• **SEC Gymnast of the Week** – LSU’s Haleigh Bryant, a freshman from Cornelius, N.C., recorded a 39.600 in her all-around debut in the win at No. 6 Arkansas. Her score was the third highest mark of 2021 and the best by a freshman this season. In addition, Bryant posted the highest all-around score for any LSU freshman in their debut and became the fifth LSU gymnast to record a 39.600 or higher in their first season. She collected wins in the all-around and on floor (9.95).

• **SEC Co-Specialists of the Week** – Arkansas’ Maggie O’Hara, a graduate student from Lexington, S.C., won two event titles versus No. 5 LSU. O’Hara registered a career-high 9.95 on bars to win the event for the second consecutive week. She also finished first on beam with a 9.925.

Florida’s Nya Reed, a junior from Landover, Md., won the floor exercise with a 9.975 in the home opener win over No. 7 Georgia. Reed also tied for third on vault (9.85) with teammate Megan Skaggs and Georgia’s Abbey Ward.

• **SEC Freshman of the Week** – Alabama’s Shania Adams, a freshman from Columbus, Ohio, won the all-around with a career-high 39.475 in the win at No. 14 Missouri. Adams earned a share of first place on vault with a career-best 9.925. She also placed second on bars (9.85), and tied for second on beam (9.85) and fourth on floor (9.85).

• Teams from the Southeastern Conference have won 10 of the last 15 NCAA Championships and 19 NCAA titles all-time. Three different SEC teams - Alabama, Florida and Georgia - have won NCAA Gymnastics Championships.

• Since 1982, student-athletes from the Southeastern Conference have claimed 116 NCAA Individual Champions titles and 744 All-American honors.

• Since 1995, 334 student-athletes from the Southeastern Conference have received All-America First-Team honors.

• 2019 saw a new format to the NCAA Championships, with eight teams advancing to the semifinals. Georgia and LSU were among those teams, with the Tigers becoming the National Runner-Up for the third time in four years.

• The SEC also had 12 individual competitors compete during the two semifinals in 2019. Four student-athletes won individual event titles, increasing the all-time total of individual titles to 116. SEC student-athletes have swept all five individual titles on five separate occasions (1991, 1993, 1994, 2009 and 2012). An SEC student-athlete has captured the All-Around title in 12 out of the past 16 NCAA Championships.

• All eight SEC programs finished the 2020 season in the Top 20 in the Road to Nationals national rankings.

The No. 4 Alabama gymnastics team beat No. 14 Missouri, 195.775-197.750, on Jan. 15 at the Hearnes Center in Columbia, Mo.

Rookie Shania Adams led the Tide, winning the all-around with a career-best 39.475. Adams and Lexi Graber tied for top honors on the vault, while Makarri Doggette won the uneven bars and Luisa Blanco took top honors on the balance beam.

After opening the night with a solid showing on the uneven bars and strong efforts on the vault and floor exercise, the Tide ran into trouble on the balance beam with two of its middle routines recording falls. Blanco closed the rotation with a 9.875, boosting UA to a 48.350 team score and giving the Tide the win.

Alabama started the night off with a 49.025 on the uneven bars led by a huge 9.925 routine from Doggette. On the vault, UA went 49.250 led by 9.925s from Adams and Graber. Graber also led the Tide on the floor exercise, posting a 9.875 to push the Tide to a 49.150 team score.

Alabama returns home on Jan. 22 to take on in-state rival Auburn starting at 7:30 p.m. CT. The Tide vs. Tigers meet will be broadcast live on the SEC Network.

The University of Arkansas gymnastics team saw improvements across the board on Jan. 15 in the Gymbacks' home opener in Barnhill Arena, but fell to the LSU Tigers 197.275 – 196.625.

The first rotation brought a lot of promise for the Razorbacks, with four consecutive 9.800 vaults. Junior Kennedy Hambrick anchored the vault team, sticking her Yurchenko one and half and closing out vault with a 9.900, giving Arkansas a 49.150.

Anchoring the bars tonight for Arkansas was graduate transfer Maggie O'Hara. O'Hara stuck her double-layout dismount, securing a career-high 9.950 and the bars title for the second straight week.

O'Hara earned her second event title of the night on the beam, scoring a 9.925 after beautifully executing her side-ariel back handspring series and side-ariel 1.5 dismount. Sarah Shaffer and Sophia Carter continued with crucial hit routines of their own, each scoring a 9.900. Hambrick's back handspring layout on the beam would earn her a 9.825 in the sixth spot, for a team total of 49.325, the eighth highest in program history.

