COACHES PICK ARKANSAS TO WIN SEC TITLES

The University of Arkansas men and women have been predicted to repeat as Southeastern Conference Cross Country Champions, as decided by a vote of the league's head coaches.

Points for the men's poll were awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12 basis, while the women's poll was awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12-13 basis. Coaches were not permitted to vote for their own teams.

The Arkansas men were selected to repeat as the SEC Cross Country Champions after capturing their 21st SEC Cross Country Championship in the last 23 years in 2013 and finishing 12th at the NCAA Championships. Florida was predicted to finish second while Ole Miss picked up three first-place votes and was chosen to finish third.

The Arkansas women were a unanimous choice to repeat as the SEC Cross Country Champions after winning their first SEC Cross Country Championship since 2008 a year ago. The Razorbacks finished 15th at the 2013 NCAA Championships. Vanderbilt was predicted to finish second, while Texas A&M was chosen to place third.

SEC IN THE NCAA: CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY

- The SEC has won eight NCAA Men's Cross Country Championships, with Arkansas claiming seven and Tennessee winning one. The last SEC NCAA Championship came in 2000, with Arkansas winning its third consecutive.
- The SEC has won one NCAA Women's Cross Country Championship, with Kentucky holding the only title, which the Wildcats won in 1988.
- The SEC boasts two NCAA Cross Country individual titles, as Godfrey Siamusiye of Arkansas won back-to-back national crowns in 1995 and 1996
- No SEC woman has ever claimed an NCAA Cross Country individual championship. Four SEC women have finished as the NCAA runner-up: Shelly Steely, Florida (1984); Valerie McGovern, Kentucky (1989); Deena Drossin, Arkansas (1992) and Amy Yoder, Arkansas (1999).

ABOUT THE SEC

- Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has directed and organized interscholastic athletic competitions, conducted tournaments and prescribed eligibility rules for student-athletes. The Conference also facilitates and assists its member institutions in maintaining intercollegiate athletic programs compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.
- The Southeastern Conference crowns champions in 21 sports 12 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, equestrian, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- In the fall of 2012, the University of Missouri and Texas A&M University became the 13th and 14th members of the Southeastern Conference. It marked the first expansion for the SEC since 1991 and the second-ever increase for the league since its founding in 1933.
- The Southeastern Conference had 46 Capital One Academic All-Americans in 2013-14. The league had 17 student-athletes earn first-team honors. The Capital One Academic All-America Teams are voted on by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). The 46 student-athletes represent 11 of the SEC 14 schools while seven schools had at least one person on the first-team. Since 2003, the SEC has had 232 student-athletes earn first-team Capital One Academic All-America status.
- The Southeastern Conference won seven national championships in 2013-14: Baseball (Vanderbilt); Equestrian (Georgia); Men's Golf (Alabama); Gymnastics (Florida); Softball (Florida); Women's Swimming & Diving (Georgia); and Women's Outdoor Track & Field (Texas A&M).

The SEC also had a national runner-up in six sports, including: Men's Basketball (Kentucky); Equestrian (South Carolina); Football (Auburn); Softball (Alabama); Men's Indoor Track & Field (Arkansas); and Men's Outdoor Track & Field (Florida).

TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

ALABAMA

The Alabama women's team remains third while the men's team remains sixth in this week's edition of the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) Division I Team Computer Rankings released Monday ... the Crimson Tide has won the team titles in the men's and women's divisions of both races they have competed in during the 2014 season, a win in a dual meet at Samford on August 29, and a victory at the Asheville Cross Country Carnival on September 20 ... the Tide resumes the 2014 season this Saturday, October 4, when Alabama travels to Bethlehem, Pa., for the Paul Short Invitational.

