#### SEC RUNNERS OF THE WEEK (SEPT. 16)

##### Men's Runner: Ty McCormack, AU

- Finished as the runner-up at the Furman Classic in Greenville, S.C., this past weekend.
- Clocked an 8K time of 24:19.53, which currently ranks as the fastest men's 8K time in the SEC so far this season.
- Paced the Tigers to a second-place overall team finish in a field that included SEC foe Georgia, as well as Clemson and Wake Forest.

##### Men's Freshman: Mark Robertson, UM

- As a freshman, once again led Ole Miss, recording a 10th-place finish with an 8K time of 25:00.31.
- Beat out 232 other runners at the Commodore Classic and helped the Rebels to a third-place finish out of 15 teams, despite sending only a portion of the squad.

##### Women's Runner: Chelsea Blaase, UT

- Posted her second consecutive runner-up finish at the Bluegrass Cross Country Invitational in Lexington, Ky., this past weekend.
- Clocked a time of 16:44.40, which currently ranks as the top women's 5K time in the SEC so far this season.
- Shattered her previous 5K personal best of 17:21.19.

##### Women's Freshman: Tayler Tuttle, UG

- As a freshman, again led Georgia with a sixth-place overall finish at the Furman Classic in Greenville, S.C., this past weekend.
- Clocked a 6K time of 21:42.11, which goes down as the fastest freshman 6K in the SEC this season and the second-fastest overall.

## COACHES PICK ARKANSAS TO WIN SEC TITLES

The University of Arkansas men and women have been predicted to repeat as Southeastern Conference Cross Country Champions, as decided by a vote of the league's head coaches.

Points for the men's poll were awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12 basis, while the women's poll was awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12-13 basis. Coaches were not permitted to vote for their own teams.

The Arkansas men were selected to repeat as the SEC Cross Country Champions after capturing their 21st SEC Cross Country Championship in the last 23 years in 2013 and finishing 12th at the NCAA Championships. Florida was predicted to finish second while Ole Miss picked up three first-place votes and was chosen to finish third.

The Arkansas women were a unanimous choice to repeat as the SEC Cross Country Champions after winning their first SEC Cross Country Championship since 2008 a year ago. The Razorbacks finished 15th at the 2013 NCAA Championships. Vanderbilt was predicted to finish second, while Texas A&M was chosen to place third.

## SEC IN THE NCAA: CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY

- The SEC has won eight NCAA Men's Cross Country Championships, with Arkansas claiming seven and Tennessee winning one. The last SEC NCAA Championship came in 2000, with Arkansas winning its third consecutive.
- The SEC has won one NCAA Women's Cross Country Championship, with Kentucky holding the only title, which the Wildcats won in 1988.
- The SEC boasts two NCAA Cross Country individual titles, as Godfrey Siamusiye of Arkansas won back-to-back national crowns in 1995 and 1996.
- No SEC woman has ever claimed an NCAA Cross Country individual championship. Four SEC women have finished as the NCAA runner-up: Shelly Steely, Florida (1984); Valerie McGovern, Kentucky (1989); Deena Drossin, Arkansas (1992) and Amy Yoder, Arkansas (1999).

## ABOUT THE SEC

- Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has directed and organized inter-scholastic athletic competitions, conducted tournaments and prescribed eligibility rules for student-athletes. The Conference also facilitates and assists its member institutions in maintaining intercollegiate athletic programs compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.

- The Southeastern Conference crowns champions in 21 sports - 12 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, equestrian, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

- In the fall of 2012, the University of Missouri and Texas A&M University became the 13th and 14th members of the Southeastern Conference. It marked the first expansion for the SEC since 1991 and the second-ever increase for the league since its founding in 1933.

- The Southeastern Conference had 46 Capital One Academic All-Americans in 2013-14. The league had 17 student-athletes earn first-team honors. The Capital One Academic All-America Teams are voted on by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). The 46 student-athletes represent 11 of the SEC 14 schools while seven schools had at least one person on the first-team. Since 2003, the SEC has had 232 student-athletes earn first-team Capital One Academic All-America status.

- The Southeastern Conference won seven national championships in 2013-14: Baseball (Vanderbilt); Equestrian (Georgia); Men's Golf (Alabama); Gymnastics (Florida); Softball (Florida); Women's Swimming & Diving (Georgia); and Women's Outdoor Track & Field (Texas A&M).

The SEC also had a national runner-up in six sports, including: Men's Basketball (Kentucky); Equestrian (South Carolina); Football (Auburn); Softball (Alabama); Men's Indoor Track & Field (Arkansas); and Men's Outdoor Track & Field (Florida).

## TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

### ALABAMA

Alabama travels to Asheville, N.C., to compete in the Asheville Cross Country Carnival on Saturday.

