- Teams from the Southeastern Conference have won 10 of the last 15 NCAA Championships and 19 NCAA titles all-time. Three different SEC teams - Alabama, Florida and Georgia - have won NCAA Gymnastics Championships.
- Since the inaugural NCAA Championship in 1982, the SEC has placed at least one team in all 38 national championship meets. Alabama and Florida have appeared in 36 of the possible 38 NCAA Championships events.
- 2019 saw a new format to the NCAA Championships, with eight teams advancing to the semifinals. Georgia and LSU were among those teams, with the Tigers becoming the National Runner-Up for the third time in four years.
- The SEC also had 12 individual competitors compete during the two semifinals last season. Four student-athletes won individual event titles, increasing the all-time total of individual titles to 116. SEC student-athletes have swept all five individual titles on five separate occasions (1991, 1993, 1994, 2009 and 2012). An SEC student-athlete has captured the All-Around title in 12 out of the past 16 years at the NCAA Championships.
- SEC student-athletes earned seven first-team and 11 second-team All-America honors in 2019.
- In 2018, Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky and LSU were six of the 12 teams that competed at the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships. This marked the first time in conference history that six programs from the Southeastern Conference competed at the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships.
- 2018 marked the 26th and final year of the Super Six format. Overall, the SEC made the Super Six Team Finals 70 times, making up 45 percent of the field all-time. Over the last 10 years of the Super Six, the SEC made up more than half of the Super Six fields with 31 of 60.

No. 8 Alabama turned in its third 197-plus score in a row and fifth of the season to defeat No. 10 Georgia, 197.450-196.050, in front of 10,792 fans in Coleman Coliseum on March 7. It was the Crimson Tide's final home meet of the season and first Saturday meet in Tuscaloosa since 2003.

Alabama closed the night with a 49.600 on the floor exercise, its highest tally on the event since going 49.650 to close the regular season against Iowa State in 2017. The Tide's floor lineup included four scores of 9.925 from senior Maddie Desch, junior Lexi Graber along with freshmen Luisa Blanco and Makarri Doggette and a 9.900 from senior Shea Mahoney.

It was Senior Night for the trio of Desch, Mahoney and Wynter Childers, with all three scoring in the Tide's lineup in their final meet in Coleman Coliseum.

With the win, Alabama goes to 15-1 against Georgia under head coach Dana Duckworth, including a 7-0 mark in regular-season meetings. Since 2010, the Crimson Tide is 27-2 against the Bulldogs in all meetings and 6-0 in Tuscaloosa.

Arkansas bounced back in Denton on March 6, posting a score of 196.300 and earning a second-place finish among the teams. The Razorbacks' 196.300 is their second-highest road score of the season.

Freshman Kiara Gianfagna claimed her first title since arriving at Arkansas, claiming the all-around title with a final score of 39.000. The Gymbacks are earned five total titles, including Sarah Shaffer's vault title, a bars title for Kennedy Hamrick and Bailey Lovett, and a floor title for Sophia Carter.

Arkansas made it a point to finish strong on their opening event on beam and with the help of Carter and Amanda Elswick, closed out the first rotation in second place with a team score of 48.950. Carter scored a 9.850 in the fifth spot, followed by a solid anchor score from Elswick with a 9.875. Elswick's 9.875 ties her season high, as she finished second among all competitors in the event.

Carter posted a 9.925 on floor, her sixth score of 9.900 or higher in the event this season. Shaffer, Hamrick and Lovett all scored a 9.875. Arkansas was holding steady in second place midway through the meet with a combined score of 98.325, the Gymbacks' highest two-rotation score of the season.

On vault, Shaffer earned a perfect score from one judge to finish with a career-high 9.925 on the apparatus. It is the highest score on the vault since 2018 when Braie Speed posted the same score at No. 5 Florida. Freshman Madison Hickey also registered a career-high 9.875.

Arkansas closed out the night on a high note with its highest bars rotation in four weeks (49.150). Gianfagna started strong for the Gymbacks, posting a 9.800 with her full-twisting double-back dismount. Lovett and Hamrick shared the event title with a score of 9.875.

No. 15 Auburn capped the long weekend with a 195.825 to come in second at the UNH Quad Meet hosted by New Hampshire on March 8. The meet was held in Durham, N.H. at the Whittemore Center. Rutgers edged the Tigers with a 195.900 to win the meet. Central Michigan finished third with a 195.175 and host New Hampshire finished with a 195.075.

The Tigers started off strong in the first rotation on bars, earning a 49.225. Derrian Gobourne anchored the squad with a 9.9 and Drew Watson added a 9.85. Freshmen Adeline Sabados and Aria Bruschi along with senior Gracie Day chipped in a 9.825 apiece towards the team score.

Emma Slappey led off the second rotation on beam with a 9.875, tying her career high and finishing second in the event overall. Watson followed with a 9.825 and senior Skyler Sheppard added a 9.775. Junior Meredith Sylvia and freshman Cassie Stevens chipped in 9.75 and a 9.725 for an overall score of 48.950.

Auburn moved on to floor in rotation three and Gobourne anchored with a 9.85 to highlight the event, winning the floor title. Bruschi earned a 9.8, while Stevens and Day finished with a 9.75 each. Watson's 9.625 went towards the team's 48.775.

The squad capped the day with a 48.875 on vault in the last rotation. Gobourne took home the title with a 9.9 and junior Jada Glenn followed with a 9.8. Day finished with a 9.775 and Stevens with freshman Elise Panzner added a pair of 9.7s. The start was the first of Panzner's career.

