2004 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- The Southeastern Conference had a nation-leading five teams ranked in either the final Associated Press or the USA Today/ESPN polls. Auburn (#2 in both polls), Georgia (#6 - USA Today/ESPN; #7 - AP), Tennessee (#13 - AP; #15 - USA Today/ESPN) and LSU (#16 in both polls) were ranked in both final polls while Florida was ranked #25 in the final USA Today/ESPN poll.
- Counting post-season bowl games, the Southeastern Conference was 28-14 (.667) against non-conference opponents in 2004-05. The SEC has won at least two-thirds of its non-conference games every year for the past 14 seasons (since 1991). This year, the SEC's winning percentage was third among the 11 Division I-A conferences - Big 12 (32-11, .744) and ACC (27-13, .675).
- For the 24th straight season, the Southeastern Conference led the nation in total attendance with 5,879,323 fans attending 79 home games in SEC stadiums. Also, for the seventh straight season, the SEC led in average attendance, with an average of 74,421 fans at SEC stadiums in 2004. SEC stadiums were filled to 95.98 percent capacity in 2004.
- Seven Southeastern Conference football student-athletes won individual post-season awards following the 2004 season. Georgia senior defensive end David Pollack earned the Chuck Bednarik Award (top defensive player), Rotary Lombardi Award (top defensive lineman), Lott Trophy (excellence on and off playing field) and the Ted Hendicks Award (top defensive end). LSU senior Ben Wilkerson was a co-winner of the Rimington Award as the nation's top center and Auburn senior cornerback Carlos Rogers won the Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back. Tennessee senior offensive lineman Michael Munoz won the Vincent DePaul Draddy Award as the nation's top football scholar-athlete while South Carolina freshman wide receiver Tim Frisby was the recipient of the Disney Wide World of Sports Spirit Award and Kentucky senior punter Sevin Suurovic won the Wyndham New Orleans Bowl Inspirational Award. Georgia senior quarterback David Greene, along with Munoz, were recipients of National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete fellowships.
- The Southeastern Conference had six players listed on the NCAA Consensus All-America Football Team. The players listed on the consensus All-America team had to reach the majority of votes competing against players at that position only in the five first-team All-America squads used by the NCAA for this chart - Associated Press, Football Writers Association of America, American Football Coaches Association, Walter Camp Foundation and The Sporting News. The SEC's six players are Tennessee offensive tackle Michael Munoz, LSU center Ben Wilkerson, Georgia defensive end David Pollack, LSU defensive end Marcus Spears, Auburn cornerback Carlos Rogers and Georgia safety Thomas Davis.

CBS SPORTS - The 2004 season marks the ninth year for CBS as the league's national network television partner. CBS will televise up to 15 games per year throughout the season. CBS will normally broadcast its SEC games in the late afternoon window beginning at 3:30 p.m. ET. CBS provides exclusive national network broadcasts of conference home games during the season. CBS televised the SEC Football Championship Game on Dec. 4 at 6 p.m. ET.

ESPN/ESPN2, the SEC's national cable provider, may televise up to 18 regular season games each year, with a minimum of nine on ESPN through the season.

JEFFERSON-PILOT SPORTS (JP) will continue its highly successful SEC Football Game of the Week this season. The Charlotte, N.C. company, holds the rights to televise 13 games annually throughout the nine-state SEC region on a syndicated basis. The games will be broadcast in the early afternoon at 12:30 p.m. ET.

FOX Sports Net South (FSNS), FOX Sports Net Southwest (FSNSW), FOX College Sports (FCS) and Sunshine Network (SUN) together form **SEC-TV**, the league's regional cable package. SEC-TV Weekly airs Thursday nights and Saturday mornings during the season, highlighting all of the SEC's athletic teams and events.

Given by the Boomer Esiason Foundation to the nation's top center. This year's winners are Michigan's David Baas and LSU senior Ben Wilkerson.

JIM THORPE AWARD

Given by the Jim Thorpe Athletic Club of Oklahoma City to the nation's top defensive back. This year's winner is Auburn senior cornerback Carlos Rogers.

WYNDHAM NEW ORLEANS BOWL INSPIRATIONAL AWARD

Presented by the Wyndham New Orleans Bowl to a Division I-A football student-athlete who has achieved academic and intercollegiate success and demonstrated superior perseverance. This year's winner is Kentucky senior punter Sevin Sucurovic.

NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION SCHOLAR-ATHLETES

The National Football Foundation's Awards Committee selects approximately 15 scholar-athletes from across the country for these prestigious \$18,000 fellowships that can be used for postgraduate studies. This year, two of the eight Division I-A recipients were from the SEC - Tennessee senior offensive lineman Michael Munoz and Georgia senior quarterback David Greene.

VINCENT DEPAUL DRADDY AWARD

Presented by the National Football Foundation, it is often referred to as the "Academic Heisman." The Draddy Award is given to the nation's top scholar-athlete and awards a \$25,000 postgraduate scholarship. This year's winner is Tennessee senior offensive lineman Michael Munoz. An SEC student-athlete has won this award four of the last nine seasons.

LOTT TROPHY

Given by the Pacific Club in Newport Beach, Calif., it is named for NFL Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, the accolade is given to the IMPACT Defensive Player of the Year. The award recognizes a player's success both on and off the field, IMPACT is an acronym for Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity. This year's winner is Georgia senior defensive end David Pollack.