### ARKANSAS

**Men** - The Arkansas men's cross country team will compete at the Iona Meet of Champions in Bronx, N.Y., this Saturday. **Women** - The Arkansas women's cross country team will compete at the Missouri Southern Stampede in Joplin, Mo., on Saturday.

### AUBURN

The Auburn men's cross country team took second place with 62 points while the women's team finished third with 58 points at the Second Annual Furman Classic in Greenville, S.C. Senior Ty McCormack led the Tigers during the men's 8K, finishing runner-up at 24:19.53. Junior Redatu Semeon clocked a 25:01.86 to finish 12th, followed by senior Francis Hernandez, who placed 14th at 25:10.31. Senior Niklas Buhner recorded a time of 25:23.89 to finish 16th, while freshman Wesley Pectol finished 33rd at 26:05.29. Sophomore Veronica Eder paced the Tigers for the second-straight meet, placing third at 21:23.81. Freshman Molly McKenna finished seventh at 21:45.60, followed by sophomore Rachel Givens, who recorded a 13th place finish at 22:04.50. Sophomore Emily Stevens placed 14th at 22:06.47, and junior Taylor Duncan recorded a new personal-best time of 22:22.94 to finish 21st. The Tigers will return to action on September 26 at the Panorama Farms in Charlottesville, Va.

### FLORIDA

The Florida Gators were idle last week, but return to competition this weekend when they host the 26th annual Mountain Dew Invitational on Saturday at the Mark Bostic Golf Course on Florida's campus. Twenty-seven men's teams are slated to compete in an 8K, while 29 women's team will run a 5K. **Men** - Through the first three weeks of competition, redshirt sophomore Mac Reynolds holds the SEC's fastest 5K time (15:13.75). Freshman Thomas Howell owns the top freshman and the SEC's third-fastest 5K time (15:20.46). **Women** - Sophomore Taylor Tubbs owns the second-best two-mile time (10:54.51). Freshman Lauren Brasure has the third-fastest two-mile mark (10:59.55).

### GEORGIA

**Men** - The Bulldogs took to the road for the first time this season and left Greenville, S.C., with a ninth-place finish (134 points) at the 8K Furman Cross Country Classic. Like the season-opening home meet, junior Steven Spevacek led UGA after taking with an eighth-place finish thanks to a 24:46.73. This marked the second consecutive year that Spevacek had topped his teammates at the Furman meet. Redshirt sophomore Morgan Malanoski also repeated his showing at the Georgia Cross Country Invitational by being the second Bulldog finisher. He was 27th overall with a finish of 25:48.78. Next across the line for Georgia was true freshman Daniel Navarro, who scored for the second time in his career with a 31st-place finish (25:59.40). Junior Michael Giuliano and redshirt sophomore Jimmy Hicks were the fourth and fifth finishers, respectively, for the Bulldogs. Giuliano finished 37th after running a 26:09.61 and Hicks completed the course on the Furman Golf Club four seconds later in 26:13.16 for 38th place. Georgia returns to action at the Greater Louisville Classic on Oct. 4. **Women** - The Lady Bulldogs managed a fifth-place finish in the 25-team field at the 6K Furman Cross Country Classic. Stepping it up a distance for the first time in 2014, true freshman Tayler Tuttle recorded the second top finish for Georgia in as many meets. Tuttle ran a 21:42.11 for sixth place overall and was the first SEC freshman across the finish line. Red-shirt sophomore Victoria Coppage and freshman Addy Lippitt gave UGA two more finishers in the top 10. Coppage registered her second top-10 finish for eighth place with a 21:52.36 while Lippitt took 10th after running a 22:01.12. In her first meet since 2012, redshirt sophomore Molly Schenck also scored after taking 16th (22:10.57). A third first-year runner in Allie Castro was the Lady Bulldogs' fifth and final scorer. Castro, who was one spot out of scoring in the season opener, was 19th in her second collegiate meet after running a 22:16.94. The Georgia women will be joining the Bulldogs in Louisville in three weeks.

### KENTUCKY

The Kentucky women's cross country team placed fourth, while the men were fifth at the Bluegrass Cross Country Invitational at Masterson Station Park on Saturday. Aundrea Busse, who was SEC Freshman of the Week for her UK debut performance, also ran strong competing for just the second time as a Wildcat. She placed third overall, with a 5,000-meter time of 16:50.80, 15 seconds behind the winner, Katie Borchers of Ohio State. Tennessee's Chelsea Blaase - SEC Runner of the Week this week - finished second. Ohio State won the women's competition with 50 points, ECU were second with 75 and No. 19 Oklahoma State finished third on 76 points. UK scored 80 points. Matt Hillenbrand made his season debut with a 14th place 8K time of 24:41.70 at the Bluegrass Invitational. Led UK to a fifth place finish, only behind ranked foes Oklahoma State, ECU as well as the talented Southern Indiana. He posted the No. 2 8K time in the conference. Spencer Hrycay was the second Wildcat to finish, with the fifth-fastest time in the SEC, 24:45.33.

