

## 2015 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament Game 3 – Thursday, March 5 – 12:00 p.m. #9 Arkansas 72, #8 Mississippi 61

## **MISSISSIPPI NOTES**

- Ole Miss is now 17-13 overall, 26-35 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- Senior forward Tia Faleru led the Rebels with 19 points, her 23<sup>rd</sup> game in double figures this year.
- Faleru moved past Jackie Martin Glass for 14<sup>th</sup> on the all-time Ole Miss scoring list with an even 1,400 points.
- Freshman guard A'Queen Hayes scored 12 points, while junior guard Gracie Frizzell had 11, the ninth double-figure game on the season for each player.
- The Rebels fall to 2-9 when trailing at the half.
- Ole Miss won the battle of points in the paint, 30-22, points off turnovers, 12-11 and second-chance points, 11-10.

## **ARKANSAS NOTES**

- Arkansas is now 17-12 on the year after its first SEC Tournament win since 2012. The Razorbacks are now 11-23 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- This was the second consecutive season that the Razorbacks opened the SEC Tournament against the Rebels, though with different results this time around after a 63-62 Ole Miss iin last year.
- Sophomore forward Jessica Jackson led Arkansas with a season-high 25 points, her 22<sup>nd</sup> double-figure game this season and ninth in a row. This was also her fifth game with 20+ points.
- Jackson was a perfect 8 for 8 from the free-throw line, setting a new season best in made free throws.
- Senior guard Calli Berna also hit a season high with 14 points, topping the 13 she scored against South Carolina on Feb. 19. It was Berna's fifth double-figure game
- Berna was 7 for 8 from the charity stripe, setting new season highs in makes and attempts.
- Sophomore guard Kelsey Brooks had her 22<sup>nd</sup> double-figure game with 13 points.
- Despite only sending two players off the bench to Ole Miss' seven, the Arkansas' bench outscored the Rebels, 9-5.