Perfection came in three different events for the Gators in Saturday's 198.10 – 196.225 win at No. 25 Penn State. First it was senior Sierra Alexander, earning the maximum value for her Yurchenko full vault (9.95). Then Trinity Thomas found perfection again – this time on floor exercise. This season, Thomas' posted a 10.0 on three events – uneven bars, balance beam and now floor exercise. On the final rotation, Rachel Gowey put together a flawless balance beam routine to earn her first 10.0.

These along with a solid team performance helped the Gators to its second-highest total of the season, 198.10. It is Florida's third total above 198.00 in 2020 – 198.375 (Jan. 24), 198.10 (March 7) and 198.05 (Feb. 21). Saturday's result gives Florida seven appearances among the nation's top 20 team totals of 2020.

No. 10 Georgia GymDogs dropped a 197.800-196.500 decision to No. 2 Florida on Feb. 28 at Stegeman Coliseum.

The GymDogs began competition on vault where they totaled a 49.275, their highest event-score of the night. Sophomore Rachael Lukacs vaulted herself to Georgia's highest score of the rotation with a 9.925. This ties Lukacs' season-high. Sophomore Abbey Ward and senior Sabrina Vega each added 9.875 marks apiece, a score which matches Vega's season-best. The GymDogs rounded out vault with 9.800 scores by sophomores Mikayla Magee and Rachel Baumann.

Moving on to bars, Georgia sophomore Megan Roberts paced the team with a 9.850. Junior Marissa Oakley scored a 9.825 in the anchor position to follow, while Vega added a 9.775. Lukacs and freshman Haley De Jong both contributed scores of 9.725.

Baumann and Vega led the GymDogs on beam with 9.900 scores apiece. Magee and De Jong scored a 9.850 and 9.825, respectively. Freshman Soraya Hawthorne contributed a 9.700.

Georgia wrapped up competition on floor, where Roberts matched a career-high performance with a 9.800. Vega finished the night as the leading scorer in back-to-back events, first on beam and finally on floor with a 9.900. Sophomores Lukacs and Alyssa Perez-Lugones notched scores of 9.825, while Roberts and Baumann pitched in 9.800 apiece.

No. 6 LSU earned a score of 197.000 to take wins over No. 17 Arkansas, Texas Woman's and Centenary on March 6 inside Kitty Winter Magee Arena.

LSU gymnasts scored multiple career highs in the final regular season road meet of the season. Ruby Harrold took the bars win with a 9.875 and Reagan Campbell scored a 9.925 on beam and floor for the wins.

The Tigers opened the meet with a 49.250 on bars, led by Ruby Harrold in the anchor spot with a 9.875. Kiya Johnson, Alyona Shchennikova and Sami Durante all earned a 9.85. The bars squad also used a 9.825 from Bridget Dean.

LSU went to beam and scored a solid 49.275 to push its lead after two rotations. The scores rose as the lineup moved along beginning with Christina Desiderio's 9.80. Dean earned a 9.825 and Durante scored a 9.875 in the third spot. Johnson and Campbell wrapped up the event with a 9.85 and 9.925 respectively.

The LSU floor lineup started with three 9.80's from Harrold, Desiderio and Dean. Freshman Maddie Rau made her debut on floor in the fourth spot with a 9.775 and Campbell's career-high 9.925 came in the fifth spot. Freshman Courtney Goodrich set a new career high with a 9.90 in the anchor spot of floor to give the squad a 49.225.

The shuffled vault lineup scored a 49.250 to end the meet on a high note. Rivers and Rau started the rotation with scores of 9.85. Rebecca D'Antonio scored a career high 9.775 and Harrold scored a 9.875 in the fourth spot. Johnson anchored the meet with a 9.90.

Freshman Helen Hu won three titles as No. 16 Mizzou earned a 196.450-195.195.925 win over No. 19 Nebraska on March 7 in Lincoln, Neb.

Hu won the all-around, bars and beam titles against the Huskers to up her team-leading season win total to 15. She went a career-best 39.525 in the all-around, 9.95 on beam, 9.9 on bars, a personal-best 9.875 on vault and 9.8 on floor.

Hu claimed her fifth bars title of the season to help Mizzou go 48.975 to open the meet. She tied for the crown with a 9.9, her fifth score of 9.9 or better on the event this year. Redshirt senior Morgan Porter claimed a 9.85 and sophomore Alisa Sheremeta and freshman Sienna Schreiber both added 9.85s.

Mizzou stuck five vault in the second rotation as the squad tallied a season-best 39.325, which stands as the sixth-best total on the event in program history. Junior Gabrielle Gottula and freshman Kambrie Brandt both led the way with career-best 9.9s, and Hu also notched a personal-best with a 9.875. Schreiber earned a 9.85 and sophomore Hannah McCrary added a 9.8.

A 49.125 on floor propelled Mizzou to a 147.425-146.350 lead with one rotation left. Identical 9.85s from McCrary and Schreiber led the way for the Tigers, while Porter earned a 9.825 and Sheremeta and Hu both went 9.8.

Hu concluded the night with a 9.95 on beam, her ninth score of 9.9 or better on the apparatus this season, which ties her for Mizzou's individual single-season record for 9.9s on one event in a year. Sheremeta had a strong performance on beam as well, earning a 9.8, and Gottula and Schreiber claimed 9.775s.
