Vanderbilt 72, Florida 62

Vanderbilt advances to face Arkansas/Ole Miss winner Saturday at approximately 2:30 p.m. CT

Series Notes:

- All-Time Series: Vanderbilt leads 70-63
- SEC Tournament: Florida leads 6-3
- Season Series: Vanderbilt leads 3-0

Game Notes:

- This is the first SEC Tournament since 2008 to have multiple overtime games.
- Vanderbilt outscored Florida 14-4 in overtime.
- The Gators used a late 9-0 run to take their first lead of the second half with 24 seconds left. A Devin Robinson free throw for Vanderbilt tied the game with nine seconds left and sent it to overtime.
- With Florida ahead by one with 5:57 left in the first half, Vanderbilt reeled off a 10-2 run to take a seven-point lead with 1:36 until halftime. The Commodores did not trail again until the final 24 seconds.
- The Commodores shot 42.9 percent from the field compared a season-low 34.4 percent for the Gators.

Vanderbilt Notes:

- Vanderbilt improves to 19-14 overall and 7-1 in its last eight games. This was their first overtime game of the year.
- This marked the fourth overtime game in SEC Tournament play for Vanderbilt (3-1) and first since losing to Mississippi State, 74-70, on March 12, 2004.
- Riley LaChance led four Dores in double figures with 18 points. It was his most points since scoring 19 against Kentucky on January 10.
- Luke Kornet notched his fifth double-double of the year with 12 points and 10 rebounds.
- Jeff Roberson added 16 points and eight boards.
- Joe Toye was held to just two points after posting a career-high 18 points in the second-round win over Texas A&M.

Florida Notes:

- Florida falls to 24-8 and is 2-2 in its last four games. The Gators drop to 1-1 in overtime games this season.
- This marked the fourth overtime game in SEC Tournament play for Florida (2-1) and first since defeating Alabama, 75-73, on March 12, 2004.
- Kasey Hill and KeVaughn Allen led the Gators with 16 points each.
- Devin Robinson recorded his first double-double of the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds.
