SEC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK Taylor Grant, Missouri

F • 5-3 • Sr. • The Colony, Texas

Grant scored both Mizzou game-winners as the Tigers earned two wins last weekend to improve to 5-1-2 on the year. Against Montana on Sept. 12, Grant sealed Missouri's 4-3 comeback victory with the game-winner in the 105th minute of play after the team trailed 3-1 late in the second half. Two days later, Grant tallied Mizzou's second goal, the ultimate game-winner, in a 3-1 win over Cal State-Northridge. The goals were the fifth and sixth of the year for Grant to set a new single-season best.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK Sabrina D'Angelo, South Carolina

GK • 5-8 • Sr. • Welland, Ontario, Canada

D'Angelo continues to close in on the program shutout record of 31 after collecting her 25th and 26th career shutouts at the USF Soccer Classic with clean sheets against USF and FGCU. D'Angelo has seven shutouts this season and allowed just one goal in non-conference play for the second-straight year. Every other league team has allowed four or more goals and no team has registered more than four shutouts. Her goals against average of 0.12 leads the league and ranks in the top six in the country. Entering the weekend with 10 saves, she posted nine in the two weekend matches in the Sunshine State, including seven against USF.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK Savannah McCaskill, South Carolina

F • 5-4 • Chapin, S.C.

McCaskill was one of two Gamecocks to post a three-point weekend at the USF Soccer Classic. McCaskill earned the assist on sophomore Sophie Groff's goal vs. UCF Friday. On Sunday vs. Florida Gulf Coast, the pair connected again, this time with McCaskill on the scoring end when the freshman netted her first career goal in the 81st minute to cap a 2-0 win and an undefeated weekend. It is Mc-Caskill's first multi-point weekend. The Gamecock leads the team with 18 shots this year and put three of her four weekend shots on frame.

AROUND THE LEAGUE

- The full schedule of conference play begins this weekend with a Thursday night match between Tennessee and Texas A&M that will be televised on the SEC Network at 7 p.m. ET.
- SEC teams have posted a 68-28-10 (.689) record in non-conference action. They have out scored their non-conference opponents 221-102.
- Six SEC teams are receiving mention in the latest NSCAA/Continental Tire poll. Florida is ranked No. 7 while Texas A&M is 11th, South Carolina is 14th and Georgia is 24th. Auburn and Ole Miss are both receiving votes.
- Arkansas and Vanderbilt enjoyed their highest scoring outputs in several years on the final weekend before league play. Arkansas's six goals against Missouri State is its most since 2008 while Vanderbilt's six goals against UT Chattanooga is its most since the 2007 season.
- South Carolina goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo has recorded seven shutouts in eight games this season. Georgia freshman Louise Hogrell has four shutouts in seven outings.
- Texas A&M's Kelley Monogue ranks fifth among active NCAA players with 42 goals and 103 points.
- The SEC Network and its accompanying digital platform will air 75 of the 77 SEC league soccer matches this season. The SEC Network will televise 17 regular season league matches while ESPNU will show four. The conference's digital platform SEC Network+ - will show 54 regular season league matches.

Preseason Poll

Florida narrowly edged Texas A&M as the favorite to claim the 2014 South-eastern Conference women's soccer title in voting by the league's 14 head coaches. This marks the 16th time that Florida has been tabbed by the coaches to win the title.

The Gators received 164 points that included eight first-place votes, topping the Aggies' 162 points (six first-place votes). Florida and Texas A&M shared the 2013 SEC title by posting identical 9-2-0 league records.

Florida returns 11 starters from last season, including MAC Hermann Award candidates Savannah Jordan, Havana Solaun and Christen Westphal. Texas A&M returns 10 starters from 2013, of which five were All-SEC selections, including first-teamers Shea Groom and Meghan Streight and second-teamers Jordan Day, Leigh Edwards and Kelley Monogue.

Points were compiled on a 13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis, though each coach was not allowed to vote for their own team.



Format

The format of the tournament is a single-elimination tournament of the top 10 teams in the Conference. The tournament champion shall be the SEC representative to the NCAA championship.

The following point system will be implemented to determine regular season standings and seeding for the tournament: a win counts as three points, a tie as one and a loss as zero points. If a game is canceled, neither team will receive a point and the standings will be determined by average points per game.

The two teams in each division with the highest number of points will be the divisional champions.

The tournament shall be played in a Monday-Wednesday-Friday-Sunday format with Thursday and Saturday designated as days off (practice days).

Seeding

The tournament will be seeded 1-10 regardless of division based on the point system implemented to determine regular season standings. If teams are tied, the following procedures, in order as follows, will be used to break the tie:

Two-Team Tie – The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the tied teams.
- B. Points earned versus common opponents.
- C. Goal differential versus common opponents.
- D. Goals scored versus common opponents.

