



2015 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament

#1 Tennessee 75, #10 Georgia 41

TENNESSEE NOTES

- Tennessee is now 26-4 overall, 74-18 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- UT now has a 14-3 postseason record vs. UGA.
- The Lady Volunteers advance to face the winner of Kentucky-Mississippi State in the semifinal on Saturday.
- The 11 points UT allowed in the first half was a season low by an opponent.
- UGA's total of 41 points marked the fewest points allowed in an SEC tournament game by Tennessee.
- The 34-point margin of victory was the largest for Tennessee over an SEC opponent this season.
- All nine Lady Vols that entered the game scored.
- Junior forward Bashaara Graves scored 13 points and pulled down a team-high 11 rebounds for her seventh double-double of the year, first since the Stanford game on Dec. 20.
- Senior forward Cierra Burdick scored six points to become the fourth Lady Vol this season to reach 1,000 career points.
- Senior guard Ariel Massengale dished out three assists, the first of which made her the fifth Lady Vol to reach 500 career assists.
- UT outrebounded the Bulldogs 47-23. The +24 margin is the fourth time Tennessee has outrebounded an opponent by 20+.
- Tennessee won the battle of points in the paint, 44-12, bench points, 34-17 and points off of turnovers, 21-12.

GEORGIA NOTES

- Georgia is now 19-12 overall, 46-32 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- The Bulldogs' 11 points in the first half were the fewest scored in a half this season, the previous low of 14 coming against South Carolina on Feb. 5.
- Senior guard Erika Ford led the Bulldogs with 13 points and tied a season high with three 3-pointers
- Senior forward Krista Donald also scored 13 points for her 10th double-digit game of the season.
