OLE MISS POST-GAME NOTES

- Ole Miss fell to 42-15 on the season, 88-86-1 against Auburn all-time, 1-4 against the Tigers in the SEC tournament and 31-32 all-time in the SEC tournament.
- Thomas Dillard and Jacob Adams both reached base multiple times for the Rebels.
- Starter Ryan Rolison went 6.1 innings and carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning. He finished with six strikeouts and two earned runs on three hits.
- Ole Miss is now 34-3 on the season when leading after the sixth inning.
- Ryan Olenek singled in the sixth to increases his team leading hit total to 77.
- The Rebels' pitching staff increased their league leading strikeout total to 548.

OLE MISS COACH MIKE BIANCO

On facing Auburn's pitching staff . . .

"Obviously, it wasn't a good day for us. We played poorly, but that's not to take anything away from Auburn. We struggled offensively. I thought (Tanner) Burns was excellent today. We just couldn't catch up to his fastball. On this field, you can't walk eight people. That led to runs at the end of the game."

On bullpen trouble . . .

"We didn't throw enough strikes, and we didn't attack the zone. Those three guys that came in didn't command it enough. You can't win when walking eight people."

On playing Georgia next . . .

"We have to play the game. This tournament gets you ready for the next tournament. This teaches you how to lose one, lose your bracket, play a night game or play at 9:30 in the morning. You may have felt comfortable three hours ago, then all-of-a-sudden you lose and go home. Those are healthy. The following week, you don't get to play anymore if you lose. It'll be a good test for us against a very good team. A team that is playing very good baseball. I think we will respond how we have all season long after bad outings. I expect we will do the same."

OLE MISS RF RYAN OLENEK

On leaving runners on base . . .

"It's a big letdown leaving runners on base any time runners are on base, no matter the situation. It looked like we were going to have a big inning, but it made out to be too many pitches. That's just baseball."

OLE MISS P RYAN ROLISON

On facing Georgia next . . .

"It's a big game for us, but I'm not worried about this team. We've bounced back all year, and we will be just fine."
