#14 Ole Miss vs. #11 Vanderbilt

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- Session 1 Attendance: 2,889 – SEC Tournament record for Session 1

OLE MISS NOTES

- Ole Miss' all-time record in the SEC Tournament falls to 26-36
- The Rebels have lost six of their last seven SEC Tournament games
- Ole Miss ends its season having lost each of its final 11 games
- For the 13th time this season, sophomore guard Shandricka Sessom scored 17-plus points

VANDERBILT NOTES

- Vanderbilt's 15-point win marks its largest margin of victory in an SEC Tournament game since defeating 10th-seeded Mississippi State, 67-51, in the 2012 first round
- For the 16th time in their last 17 SEC Tournament appearances, the Commodores won their first game of the event, with the only loss during that span coming in 2014
- Vanderbilt improves its all-time SEC Tournament record to 47-30
- The Commodores are now 22-10 in SEC Tournament play under 14th-year head coach Melanie Balcomb
- Vanderbilt entered today's game averaging 5.6 three-point field goals per game—it had six threes through the first 17:13 of regulation alone
- Vanderbilt drained seven three-pointers, marking the 11th time this season it has finished a game with 7-plus threes.
 - The Commodores improved to 10-1 in those games
 - Vanderbilt also matched its highest three-point field goal percentage for games in which it made at least seven triples this season (7-10, 70 percent), with the other occurrence coming against Air Force (Nov. 30, 2015)
- Vanderbilt's 29 first-quarter points were the most its scored in any quarter this season
 - Moreover, the Commodores' 42 points in the first half marked their third-highest total in a first half this season
- For the sixth time this season, Vanderbilt had four players score in double figures—Christa Reed (21), Marqu'es Webb (13), Minta Spears (13), Morgan Batey (10)
 - Today was the fourth time this season three Commodores scored 13-plus points
- Sophomore guard Christa Reed finished with a game-high 21 points to log her second consecutive 20-point outing
 - Reed boasts four 20-point games this season
- Junior forward Marqu'es Webb finished the game with 13 points on 3-of-4 shooting, bringing her field goal percentage to 87.1 percent (27-31) in Ole Miss' last eight games
