



## 2015 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament

Game 8 – Friday, March 6 – 2:30 p.m.

#4 LSU 71, #5 Texas A&M 65

### LSU NOTES

---

- LSU is now 17-12 overall, 34-34 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- The Tigers advance to face the No. 1 seed South Carolina in the semifinal on Saturday.
- LSU's 44 points in the first half were the second-most by the team in a first half this season, behind only the 48 the Tigers scored against A&M in the regular-season finale, an 80-63 LSU win.
- The Tigers began the game on a 22-4 run over the first 7:33 of the game.
- LSU is now 16-2 when leading at the half.
- The Tigers are 11-1 when scoring 70+ points.
- Junior guard Danielle Ballard led the Tigers with 22 points, her fourth game with 20+ points this season.
- Ballard also led LSU with 10 rebounds for the fifth double-double of the season and the 12<sup>th</sup> of her career.
- Sophomore guard Raigyne Moncreif scored 14 points to record her team-best 20th double-figure game of the season.
- Senior guard DaShawn Harden scored 10 points for her 13<sup>th</sup> game in double figures.
- LSU's bench outscored its Texas A&M counterparts 17-14.

### TEXAS A&M NOTES

---

- Texas A&M is now 23-9 overall, 5-2 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- The loss breaks a 10-year streak of the Aggies making the conference tournament semifinals between Big XII and SEC Tournaments.
- Junior Courtney Williams led A&M with 19 points, her 22<sup>nd</sup> game in double figures, and ninth straight.
- Junior guard Courtney Walker scored eight points, giving her 1,389 for her career, which moves her into sole possession of eighth place on the Texas A&M all-time scoring list.
- The Aggies outrebounded the Tigers, 41-33 and lost for just the fourth time this season when holding the rebound edge. They are now 17-4 when outrebounding an opponent.
- The teams were even in points in the paint, 26-26
