



2016 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament

#11 Vanderbilt vs. #6 Georgia

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- Vanderbilt is the seventh No. 11 seed to make the SEC Tournament quarterfinals since the conference stopped seeding the field divisionally in 1986
 - Other No. 11 seeds who were quarterfinalists: Mississippi State (2011), Florida (2007), Arkansas (2005), Auburn (2002), Ole Miss (2001), South Carolina (1998)
- Vanderbilt is the first No. 11 seed since 1986 to win two SEC Tournament games
- Tonight was the first SEC Tournament game to go to overtime since 2010, when fifth-seeded Vanderbilt defeated 12th-seeded Arkansas, 65-64, in the first round
 - It was the sixth overtime game in SEC Tournament history
 - Georgia and Vanderbilt's combined 103 points marked the lowest total in any of the SEC Tournament's six overtime games

VANDERBILT NOTES

- Vanderbilt's all-time SEC Tournament record improves to 48-30
 - The Commodores are 23-10 under 14th-year head coach Melanie Balcomb
- Vanderbilt has won two games in the SEC Tournament for the first time since 2010
- For the third time this season, the Commodores did not surrender a three-pointer
- The Commodores are now 4-3 this season when shooting less than 40 percent overall
- Vanderbilt's 54 points matched its lowest total in a win this season
- Vanderbilt scored just two points in the second quarter, marking its lowest scoring output in any quarter this season
 - It was also the first time in the last six games Vanderbilt scored less than 10 points in a quarter
- Sophomore guard Christa Reed had 14 of her 18 points in the second half and overtime
- Junior guard Minta Spears' 17 points is her third straight game of double-digit scoring

GEORGIA NOTES

- Georgia's all-time SEC Tournament record falls to 46-33
- For a fourth consecutive game, Georgia scored less than 10 points in the first quarter
 - The Bulldogs scored eight points on 3-of-19 shooting (15.8 percent) in the frame
- Georgia is 0-3 this season when trailing by 10-plus points after the opening quarter—it trailed 18-8 after this evening's first quarter
- Freshman guard Caliya Robinson totaled a team-high 14 points and a career-high 12 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the season
- Tonight was the seventh time this season Georgia shot less than 35 percent overall
 - It fell to 1-6 in such games during the 2015-16 campaign
