

2018 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament Game 1 – Wednesday, Feb. 28 – 11:00 a.m. #13 Arkansas vs. #12 Vanderbilt

ARKANSAS NOTES

- The Razorbacks are now 13-17 overall, 12-26 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- Arkansas led at the half, 37-32, the 11th time this season the Razorbacks led at the break. UA is now 10-1 when leading at the half, with the only loss coming to Vanderbilt in the regular-season finale on Sunday.
- This marks the first win for the Razorbacks in the SEC Tournament since a 72-61 victory over Ole Miss in 2015 second round.
- The 88 points scored for UA is the highest point total in a win over an SEC opponent this season and the 12-point margin of victory is the widest winning margin for the Razorbacks in an SEC game (10 points, 68-58 over Auburn).
- Today's win broke a six-game losing streak for Arkansas.
- Arkansas finished with 6 turnovers, the 10th time this season the Razorbacks finished with single-digit turnovers.
- UA dominated the turnover battle, 6-20 and turned the 20 Vanderbilt miscues into 23 points.
- The third-leading 3-point shooting team in the SEC, Arkansas hit 12 shots from beyond the arc, above the season average of 7.6. It was the eighth time this season UA hit double-digit 3-pointers.
- Sophomore forward Kiara Williams led the Razorbacks with 25 points, the most of her career.
- Junior guard Malica Monk scored 20 points, her 28th game in double figures this season.

VANDERBILT NOTES

- Vanderbilt fell to 7-24 on the season and 48-33 all-time in SEC Tournament play.
- The Commodores dropped its opening game in the SEC Tournament for the second consecutive season after falling, 69-53, last season to Alabama.
- Senior guard Rachel Bell finished with 12 points for her fourth straight double-digit scoring performance.
- Fellow senior Guard Christa Reed reached double-figures in scoring with 16 and tied a career high with nine boards.
- Sophomore forward Kayla Overbeck tallied 16 points and a career-high 14 rebounds to share or lead the Commodores in both categories. The Newbury Park, Calif., native hit her first six field goals of the game and finished shooting 7-for-8 from the floor.
- Sophomore guard Kaleigh Clemons-Green contributed a career-high six assists in her 23 minutes of action off the bench.
- The 19 Vanderbilt assists were their most since another 19-dime game against Lipscomb (Dec. 28).

- The Commodores moved to 3-1 in the meetings with the Razorbacks at the SEC Tournament.
- After trailing 37-32 at the half, Vanderbilt opened the third quarter hitting 6-of-7 to even up the score with the Hogs.
