### **SEC Players of the Week**

Offensive Player of the Week Rhamat Alhassan • Florida Freshman • MB • 6-4 • Glenarden, Md.

Alhassan led Florida with a .575 clip (4.50 k/s), 5.58 points/s and 2.0 blocks/s last week as the Gators downed No. 13 San Diego and No. 6 USC on the road in straight sets to improve to 5-2 on the season with their first wins against ranked opponents, including career victory No. 800 for Florida head coach Mary Wise against the Trojans. Her .800 clip against San Diego marked the third time this season for Alhassan above .750 in a single match, all three times error free, while her 16 kills and 19.0 points were both career-best outputs.

Defensive Player of the Week Jackie Napper • Kentucky Senior • L • 5-7 • Louisville, Ky.

Napper led the Wildcats defensively with 80 digs in four matches this week. She began the week by charting a career-high 26 digs a season-high six assists in the win against Louisville, while going perfect in the serve-receive line in 31 attempts. Napper then matched her career-best total a match later with 26 digs against No. 17 North Carolina. She had a match-high 15 scoops vs. VCU, before logging 13 against Georgia Southern while also adding six assists. Now with 1,163 career digs, Napper has moved into sixth place all-time in UK's career digs record lists.

# Freshman of the Week Stephanie Aiple • Texas A&M Freshman • S • 6-1 • Round Rock, Texas

Aiple was named to the USC Classic all-tournament team after setting A&M to a 2-0 record with victories against both No. 6 USC and No. 13 San Diego. She directed a balanced A&M offense that hit above .300 against each ranked opponent and hit a combined .312 for the week. Aiple dished out a career-high 56 assists as A&M hit .319 and defeated No. 6 USC, 3-2, to record its highest ranked road victory since 1999. She had 43 assists as A&M hit .303 in the victory against No. 13 San Diego. Aiple averaged 10.82 assists per set and was third on the team with 2.27 digs per set.

### **Team Notes**

Alabama: Alabama swept their opponents at the ISTAP Collegiate Cup 2, picking up victories over Southern Miss, Towson and host Alabama State. Junior Sierra Wilson and sophomore Brittany Thomas both earned a spot on the All-Tournament Team. Wilson paced the Tide's offense, tallying 97 assists in nine sets, an average of 10.7 per set. Her 38 assists against Alabama State are her most in a three-set match this season, while her three kills against Towson are the most for Wilson in any match this season. Thomas finished the weekend with 24 kills (2.67/set), a .345 hitting percentage, 18 digs and seven blocks. Her .478 hitting percentage against Alabama State was a new career high, as were her three solo blocks against Towson later that day. On Tuesday, Sept. 16, Alabama makes its 2014 home debut, welcoming the UAB Blazers (3-7) to Foster Auditorium. This weekend, Alabama will host the Crimson-White Tournament as the Tide welcome Florida International, San Diego State and Clemson into Foster Auditorium. Alabama opens the weekend against Florida International on Friday, Sept. 19 at Noon CT before ending the day against San Diego State at 7 p.m. CT. The following night, the Tide play Clemson at 7 p.m. CT.

Arkansas: In their final non-conference weekend, the Razorbacks travel to Lawrence, Kan., for the Jayhawk Classic with a field that also includes Cleveland State, North Texas and host and 24th-ranked Kansas. Arkansas then opens the SEC season Sept. 26 against Tennessee at Barnhill Arena. Last weekend, senior Meredith Hays earned all-tournament accolades at the Razorback Invitational after a pair of double-doubles during the three-match round robin. Hays recorded the 600th kill of her Razorback career and currently sits in 24th place in program history. Junior libero also reached a milestone with her 500th career dig in route to a 24-dig effort against SMU. At the net, Arkansas' block continues to shine as one of the top units in the country at 2.69 blocks per set which is third in the SEC and 28th in the NCAA. Individually, Hays is first in the conference and 23rd in the NCAA with 4.31 kills per set while sophomore Ana Sofia Jusino is 41st in the country with 1.32 blocks per set.

Auburn: Auburn (5-4) finished 2-1 at the Active Ankle Challenge on its home court last weekend ... The Tigers won their first two matches of the weekend, sweeping Troy on Friday night before outlasting Winthrop in five sets Saturday ... In its last match of the weekend, Auburn fell behind 2-0 against USF and stormed back to force a fifth set, but the Tigers comeback bid fell short on Saturday night losing 3-2 to the Bulls ... Stephanie Campbell and Macy Reece earned all-tournament honors for their performances at the Active Ankle Challenge ... Reece led the club with 48 kills, hitting .350 during Auburn's three matches ... Reece's 25 kills against USF tied the freshman for the fifth-most kills in a single match in school history ... Campbell led the Tigers with a career-high 18 kills against Winthrop ... The sophomore also collected 11 blocks at the Active Ankle Challenge and chipped in 36 kills during the weekend. The Tigers travel to No. 7 Florida State on Tuesday for their last road non-conference contest of the season ... Auburn wraps up non-conference play by hosting the War Eagle Invitational at Auburn Arena this Friday and Saturday.

