

2016 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament Game 10 – Friday, March 4 – 8:30 p.m. #11 Vanderbilt vs. #3 Mississippi State

## TOURNAMENT NOTES

- Double-digit seeds remain winless in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals since 1993, when 10th-seeded Ole Miss topped No. 2-seeded Auburn to advance to the semifinals
- Session 5 Attendance 4,214

## VANDERBILT NOTES

- Vanderbilt's all-time SEC Tournament record falls to 48-31
  The Commodores are 23-11 under 14th-year head coach Melanie Balcomb
- Vanderbilt has lost three consecutive SEC Tournament quarterfinal games
- The Commodores were held below 50 points for just the third time this season, and their 46 points marked its second-lowest total of their 2015-16 campaign
- Vanderbilt committed 27 turnovers, its second-highest total in a game this season
  - Entering tonight, the Commodores had only committed more than 25 turnovers in two games this season—both were losses
- Vanderbilt's six first-quarter points matched its third-lowest total in a quarter this season

## MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

- Mississippi State's all-time SEC Tournament record improves to 16-36
  - The Bulldogs are 2-3 under fourth-year head coach Vic Schaefer
- Mississippi State will make its first SEC Tournament semifinals appearance since 2010
  - It will be the fourth SEC Tournament semifinals appearance in program history, with the other occurrences coming in 2000, 2003, and 2010
- The Bulldogs held Vanderbilt to a season-low 12 field goals
- For the 13th time this season and eight time in its last 13 games, Mississippi State held its opponent to less than 25 points in the first half
- For only the seventh time this season, Mississippi State won a game in which it made 23 or fewer field goals
  - All six of the Bulldogs' losses this season have come in games when they made less than 23 field goals
- Junior guard Dominique Dillingham has scored in double figures in each of Mississippi State's last four games, marking her longest streak of the season
- Freshman center Teaira McCowan's scored 11 points to notch her seventh game of 10plus points this season
  - Her 11 points were the most she's scored in a game since a 24-point outing against Western Michigan back on Dec. 20, 2015
- For only the fourth time this season, sophomore guard Victoria Vivians finished with less than four field goals in a game in which had at least eight field goal attempts
