- Florida narrowly edged Texas A&M as the preseasn favorite to win the 2014 SEC title in a poll of the league's coaches. The Gators received 164 points (eight first-place votes), narrowly topping Texas A&M's 162 points (six first place votes).
- Eight players from SEC soccer programs have been named to the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy Watch List Sabrina D'Angelo (SC), Arin Gilliland (UK), Shea Groom (AM), Savannah Jordan (UF), Havana Solaun (UF), Meghan Streight (AM), Christen Westphal (UF) and Hannah Wilkinson (UT).
- Five players that earned 2013 NSCAA All-America honors return for the 2014 season, including first team selection Sabrina D'Angelo (SC); second team picks Christen Westphal (UF) and Savannah Jordan (UF); in addition to third team All-Americas Shea Groom (AM) and Arin Gilliland (UK).
- In 2013, six SEC teams advanced to postseason play. It is the sixth time in the past seven seasons that at least six teams have received postseason bids.
- Each of the SEC teams advancing to postseason play in 2013 won their first round match.
- All 14 SEC teams earned the NSCAA/adidas College Team Academic Award in 2013.
- The SEC Network and its accompanying digital platform will air SEC content 24/7. The network will televise events from across the SEC's 21 sports annually, including 17 regular season soccer matches. Additionally, more than 100 additional soccer matches will be offered exclusively on the digital platform SEC Network +.
- Alabama returns nine starters and 12 letterwinners but 15 members of the squad are either sophomores (5) or freshmen (10).
- Arkansas returns 20 players, including eight regular starters, from the 2013 team that advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.
- Auburn reached the SEC Tournament for the

13th-straight year in 2013, the second-longest active streak in the conference behind only Florida (19).

- Florida opens 2014 as No. 8 on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) preseason poll. This is the program's 18th consecutive appearance in the NSCAA preseason poll.
- Georgia returns six starters and 17 letterwinners from the 2013 campaign in which the Bulldogs went 12-7-1 and 5-5-1 in conference, with a trip to the SEC Championships quarterfinals.
- Kentucky returns eight of 11 starters from the best season in program history in 2013, where UK collected 14 wins, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- LSU returns its top three scorers and six of their top seven scorers from a season ago, including leading goal scorer Summer Clarke with 10 goals.
- Ole Miss' 16 wins last season set the school record for wins in a season as the Rebels hosted an NCAA Tournament game for the first time.
- Mississippi State has six starters returning, including lone senior Shannen Jainudeen. The squad will be young, with 19 newcomers joining the squad.
- Missouri returns the team's top two point producers from 2013, seniors Kaysie Clark and Taylor Grant.
- South Carolina finished 2013 with a 17-4-2 (8-2-1 SEC) record and went undefeated at home (11-0-0) in one of the most successful seasons in program history.
- Tennessee begins its third season under coach Brian Pensky and UT returns 17 players from last season's squad that went 8-7-4, which marked UT's third-consecutive and 14th-overall winning season.
- The Aggies return 10 starters from 2013, of which five were All-SEC selections, including first-teamers Shea Groom and Meghan Streight.
- Vanderbilt returns 21 letterwinners and nine starters, including three who started all 19 games.

Preseason Poll

Florida narrowly edged Texas A&M as the favorite to claim the 2014 Southeastern Conference women's soccer title in voting by the league's 14 head coaches. This marks the 16th time that Florida has been tabbed by the coaches to win the title.

The Gators received 164 points that included eight first-place votes, topping the Aggies' 162 points (six first-place votes). Florida and Texas A&M shared the 2013 SEC title by posting identical 9-2-0 league records.

Florida returns 11 starters from last season, including MAC Hermann Award candidates Savannah Jordan, Havana Solaun and Christen Westphal. Texas A&M returns 10 starters from 2013, of which five were All-SEC selections, including first-teamers Shea Groom and Meghan Streight and second-teamers Jordan Day, Leigh Edwards and Kelley Monoque.

Points were compiled on a 13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis, though each coach was not allowed to vote for their own team.



Format

The format of the tournament is a single-elimination tournament of the top 10 teams in the Conference. The tournament champion shall be the SEC representative to the NCAA championship.

The following point system will be implemented to determine regular season standings and seeding for the tournament: a win counts as three points, a tie as one and a loss as zero points. If a game is canceled, neither team will receive a point and the standings will be determined by average points per game.

The two teams in each division with the highest number of points will be the divisional champions.

The tournament shall be played in a Monday-Wednesday-Friday-Sunday format with Thursday and Saturday designated as days off (practice days).

