Semifinals – Game #11 Notes

Kentucky 91, Auburn 67

Kentucky will play the winner of Arkansas/Georgia Sunday at noon CT.

Series Notes:

- All-Time Series: Kentucky leads 91-17
- Season Series: Kentucky leads 2-0
- SEC Tournament: Kentucky leads 13-1
- The Wildcats have won 18 straight in the series.
- The teams last met in the 2003 SEC Tournament, won by UK 78-58 in New Orleans.

Game Notes:

- After Auburn scored the game's first bucket, Kentucky responded with a 15-2 run. The Wildcats led by as much as 20 in the first half and 28 in the game.
- UK shot 56 percent from the field and have hit for that clip or better seven times this season. Auburn was limited to just 33 percent shooting.
- The Kentucky bench outscored Auburn's 26-5.
- The Wildcats enjoyed a 39-25 rebounding edge and 17-5 advantage in assists.

Kentucky Notes:

- Kentucky improves to 33-0.
- The Wildcats' current 33-game win streak is the longest in school history, besting the 32-game run from 1953-54 to 1954-55.
- UK advances to the SEC Tournament finals for the second straight year and 38th time in its history, which is the most of any school.
- The Cats are now 39-2 all-time in SEC Tournament semifinal games.
- Willie Cauley-Stein recorded his second-highest scoring output of the season with a team-high 18 points. He led five Wildcats in double figures.
- Andrew Harrison had his fifth game of the year of 15 or more points.
- Karl-Anthony Towns earned all eight of his points from the free throw line, going 8-for-8 from the stripe. Both attempts and makes were season highs.
- Tyler Ulis posted his second-most assists of the year with a game-high six.

Auburn Notes:

- Auburn falls to 15-20 and snaps its three-game win streak.
- Antoine Mason notched his fifth 20-point game of the year with 23. He averaged 26.0 ppg in two meetings against Kentucky this year.
- Malcolm Canada scored a career-high 16 points and averaged 15.0 over the last two games.
- The Tigers' 25 free throws and 34 attempts are the most against the Wildcats this season.
