

2018 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament Game 12 – Saturday, March 3 – 6:30 p.m. #3 Georgia vs. #2 South Carolina

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- This is the second time in the history of the SEC Tournament that the same two teams will meet for the title three years in a row. Auburn and Tennessee faced off each year from 1988-1990.
- Session Six attendance: 8,819

GEORGIA NOTES

- Georgia is now 25-6 on the season, 48-35 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- The 25 wins for UGA are the most in a season since the 2012-13 Bulldogs finished 28-7 under Andy Landers.
- All six losses for Georgia this season have come at the hands of ranked opponents.
- Georgia has now dropped nine straight games to South Carolina, dating to 2013. The Bulldogs still lead the overall series, 33-16.
- A night after holding Missouri to 27.1% (16-59) from the floor, the Bulldogs allowed the highest field goal percentage by an opponent this year as South Carolina shot at a 56.5% (26-46) clip. The previous high for a Georgia opponent was 49.2% (32-65) by Mississippi State on Dec. 31.
- Eight players scored for Georgia, the 23rd time this season eight or more Bulldogs have scored.
- Senior forward Mackenzie Engram scored 10 points, her 23rd game in double figures this season. She was the only Bulldog to finish in double figures.

SOUTH CAROLINA NOTES

- South Carolina improved to 25-6 on the season and 19-23 all-time at the SEC Tournament.
- The Gamecocks join Auburn (1987-1990) and Tennessee (1989-1992) as SEC programs to play in four consecutive SEC Tournament finals. SC will look to be the first team in tournament history with four straight titles.
- The Gamecock offense hit 9-of-11 shots from the 3:14 mark in the first quarter to 5:54 remaining in the second. During that stretch, SC outscored the UGA 20-6.
- SC won their ninth consecutive meeting against Georgia and are 12-6 against the Lady Bulldogs in the Dawn Staley era. UGA holds a 33-16 lead in the all-time series.
- Three-time SEC Player of the Year, A'ja Wilson, came off the bench to drop in 21 points and collect 11 rebounds. Wilson added a pair of blocks during her 51st career doubledouble.

- Junior guard Doniyah Cliney knocked down 3-of-4 from behind the 3-point arc in her 14-point night. Cliney led the Gamecocks in assists for the fifth career time, tallying five dimes for the second time this season.
- Mikiah Herbert Harrigan scored in double-figures for the third consecutive game, the longest streak of her career. The sophomore pitched in 14 points on 6-of-9 shooting and added a trio of blocks.
- South Carolina finished with a 41-28 edge in rebounds, including a 33-12 edge in defensive boards. SC remains perfect (11-0) when owning a 10+ advantage in rebounding.
- The Gamecock defense held Georgia to 19-of-64 shooting (31.7%). Including inducing one of Tennessee's worst shooting performances of the season on Friday, the Gamecocks are holding teams to 42-of-150 shooting (28.0%) in their two SEC Tournament games.
