WEEKLY HONORS

- **SEC Gymnast of the Week** – Florida's Leanne Wong, a junior from Overland Park, Kan., earned her third consecutive all-around title this season with a nation-high score of 39.875 in the win over No. 2 LSU. Wong became the 15th student-athlete in NCAA history to complete the Gym Slam after scoring a perfect 10.0 on the floor exercise. She shared the event titles on floor and beam (9.975) and finished first in the all-around and bars (9.95). Wong also tied for second place on vault (9.95) en route to claiming her 13th career win in the all-around and her fourth during the 2024 season.

- **SEC Specialist of the Week** – Alabama's Shania Adams, a senior from Columbus, Ohio, registered back-to-back season-high scores of 9.950 to help her team earn its third-highest team score in program history (198.075) in the win over No. 18 Georgia. Her performance on beam earned Adams a share of first place and helped push the Crimson Tide to a season-high-tying event score of the season at 49.600. She also claimed sole possession of first place on the balance beam to help Alabama record its second-highest rotation score this season at 49.400.

- **SEC Freshman of the Week** – Florida's Anya Pilgrim, a freshman from Germantown, Md., posted the highest all-around score among the nation's freshman this season with her 39.650 in the win over No. 2 LSU. Pilgrim set or matched her collegiate best on three events vs. the Tigers. She scored a career-high 9.975 on beam to share the event title with teammate Leanne Wong. Pilgrim was a part of a three-way tie for second place on vault with a collegiate high score of 9.95, and she equaled her high score of floor with a 9.925.

The No. 10 Alabama gymnastics program defeated the No. 18 Georgia Bulldogs behind a 198.075-196.975 score. The mark tied for the third-highest team total in program history.

Behind an energetic crowd of 12,586 in attendance, the Crimson Tide matched or set two season-high rotation scores (uneven bars - 49.600) and (floor exercise - 49.750) for the second consecutive meet. UA's 49.750 mark on floor also became a program record.

The Crimson Tide swept the event titles as Luisa Blanco captured the all-around (39.675) title, and a share of the title on the uneven bars (9.950), Shania Adams secured a share of the title on bars (9.950) before also claiming the balance beam title (9.950) and Gabby Gladieux won both the vault (9.925) and the floor exercise titles (9.975).

Alabama will travel to Baton Rouge, La., to compete against the LSU Tigers in Maravich Center on March 1 at 5 p.m. CT. The meet will air live on ESPN2.

The No. 16 Gymbacks were clearly happy to be home on February 23 as they defeated the No. 6 Kentucky Wildcats, 197.400-197.150, at Barnhill Arena.

The victory was Arkansas' highest-ranked win and the first in a regular-season meet over Kentucky since 2016. It also marked the fifth 197+ score for the Razorbacks this season, which matches a single-season record set in 2021. The final of 197.400 ties for the fourth-highest score in program history.

Arkansas outscored the Wildcats on every event but beam and set a program record of 49.675 on floor, upending the previous high of 49.575 earned in 2015. Four Gymbacks got at least a share of an event title: Cami Weaver and Lauren Williams on vault (9.925), Maddie Jones on bars (9.950) and Frankie Price on floor (9.975).

Price's mark of 9.975 on floor matched her career high and the program record. Two other gymnasts have scored 9.975 on floor in Katherine Grable and Jaime Pisani, but Price is the first to do so twice.

Arkansas has eight days off before traveling to Columbia, Mo. on Sunday, March 3 for an SEC dual with the Tigers at 5 p.m. CT. The meet will be broadcast live on SEC Network.

Saving her best for last, Cassie Stevens scored a career-high 9.95 on floor in her final event at Neville Arena to win the all-around on February 23 and lead No. 12 Auburn to a come-from-behind 197.425-197.0 win over No. 13 Missouri.

In her fifth season on the Plains, Stevens won the all-around for the fourth time this year, earning a 39.625 while claiming the vault title and sharing event titles on beam and floor.

In her 200th career routine, Stevens anchored on vault and earned a 9.9 to highlight the Tigers' opening rotation.

Moving to bars for Auburn's second rotation, Sophia Groth stuck her landing to her season high with a 9.9 and Olivia Greaves anchored with a career-best 9.9 as they each shared the event title with Missouri's Sienna Schreiber.

Stevens and Schreiber shared the beam title after recording 9.925s. Closing out on floor, Stevens and Olivia Hollingsworth closed the meet in style with matching 9.95s.

Schreiber finished second in the all-around with a 39.475 while Groth (39.450) and Hollingsworth (39.4) also competed in all four events for Auburn.

Auburn will spend March on the road with three meets before the SEC Championships, beginning on Friday, March 1, at Georgia at 6 p.m. CT.

No. 5 Florida upset No. 2 LSU, 198.150-197.950, on February 23 in front of a sellout Exactech Arena crowd of 8,884.

