FLORIDA POST-GAME NOTES

- Overall Record: 44-16
- Florida leads the all-time series against Vanderbilt 130-71-1.
- This is Florida's seventh SEC Tournament Championship and its second in five seasons (1981, 1982, 1984, 1988, 1991, 2011 & 2015).
- The Gators are 7-6 all-time in the SEC Tournament Championship Game.
- Florida is 3-8 all-time in the SEC Tournament against Vanderbilt, but has won its last two tournament championship games against the Commodores.
- The Gators are 32-4 when scoring first this season, 21-1 when scoring in the first inning.
- After beginning the tournament 0-for-8, junior left fielder Harrison Bader has gone a combined 4-for-9 in the last two wins over LSU and Vanderbilt, including one RBI and two runs scored in the championship game.
- Sophomore Peter Alonso went 6-for-13 (.462) over five games with five walks, five RBI, and five runs scored.
- Catcher JJ Schwarz was named the SEC Tournament Championship MVP and finished the tournament 10-for-19 (.526) with six RBI.

VANDERBILT POST-GAME NOTES

- Overall Record: 42-19
- Vanderbilt was selected to host a 2015 Regional.
- The Commodores are now 2-5 over Top 10 teams. Florida is ranked No. 7 in the country.
- Vanderbilt has finished runner-up in the SEC Tournament eight times. It is also the fifth time the Commodores have finished runner-up in the tournament since winning the tournament in 2007.
- The seven runs given up against Florida were the most runs given up by Vanderbilt in the tournament. The last time Vanderbilt gave up seven runs was also to Florida on May 9.
- Vanderbilt led the tournament in doubles (14) and home runs (8).
- Dansby Swanson recorded a hit in all five of his SEC Tournament games.

FLORIDA HEAD COACH KEVIN O'SULLIVAN

On using momentum for NCAA Tournament...

"Unfortunately, this doesn't help us for next weekend. It's a new tournament and a new season. I am pleased with how we played this week. We had a very difficult loss on Wednesday. Arkansas played great. We battled back and played some really good teams. We beat LSU, the No. 1 team in the country (Saturday). That was a big win for us, and obviously Vanderbilt is extremely talented and are very good. We played two of the best teams in the whole country the last few days."

NO. 15, DANNY YOUNG, LHP, JR.

On pitching after the rain delay...

"Obviously rain delays are kind of tough, but I just tried to attack hitters the best I could. I didn't really have much working, but I was just trying to locate my fastball and get ground balls to get easy outs."

VANDERBILT HEAD COACH TIM CORBIN

Opening statement...

"It looked like it was for us. Their bullpen did a pretty good job of shutting us down. There were some defensive break downs that cost us a lot of runs. I thought our execution early was below average and they took advantage of it early."
