# THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

## "THE STANDARD OF EXCELLENCE"

The Southeastern Conference, with its storied 81-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of intercollegiate competition of any league in the country since its inception in 1933.

The 2013-14 academic year was another season to remember for the SEC as conference teams captured seven national titles and six national runner-up finishes. The SEC has won consecutive national championships in equestrian, men's golf, gymnastics and women's swimming and diving. Since 1990, the SEC has won 163 team national championships for an average of more than six per year.

Florida's second consecutive gymnastics national title was the fourth straight for the league and 198th overall. The Georgia equestrian team brought home the national title marking the 13th consecutive year that a team currently in the SEC captured the title. Alabama won its second consecutive national championship in the sport of men's golf. Georgia's women's swimming team captured its sixth national title and second in a row. The Florida softball team prevailed in an all SEC final to win its first championship and second for the league. Texas A&M won the league's 18th championship in women's outdoor track & field. Vanderbilt won the baseball title, the league's fourth in the last six years.

Overall, the SEC finished in the top two in nine of its 21 sponsored sports and in the top five in 13 of the 21 sports. Ten SEC teams participated in football postseason bowls with Auburn participating in the BCS Championship. Three men's basketball teams were invited to the NCAA Tournament and eight women's basketball teams were also invited to the NCAA Tournament. The SEC had 10 teams advance to postseason play in baseball with Ole Miss and Vanderbilt advancing to the College World Series. With 178 teams advancing to NCAA postseason competition, the SEC continued to solidify its place as the nation's premier conference.

In addition to the seven team championships, 71 SEC student-athletes garnered individual national championships, while 555 individuals were awarded with First-Team All-America Honors. Student-athletes around the league continued to excel in the classroom as well with more than 3,100 earning recognition on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

On the national all-sport level, all 14 SEC schools placed in the top 55 of the NACDA Director's Cup rankings. Florida led the league with a second-place finish. Texas A&M placed 10th while Kentucky was 11th; Georgia finished 16th, Alabama 17th, LSU 24th, Arkansas 28th, Auburn 34th, South Carolina 35th, Tennessee 40th, Vanderbilt 45th, Missouri 46th, Mississippi State 52nd and Ole Miss 54th.

# ROY F. KRAMER SEC ATHLETES OF THE YEAR

## REED AND ROGERS NAMED SEC ATHLETES OF THE YEAR

**BIRMINGHAM, Ala.** - Kentucky baseball player AJ Reed and Florida softball player Hannah Rogers have been named the 2013-2014 Roy F. Kramer SEC Male and Female Athletes of the Year by a vote of the league's athletics directors, Commissioner Mike Slive announced today.

"AJ and Hannah are true examples of outstanding student-athletes. They have competed at the highest level of collegiate athletics, and through their hard work, dedication and commitment to excellence, have been successful in their endeavors," said SEC Commissioner Mike Slive. "They are fine representatives of their universities and this conference. The SEC is proud to honor them for their accomplishments."

A native of Terre Haute, Ind., Reed was named national player of the year by Collegiate Baseball and the ABCA, the College Player of the Year by Baseball America, and won the 2014 Dick Howser Trophy, presented by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association at the College World Series. He also won the John Olerud Award, given to the top two-way player in the nation.

The consensus first-team All-America and SEC Player of the Year had one of the top seasons in the history of college baseball as a two-way star. He led the nation in homers (23), slugging percentage (.735) and OPS (1.211), while also leading the SEC in pitching wins (12), RBI (73), walks (49), total bases (164) and on-base percentage (.476). He is the first player in league history to lead the conference in homers and pitching wins.

A five-time National Player of the Week honoree, also winning SEC Player of the Week twice and SEC Pitcher of the Week once, he hit more homers by himself than 185 schools in college baseball, including six SEC schools.

Rogers led Florida softball to its first national championship in 2014 and was named the Women's College World Series (WCWS) Most Outstanding Player after factoring in all five games (four complete-game wins, three shutouts, and one save). The Gators went undefeated at the WCWS, outscoring opponents 32-6 in the five games played in Oklahoma City. The Lake Wales, Fla., native earned a complete-game victory in all seven starts she made during the NCAA Tournament and finished her Gator tenure as the NCAA active career leader in wins (127). She was named a Third Team NFCA All-American, becoming the first Florida softball player to earn All-America honors four times. She also earned All-SEC recognition in each of her four seasons.

This past season, she won 30 games (30-8) for the third time in her career, compiling a 15-7 record against ranked opponents, including a six-game winning streak in such contests to close the season. She completed her Florida career as the second winningest pitcher in program history (Stacey Nelson - 136).

# H. Boyd McWhorter SEC SCHOLAR-ATHLETES OF THE YEAR

## WHITSETT, VREELAND NAMED MCWHORTER WINNERS

**BIRMINGHAM, Ala.** – University of Alabama golfer Cory Whitsett and University of Georgia swimmer Shannon Vreeland have been named the 2013-14 Southeastern Conference H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athletes of the Year, Commissioner Mike Slive announced Tuesday.