- E. Won-Lost record of the two teams versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- F. Goal differential versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- G. Goals scored versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- H. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

Three-Team Tie (or more) – The following procedure will be used until the tie is broken. If at any time this tie breaker results in only two remaining tied teams, then the two-team tiebreaker will be used beginning with Subsection A in that procedure and continuing from that point:

- A. If all teams have played one another, then most points earned in those matches
- B. If all teams have not played, but one team has defeated all teams in the tie break, then that team breaks the tie and shall be placed highest. Remaining teams will continue with the tie break procedure.
- C. If all teams have not played one another and a team does not have all wins over the tied teams, then use Subsection B in the two-team tie break procedures and continue through the two team tie-break procedures until ties between all teams are broken (except Subsection H will read "if three or more teams are still tied, the Commissioner will conduct a draw").

ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE

The Tide takes on UAB this weekend in a Friday instate matchup. UAB owns the all-time series 7-6-1, but UA has won the last four contests. Alabama fell to No. 3-ranked Virginia, 3-0, on Friday night in women's soccer action. The game was played front of a crowd of 1,308 fans, the second-biggest crowd in the history of the Alabama Soccer Complex. The team scored a goal in each half and cruised to a 2-0 victory over Jacksonville State on Sunday night at the Alabama Soccer Complex. The Crimson Tide dominated play from the opening whistle, outshooting the Gamecocks, 30-3, on the night, which included a 10-1 edge in shots on goal and an 11-1 advantage on corner kicks. Alabama is now 3-2-1 on the season.

TEXAS A&M AGGIES

Overall: 6-1-1 SEC: 0-0-0

The Aggies boast one of the most experienced squad in the nation for 2014. Currently, Texas A&M has six of the top 12 active players in terms of games played. Allie Bailey and Meghan Streight enter the weekend tied for fourth among all active players with 82 matches. Kelley Monogue is tied with two others for sixth place with 81 matches under her belt. Leigh Edwards is tied with Florida's Annie Speese for ninth place with 80 matches. Annie Kunz and Bianca Brinson are tied for 11th place with 78 matches. Seven of the Aggies' 20 goals this season have come on set pieces, including four corner kicks, two free kicks and one penalty kick. A&M scored on a corner kick in each of its first four matches. Kelley Monogue ranks fifth among active NCAA Division I players with 42 goals and 103 points. Monogue is one point shy of Kristen Strutz (104 - 2000-03) for fifth place on the Aggies' all-time points list. The Aggies current home win streak stands at 14 matches dating back to September 8, 2013. The streak ranks fifth all-time. It is the fourth-longest win streak for the Aggies at Ellis Field. With her goal against Marquette, Shea Groom became the 12th player in school history with 30 career goals. It marks the first time since the end of the 1996 season that the Aggies have three 30-goal scorers on the same squad (Monogue -42, Kunz – 32, Groom – 30). The Aggies have beat the defending champions of the Atlantic 10 Conference (Dayton), Southland Conference (Stephen F. Austin), American Athletic Conference (UCF) and Missouri Valley Conference (Illinois State), Atlantic Sun Conference (Florida Gulf Coast) and Big East Conference (Marquette this season by a combined score of 17-5, including three shutouts.

VANDERBILT COMMODORES

The Commodores posted two shutouts in a pair of wins over Lipscomb and Chattanooga this past weekend. On Friday, senior Gena Inbusch scored her first goal of the season in the 43rd minute, off an assist from senior Ashley Oswald, to lift Vanderbilt to a 1-0 victory over Lipscomb. On Sunday, the Commodores rolled past another in-state rival, Chattanooga, for a 6-0 victory. The six goals were the most scored by a Vanderbilt team since a 6-0 win over Tennessee Tech on Sept. 9, 2007. The Commodores scored five goals by halftime against the Mocs. In all, Simone Charley, Colby Ciarrocca, Oswald, Inbusch, Taylor Elliott and Sasha Gray scored for the 'Dores. Vanderbilt, which used 28 players, took a season-high 47 shots and allowed UTC to get just one shot off. Vanderbilt entered the game with just eight goals on the season but nearly doubled that total in one game. The Commodores also once again did not allow a first-half goal. They have yet to allow a goal in the opening half this season. Vanderbilt has held its opponents scoreless over the last 201 minutes, last giving up a goal on Sept. 7 to North Texas. With the win, Vanderbilt (5-3) surpasses its entire win total (four) from last year. The Commodores now begin SEC play at 2 p.m. on Sunday at Georgia in a game televised on the SEC Network.