DISNEY WIDE WORLD OF SPORTS SPIRIT AWARD

Disney's Wide World of Sports Spirit Award is presented annually to college football's most inspirational individual or team. This year's recipient is South Carolina freshman wide receiver Tim Frisby.

BROYLES AWARD

Presented by Downtown Rotary Club of Little Rock to nation's top assistant football coach. This year's winner is Auburn defensive coordinator Gene Chizik.

THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- More than 1,900 student-athletes were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003-04. Members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll must have a 3.0 grade point average for either the previous academic year or his/her academic career.
- During the 2003-04 academic year, the Southeastern Conference had 35 student-athletes selected CoSIDA Academic All-America, tied with the Big 12 for the most of any conference in the nation. The SEC have 15 first-team Academic All-Americans in 2003-04, but also placed 15 on second-teams and five on third-teams, giving the league a total of 35 student-athletes honored.
- During the last eight years, the SEC has had 15 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since 1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award. In 2004, Alabama gymnast Kristin Sterner, Tennessee basketball player Kara Lawson and Ole Miss football player Eli Manning were named recipients of this award.
- The Southeastern Conference had three student-athletes named by the National Football Foundation as National Scholar-Athletes for the second straight year. In 2003, the NFF honored 14 student-athletes from all classifications. In Division I-A, the SEC had three of the six student-athletes honored.

FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The SEC was the first conference in the nation to assemble a Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Two representatives from each of the SEC member schools are selected to serve on the committee which meets twice a year to discuss issues of concern to the student-athlete.
- The SEC, in conjunction with the ALLTEL Corporation, annually awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Alabama soccer player Lauren Imwalle and Auburn diver Caesar Garcia were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners in 2003-04.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community. Georgia football player Brett Kirouac and Tennessee women's basketball player Kara Lawson were named recipients of this award in 2003.
- The SEC was the first conference to develop a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, among other things, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The conference office supplies each SEC institution with a \$2000 grant each year to assist with stipends for minority and female student internship opportunities. This season, the conference office reinstated a minority internship program that will offer opportunities for growth in the athletic industry.

IN THE COMMUNITY

- The SEC launched its education initiative in 2002, utilizing the platform of inter-collegiate athletics to provide elementary school teachers with relevant resources they can use to educate and prepare children for life.

Phase I: The SEC became the nation's first conference to develop customized educational software, providing a CD Rom containing SEC branded content correlating to national educational standards. The program reached one million students during the 2002-03 academic year. It was sent to every elementary school and public library in nine-state SEC region. Approximately 2,000 schools have registered software since Sept. 2002.

Phase II: The SEC introduced a web-based program in the fall 2003 targeted at K through 8th grade students. The online software features educational content that correlates to state standards, as well as a real-time reporting tool for teachers to track the progress of individual students. More than 1,400 schools are now utilizing this online program.

Phase III: The SEC is offering an enhanced version of the Kid's College online program to schools for the 2004-05 academic year, as well as the Character Development Series on CD-Rom called STAR Sportsmanship. The CD features former SEC standouts Peyton and Eli Manning, Shaun Alexander and Karar Lawson. The CD will be distributed through conference and corporate outlets.

- SECKids.com is an all new website uniquely designed for school age students. Now fan's of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECKids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights. Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's collegiate software in their classroom.
- The SEC and its member institutions have joined in a partnership with the nine Special Olympics state organizations in the SEC region. The partnership is featured on public service announcements aired on SEC telecasts and Special Olympics will also participate in the Dr Pepper SEC FanFare, held in conjunction with the SEC Football and Basketball Championships.
- The SEC and its corporate partners host youth clinics each year in conjunction with several conference events, including the football championship game, the men's and women's basketball tournaments, the baseball tournament and the volleyball tournament. These clinics provide children from host cities the opportunity to receive instruction from SEC and other area coaches.
- The SEC selects a Good Works Team in all of its sports. The Good Works Team features a representative from each institution who has shown a commitment to community service.

OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS

- Since 1990, the SEC has won 97 team and 610 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally 76.5 percent of the total sports competed in (221 of 289). Nine of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the 20 sponsored sports of the Southeastern Conference, the SEC had a higher national finish than any other conference in the nation in 2003-04. In a ranking system, using national polls and NCAA Championships finishes, the SEC had 1029.5 points, edging second-place Pac-10 with 909 points. The Big 12 was third with 571.9 points followed by the Big Ten with 504.5 and the Atlantic Coast with 370.5 points. In nine of its 20 sponsored sports, the SEC had teams finish in the top two in the nation and had at least one team ranked or finish in the top 10 in 19 of 20 sports the league sponsors.

FOR THE FANS AND ALUMNI

- For the 23rd straight season, the SEC recorded the largest total and average football attendance of any conference in the country. More than six million fans attended SEC football games in 2003 while stadiums were filled to almost 97.1 percent of capacity.
- The SEC is the only conference that is guaranteed a national network appearance in football each week through its contract with CBS Sports. The network also televises SEC men's and women's basketball games.
- The SEC also has an extensive agreement with FOX Sports Net South to televise original programming featuring conference sports, including live Olympic Sports coverage and conference championships. FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sunshine Network combine to form SEC-TV, which blankets the Southern United States.
