- Will Miles, South Carolina Senior
 Hilton Head Island, S.C. / Heritage
 Southern Intercollegiate //-8 (71-65 136) // 1st
 Shot 8-under (136) to win the Southern Intercollegiate at Athens Country Club, a one-day 36 hole event hosted by the University of Georgia on Monday
 Opened with a 71 (-1) and closed with a lights out 65 (-7) to win by four shots in windy conditions
 Helped the 17th-ranked Gamecocks pickup their third win of the spring by 20 shots
 Marked his second college victory, both of which have come this spring
 Miles had 14 red numbers on his scorecard to lead the 85-man field, and he was the only player to post double-digit birdies
 He joined a trib of former Gamecock All-Americans as the only players in school history to have multiple wins in the same season
 Miles leads the team with a 69.44 scoring average this spring in six events played
 He leads the Gamecocks with nine rounds in the 60s and ranks second with seven top-20s in 10 starts during the 2018-19 season

Men's Freshman Golfer of the Week: Jackson Suber, Ole Miss
Led the Rebels to a runner-up finish at the Old Waverly Collegiate Championship, defeating No. 4 Vanderbilt and host Mississippi State
His runner-up finish individually, the second of his career, in the 84-man field included beating a pair of top 20 nationally-ranked golfers (according to Golfstat)
Posted a 54-hole total of 70-71-65-206, tying his career low and was the third-best in the tournament's seven-year history
Recorded a bogey-free final round 65 (-7), a personal best that tied the tournament record for lowest round in its seven-year history; it was the first time a 65 was shot in the tournament's final round.
Ranked second in par-4 scoring (-3), third in birdies (14) and fourth in par-5 scoring (-7) throughout the week

Women's Golfer of the Week: Brooke Matthews, Arkansas
Matthews earned co-medalist honors shooting a collegiate career-best 4-under 68 in the single round of stroke play at the Liz Murphey Colle-giate Classic last week.
It is her first medalist honor as a Razorback. The Rogers, Arkansas, native, turned 1-under and finished strong with three consecutive birdies on her final holes.
She played the par-3 and par-4 holes 1-under and averaged 2-under on the par-5 holes.
Matthews tied for the second most birdies and the second most par holes helping Arkansas to a T-4 overall.
Matthews que to no win all three of her matches defeating players from Louisville, Augusta and the host Georgia. She was the only Razor-back to win all three matches.

Women's Freshman Golfer of the Week Emily Price, South Carolina
Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic at University of Georgia Golf Course // +1 (73, T7) - *PAR 72*1/3
Contributed to all three victories for South Carolina on their way to the championship at the 2019 Liz Murphey Collegiate Championship. Price finished 2-0-1 in three matches for the Gamecocks and in a tie for seventh individually after stroke play.
The victory is Carolina's first event victory of the season and first match-play title in program history, according to records dating back to 1980.
Defeated Georgia's No. 65 Jenny Bae in the semifinals, 1-UP.
Finished with a par on the 18th to claim the victory and put Carolina up 2-0 in the match.
Defeated Ole Miss' No. 197 Ellen Hutchinson-Kay in the quarterfinals, 3&2.
Finished all-square with Augusta's Teresa Diez-Moliner in the finals to halve the match point.

Jo Hua Hung, Georgia • Posted a 3-0 record in match play to help Georgia finish third in the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic. • One of only four golfers in the 40-player match play bracket to win all three of her matches. • Trailed for only one of the 50 holes of her three matches over the week-end

Trained for only one of the or marked states and end.
Defeated Arkansas All-American Dylan Kim, 4-and-3, to help Georgia knock off the Razorbacks, 3-2, in the third-place match.
Won back to back matches on Friday over Medy Thavong of Kennesaw State and Marion Veysseyre of South Carolina.
Shot 75 in the Liz Murphey stroke play qualifying round to tie for 23rd.