### LSU

Seniors Philip Primeaux finished in seventh place and Andria Aguilar finished in eighth place overall to lead the LSU men's and women's cross country teams to top-five finishes at the Rice Invitational Cross Country Meet held Friday at the Rice Intramural Fields. The Lady Tigers finished third overall with a score of 97, while the men finished fifth overall with a score of 139. Aguilar led the Lady Tigers, finishing eighth out of 92 runners in the 4k course. Aguilar clocked 13 minutes, 56 seconds to finish 33 seconds behind first-place finisher Cali Roper of Rice. On the men's team, Primeaux placed seventh out of 91 runners in the 6k course. He finished with a time of 17:22. Houston's Brian Barraza took home first place with a time of 16:57. The Tigers will return to Baton Rouge to host the LSU Invitational at Highland Road Park on Sept. 20. The women will begin at 8:05 a.m. CDT, and the men will start shortly behind at 9:15 a.m. as each will compete on the 5k course.

### OLE MISS

**Men** - The Ole Miss men's cross country team grabbed a third-place finish in the Commodore Classic, besting both SEC rivals Mississippi State and Vanderbilt in the 8K event. Just as in the first meet of the season, freshman Mark Robertson posted the best time for the Rebels. His time of 25:00.31 was good for 10th overall in the field of 242 runners. In his first action of the season, Ian Carter placed 15th overall with a time of 25:17.94. The Rebels have a first place and third place finish on the season while sending only a portion of the team to the meets. Ole Miss has a two-week break before returning to action at the Greater Louisville Classic on Oct. 4. **Women** - The Ole Miss women's cross country team placed sixth in a field of 17 teams at the Commodore Classic. For the second time in two events, Mary Alex England finished with the best run for Ole Miss. Her time of 17:23.33 in the 5K placed eighth overall of 260 runners. Of the 11 Rebels that raced, six were freshmen and four were sophomores. Ole Miss has a two-week break before returning to action at the Greater Louisville Classic on Oct. 4.



## TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

### MISSISSIPPI STATE

Mississippi State continued to impress on the cross country trails Saturday, as both the men and women recorded Top 10 finishes at the Commodore Classic in Nashville. The women's squad earned a second-place finish, while the men finished seventh. Leading the way for the women was sophomore Rhianwedd Price in second place at 16:57.77 in the 5K. Also running Saturday were Lisa Ziegler (16th, 17:31.42), Cornelia Griesche (19th, 17:37.49, 35, Jodie McGuff (35th 18:10.54) and freshman Mia Meydrich (59th, 18:28.85). The women's second-place finish landed them behind Vanderbilt. MSU beat out SEC rival Ole Miss, which finished sixth. On the men's side, finishing in ninth was Damian Roszko with a time of 24:58.45. Also helping led the team to a Top 10 finish was junior Curtis Kelly (18th, 25:20.53). Following Kelly in MSU's Top 5 were Patrick Monaghan (61st, 26:03.02), Mathew Dunn (63rd, 26:04.86) and Branden Nosker (105th, 26:52.17). Mississippi State will travel to Bethlehem, Pa., to compete in the Paul Short Invitational on Oct. 4.

### MISSOURI

The Tigers' winning streak continued over the weekend, as the teams made their second appearance this season at the Forest Park XC Festival with a sweep on the men's side and the second consecutive team victory on the women's. Men – The men were in full force this weekend after sitting out a couple of their top ten during the season-opener in Illinois, dominating the field with a sweep of the first five spots, and putting 15 in the top 20. Leading the charge was the group of junior Kenny Cushing, sophomore T.J. Carey, senior Sam Dickerson, junior Tyler Schneider, and sophomore Dan Roe, all of whom finished between 18:42 – 18:44 on the 6000-meter course. The Tigers are now in for a week of training before they look to their first big test of the season at the Roy Griak Invitational in Minneapolis, Minn., on September 27th. Women – Leading the charge once again for the ladies was sophomore Kaitlyn Fischer, who guided the black and gold to a 33-point win with her final time of 17:37, good for third overall. Less than a second later were the next two Mizzou finishers, freshmen Karissa Schweizer and Jamie Kempfer, who crossed in 17:37 and 17:38 for fourth and fifth, respectively. This trio of young Tigers also led the squad at the season-opener against Illinois, where they finished within three seconds of each other. Back in the fourth position was junior Sam Garrett, while sophomore Nicole Mello stepped up as the fifth Tiger finisher. The women now move up into the No. 4 spot on the Midwest Regional Rankings, tying their highest USTFCCCA in-season ranking over the last five years.

