

2015 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament

Nashville, Tenn. - Bridgestone Arena



Quarterfinals – Game #8 Notes Auburn 73, LSU 70 (OT) Auburn will play Kentucky Saturday at noon CT.

Series Notes:

All-Time Series: LSU leads 84-66
Season Series: Auburn leads 2-1
SEC Tournament: LSU leads 5-4

This marks their first meeting in the SEC Tournament since 2005 and just the second since 1991.

Game Notes:

- With Auburn advancing to the semifinals, it marks the deepest run for a team seeded 13 or lower since the SEC Tournament moved to a 14-team bracket in 2013.
- Down 61-53 with 2:45 remaining, Auburn's KT Harrell connected on five free throws and two 3-pointers, including the game-tying trey with 0.7 seconds left, as part of an 11-3 run to tie the game at 64-64 and force overtime.
- Auburn took their first lead of the game at the 3:45 mark of overtime. LSU led by as much as nine in regulation.
- There was a combined 80 free throw attempts in the game, and LSU shot a season-high 44.
- Auburn held a 23-5 edge in bench points.

LSU Notes:

- LSU falls to 22-10 and has dropped their last two games.
- LSU is 3-2 in overtime games this year.
- Jarell Martin registered his 14th double-double of the year with 18 points and 16 rebounds, which tied his career best for boards.
- Keith Hornsby notched his fourth 20-point performance of the season with 24, which was one shy of his career high.

Auburn Notes:

- Auburn improves to 15-19 and has won three straight after snapping a six-game skid.
- Auburn is 2-0 in overtime games this year.
- The Tigers have won their first three SEC Tournament games for the first time since 1985.
- After entering the week with a 0-11 mark against league foes when trailing at halftime, Auburn has overcome deficits at the break of all three SEC Tournament games.
- KT Harrell tied his career high with 29 points and set career bests for free throw makes and attempts, hitting 15-of-18. He topped the 25-point mark for second straight game and fifth time this year.
- Harrell scored Auburn's final 11 points of regulation and first four of overtime.
- Malcolm Canada was one point shy of his career high with 14 on 6-of-8 shooting.
- K.C. Ross-Miller tied his career high for rebounds with seven.