ARKANSAS

Men - In their last outing the Razorbacks placed three runners inside the top five to pick up the team title at the 2014 Iona Meet of Champions. Alex George led the Razorback pack by picking up a second-place finish (25:36.66) in the first 8K collegiate race of his Arkansas career. 2013 NCAA All-American Stanley Kebenei finished a spot behind George in his first race of the season by clocking in at 25:41.65 and two-time NCAA All-Region runner Gabe Gonzalez rounded out the trio of top five runners with his time of 25:42.94. The No. 15 Razorbacks will be back in action on Oct. 4, as they will run their only regular season meet in Fayetteville by participating in the Chile Pepper Invitational at Agri Park. Race time is slated for 9:45 a.m. Women - For the second straight week redshirt junior Dominique Scott set a meet record en route to capturing her fourth career individual event title to help the No. 8-ranked Arkansas women's cross country team win the Missouri Southern Stampede. Scott turned in a career-best 5K time of 16:32.78 to win her second consecutive meet and record the best time in Missouri Southern Stampede meet history. The time of 16:32.78 surpasses her previous personal-best in the 5K by over 28.03 seconds. As a team, the Razorbacks were able to pick up their third straight win to open the 2014 season. Arkansas finished with a rotation score of 24, as its top five runners all finished inside the top 10. Each runner in the Razorback scoring rotation set a new personal-best time in the 5K. The No. 8 Razorbacks will be back in action on Oct. 4, as they will run their only regular season meet in Fayetteville by participating in the Chile Pepper Invitational at Agri Park. Race time is slate for 10:20 a.m.

AUBURN

Auburn senior Ty McCormack captured his second victory of the 2014 campaign with an 8K time of 23:51.97 at the Panorama Farms Invitational on Friday. McCormack defeated 109 other competitors in a field that featured two top-25 teams and nine teams ranked in the top-15 in their respective region. Overall, the men's team finished fourth with 138 points while the women tied for fifth with Furman at 109 points. Senior Kane Grimster was the Tigers' second scorer in the men's race, finishing 14th with a time of 24:25.86. Junior Redatu Semeon ran a 25:05.95 to finish 37th, followed by senior Griffin Jaworski, who finished 41st at 25:11.73. Senior Niklas Buhner placed 48th with a time of 25:19.04. Sophomore Rachel Givens paced the Tigers in the women's 6K race, recording a personal-best time of 21:32.38 to finish 13th. Freshman Molly McKenna recorded her third-consecutive top-20 finish at 21:48.49. Junior Taylor Duncan set a new personal best with a time of 24:52.40 to finish 21st, while sophomore Emily Stevens finished 27th at 22:10.44. The Tigers will return to action on October 10 for the Florida State Invite in Tallahassee, Fla.

FLORIDA

The Florida Gator women return to competition this weekend at the Paul Short Run, hosted by Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pa. After winning their first two races of the season, the Gators will run against some of the top teams from the Northeast. The Gator men will be idle this weekend, but return to action Saturday, Oct. 11 at the Walt Disney Invitational in Orlando, Fla. Men - Freshman Thomas Howell was named SEC Men's Runner of the Week last week after placing fifth at the Mountain Dew Invitational with a time of 24:45.76 in the 8K race. Women - Freshman Lauren Brasure picked-up her first SEC award last week, earning SEC Women's Freshman Runner of the Week after winning her first collegiate race at the Mountain Dew Invitational on Sept. 20. Brasure crossed the finish line in a Florida course record time of 16:45.93 (5K).

GEORGIA

Georgia will return to action at the Greater Louisville Classic in Louisville, Ky., on Oct. 4. The Lady Bulldogs checked in at seventh in the latest USTFCCCA South Region poll while the Georgia men are holding down the 11th spot.

KENTUCKY

The UK cross country teams returned to competition this weekend at the Minnesota's Roy Griak Invitational in Minneapolis. The UK men's team placed 21st overall with 532 points. The meet marked UK's first competition of 2014, which could be considered as part of teams' body of work when at-large bids are awarded for the NCAA Championships. The UK men's team's top-5 runners were Zack Beavin, Ryan Polman, James Brown , Matt Hillenbrand and Michael Iacofano respectively. Beavin and Polman each posted top-100 8k finishes as Beavin placed 67th (26:09.9) and Polman was 85th (26:19.9). The Griak boasted one of the strongest fields of any meet in the country this weekend. The men's race had three ranked teams in No. 24 Texas, No. 27 Iowa State, and No. 29 Colorado State. The women team race featured No. 3 Michigan State, No. 9 Iowa State, No. 11 Butler, No. 20 Boise State, No. 22 Vanderbilt, No. 28 hosts Minnesota, and No. 30 North Carolina. The young UK women's team was led by freshman Aundrea Busse, who finished 48th overall with a 6,000-meter time of 22:21.9. Katy Kunc also turned in a strong performance with a top-100 finish against a strong field. She clocked in at 22:58.6. The women's team did not have five finishers, and thus did not qualify for a team score (cross country team scores are tabulated by calculating the lowest aggregate of individual placement with each team's top-5 runners' finish tabulated). The Wildcats will compete on consecutive Saturdays for the first time this season next weekend at the Greater Louisville Classic. Kentucky would only be scheduled to compete two weeks in a row one other time this year, should they qualify for the NCAA Championships after the NCAA Southeast Regional.