Florida headed into the final rotation trailing by 0.15. Florida's finish on floor exercise included collegiate or season bests from its first four competitors. UF's fifth performer, Super Senior Payton Richards, opened her floor routine with a hit double layout but stopped the routine due to injury. The final performer for the Gators was junior All-American Leanne Wong, who earned a perfect 10.0 to elevate her team to the win and become the 15th gymnast in NCAA history to complete the 'Gym Slam' [a 10.0 in each apparatus].

Floor was one of four event titles Wong won at least a share of during the meet. She set the nation's 2024 high of 39.875 to win her fourth all-around title of her junior season.

In addition to Wong's all-around win, Anya Pilgrim was third with the nation's top 2024 freshman total of 39.65. Florida's other two all-rounders – Sloane Blakely (39.60 – season best) and Victoria Nguyen (39.55 – collegiate best) also turned in impressive all-around performances.

Florida will close out its SEC regular-season schedule on Sunday, March 3 at Kentucky. The meet will air live on ESPN2.

The No. 18 University of Georgia gymnastics team posted its season-high road score with a 196.975, falling to No. 10 Alabama's 198.075 on February 23 in Coleman Coliseum.

Senior Katie Finnegan scored a career-high 9.925 on vault and took home a share of the event title, tying Alabama's Gabby Gladieux. Three additional GymDogs notched season-high scores, including Sidney Fitzgerald on bars, Eryn Williams on floor, and Anya Turner on beam.

The GymDogs started competition on bars, scoring a 49.275. Freshman Lily Smith led the rotation with a 9.925 from the anchor position. Sophomore Ja Free Scott followed with a 9.875 and freshman Ady Wahl contributed a 9.850. Sophomore Sidney Fitzgerald received a season-high 9.825.

Moving onto vault in the second rotation, Georgia scored a season-high 49.275. Senior Katie Finnegan notched a career-high 9.925 in the third spot. Freshman Ady Wahl scored a 9.900 and Scott received a 9.850.

Georgia performed on floor in the third rotation, totaling a 49.175. Smith led the rotation again, scoring a 9.900 for her floor routine. Sophomore Sidney Fitzgerald scored a 9.850 and Eryn Williams received her season-high score of 9.825. Ashlyn La Clair and Wahl both received a 9.800 for their performances.

Finishing on beam, the GymDogs added a 49.250. Ja Free Scott and Anya Turner led the squad, both scoring a 9.900, which marked a season-high for Turner.

The GymDogs are home for the final meet in Stegeman Coliseum this season on Friday, March 1 against Auburn. Competition is slated to begin at 7 p.m.

On the floor exercise, Raena Worley tied Arkansas' Frankie Price as they each scored a 9.975. Worley's individual win on floor was the 23rd of her career. She went on to earn her 27th career all-around title with her final score of 39.350.

In the final rotation on the balance beam, Bunn and Isabell Magnelli tied for first place after each scoring a 9.875. Magnelli earned her seventh career win on the event, while Bunn earned her third.

Kentucky will be back in Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center for Senior Day on Sunday, March 3 at 2 p.m. EST. The meet against Florida will be the final event of the Rupp Arena Women's Sports Takeover.

The No. 2 LSU Gymnastics team fell to No. 5 Florida by a final score 198.150-197.950 on February 23 in the O'Connell Center.

The Tigers finished the night with a season-high road score after putting up a strong performance. Their 197.950 is also the fourth-highest score away from the PMAC.

On vault, Amari Drayton continued to impress in her freshman campaign as she stuck a yurchenko 1.5 that scored a 9.975 for the Tigers in the third spot as she earned her first collegiate event title.

Haleigh Bryant continued to show out for the Tigers as she recorded scores of 9.9+ on every event for LSU for a score of 39.750 on the night.

Aleah Finnegan finished as one of the top floor performers on the night as she and Florida's Leanne Wong were each awarded 10.0s. Finnegan claimed her second floor title this year to move her total to seven on the event. She now owns 19 individual wins in her career.

LSU will host Alabama on Friday, March 1 at 5 p.m. CT in the PMAC. The competition between the Tigers and the Tide will be the squad's second meet on ESPN2 this year.

The No. 13-ranked University of Missouri gymnastics team posted a solid score in its final SEC road meet, but fell to No. 12 Auburn, 197.425-197.000, on February 23 at Neville Arena.

By cracking the 197 threshold, the Tigers have locked up their fourth road score (sixth total) of at least 197 this season.

Junior Jocelyn Moore picked up her fourth floor title of 2024, showing out with a 9.950 in the anchor position.

After a month away from Columbia, the Tigers return to Hearnes Center on Sunday, March 3, for a Battle Line Rivalry showdown against Arkansas. First touch is scheduled for 5 p.m. CT, and the meet will air live on SEC Network.