The two were chosen by a committee of Faculty Athletics Representatives from SEC universities and both will receive a \$15,000 post-graduate scholarship, provided by AT&T, an SEC Corporate Champion, and the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

“Cory and Shannon demonstrate a commitment to excellence that makes them the ideal choices for the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award,” Slive said. “This is the SEC’s most prestigious award and they deserve this honor because of their hard work that allows them to excel at the highest level in their sport and in the classroom. I congratulate them as outstanding representatives of their respective institutions and the SEC.”

A business major, who graduated this past Saturday, Whitsett’s accomplishments both on and off the golf course are nearly unmatched in collegiate golf. Whitsett was the 2013 SEC Golfer of the Year and SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and a two-time NCAA Elite 89 Award winner as the golfer with the highest grade-point average (4.0) at the NCAA Championships.

An at-large member of the 2013 Capital One Academic All-America team and a Cleveland Golf All-American Scholar, he is a two-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection and was named to the SEC Newcomer Academic Honor Roll in 2011.

In 2013 he helped lead Alabama to the NCAA Championship and spent time as the world’s No. 1 amateur while helping lead the United States to victory at the 2013 Walker Cup and Palmer Cup.

He is a four-year starter at Alabama, earning first team All-SEC in each of his first three years and consensus first team All-America honors in 2013 while gaining a second-team selection in 2011 and 2012. He was a member of the 2013 All-Nicklaus Team and the 2011 All-Mickelson Team, and he owns five career individual medalist honors, second most at Alabama and is third in school history in scoring average (71.45).

The 2011 SEC Freshman of the Year, he has 16 top-five and 22 top-10 finishes in his career and has won three individual titles at the Linger Longer Invitational as well as the 2011 Western Refining All-American Classic and the 2013 Aggie Invitational.

Vreeland is a double major in Economics and International Affairs and is on target to graduate in December 2014. She was named a recipient of the Ramsey Scholarship for Academic and Athletic Excellence and chosen as the recipient of the Lisa Coole Memorial Scholarship.

Named to the Athletic Director’s Honor Roll, Vreeland was picked as a swimming and diving representative on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and chosen for the Southeastern Conference Community Service Team. She was previously recognized as the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for swimming and diving.

She placed second in the 200 freestyle, fifth in the 100 freestyle and sixth in the 500 freestyle at the NCAAs as the Lady Bulldogs won their second straight national championship. She came in second on the 800 freestyle relay, third on the 400 medley relay and fourth on the 400 freestyle relay at the NCAAs.

Vreeland, a team captain, won the 200 freestyle and placed second in the 100 and 500 freestyle at the SEC Championships as the Lady Bulldogs won their fifth straight title. She finished first on the 400 and 800 freestyle relays and second on the 400 medley relay at the SEC meet.

Named the Kansas City Sports Commission’s Sportswoman of the Year, Vreeland earned a Golden Goggles Award from USA Swimming for Relay Performance of the Year after helping the 400-meter freestyle relay win gold and set the American record at the 2013 World Championships. She also placed second in the 100-meter freestyle, fourth in the 200-meter freestyle and eighth in the 400-meter freestyle as the United States defeated Europe 132-131 in the Mutual of Omaha Duel in the Pool in Scotland, and she swam on the runner-up 400-meter freestyle relay in the Duel in the Pool.

Vreeland ranks second in the 200 freestyle, fourth in the 500 freestyle, sixth in the 100 freestyle, eighth in the 200 and 400 individual medley, ninth in the 1,000 freestyle and 10th in the 1,650 freestyle in Georgia school history. She led off the 800 freestyle relay that set the American, U.S. Open, NCAA and Georgia records and she led off the 400 freestyle relay that lowered the NCAA, U.S. Open and Georgia marks. She also swam on the 400 freestyle relay that set the American record.

# Bernie Moore ALL-SPORTS TROPHY

Symbolic of the Southeastern Conference's premier men's athletic program, the Bernie Moore All-Sports Trophy was presented annually for 21 years. The SEC officially began tabulating all-sports points after the 1973-74 school year and named the award after Bernie Moore, who served as SEC Commissioner from 1948-66. The all-sports race was discontinued after the 1993-94 school year.

Points for both the Bernie Moore and Women's All-Sports Trophies were awarded on a 12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis for all sports. However, only the top six finishes counted toward an institution's total. If a school's lowest finish occurred in more than one sport, the most recent team to record the finish was not counted. In addition, if a team was on probation in a sport, the institution was required to count that sport's vacated position among its six.

In the event of a tie for a position, the points for the number of places involved were added together, divided by the number of teams involved in the tie and awarded to those teams equally.

The track finish was figured by doubling the outdoor point total and adding it to indoor and cross country. Overall points for track were then assigned by the 12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 format.

# Women's ALL-SPORTS TROPHY

For an 11-year span, the Women's All-Sports Trophy was awarded on the same basis as the Bernie Moore All-Sports Trophy for men's athletics. The Bernie Moore and Women's All-Sport Trophy was discontinued following the 1993-94 seasons.

Following the 1983-84 school year, the SEC began recognizing a women's all-sports champion. Women's athletics officially came under the auspices of the NCAA and SEC in 1982. However, SEC schools participated in organized conference championships prior to that date. Those championships were retroactively recognized by the SEC.
