Georgia - The women have won the 800 free relay seven straight years and 12 times overall

LSU - Set school records in the men's 200 medley relay (1:25.92) and women's 800 free relay (7:04.77) ... Jake Markham set a new 200 free school mark with a 1:35.09 split.

Missouri - The Tigers set school records in the women's 200 medley relay (1:36.42) and the men's 800 free relay (6:19.17)

South Carolina - Set a new school mark in the women's 800 free relay (7:10.28)

Tennessee - Now won the women's 200 medley relay six times overall and five times since 2010 ... Tied the men's 200 medley relay school mark (1:24.09)

Vanderbilt - Set a new school record in the 200 medley relay (1:40.61)