Florida: The No. 10 Florida volleyball team improved to 5-2 last week with a pair of wins against ranked opponents in No. 13 San Diego and No. 6 USC on the road in Los Angeles at the USC Classic. The Gators swept both the Toreros and Trojans in straight sets to give head coach Mary Wise her 799th and 800th career victories. UF's wins were the first two victories against ranked opponents this season. Wise became the only active female head coach in the NCAA to eclipse the 800-win milestone. The Gators were led by freshman Rhamat Alhassan, who had career matches against both USD and USC with a .575 clip (4.50 k/s), 5.58 points per set and 2.0 blocks per set through the two-match road swing. UF hit a season-best .449 against San Diego, led by Alhassan's .800 hitting efficiency and career-high 16 kills on 20 errorless swings. The first-year Gator, who paces the SEC with her .529 hitting percentage this season, then returned against the No. 6 team in the country in USC and posted a career-best 7.0 blocks to contribute to Florida's 10.0 as a team, while hitting .350 with 11 kills, her third double-digit kill performance of the season. For her efforts, Alhassan was named the Sports Imports/AVCA Player of the Week

and the SEC Offensive Player of the Week. Junior middle blocker Simone Antwi turned in a .455 clip, while sophomore right side Alex Holston notched 3.33 kills per set for a .439 hitting efficiency. Junior setter Mackenzie Dagostino dished out all but six of UF's 79 assists in the tournament and senior Holly Pole led the Orange and Blue with 4.50 digs per set. Florida will now enjoy a weekend thome when the Orange and Blue play host to (rv) Marquette and UCF Friday and Sunday, respectively, sponsored by Campus USA Credit Union. Both matches will air live on SEC Network +.

Georgia: The Georgia volleyball team went 1-2 last weekend in its final home tournament of the season. Georgia opened the weekend with a 3-0 win over UNC Asheville before dropping a pair of 3-1 decisions to Harvard and NC State on Saturday. Georgia is now 5-4 on the year. Despite the record, several members of the team had strong showings. Jasmine Eatmon finished with a .391 efficiency to go along with 23 kills and nine blocks, while Amanda Dachs totaled 31 kills on a .304 attack percentage. Lauren Teknipp led the team with 37 kills, finishing with 14 against UNC Asheville and Harvard. Gaby Smiley who finished 46 digs and earned a spot on the all-tournament team controlled the Georgia backcourt. Defensively at the net it was Desiree McCray who led the Bulldogs. The redshirt sophomore finished with a team best 17 blocks, averaging 1.70 blocks per set. She finished with a careerbest 15 against NC State in the final match of the year. Georgia returns to action next weekend, Sept. 19-20, when it makes the short trip to Atlanta, Ga., to take part in the Georgia Tech Volleyball Invitational. The Bulldogs will open the tournament against Georgia Tech on Friday at 7 p.m., and will take on Southern Miss and Alabama A&M on Saturday at 10:00 a.m., and 4:30 p.m., respectively.

Kentucky: The 16th-ranked Kentucky volleyball team went 3-1 on the week which included a road victory at Louisville marking the first win vs. the Cardinals on their home floor since 1993. UK earned a four-set win vs. Georgia Southern at the Carolina Classic to mark head coach Craig Skinner's 210th career win, making him the program's all-time winningest head coach. Skinner passes UK Hall of Famer Kathy DeBoer who finished her career with 209 victories. Junior setter Morgan Bergren was named to the Carolina Classic All-Tournament team after passing out 36 or more assists in all three matches and leading the Wildcats in blocks for the weekend. Bergren dished out 55 assists in the win at Louisville which marked the most in a four-set match in the 25-point rally scoring era history. Senior Jackie Napper had a career-high 26 digs in a win at Louisville and matched that total vs. No. 17 North Carolina. She moved into sixth place in UK's career record books for digs with 80 in the four matches. Freshman Emily Franklin had a breakout weekend this week which included a career-high kill total (9) in a win vs. VCU and a career-best block total vs. Georgia Southern (8). UK will host Lipscomb on Thursday, Sept. 18 and Xavier on Saturday, Sept. 20 in its final tune-up before beginning Southeastern Conference action the following week.

