a senior in 2012, Lapuaho finished with 35 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks. Nielsen finished with 5.0 sacks and 6.5 tackles for loss. Nielsen had 4.5 sacks and blocked two kicks during the year. Williams finished the 2012 with a team-high six sacks.

During the 2011 season, Maile helped Utah State's defense end the year ranking first in the WAC in total defense, second in the conference in rushing defense and tackles for loss, and third in the league in pass efficiency defense and quarterack sacks.

In 2011, Maile coached senior defensive end Levi Koskan who earned second-team All-WAC honors after finishing the year with 27 tackles, 10.0 tackles for loss and a team-best 5.5 sacks, as well as six quarterback hurries. Overall, Koskan ranked eighth in the WAC in sacks and 12th in tackles for loss. Maile also coached Quinn Garner and Lapuaho that season, with both contributing 31 total totals.

Prior to joining the Aggies as a full-time position coach, Maile spent two years as a strength and conditioning graduate assistant at Utah State.

Maile was a standout defensive lineman for the Aggies from 2004-07, enjoying 21 career games. He was a senior co-captain, finishing his career with 19 tackles for loss among 71 total stops. He also earned his bachelor's in interdisciplinary studies and his master's in education from Iltah State

A native of West Valley City, Utah, Maile was a first-team all-state defensive lineman at Alta (Utah) High School. He went on an LDS Church Mission to the Dominican Republic from 2001-03.

Maile, and his wife, Heather, have three sons, Maximus, Samson and Titan, and one daughter, Cecilia.

#### Defensive Secondary Coach 1st vear on Vanderbilt staff

Brett Maxie joins Derek Mason's Vanderbilt staff as secondary coach after serving the last two years in a similar role with the crosstown Tennessee Titans.

After 16 seasons in the National Football League. Maxie's role as mentor of the

Vanderbilt secondary is his first in the collegiate coaching ranks.

In 2013, Maxie coached an improved Titans' defensive backfield paced by cornerback Alterraun Verner, who earned All-Pro recognition for the first time after recording a career-high five interceptions. In 2012, another young Titan cornerback, Jason McCourty, posted four interceptions as the Tennessee defense ranked seventh in the NFL with 19 interceptions.

Maxie joined Tennessee after four seasons as secondary coach for the Dallas Cowboys, working for noted defensive coordinators Wade Phillips and Rob Ryan. In 2008, Maxie's secondary helped the Cowboys rank fifth in the NFL in passing defense. One of Maxie's leading players in Dallas, cornerback Terence Newman, totaled 16 interceptions during the four-year tenure in Dallas. Another cornerback, Mike Jenkins, earned Pro Bowl honors in 2009.

In 2007, Maxie mentored the Miami Dolphins secondary under coordinator noted Dom Capers. The Dolphins produced the NFL's fourth-best passing defense that year, limiting opponents to 188.7 passing yards per game.

During his tenure in Atlanta, Maxie helped cornerback DeAngelo Hall develop into a two-time Pro Bowler. The 2004 season saw the Falcons secondary register a club-record five touchdowns, including four via interception returns.

Prior to working in Atlanta, Maxie worked with the San Francisco 49ers from 1999 to 2003, including three seasons as the assistant secondary coach and the final two

years as secondary coach. From 2001-03, Maxie's 49er secondary totaled 66 interceptions - the third highest number in the NFL during that

His first NFL coaching job came in 1998 as a quality control coach with the Carolina Panthers.

Maxie started a distinguished 13-year NFL playing career as an undrafted safety from Texas Southern, signing with the New Orleans Saints. He played in 153 NFL games, earning 104 starts, and recording 23 interceptions and three touchdowns. Maxie played nine seasons (1985-93) with the Saints, one season in Atlanta (1994), two years in Carolina (1995-96) and finished his career with one year in San Francisco (1997).

Maxie and his wife, Angela, have two sons, Brett and Adam, and two daughters, Maya and Olivia. At Texas Southern, he earned his degree in

# Kenwick **Thompson**

#### Outside Linebackers Coach 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

Kenwick Thompson, defensive coordinator at San Jose State last year, will serve as outside linebackers coach at Vanderbilt.

Prior to joining San Jose State for the 2013 campaign, Thompson served six years as a

key defensive assistant coach at the University of California under Head Coach Jeff Tedford.

At San Jose State, Thompson's responsibilities included mentoring Spartan linebackers. One of his top players was linebacker Keith Smith, who became just the second San Jose State player to become a four-year All-Mountain West recipient. As a senior captain under Thompson, Smith earned First Team All-MVC honors after leading the NCAA with 159 total tackles. His performances included back-to-back, 20-tackle efforts against Minnesota and Utah State. In addition to Smith, Thompson also mentored First Team All-MVC defensive back Bene Benwikere at San Jose State. Benwikere matched the Spartan career record with 14 interceptions, including five picks as a senior.

From 2007-12, Thompson worked as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of California, helping the Golden Bears to four bowl games. In 2012, he was also named Cal's associate head coach.

In 2011, Thompson's linebacker corps helped the Golden Bears top the Pac-12 in both total defense (332.9 yards) and pass defense (204.2 yards) during a 7-6 regular season that concluded with a Holiday Bowl appearance. In 2010, the Golden Bears also led the Pac-12 in total defense.

Several of Thompson's linebackers at Cal earned all-conference recognition, including 2011 All-America and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year Mychal Kendricks.

Thompson spent the 2001-06 seasons at San Jose State in a variety of coaching roles under head coaches Fitz Hill and Dick Tomey. His positions included linebackers coach in 2001-03, recruiting coordinator in 2002-03, defensive line coach in 2004 and defensive tackles coach in 2006.

From 1994-2000, Thompson served on the coaching staff at Texas Southern, including the last five seasons as defensive coordinator.

As a collegiate player, he was a defensive standout and team captain at Harding (Ark.) University, earning all-conference honors as a senior. Thompson earned his undergraduate degree from Harding in 1992.

Thompson's first coaching position came in a player-coach capacity in the Italian-American Professional Football League in 1990. The following season, Thompson was named as a graduate assistant at his alma mater.

Thompson and his wife, Monica, have two sons, Jaxson and Jacob.

In 2013, Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason

and Hughan worked together at Stanford, with Mason serving as associate head coach/defensive coordinator and Hughan as a sports performance coach for the Cardinal football squad.

A native of Oxford, Conn., Hughan helped mold the 2013 Pac-12 champs into one of the nation's most physical teams. Stanford finished the season with an 11-3 record and second straight Rose Bowl appearance.

Prior to joining Stanford, Hughan worked in the strength and conditioning departments with three National Football Leagues teams.

In 2011, Hughan was named as Head Strength and Conditioning Coach of the New York Jets. He served with the Jets franchise through the 2012-13 regular seasons.

Hughan accepted the Jets position after serving a three-year tenure as assistant strength coach with the Atlanta Falcons (2008-10) and four-year stint as assistant strength coach with the Oakland Raiders (200407).

Before nearly a decade of work in the NFL, Hughan worked three years as Assistant Director of Strength and Conditioning at the University of Missouri. During his time in Columbia, Hughan worked with the Tiger football team and more than a dozen other varsity sports. He was promoted to interim director of the Missouri department before leaving for the position in Oakland.

He served as a graduate assistant in the strength and conditioning department at Columbia (1999-2000) after working one season with the Kansas City Royals' Triple-A baseball team, Omaha Golden Spikes.

Hughan's first job was as a strength and conditioning intern at Yale (1997-98). He earned his undergraduate degree in exercise science from Springfield College (Mass.) in 1998 and later a master's degree in applied physiology from Columbia University in New York City.
