The No. 8 Alabama gymnastics team finished in fourth place at the NCAA Regional finals in the Lloyd Noble Center on the campus of the University of Oklahoma, scoring a 197.650.

The top-seeded Oklahoma Sooners won the regional with a 198.050, followed by No. 9 Kentucky at 197.850. No. 15 Ohio State finished third with a program record team total of 197.750.

Alabama increased its rotation score in every event throughout the night, starting with a 49.275 on the vault in the opening rotation, .300 out of second place. The Tide responded with a 49.400 on the uneven bars to narrow the gap to .175 behind second-place Ohio State. Luisa Blanco and Lilly Hudson closed out Alabama’s balance beam rotation with back-to-back 9.925s, leading UA to a 49.425 on the event. The Tide closed out the night with a 49.550 on floor exercise to finish just .100 behind Ohio State and .200 behind the Wildcats.

The Tide totaled 11 scores of 9.9-or-higher, with Shallon Olsen (9.900) on the vault, Shania Adams (9.900), Cam Machado (9.900) and Makarri Doggette (9.925) on the uneven bars, Gladieux (9.900), Hudson (9.925) and Blanco (9.925) on the balance beam, and Shania Adams (9.900), Gladieux (9.900), Hudson (9.950) and Blanco (9.950) on the floor exercise.

Blanco will represent Alabama as an individual on the uneven bars at the NCAA Championships after scoring a 9.975 in Thursday’s regional semifinal.

While Arkansas’ season came to an end as a team on March 30, the Hogs went out on a high note as they posted a 197.275, the program’s best-ever regional score.

The Razorbacks came in third behind No. 1 Oklahoma (197.924) and No. 16 Ohio State (197.350) and fell just short of their third consecutive regional final.

In addition to the best new team score, Arkansas also set a regional floor high of 49.500. The Hogs finished in second among the four teams on both floor and bars (49.350).

Graduate transfer Norah Flatley and freshman Lauren Williams have qualified for individual event specialist spots.

Flatley qualified on beam after she posted a 9.950 in the Norman regional semifinal, the highest of the afternoon session and tied for highest on the day. It will be the second NCAA individual appearance for Flatley, as she qualified as an all-around competitor in 2022 with UCLA and placed seventh overall and fourth on beam (9.9375), both of which earned her a pair of All-American honors. Flatley is the first beam specialist to qualify as an individual for Arkansas since Hailey Garner in 2019 and seventh ever. She carries a 9.905 NQS into championships and a season high score of 9.975.

Rookie Lauren Williams will represent her home state of Arkansas as an individual vault qualifier after she posted a 9.900 in the Norman regional semifinal. She is the first freshman individual to qualify since 2017, the first vault qualifier since 2014, and first freshman event specialist since 2011. Prior to 2014, finishers 1-4, including ties, from each session would advance to the individual finals on day two of the championships. Williams has been a standout all season for the Gymbacks and has scored 9.900 or above four times over the course of 12 meets. She currently has a 9.880 vault NQS and personal high of 9.925.

No. 12 Auburn concluded its season in the opening round of the NCAA Regional at UCLA's Pauley Pavilion, scoring 195.9 to finish fourth in the afternoon session.

Beginning on floor, Derrian Gobourne anchored with a team-high 9.925 to earn a share of the session event title. Gabby McLaughlin led off with a 9.875, a score equaled by Olivia Hollingsworth. Sophia Groth and Cassie Stevens each added 9.85s to give the Tigers a team score of 49.375, comfortably ahead of Washington (49.050 on vault) and Southern Utah (48.950 on bars), trailing only Utah (49.5 on beam).

Auburn moved to vault for its second event, with Caroline Leonard leading off with a career-high 9.875. After Sara Hubbard followed with a 9.850, Hollingsworth and Stevens each earned 9.8s before Gobourne equaled Leonard's 9.875 in the anchor spot, giving Auburn 49.2 in the event and 98.575 through two rotations.

Trouble arrived on bars at the top of the lineup. Aria Brusch regained momentum for Auburn, earning a 9.9 in the fourth spot before Stevens tied her career high with a 9.925 to finish third in the session and Gobourne anchored with a 9.85.

Finishing on beam, freshman Hannah Hagle scored a career-high 9.9 for Auburn's top score. McLaughlin anchored with a 9.875, Brusch earned a 9.825, Hollingsworth scored a 9.8 and Groth added a 9.775 for a team score of 49.175.

Stevens (39.325) finished third in the all-around, while Hollingsworth and Groth finished fifth and sixth, respectively.

Gobourne will represent Auburn gymnastics at the 2023 NCAA Championship as an individual competitor. She will compete on floor as she finished first in the first session at the Los Angeles Regional.

Florida was runner-up at the 2023 NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships with a final score of 198.2375. The Gators' score was the fifth-highest ever in the 30-year history of the team final format started in 1993.

