## KENTUCKY NOTES

---

- Kentucky's all-time SEC Tournament record improves to 33-36, and are now 14-8 in SEC Tournament play under ninth-year head coach Matthew Mitchell
- Kentucky will make its seventh consecutive SEC Tournament semifinals appearance
  - The Wildcats have only been eliminated before the semifinals twice since 2006
- Kentucky extends its winning streak eight games, and its won all but one of those games by at least 10 points
- The Wildcats are now 24-6 when scoring 70-plus points in an SEC Tournament game
  - Since 1995, Kentucky is 12-1 in such games
- Kentucky's 33 second-quarter points marked its highest total in any quarter this season
  - UK previously tallied 30-point quarters against Morehead State (Nov. 18) and Jackson State (Nov. 29)
- Kentucky's 92 points are the third-most its ever scored in an SEC Tournament game
- Junior guard Makayla Epps scored a game-high 22 points for her 10th 20-point game of the season and 17th of her career
- Junior forward Evelyn Akhator tallied 12 points and 11 rebounds her 12th double-double of the season—which also culminated in her 14th game of 10-plus rebounds this season, including her third in a row

## FLORIDA NOTES

---

- Florida's all-time SEC Tournament record falls to 19-36
  - The Gators are now 5-9 under ninth-year head coach Amanda Butler
- The Gators have lost each of their last 13 SEC Tournament quarterfinal games, with their last win coming in 1998
- Florida has lost consecutive SEC Tournament games by 20-plus points for only the third time in program history, with the other occurrences coming in 1987-88 and 1990-91
- Florida allowed 30 points in a quarter for just the fifth time this season, with Kentucky's 33 points marking the highest total it surrendered in any quarter this season
- For the seventh time this season, UF outscored by at least 10 points in a quarter
  - Prior to today, the largest single-quarter point differential a Gators opponent posted this season was 15 points, which came in the third quarter of a win over Alabama (outscored 30-15)—UK outscored Florida, 33-13, in the second frame
- Senior guard Carlie Needles tied UF's SEC Tournament single-game record for three-pointers (five)