<u>LSU</u>

Senior Andria Aguilar's first-place finish helped the Lady Tiger's continue their winning streak on Saturday morning at McNeese State's Cowboy Invitational, while the men posted a solid performance for third place. The women scored 34 points giving the Lady Tigers their second win of the season. Tulane finished 20 points behind the Lady Tigers. McNeese State placed first in the men's race with 31 points. The Tigers finished with 73 points, 42 points behind the Cowboys, for another top-five performance this season. Aguilar crossed the finish line at 17 minutes, 17.4 seconds, and junior Morgan Schuetz placed third overall with a time of 17:27.7. Sophomore Chaiss Matthews and freshman Andrea Maxwell finished in the top-10 for the Lady Tigers. Matthews finished ninth with a time of 18:11.6, while Maxwell placed 10th with a time of 18:17.4. Sophomore Ashley Welborn followed Maxwell and finished two second behind for 11th place. Senior Philip Primeaux led the Tigers for the third consecutive meet, clocking 19:29.2 for a second-place finish. Primeaux was the firstplace runner last week at the LSU Invitational to help the men earn their first win of the season. Junior Travis Pope placed seventh with a time of 19:48.4. Junior Bryan Mutell finished in the top 20, clocking 20:17.7 for 17th place. LSU continues their season traveling to Fayetteville, Ark., next Saturday to race in the Chile Pepper Festival. The women will begin at 9:45 a.m. CDT, and the men will follow at 10:15 a.m.

OLE MISS

Men - After a two-week break, Ole Miss returns to action at the Greater Louisville Classic on Oct. 4. After the second meet of the season, freshman Mark Robertson earned his second SEC Men's Freshman of the Week. The Rebels have a first place and third place finish on the season while sending only a portion of the team to the meets. **Women** - After a two-week break, Ole Miss returns to action at the Greater Louisville Classic on Oct. 4. For the second time in two events, Mary Alex England clocked the best time for Ole Miss. Of the 11 Rebels that have raced at meets this season, six are freshmen and four are sophomores.

TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

MISSISSIPPI STATE

As a two-week break from competition comes to an end, the Mississippi State men's and women's cross country teams return to action this weekend. The Bulldogs will travel to Bethlehem, Pa. to compete in the Paul Short Invitational on Oct. 4. The men's team is set to run at 11 a.m. with the women following at 1 p.m. Alabama and South Carolina will also be competing in the Paul Short Invitational.

MISSOURI

The Tigers battled the heat in Minneapolis, Minn., over the weekend as they took on the Roy Griak Invitational on Saturday (Sept. 27). Men – Leading the way for the Mizzou men was sophomore T.J. Carey, who took the reins for the first time this season, placing 12th in the competitive field with a final time of 25:15.50. A squad of sophomores made up the five Tiger scorers with Dan Roe, Jordan Cook, Drew White, and Tyler Rusboldt leading the team to a 14th-place finish in the field. Women – Once again crossing first for the black and gold was sophomore Kaitlyn Fischer, who made the podium with her 14th-place finish (21:37.50). Placing second for the squad for the second consecutive meet was freshman Karissa Schweizer, followed by senior Courtney Wood and juniors Maria Effinger and Sam Garrett. These five women led the Tigers to an 11th-place team finish, beating out one of the top-30 ranked teams heading into the weekend in Butler. Both teams will have a quick turnaround as they prepare for the Greater Louisville Classic on Saturday, October 4th.