Sloane Blakely started off the Gators with a 9.9 on balance beam, the highest mark among the four team's opening competitors. It was the first of four 9.9 or better beam marks for the Gators as UF opened the meet with a 49.525, the team's highest beam total ever in NCAA Final action. Sophomores Riley McCusker and Leanne Wong led the Gators with marks of 9.9375 and a 9.9125, respectively. Freshman Kayla DiCello also posted a 9.9.

Floor scores were solid but not spectacular, with just Super Senior Rachel Baumann and DiCello reaching the 9.90 mark.

The Gators put together their top vault total in NCAA Final action with a 49.575. That total was UF's season-best and led all teams on the event. Super Senior Trinity Thomas started her competition with the day's first 10.0. That was 10.0 No. 28 to tie for the all-time NCAA career record for perfect marks. Wong started off the vault lineup with a 9.9125 and DiCello also earned a 9.90.

Heading into the final rotation, Florida trailed OU by 0.1875. The Gators set their NCAA Final uneven bars high of 49.7125 but it was not enough to close the gap. Like the Gators, the Sooners closed with the highest team total of the day on their finishing event as OU posted 49.675 on floor exercise.

Every Gator scored a 9.9 or better on the bars rotation. That 49.7125 included a pair of near perfect 9.975 by DiCello and Wong. Blakely and McCusker started off and anchored the lineup, respectively, with 9.925s. Thomas' 9.9125 also went toward the UF bars total.

Despite resilient effort, the University of Georgia gymnastics season comes to a close after scoring a 197.00 to finish third in the second round of the NCAA Denver Regional on March 31 at Magness Arena.

The 197.00 team total is 0.14 higher than the team's National Qualifying Score coming into the regional. LSU and Oregon State advanced to the NCAA Denver Regional Final after both schools scored a 197.375. Nebraska scored a 195.525 to finish fourth.

The GymDogs started strong on bars, scoring a 49.300 in the first rotation, which was the highest bars score of the day. Freshmen Naya Howard and JaFree Scott, and junior Katie Finnegan all scored a 9.875. Senior Haley de Jong received a 9.850 and graduate Josie Angeny contributed a 9.825.

Moving onto beam, the GymDogs added another 49.300 to the total. Georgia added another three 9.875s from Howard, JaFree Scott, and de Jong. Angeny received a 9.850 for her routine and Jacquie Moran was back in the lineup, scoring a 9.825.

Kentucky gymnastics closed its historic run in the Elite 8 on April 13 at the 2023 NCAA National Championships. The Wildcats finished the semifinal meet with an overall meet score of 197.1250, placing fourth in Session II and sixth out of eight total teams.

Makenzie Wilson, Isabella Magnelli and Raena Worley placed individually in the top 10 overall earning trophies for their accomplishments on vault, beam and all-around.

On vault, UK recorded a collective 49.3125 on the apparatus with Wilson earning the top score in the lineup with a 9.9125. Her top mark placed her fourth overall out of both sessions.

The Cats scored a 49.4125 on the balance beam, with Magnelli posting the highest score for the Cats with a 9.9500. The high score earned the junior an individual fourth-place trophy.

Finishing the meet on floor, the Wildcats tallied a 49.2750 to close out the session. Worley was the top gymnast on the apparatus, anchoring the event with a 9.9375. Worley, who placed seventh overall as an individual all-arounder, scored a 39.5875 through four events. Her overall score was made of a 9.8500 on vault, 9.9250 on bars, 9.8750 on beam and 9.9375 on floor.

The LSU gymnastics team concluded the 2023 season with a team score of 197.525 in the NCAA Championship Final to finish fourth nationally.

Junior Haleigh Bryant led the Tigers with a 39.725 all-around score, which marks the best for an LSU gymnast at an NCAA Championship in school history.

The squad opened the national championship with a 49.3125 on bars. Alexis Jeffrey and Ashley Cowan scored a 9.8375 and 9.825. Tori Tatum matched her NCAA Championship best with a 9.875. Aleah Finnegan followed with a 9.825 and Alyona Shchennikova earned a 9.80. Bryant anchored the event with a 9.95 to match the highest on the event at NCAA Championship in school history.

In the second rotation, LSU scored a 49.2375 on beam. Shchennikova scored a 9.8125 to set the next four performers. Jeffrey and Ballard each followed with a 9.825. Bryant built on the rotation with a 9.85, and Finnegan anchored with a 9.925.

The Tigers recorded a 49.450 on floor. Sierra Ballard opened with a 9.8125, and Shchennikova scored a 9.85 in the second spot. Arenas earned a 9.9125, and Chase Brock matched her career high with a 9.925. Two of the top floor performers in the country, Finnegan and Bryant, ended the third rotation with a 9.925 and 9.9375, respectively.

LSU concluded with 49.525 on vault. The score tied the highest at a championship final and second best at an NCAA Championship for the program. Arenas led off the squad with a 9.90, and Shchennikova scored a 9.925. Finnegan scored a 9.8625, and was sandwiched between 9.8875s from Brock and Bryce Wilson. Bryant ended the night with a 9.9875, which tied for the highest at an NCAA Championship in LSU history.