LSU: LSU went 1-2 at the Four Points by Sheraton Seminole Invitational last weekend after having a week off from competition. Five of LSU's six matches this season have been four sets or longer, playing two four-setters and a five setter this past weekend. Four of LSU's six matches have been two hours or longer. The Tigers took the first set off of No. 7 Florida State in the finale, and have won the first set in each of the last two matches after not winning the first in the previous four. LSU's .294 hitting percentage against Samford was a season-high, and the first time the team has hit over .250 as a group in a match this season. LSU outhit its opponents in average .225 to .205 on the weekend. After not having a solo block in the first three matches of the year, the Tigers combined for 11 in the three this past weekend. LSU has earned double-digit blocks in each of three, outblocking each of the last three opponents. The .152 attack percentage by Samford was the lowest LSU has held an opponent to so far this season, while the seven points the Bulldogs had in the third set is tied for the fourth lowest allowed by an LSU team in a set. Fran Flory earned her 300th win of her LSU head coaching career, becoming the second head coach in team history to win that many at LSU. Cati Leak was named to the Four Points by Sheraton Seminole Invitational All-Tournament team after averaging 3.46 kills and 2.38 digs per set.

### **Team Notes**

Leak had two double-doubles on Saturday alone, drilling a season-high 18 kills against the Seminoles. Leak has earned double-digit kills in all six matches this season. Leak and Malorie Pardo, who also had a double-double on the weekend, lead the team with three double-doubles each this season. Briana Holman led LSU on the weekend, averaging 3.80 kills per set and 1.60 blocks per set, earning four solo blocks on the weekend. Holman's 19 kills against Samford is an individual season high for the team this year. Holman has hit no lower than .345 this season. LSU had four players average more than two digs per set on the weekend, led by Haley Smith who averaged 4.46. Smith earned 22 digs against Florida State, the most in a single game for LSU this season. Pardo has a service ace in each of the last three matches. Madi Mahaffey has earned 13 blocks in the last three matches, including having five against Samford with three solo blocks.

Ole Miss: Ole Miss captured the Magnolia Invitational this past weekend to improve to 10-0, its best start in school history ... The Rebels downed UAB and Mercer 3-0 and then defeated Jackson-ville State 3-1 after dropping the first set for the first time all year ... Freshman Lexi Thompson was named the tournament MVP, while Ty Laporte and Aubrey Edie joined her on the all-tournament team ... Thompson averaged 2.80 kills, 3.00 digs and 0.50 blocks and aces per set to lead the Rebels to the title ... She tallied a career-high 18 kills, and a career-best 17 digs in the 3-1 win against Jacksonville State ... With the Rebels dropping the first set for the first time all year, Thompson tallied 7 of her 18 kills in the second set, as the Rebels evened the match ... Laporte finished the tournament with 28 kills and 9 blocks and hit .375 ... Edie posted 122 assists, 12.2 per set to earn her third straight all-tournament team honor ... Ole Miss will host the Rebel Classic this weekend, which includes Louisiana Tech, Samford, Lamar and Jackson State.

Mississippi State: Taking court at Newell-Grissom for the first time in 2014, the Mississippi State volleyball Bulldogs (4-7) split matches on the weekend, highlighted by a conference record-breaking performance by freshman Payton Harris. After dropping the opening two matches, the Bulldogs knocked off Nicholls State 3-0 and followed with a five-set victory against Northwestern State. In the Bulldogs' victory against the Lady Demons, Harris turned in 59 digs, setting a SEC and school record for most digs in a match. Harris' 59 digs upped her total to 301 on the year with a 7.00 digs per set average, both tops in the SEC. Her total also pushed MSU into first in conference in digs, with 752 and a 17.49 average. The Maroon and White return to the court Thursday with the Bulldog Invitational, the second of two MSU-hosted tournaments. The field includes North Dakota, SIU-Edwardsville, Mississippi Valley State and Pacific. The Bulldogs play on Thursday at 7 p.m. CT, Friday at 3 p.m. and 7 p.m., and Saturday at 7 p.m. All MSU matches will be broadcast on SEC Network +.

Missouri: Mizzou picked up wins over Boise State, Portland and Eastern Washington to win the Idaho Nike Invitational Title. Senior Emily Wilson was named Tournament MVP after averaging 4.50 kills per set on .378 hitting. Sophomore Carly Kan was also named to the All-Tournament team. Senior middle hitter Whitney Little had a historic weekend in Idaho as she reset the school's career blocking record as she now has 462 in her career. Mizzou is now 8-4 and riding a season-long four-match winning streak. The Tigers will round out non-conference play next weekend in Coral Gables as they play Miami and UNC Greensboro in the Miami Invitational, their final tournament of the season.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks claimed the Campbell Invitational title over the weekend, sweeping Campbell and Elon and defeating North Florida in four sets. South Carolina extended its winning streak to four matches, improving its record to 7-2 on the season. As a team the Gamecocks out-hit their opponents .284-.098 on the weekend. Freshman outside hitter Taylr McNeil was named Tournament MVP after averaging 4.10 kills per set while hitting .309 and 2.10 digs per set in 10 sets played. Junior right side Sarah Blomgren and sophomore KoKo Atoa-Williams made the All-Tournament Team. Blomgren averaged 1.90 kills per set, while Atoa-Williams averaged 3.20 kills and 3.00 digs per set. Junior middle blocker Darian Dozier, who entered the weekend leading the nation in blocks per set, averaged 1.30 blocks in 10 sets played. The

