



2015 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament

Second Round – Game #4 Notes

Auburn 66, Texas A&M 59

Auburn will play No. 4 seed LSU Friday at approximately 2:30 p.m. CT.

Series Notes:

- All-Time Series: Texas A&M leads 7-4 overall and 4-2 since entering the SEC.
- Season Series: Texas A&M leads 2-1
- SEC Tournament: Tied at 1-1
- Texas A&M defeated Auburn in the last SEC Tournament in Nashville, 71-62 in 2013.

Game Notes:

- With Auburn advancing to the quarterfinals, it matches the deepest run for a team seeded 13 or lower since the SEC Tournament moved to a 14-team bracket in 2013. The No. 13 seed South Carolina advanced to the quarters last year.
- Down 33-23 at halftime, Auburn stormed out of the break on a 16-1 run to take a 39-34 edge with 16:03 left. Auburn led by as much as 12 in the second half.
- After Auburn jumped out of the gates to a 10-4 lead, Texas A&M responded with an early 15-2 run to take a 19-12 advantage at the 8:47 mark. The Aggies led by as much as 11 in the first half.
- A&M committed 19 turnovers, while Auburn committed 10.
- Points off turnovers were 20-5 in favor of the Tigers.

Texas A&M Notes:

- Texas A&M falls to 20-11 and has dropped three straight games.
- The Aggies are 2-3 this season without Daniel House in the lineup.
- A&M loses for just the third time this season when leading at the half, falling to 13-3.
- Alex Robinson registered double-digit points for the sixth time this season and first time in four games with 11. He tied Alex Caruso for the team-lead in scoring.
- Kourtney Roberson collected double-figure rebounds for the sixth time this year with a game-high 12.

Auburn Notes:

- Auburn improves to 14-19 and has won two straight after snapping a six-game skid.
- The Tigers have won their first two SEC Tournament games for the first time since 2000.
- After entering the week with a 0-11 mark against league foes when trailing at halftime, Auburn has overcome deficits at the break of both SEC Tournament games.
- KT Harrell topped the 25-point mark for the fourth time this year with a game-high 25. He connected on 4-of-6 3-pointers.
- Cinmeon Bowers posted 10 points and eight rebounds, which marked his most in the last nine games.