SOUTH CAROLINA

For the third consecutive meet, the South Carolina cross country team walked away with a win, claiming the Charlotte Invitational at McAlpine Creek Park with 37 points in the squad's first 6K race of the season. The Gamecocks were 25 points clear of Samford, which finished in second place, and Davidson, which took third with 74 points. After winning just the second meet of her career two weeks ago, junior Anna Todd won her second race of the season with personal best time of 21:58.9. Todd finished more than 12 seconds faster than Karisa Nelson of Samford. Sophomore Mary Reiser (22:29.5), juniors Christine Kent (22:30.7) and Stephanie Berger (22:36.5) finished in the top 10 along with Todd, with Reiser in fifth, Kent in sixth and Berger in eighth. The four keyed the Gamecocks win as they combined for 20 points. South Carolina will be back on the road next weekend as the team travels to Bethlehem, Pa., to compete in the Paul Short Invitational on Oct. 4. The women's Open 6K begins the day at 10 a.m., ET.

TENNESSEE

The men's and women's cross country teams at Tennessee were idle for the second consecutive week last week, but return to competition this Saturday at the Greater Louisville Classic. The UT men are one of 29 collegiate participants in Louisville, while the women will compete within a field of 34. The race will be held at E.P. Tom Sawyer State Park and is expected to feature 2,600 participants across eight races that include upwards of 125 collegiate programs spanning multiple NCAA divisions as well as high school athletes. Last year, the Tennessee men came in fourth place at the Classic while the women placed sixth. Junior Austin Whitelaw posted the best time of any of the men's returners at last year's event, running the 8k in a time of 25:17.40. Meanwhile, junior Alexi Panisse paced the women a year ago with a 5k time of 17:23.50. Fellow junior Chelsea Blaase, who has opened the year with back-to-back runner-up finishes, came in 27th (17:54.88) at the 2013 Classic.

TEXAS A&M

Texas A&M women finished 13th, one place ahead of nationally ranked No. 11 Butler, while the Aggie men placed 16th during the 29th annual Roy Griak Invitational hosted by Minnesota this past weekend. This week in region rankings A&M women dropped a spot to No. 5 while the men fell one spot to No. 4 in the South Central. The Aggies return to action on Oct. 10 in the Houston Baptist Invitational and then compete in the Wisconsin adidas Invitational on Oct. 17. Men – Isaac Spencer led the A&M men once again, placing 33rd as he ran 25:41.7 on the 8,000-meter course. Austin Wells clocked 26:02.8 to finish 58th while Ryan Miller posted a 26:29.4 to place 101st. The final two scoring places for the Aggies were claimed by Elliott Farris (26:56.5) and Austin Geerts (27:12.8) as they finished 137th and 166th. Texas A&M scored 462 points to finish a couple of places behind SEC foe Missouri (391) and ahead of conference schools Kentucky (21st – 532) and Vanderbilt (23rd – 548). Women – Karis Jochen finished amid the top 10 among an elite field at the Griak Invitational to lead the Aggies. Jochen posted a time of 21:20.0 over the challenging 6,000-meter course to place eighth. Teammates Grace Fletcher and Hillary Montgomery placed 19th (21:46.2) and 36th (22:10.7) on the challenging course. Wrapping up A&M's team score of 400 points were Haley Deakins (23:50.5) and Melanie Enriquez (24:23.2) as they placed 176th and 228th in the field of 390 runners. SEC teams in the meet included Vanderbilt (8th -237) and Missouri (11th – 380).

VANDERBILT

Running against a deep field that featured seven ranked teams, the No. 22-ranked Vanderbilt women posted an impressive eighth-place finish in the Women's Gold 6k Race at the Roy Griak Invitational hosted by the University of Minnesota. Vanderbilt's top-five finishers were separated by only 21 seconds, representing the best 1-5 spread of any team in the field. Amira Joseph paced the Commodores, finishing 34th with a time of 22:10. Sara Barron was the second Commodore to cross the line, posting a time of 22:16 to take 40th. The Commodores' top five finishers also included Lily Williams (22:24, 50th), Carmen Carlos (22:28, 54th) and Vanessa Valentine (22:31, 59th). They were followed by Reagan Anderson (22:34, 61st) and Rebecca Chandler (22:52, 82nd). Michigan State (66 points) won the event, and Iowa State (102) took second. The Vanderbilt men finished 31st in the Men's Gold Division 8k race. Nick French (27:41) and John Ewing (28:12) led the way for the Commodores. Up next for the Vanderbilt men is the Florida State Invitational on Oct. 10. Next for the Vanderbilt women is the Wisconsin adidas Invitational on Oct. 17.
