### CROSS COUNTRY

**Men** — Eight team national championships, two individual titles, 113 All-Americans since 1984 and 57 teams have finished among the Top-25 at the NCAA Championships since 1984.

**Women** — One team championship in 1988, 82 All-Americans since 1981 and 52 teams have finished among the Top-25 at the NCAA Championships since 1982.

### INDOOR TRACK & FIELD

**Men** — Eighteen team national championships since 1992, 151 NCAA individual and relay titles (six in 2014) and eight NCAA Championship records. SEC athletes earned 39 First-Team All-America honors in 2014.

**Women** — Fourteen team national championships since 1987, 132 NCAA individual and relay titles (six in 2014) and eight NCAA Championship records. SEC athletes earned 65 First-Team All-America honors in 2014.

### OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD

**Men** — Twenty NCAA team titles, including 18 national championships since 1989, 215 NCAA individual and relay titles (10 in 2014) and six NCAA Championship records. SEC athletes earned 68 First-Team All-America honors in 2014.

**Women** — Seventeen NCAA team titles since 1987, 145 NCAA individual and relay titles (eight in 2014) and five NCAA Championship records. SEC athletes earned 72 First-Team All-America honors in 2014.
