#10 Arkansas vs. #7 Tennessee

TOURNAMENT NOTES

• Tonight marked the first Arkansas-Tennessee matchup in SEC Tournament history

ARKANSAS NOTES

- Arkansas' all-time SEC Tournament record falls to 11-25
 - The Razorbacks are 1-2 in SEC Tournament play under second-year head coach Jimmy Dykes
- Arkansas remains winless in the SEC Tournament first round as a No. 10 seed
- Sophomore center Devin Cosper scored a career-high 20 points and posted her fifth 15point outing of the season
- Cosper's eight field goals were also a career high, while her 19 field goal attempts tied a career high
- Junior forward Jessica Jackson scored all seven of Arkansas' first-quarter points
 Jackson's only other points (five) came in the fourth quarter

TENNESSEE NOTES

- Tennessee improves its all-time SEC Tournament record to 76-19
 - The Lady Vols are 7-2 in SEC Tournament games under fourth-year head coach Holly Warlick
- The Lady Vols have now won their last 23 SEC Tournament openers
- UT has won 23 consecutive SEC Tournament games when scoring 65-plus points, with its last loss coming in a 68-66 overtime setback against Georgia in the 2004 semifinals
- Tonight marks the fourth time this season UT shot less than 40 percent and won
- Tennessee forced its opponent to shoot less than 35 percent from the field for the 10th time this season
- Nine of the 11 Volunteers who saw game action made at least one field goal
- Tennessee was previously 0-3 this season when it forced 10 or fewer turnovers
- The Lady Vols' 10 turnovers were their second-lowest total of the season
- Tennessee made 14 of its 17 free throw attempts, marking the third time this season it made 80-plus percent of its free throws when it had at least 15 attempts
- Redshirt sophomore guard Diamond DeShields scored 10 of her 15 points in the third quarter
- Junior guard Jordan Reynolds scored in double figures for just the third time this season
