LSU junior Kiya Johnson scored a 9.9125 during Semifinal II of the 2022 NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships on April 14 at Dickies Arena.

Johnson finished sixth overall between the two semifinals and third in Semifinal II to earn first-team honors. The honor also marked the ninth overall for Johnson, who sits at 10 all-time for honors in program history.

Johnson qualified after finishing in the top spot on vault during the second round of the NCAA Raleigh Regional. Johnson earned the tiebreaker after earning a 10 from one judge.

Overall, LSU gymnasts have combined to win 16 individual national championships with seven coming on vault. Johnson's teammate Haleigh Bryant won the 2021 NCAA vault title in her debut season. Rheagan Courville and Kennedy Edney each won two NCAA titles on vault during their careers. Susan Jackson and Ashleigh Clare-Kearney also each won vault championships.

The University of Missouri earned a fifth-place finish at the 2022 NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships on April 14, scoring 197.200 points in Semifinal II at Dickies Arena.

Mizzou tallied the highest NCAA finish in program history, ranking ahead of Alabama, Michigan and Minnesota.

The Tigers' score of 197.200 placed them third in their session as Florida (197.9750) and Auburn (197.8375) advanced to the National Championship from Session II. In Session I, Oklahoma (198.1125) posted the top score of the meet and Utah (197.7125) earned the second advancement slot. Minnesota (197.1125), Alabama (197.100) and Michigan (196.2875) all finished behind Mizzou.

Missouri had a pair of national runner-up finishes from sophomore Sienna Schreiber (beam) and freshman Amari Celestine (vault). Schreiber tied for second on beam with a 9.95, the second-highest score of the evening session – adding to her 39.500 total in the all-around. Celestine posted a 9.950 on vault, the top score in the evening session and second overall. Junior Helen Hu tied for fourth on beam, scoring 9.9375.