The Gymbacks went above and beyond on the floor tonight, finishing with a 49.500 as a team. Junior transfer Abby Johnston started the rotation with a double-pike first pass and double-back last pass, finishing with a 9.875 in the lead off spot. Shaffer and Hambrick delivered another pair of 9.900s. Shaffer wrapped up her final home opener as a Razorback with a career-high 39.525 in the all-around. Redshirt-sophomore Bailey Lovett's stellar double-layout first pass is always a show-stopper and helped the Razorbacks with the third-straight 9.900 on the floor.

In true Sophia Carter fashion, the senior pulled the curtains on an exciting night in Barnhill Arena with gorgeous performance, highlighted by her double-back first pass and switch half-split full. Carter earned a 9.925 for her routine for the second week in-a-row.

The No. 9 Auburn gymnastics team finished its first road trip with a 194.550 as the squad fell to No. 8 Kentucky in Lexington on Jan. 15. The Wildcats finished with a 196.225.

The Tigers opened up on bars and two freshmen in McLaughlin and Hollingsworth kicked things off, competing on the apparatus for the first time in their collegiate careers. Sophomore Anna Sumner went third and scored a 9.625, while classmates Piper Smith and Sabados put together a pair of 9.725s. Gobourne capped the rotation with a 9.825.

Rotation two was vault and Auburn finished with a 48.800. Gobourne once again led the way with another 9.825 in the anchor spot. Freshman Payton Smith led off with a 9.7, competing for the first time in her career. Hollingsworth and Piper Smith followed with a pair of 9.75s and Sabados earned a 9.775 to close out team scoring.

Auburn finished with a 48.750 on floor, seeing career performances on the night. Junior Sabrina Cheney led off with a 9.75, tying a career high. McLaughlin put together a 9.7 and Sabados went fourth with a 9.775. That score set a career high for the Aurora, Colo., product. Senior Drew Watson finished with a 9.75 and Gobourne was awarded a 9.775.

The Tigers concluded the night on beam with a 48.550. Watson led off with a 9.7, while Piper Smith and senior Meredith Sylvia led the squad with a pair of 9.775s. Hollingsworth and Gobourne added a 9.65 each.

Auburn continues its road swing, traveling to rival Alabama next Friday, Jan. 22. The two squad will face off at 7:30 p.m. CT in Tuscaloosa on SEC Network.

The wins for Leah Clapper (balance beam – 9.925) and Nya Reed (floor exercise – 9.975) were the second of their careers for the events. Reed’s mark set her collegiate high. Florida sold out its physically-distanced tickets (2,200) for the Georgia dual.

Next up, Florida travels to No. 8 Arkansas for a Friday, Jan. 22 dual meet. The meet streams on SEC Network + at 8 p.m. ET.

The No. 7 Georgia gymnastics team scored a 196.075, falling to the top-ranked Florida Gators' score of 197.250 on Jan. 15 at the Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

In her first time competing all-around, sophomore Haley de Jong took home the crown with the highest collective score of the night - a 39.175.

The GymDogs began competition on bars, swinging to a 49.050. Junior Megan Roberts and senior Marissa Oakley led the squad with scores of 9.850. Freshman Victoria Nguyen and de Jong followed, each receiving a 9.800. Sophomore Amanda Cashman contributed a 9.750 to the team total.

Rachel Baumann started the team off on vault with a 9.875 and led the GymDogs in that event. Following her was junior Abbey Ward with a 9.850. Junior Rachael Lukacs competed for the first time this season, notching a score of 9.825 to match de Jong, and Nguyen contributed a 9.700. The team improved its vault score from last week to a 49.050.

Before the third rotation, Georgia made changes to the floor lineup and subsequently the beam one as well. They GymDogs were able to adjust quickly and saw even bigger improvements in the total floor score- a 49.350. In the anchor position, it was Baumann again who led the GymDogs with a 9.925. Sophomore Soraya Hawthorne and Roberts scored a 9.875 apiece and de Jong performed to a 9.850. Cashman tumbled to a 9.825 to round out the event.

Georgia is back on the road next week as the team takes on the LSU Tigers in Baton Rouge on Friday, January 22 at 8:15 p.m. ET.

No. 8 Kentucky made its 2021 home debut in triumphant fashion, leading No. 9 Auburn from start to finish in a 196.225-194.575 victory on Jan. 15 at Memorial Coliseum.

Kentucky navigated the night in Olympic order, beginning with a 49.250 vault rotation. Each member of the Wildcats' introductory lineup scored 9.800 or better, led off by a 9.850 from Bailey Bunn. Raena Worley and Isabella Magnelli followed with back-to-back scores of 9.800, while Arianna Patterson received a 9.825. Cally Nixon performed the night's best vault routine with a career-high 9.925. Josie Angeny anchored the Wildcats with a 9.850.

