FLORIDA POST-GAME NOTES

- Overall Record: 41-16
- Auburn still leads the all-time series, 125-111-2.
- Florida will play the loser of Game 12 between LSU and Arkansas on Friday evening.
- The Gators are now 7-2 against Auburn in the SEC Tournament.
- Florida also played in an elimination game last season after dropping its first game in the tournament.
- Manager Kevin O'Sullivan is now 13-13 in Hoover during his eight-year career at Florida.
- Pitcher Logan Shore picked up his first win since April 17. It was also his third-straight outing of at least seven innings.
- Senior Josh Tobias went 4-for-5 with two RBIs. It was Tobias' first four-hit game and 22nd multi-hit game of the season.
- Sophomore Peter Alonso went a perfect 3-for-3 on the day with three RBIs.
- All eight of Florida's runs in the third inning came with two outs. It was the highest output since the team scored nine against Rhode Island on Feb. 14.
- The Gators are now 12-0 on the season when scoring 10-plus runs.
- This was Florida's third win in the SEC Tournament by nine or more runs.
- Florida is now 30-20 in the SEC Tournament when recording 10 or more hits.

AUBURN POST-GAME NOTES

- Overall Record: 35-24
- Auburn fell to 7-4 in the SEC Tournament after winning its first game. The Tigers are now 2-7 against the Gators in the SEC Tournament.
- Auburn's all-time record in SEC Tournament play is 31-44.
- With two stolen bases on Thursday, the Tigers have now stolen 34 in their past 23 games after stealing 23 bases in the first 36 games.
- Centerfielder Anfernee Grier's triple today was Auburn's 17th of the season, which is the most for Auburn since recording 19 in 2012.
- For the third time this season, Auburn's pitching staff did not walk a batter. Previously, the Tigers didn't allow a walk vs. Georgia State on April 8 and vs. Kennesaw State on April 29.

FLORIDA HEAD COACH KEVIN O'SULLIVAN

Opening Statement ...

"I am really proud of the way we responded to the tough loss last night. Obviously, it was a short night for us. I am really pleased with how they came out with some focus. Logan [Shore] was outstanding on the mound and kept our bullpen intact. Then obviously, Josh [Tobias] had four hits and Peter [Alonso] had three. Overall I am pleased with our game today and we'll get out there tomorrow and go again. "

On the team's pitching...

I think we are in pretty good shape now. In all we have six guys who have not thrown yet. Everybody else should be close to ready to go tomorrow. It should come down to our starters, specifically A.J. [Puk]. If he gives us the start we need him to then we should have a chance."

On the possibility of playing LSU...

We played them last year and they have a lot of guys back. We will just watch them tonight. What is really important is what our guys can do on the mound. We will figure it out and go from there."

NO. 24, JOSH TOBIAS, 3B, SR.

On the 8-run inning...

"It was a great inning to get 8 runs. The main thing we did was string together at bats. Things kind of unfolded from there. It is always awesome to have innings like that."

NO. 20, PETER ALONSO, 1B, SO.

On the 8-run inning...

"Being a part of a game like that is super fun. Hitting like that is very contagious. When you get in that situation it is kind of hard to not get a hit because you just want to pass the torch to the next guy."

AUBURN HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Opening Statement...

"Well, just real disappointed in our performance today. Reflecting on the tournament, the kids did a really good job of coming in winning and playing hard-fought contests. Really two innings—the six run inning against LSU yesterday and the eight run inning today. That's tough for any team to overcome. That's something that hadn't happened to us, happened to us here so you've got to give LSU and Florida a lot of credit. We've got to do a better job of controlling that. I thought when [Richie] Martin laid down the bunt, just to move a guy into scoring position with two outs, there's a ball we can make a play on and the next thing you know the flood gate just opened and they scored eight runs with two outs. That's pretty discouraging, but we'll go back and regroup and take a few days off. I know our kids are tired after coming back from Florida and bouncing right down here. We've had a good weekend. The tournament's real excellent. We lost to two very good teams that I hope get what they deserve, which I think is a national seed. I know both coaches have worked hard to get their programs to a position to be able to do that especially this year."

NO. 6, DAMON HAECKER, RF, SO.

On today's performance and heading into next week...

"Today we gave up the one inning with eight runs so that is disappointing, but you've got to battle back. That was early so we had to push runs across late and execute. We know what we need to work on going into next week. We just need to go back to work next week and get ready for next weekend."
