



2015 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament

MISSOURI NOTES

- Missouri is now 17-13 overall, 0-3 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- The loss ends the Tigers' four-game winning streak, the longest conference streak for Mizzou since 2005-06.
- Sophomore guard Sierra Michaelis led the Tigers with a career-high 29 points, surpassing her previous best of 28, set against Alabama on Feb. 12.
- This was Michaelis' 14th game this season in double figures and the seventh time she has led Mizzou this season.
- Michaelis tied her career high of 10 field goals and set a new career mark with 21 attempts.
- Junior guard Morgan Stock scored 11 points for her ninth double-figure game of the season.

GEORGIA NOTES

- Georgia is now 19-11 overall, 46-31 all-time in the SEC Tournament and advances to face Tennessee in Friday's quarterfinal.
- The Bulldogs now lead the all-time series with the Tigers 5-2. This was the first time they have met in the SEC Tournament.
- Junior guard Tiaria Griffin led the Bulldogs with 21 points, her 18th double-figure game this season and third 20+ point performance.
- Griffin hit two 3-pointers on six attempts, giving her 67 career treys, which moves her into a tie with former Bulldog Ashley Houts for ninth on the UGA all-time list.
- Griffin played all 40 minutes for the fourth time this season, also going the distance in both meetings with Tennessee and against LSU.
- Senior forward Krista Donald scored 13 points and pulled down a season-high 15 rebounds to record her third double-double of the season.
- It was Donald's ninth double-figure scoring game and fifth game with 10+ rebounds.
- UGA outrebounded Mizzou, 39-26, and is now 15-5 this season when finishing with the edge on the boards.
- The Bulldogs are now 15-1 when leading at halftime.
- Georgia outscored Missouri in the paint, 30-24, had a 21-9 edge in second-chance points and outscored the Tiger bench, 26-17.
