Second Round – Game #4 Notes Alabama 81, Ole Miss 73

Alabama advances to face Kentucky Friday at approximately 6 p.m. CT

Series Notes:

All-Time Series: Alabama leads 119-57
SEC Tournament: Alabama leads 5-2

Season Series: Tied at 1-1

• Alabama has a four-game win streak against Ole Miss in SEC Tournament play.

Game Notes:

- With the game tied at 40-40 early in the second half, Alabama went on a 13-4 run to take a 53-44 lead with 15:07 left. After the Rebels trimmed the deficit to five at 57-52, the Crimson Tide reeled off nine straight points to take its largest lead of the game at 66-52 with 8:03 remaining.
- Ole Miss jumped out of the gates to take a 12-5 lead, but Alabama responded with a 21-7 run to take a 26-19 advantage at the 9:17 mark of the first half.
- The Tide shot 50 percent (12-of-24) from the 3-point line, its second-highest mark of the year.
- Bench points were 30-14 in favor of Alabama.

Alabama Notes:

- Alabama improves 18-13 and wins for just the second time in its last six games.
- Retin Obasohan led four Tide players in double figures with 17 points, good for his 16th consecutive double-digit effort.
- Riley Norris notched his third double-double of the year with 16 points and 11 rebounds. The 16 points marked his most in the last eight games.
- Norris matched his second-most 3-pointers of the season with four on seven attempts.

Ole Miss Notes:

- Ole Miss falls to 20-12 and loses for the just the second time in its last six games.
- Stefan Moody scored the second-most points in SEC Tournament history with 39, just three behind Melvin Turpin's record of 42 in 1984. He topped 30 points for the fifth time this year and the second time in the last three games.
- Moody tied the SEC Tournament record for 3-pointers made with eight on 17 attempts. His 17 attempts tied for the second most 3-point attempts in SEC Tournament history.