### SOUTH CAROLINA

For the second consecutive meet, South Carolina produced a clean sweep with 15 points. The win marked the first time since 2011 that the Gamecocks have won their opening two meets to the season. Two weeks ago, Carolina held out several its top runners. Junior Anna Todd, one of which was held out, earned the second win of her career with a time of 18:32.11. Right on her heels was sophomore and 2013 SEC All-Freshman Team member Mary Reiser at 18:37.54. Hannah Giangaspro led all freshmen at the meet, placing third at 18:50.46. All three were held out of the team's opening meet of the season on Aug. 30. Carolina Invitational winner, Stephanie Berger, finished fourth at 18:56.52. Overall, the Gamecocks claimed the top-10 spots at meet. With such a young team entering 2014, Carolina placed 13 freshmen in the top 20, while 17 of its racers finished in the top 20. South Carolina will be off until Sept. 26 when the team heads to Charlotte, N.C., to compete in the Charlotte Invitational at McAlpine Creek Park.

### TENNESSEE

Tennessee competed in its second event in as many weeks last weekend when it traveled to the Bluegrass Invitational in Lexington, Ky. Highlighting the race for the Volunteers was another second-place finish from Chelsea Blaase. Fresh off a runner-up finish at the season-opening Powerade Invitational, the junior repeated the feat on Saturday with a 5k time of 16:44.40 to finish behind only Katie Borchers of Ohio State. That mark obliterated her previous career best 5k time of 17:21.80 and made her the only UT female to finish inside the top 20. Coming in behind Blaase for the second straight race was fellow junior Alexis Panisse. Panisse posted a time of 17:32.80. The Tennessee women came in sixth place in the team standings on Saturday. Meanwhile, the men finished in seventh place and were headed by senior Austin Whitelaw, who came in 20th with an 8k time of 24:51.39. Jack Little (25:14.11) was 35th and Kyle Walter, who finished fourth at the Powerade Invitational last week, was 40th at 25:20.70. Tennessee competed on Saturday in the absence of first-year director of track and field/cross country Beth Alford-Sullivan, who was in Marrakech, Morocco, as the head coach of the Americas team at the 2014 IAAF Continental Cup. The Volunteers return to competition on Oct. 4 at the Louisville Classic in Louisville, Ky. Both the men's and women's team competed in the Classic in 2013, with the men coming in 2nd and the women in 6th, headed by Panisse's 6th-place finish.

### TEXAS A&M

The Aggies will play host to a 12-team field this Saturday morning at the Texas A&M Invitational as they compete on a new facility, which will be named Dale Watts '71 Cross Country Course. The men will race over 6,000 meters with the women competing on a 4,000m course. Recent region rankings have the A&M women No. 3 and the men No. 4 in the South Central region. Eleven of the teams competing in the Invitational are from the South Central region. In addition to the Aggies, seven of the teams ranking among the men's top 15 in the South Central while five school are ranked among the women's top 15. The field includes a pair of former SWC and Big 12 foes in Baylor (No. 4 women, No. 10 men) and Texas Tech, with the Red Raiders ranked No. 13 for their men and women in the Mountain region. Also competing is Lamar, with the men ranked No. 3 and the women No. 7 in region rankings.

### VANDERBILT

After winning the Belmont Opener in impressive fashion two weeks ago, the No. 23-ranked Commodores delivered an even more dominating effort Saturday while storming to a victory in the Commodore Classic. Vanderbilt finished with 25 points, well ahead of second-place Mississippi State (114 points) and third-place MTSU (123). The Commodores had five runners finish in succession in the No. 3 through 7 positions. Carmen Carlos took third place with a time of 17:15.4. She was followed by teammates Sara Barron (fourth at 17:17.5), Claire Benjamin (fifth at 17:21.5), Amira Joseph (sixth at 17:21.6) and Katherine Delaney (seventh at 17:22.0). Vanessa Valentine finished 11th with a time of 17:27.16. Then came another tightly-bunched collection of Vanderbilt runners, who claimed the No. 13 through 15 positions. The group was led by freshman Emma Abrahamson (17:27.76), who was followed by Rebecca Chandler (17:28.42) and Lily Williams (17:28.55). The Vanderbilt men finished 13th in the 8k race. John Ewing led the Commodores with a time of 26:00.99 for a 59th place finish. Nick French finished second among the Vanderbilt runners with a time of 26:15.28 in 70th place, and teammate Jake Van Geffen was right behind him in 71st place at 26:15.87. Andrew Fix posted a time of 27:07.68. The Vanderbilt men and women will be off next weekend before traveling to Minnesota for the Roy Griak Invitational on Sept. 27.