On the uneven bars, Kentucky ended its rotation with four straight routines of 9.850 or better. Nixon (9.850) and Worley (9.850) began the trend from the third and fourth spots, respectively, before a career-high-tying 9.875 from Shealyn Luksik preceded Angeny's second consecutive career-high showing of 9.900 and a second bars title in as many weeks.

A career high from Nixon (9.825) and a strong showing by Worley (9.850) kept the rotation on beam afloat. Angeny recorded a 9.875, good enough to claim her second event win of the meet and fourth career beam title.

The Wildcats ended the night as it began, concluding its floor exercise rotation with another 49.250. Bunn led off once more with a 9.875, while Ann Haigis eventually earned her first collegiate victory on any event with a career-high 9.925. Sophomore Makenna Clarke followed up with a career-high 9.875 of her own, while Worley produced the same score during the meet's final routine.

Worley was named the contest's all-around champion with a grand total of 39.375, marking the first all-around win of her career.

Next week, Kentucky is set to hit the road once more for a matchup with Missouri on Friday, Jan. 22, at 7 p.m. ET, live on SEC Network.

Freshman Haleigh Bryant scored a 39.600 in her all-around debut to lead the fifth-ranked gymnastics team to a 197.275-196.625 victory over No. 6 Arkansas on Jan. 15 inside Barnhill Arena.

Bryant made her debut in the all-around and shined for the Tigers with a 9.85 on vault, career high 9.90 on bars and beam, and 9.95 on floor. Bryant's all-around score marked the third highest in the nation this season.

With four of six underclassmen in the Tigers' bars lineup they delivered with huge scores to start LSU's meet strong. Kiya Johnson and Bridget Dean each opened up with a 9.825. Freshmen Olivia Dunne and Bryant then each scored a career high 9.90. Alyona Shchennikova rebounded from her season opener with a 9.925 and Sami Durante closed out the event with a 9.875.

LSU put up a solid 49.100 on vault to take a 98.525-97.800 lead over the Razorbacks. Elena Arenas opened with a 9.800 and Shchennikova and freshman Chase Brock followed with a 9.825. Sarah Edwards scored a 9.80 and Bryant earned a 9.85 in the anchor spot.

The Tigers scored a solid 49.375 on floor to extend their lead. Dean opened with a 9.75 and senior Reagan Campbell scored a 9.85. Edwards matched her season high with a 9.875 and Bryant and Johnson ended the rotation with a 9.95 for the floor win.

In a last second switch on beam for Christina Desiderio, Arenas answered the call and opened the beam lineup with a 9.825 for a career high. The lineup continued to build and after Durante's 9.85 the trio of Bryant, Dean and Campbell ended the night with a 9.90 to seal the SEC win.

LSU returns home to take on Georgia in the PMAC at 7:15 p.m. CT on Jan. 22. The meet will be televised on the SEC Network.

The No. 14 Mizzou gymnastics team fell by the closest of margins on Jan. 15, suffering a 195.775-195.750 loss to No. 4 Alabama at the Hearnes Center. The Tigers improved a full 1.5 points from their season-opening score, but it was not enough to take down the Crimson Tide.

Junior Hannah McCrary won the floor title with a career-high-tying 9.925 in Mizzou's final routine of the night.

The Tigers got the night started with a 48.925 on vault in the opening rotation. Freshman Jena Swanson nearly stuck her Yurchenko 1.5 for a career-best 9.875 to lead the squad, while freshman Amaya Marshall also went for a personal-high with a 9.825. Senior Gabrielle Gottula went 9.775 and McCrary and sophomore Sienna Schreiber each added 9.725s.

Three Tigers reached the 9.8 mark in the second rotation as Mizzou totaled a 48.925 on the apparatus. Schreiber and junior Alisa Sheremeta both had team-best 9.825s, while Marshall went 9.8 for the second meet in a row. Senior Chelsey Christensen posted a 9.750 and sophomore Adalayna Hufendiek went 9.725.

Schreiber and Sheremeta each tallied 9.85s on beam, which tied a career-high for Sheremeta, to lead the way on beam. Freshman Sydney Schaffer added a 9.775 and Marshall went 9.7. Overall, the squad went 48.825 on the event.

Mizzou had four Tigers go at least 9.8 on floor to give the Tigers a 49.075 on the event to tighten the team race, but the team fell just shy of earning the win. McCrary's career-high-tying 9.925 anchored the lineup for her fourth career event title. Marshall and Swanson also impressed with career-best scores of 9.875 and 9.85, respectively. Sheremeta closed her strong night with a 9.8.

The Tigers host Kentucky on Friday, Jan. 22 at 6 p.m. CT at the Hearnes Center. The meet will be televised live on SEC Network.
