• Tennessee is making its first appearance in the NCAA Quarterfinals. This marks the fifth consecutive year the SEC has had at least one team advance to the NCAA Quarterfinals.

• The SEC tied for the national lead with seven teams advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

• Seven teams in the second round of the NCAA Tournament are tied (2014) for the most in SEC history.

• An SEC record-tying nine SEC teams highlight the field of 64 competing for the 37th NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship.

• This marks the 11th time in the last 12 seasons that the SEC has had at least six teams advance to postseason play.

• The SEC's 30 NCAA bids over the last four years are second only to the ACC's 33. The Pac-12 has had 25, Big Ten 24 and Big 12 19 during that time.

• Three SEC teams earned national seeds: No. 2 Tennessee, No. 3 South Carolina and No. 3 Texas A&M.

• Eight of the nine teams earned the right to host their opening round match on their home pitch.

• Arkansas is competing in the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in the last six years. The Razorbacks went unbeaten at home during the regular season for the first time in school history and tied the school record for home wins in a season.

• Auburn earned its 16th NCAA Tournament bid and its fifth in a row. The Tigers turned in nine shut-outs this season which tied for the fourth most in a single-season in program history.

• LSU received the SEC's automatic NCAA Tournament bid after outlasting Arkansas in penalty kicks in the SEC Tournament championship game yesterday. The Tigers are making their sixth NCAA Tournament appearance and first since 2015.

• Ole Miss returned to NCAA play for the second year in a row and eighth time overall. Senior midfielder CeCe Kizer became just the second player

since 2005 to lead the SEC in both goals (13) and assists (8) during the regular season.

• Mississippi State made its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. The Bulldogs entered the season with a roster that was tied for the most freshmen in the conference.

• South Carolina is making its 11th trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last 12 years. The Gamecocks, who are led by SEC Defensive Player of the Year Grace Fisk, advanced to the semifinals of the College Cup last season

• Tennessee is making its 12th NCAA Tournament appearance after finishing second in the SEC with a 7-2-1 conference record. The Volunteers, who are led by SEC Offensive Player of the Year Bunny Shaw, are making back-to-back NCAA appearances for the first time since 2011 and 2012.

• Texas A&M is one of four teams to make it to every NCAA Tournament since 1995, a streak of 24 consecutive years. Aggie head coach G Guerrieri ranks among the leaders in victories (fourth with 457) and winning percentage (sixth with 74.8 percent) among active Division I coaches.

• Vanderbilt earned its second consecutive NCAA Tournament and ninth overall after winning the 2018 SEC championship with an 8-1-1 league record. The Commodores are led by SEC Coach of the Year Darren Ambrose and SEC Freshman of the Year Haley Hopkins.

• LSU won its first SEC Tournament championship in in penalty kicks (4-1) over Arkansas Nov. 4 in Orange Beach, Ala.

• Vanderbilt secured the 2018 SEC Championship, its first SEC championship since 1994.

• Tennessee is No. 10 in the Nov. 6 United Soccer Coaches rankings while Vanderbilt is 13th, Texas A&M 16th, South Carolina 18th and LSU 19th. Arkansas, and Auburn are among the teams receiving votes in the poll.

SEC SOCCER BEGINS 26TH SEASON

The Southeastern Conference has continued its rise as one of the top conferences in soccer.

SEC women's soccer will begin its 26th season in 2018 deeply rooted in the national scene of collegiate soccer. Since the SEC initiated women's soccer as a varsity sport in 1993, the sport's popularity has grown through the country and especially in the Southeast.

The 2017 season reaffirmed the SEC's prominence in the women's soccer. The SEC had a league-record nine teams selected to participate in the 2017 NCAA Tournament. It marked the 10th time in the last 11 seasons that the SEC has had at least six teams advance to postseason play. Three teams earned national seeds and five teams earned the right to host their opening round match on their home pitch.

Two teams - Florida and South Carolina - advanced to the Quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament. It was the third time in four years the SEC has had multiple teams in the NCAA Quarters.

South Carolina advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. It is the second time in four years (Texas A&M 2014) that the SEC has placed a team in the College Cup.

SEC teams finished 10-6-2 against other conferences in the NCAA Tournament this year and is 38-20-11 (.630) over the last four seasons.

South Carolina's 9-0-1 league record earned the Gamecocks the 2017 SEC Championship. It was the second consecutive and third overall SEC title for South Carolina.

Texas A&M won its third SEC Tournament championship in the last five years with a 2-1 overtime win over Arkansas in Orange Beach, Ala. A&M midfielder Mikaela

Harvey was named SEC Tournament MVP.

South Carolina's Savannah McCaskill and Grace Fisk were named SEC Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year, respectively. USC's Shelley Smith was named SEC Coach of the Year. Florida's Deanne Rose was Freshman of the Year while Mississippi State's Mallory Eubanks earned Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors.

That incremental growth, combined with increasing exposure on the national and regional scene, has SEC women's soccer looking to blossom to new heights in the year 2018 and beyond.

- 28 student-athletes on the NSCAA All-Region teams
- NCAA-leading nine teams advancing to the NCAA Championships
- At least six teams advancing to the postseason for the 10th time in the past 11 seasons
- Multiple teams (2) advanced the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth consecutive year
- Seven different schools have made Round of 16 appearances over the last five years
- Multiple teams (2) advanced to the Round of 8 in the NCAA Tournament for the third time in the last four years
- A team in the College Cup for the second time in four years



There shall be a single-elimination tournament of the top ten teams played at the conclusion of the SEC regular-season schedule. The tournament champion shall be the SEC representative to the NCAA championship.

The top ten teams with the highest point total, regardless of divisions, will participate in the tournament. The following point system is utilized to determine regular season standings and seeding for the tournament: a win counts as three points, a tie as one, and a loss as zero points. If a game(s) is cancelled, neither team will receive a point and the standings will be determined by average points per game. The tournament shall be played in a Sunday-Tuesday-Thursday-Sunday format with Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday designated as off/practice days.

Tie-Breaker Procedures

The tournament will be seeded 1-10 regardless of division based on the point system implemented to determine regular season standings. If teams are tied, the following procedures, in order as follows, will be used to break the tie:

1. **Two-Team Tie:** The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the tied teams.
- B. Points earned versus common opponents.
- C. Goal differential versus common opponents.
- D. Goals scored versus common opponents.
- E. Won-Lost record of the two teams versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- F. Goal differential versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- G. Goals scored versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.
- H. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

2. **Three-Team Tie (or more):** The following procedure will be used until the tie is broken. If at any time this tie breaker results in only two remaining tied teams, then the two-team tiebreaker will be used beginning with Subsection A in that procedure and continuing from that point:

A. If all teams have played one another, then most points earned in those matches only.

B. If all teams have not played, but one team has defeated all teams in the tie break, then that team breaks the tie and shall be placed highest. Remaining teams will continue with the tie break procedure.

C. If all teams have not played one another and a team does not have all wins over the tied teams, then use Subsection B in the two-team tie break procedures and continue through the two team tie-break procedures until ties between all teams are broken (except Subsection H will read "if three or more teams are still tied, the Commissioner will conduct a draw").