Seeding

The tournament will be seeded 1-10 regardless of division based on the point system implemented to determine regular season standings. If teams are tied, the following procedures, in order as follows, will be used to break the tie:

Two-Team Tie – The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the tied teams.
- B. Points earned versus common opponents. 97
- C. Goal differential versus common opponents.
- D. Goals scored versus common opponents.

- E. Won-Lost record of the two teams versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- F. Goal differential versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- G. Goals scored versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- H. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

Three-Team Tie (or more) – The following procedure will be used until the tie is broken. If at any time this tie breaker results in only two remaining tied teams, then the two-team tiebreaker will be used beginning with Subsection A in that procedure and continuing from that point:

- A. If all teams have played one another, then most points earned in those matches
- B. If all teams have not played, but one team has defeated all teams in the tie break, then that team breaks the tie and shall be placed highest. Remaining teams will continue with the tie break procedure.
- C. If all teams have not played one another and a team does not have all wins over the tied teams, then use Subsection B in the two-team tie break procedures and continue through the two team tie-break procedures until ties between all teams are broken (except Subsection H will read "if three or more teams are still tied, the Commissioner will conduct a draw").

ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE

Overall: 0-0 SEC: 0-0

Alabama returns nine starters and 12 letterwinners off last season's squad, which includes four seniors from a year ago. However, the Tide will be a young team as 15 members of the squad are either sophomores (5) or freshmen (10). The Crimson Tide returns four of its top five offensive leaders in total points from a year ago. Highlighting the list of returning scorers is senior Pia Rijsdijk (7g, 4a/18 pts), who led the team in goals and points last season. Rijsdijk was one of the top players in league play a year ago. After recording only one point in nonconference play, the Numansdorp, Netherlands native accounted for 17 of her 18 points against SEC competition. Joining Rijsdijk in the offensive attack will be seniors Merel van Dongen (4g, 0a), Theresa Diederich (3g, 2a) and Laura Lee Smith (3g, Oa). Senior Merel Van Dongen returns for her senior season after missing the final 12 games of last year with a knee injury. She injured the knee in mid-September training with the Netherlands Women's National Team, Van Donaen, who was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year and an second team All-SEC performer in 2012, scored four goals in the team's first six games a year ago, including a pair of game-winners. Senior Pia Rijsdijk is closing in on the program's all-time shots record, which was set just last year by Molly Atherton. Atherton set the record last year and finished her career with 199 shots. Rijsdijk enters the 2014 campaign with 178 career shots, which ranks second in program history. If she accomplishes the feat, she would become the first player in program history to record 200 shots in a career.

ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS

Arkansas returns 20 players, including eight regular starters, from the 2013 team that won a program record 15 games (15-8-1) en route to advancing to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen in its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. Picked first-ever NCAA Tournament win on the road at Oklahoma State before advancing to the third round with a win over St. John's in Durham, N.C. Arkansas posted a program single-season record eight shutouts in 2013, while it won 11 one-goal games and five overtime contests. One of four SEC schools to rank in the top five in the conference in goals per game and total shutouts in 2013. The Razorbacks return 75 percent of their scoring (102-of-136 points) led by junior Ashleigh Ellenwood, who ranked in the top 10 in the SEC in points (35/7th), goals (14/6th), assists (7/T-7th) and game-winning goals (6/T-3rd). Arkansas returns eight of its top 11 scorers, who accounted for 33 of the 46 goals scored last season and 36 of the 44 assists handed out. Started the 2013 campaign 7-0, cracking the top 25 for the first time in program history. Head coach Colby Hale enters his third year at the helm and has orchestrated the Razorbacks to 24 wins over his first two seasons, the most over any two-year span in program history.

2014 is season No. 20 for the Gator soccer program. In the program's previous 19 seasons, the Gators have compiled a 337-90-28 (.771) record, advanced to NCAA play in 17 years and won the 1998 NCAA title and claimed a league-leading 13 Southeastern Conference crowns. Florida opens 2014 as No. 8 on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) preseason poll. This is the program's 18th consecutive appearance in the NSCAA preseason poll. A&M earned its 19th consecutive NCAA Tournament berth in 2013, ending their season at 18-5-2 after making the 12th Sweet 16 appearance in school annals. The Aggies are one of five schools to make it to every NCAA Championship since 1995. The other schools include North Carolina (1982-2013), Notre Dame (1993-2013), Virginia (1994-2013) and Penn State (1995-2012). Texas A&M owns a 192-29-5 (.861) all-time record at Ellis Field (formerly Aggie Soccer Stadium). The Maroon and White have called the field home since the 1994 season, playing the inaugural 1993 season at Old Tiger Field. Since 2005, the Aggies have registered a 92-13-4 (.862) mark on the friendly pitch.