Gamecocks will be back in action this weekend as they host the Carolina Classic on Friday and Saturday at the Volleyball Competition Facility. Carolina will face Nofolk State (10 a.m.) and Eastern Kentucky (7 p.m.) on Friday and The Citadel (3 p.m.) on Saturday.

Tennessee: Tennessee (5-5) capped off its 10-match, season-opening road swing last week, going 3-1 in four matches. The Lady Vols started off the week by capturing their first true road win of the year, prevailing 3-1 at Evansville on Tuesday night. UT then finished 2-1 at the Coastal Carolina Tournament, earning 3-1 wins over both Kennesaw State and Loyola Maryland before falling in the finale against host CCU by the same score line. Sophomore Jamie Lea was steady all week for Tennessee and earned All-Tournament team honors at CCU after averaging 3.56 kills and 2.38 digs per set. She recorded two double-doubles on the weekend, notching a season-best 18 kills and 14 digs against KSU before posting a career-high 17 digs to go along with 14 kills against the Chanticleers. Having also recorded 14 kills at Evansville to start the week, Lea has now reached four consecutive matches with 10 or more kills. Also breaking out over the weekend was true freshman Kendra Turner. The outside hitter got her first career start at Evansville and came away with a then career-best seven kills. What followed was a 19-kill performance against Kennesaw State—a new career-best accompanied by a stellar .375 attack percentage. For the week, Turner averaged 3.14 kills per set and a hitting percentage of .202. Lea continues to lead the Lady Vols with 104 kills and 3.06 kills per set. Middle blocker Raina Hemrby and outside hitter Ashley Mariani are next with 60 kills each. Setter Lexi Dempsey now has 308 assists on the season, translating to 9.62 assists per set. Freshman middle blocker lesha Bryant still holds the top spot in blocks, averaging 1.25 per game. Next up, Tennessee makes its home debut when it hosts the DISH Lady Vol Classic. UT will conclude the non-conference slate with four matches over the weekend, hosting in-state foes Austin Peay and Memphis as well as Mercer and Montana State. This season marks the 13th consecutive year that Tennessee has hosted the Lady Vol Classic. UT is 38-11 in 17 Classics under head coach Rob Patr

Texas A&M: Texas A&M sent shockwaves through southern California as the unranked Aggies spoiled sixth-ranked USC's home opener by defeating the previously undefeated Women of Troy, 3-2, on Thursday. The Aggies followed that performance by defeating No. 13 San Diego, 3-1, on Friday to go 2-0 at the USC Classic. A&M also extended its win streak to five matches overall and improved to 7-1 for the season. Junior middle blocker Shelby Sullivan and freshman setter Stephanie Aiple both were named to the all-tournament team for the second consecutive week. The win against the Trojans was A&M's first ever in nine all-time meetings. It also marked the second time USC lost to a non-Pacific 12 Conference team at Galen Center, and it was A&M's highest ranked true road win since the Aggies defeated No. 3 Hawaii in the 1999 NCAA regional semifinal at Honolulu. Aiple had a careerhigh 56 assists against USC, running a balanced attack that had four A&M players posting double figures in kills, including Sullivan who tied for team-high honors with 15 kills while hitting .462, and sophomore middle blocker Jazzmin Babers, who had 14 kills and no errors in 24 attempts for a career-high .583 hitting percentage. Babers and Sullivan also had seven and six blocks, respectively, as A&M outblocked the Trojans, 13-7. Freshman opposite hitter Ashlie Reasor had a career-high 13 kills and hit .480 against USD, and Sullivan also pitched in 13 kills while hitting at a .440 clip in the victory against the Toreros. As a team, A&M hit above .300 in each match, outhitting USC, .319 to .233, and outhitting USD, .304 to .203. After playing two tournaments, including five matches, away from home, the Aggies return to Reed Arena for a pair of matches against seventh-ranked Florida State on Friday and Saturday. A&M upset the then 16th-ranked Seminoles, 3-0, last year at the Texas A&M Invitational. The Aggies close out the non-conference schedule Monday, Sept. 22 as they play host to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.
