SEC HIGHLIGHTS

The Southeastern Conference continues to dominate as one of the top conferences in women's basketball.

ALABAMA: Under second-year head coach Kristy Curry, Alabama looks to build on the foundation it put down a year ago, climbing from the bottom of the Southeastern Conference standings to a tie for sixth place in the league. Along the way the Crimson Tide enjoyed some big wins, including at No. 9 Kentucky, 57-55, for the program's first victory in Lexington since 2002 and first road W against a top-10 team since 1998 as well as its first win in program history at Vanderbilt. Alabama also closed the regular season with a 78-60 victory over No. 23 LSU, its first win against the Tigers since 2002. The Tide returns three of its five starters from last season including sophomore Ashley Williams, who was named to the Freshman All-SEC team in 2013-14, junior Nikki Hegstetter and senior Sharin Rivers. Karyla Middlebrook, who started seven of nine games before sitting out the remainder of the season with a hip injury, also returns, as well as senior Briana Hutchens, junior Khadijah Carter and sophomore Oceana Hamilton. Alabama welcomes five newcomers including four true freshmen in Quanetria Bolton, Hannah Cook, Meoshonti Knight and Diamanté Martinez, and sophomore Breanna Hayden, who will be eligible in January after transferring from Baylor.

ARKANSAS: The @RazorbackWBB team begins a new era under the direction of Jimmy Dykes, the eighth head coach in program his-

tory. Dykes returns four starters from a 19-win team but enters the season with 11 players who will all compete for starting jobs and significant minutes. The Razorbacks' top returners include seniors Calli Berna and Jhasmin Bowen along with All-SEC Freshman team member Jessica Jackson who led the team in scoring last season. Juniors Melissa Wolff and Joey Bailey will also be expected to see a lot of playing time. The rest of the team includes sophomores McKenzie Adams and Kelsey Brooks, both of whom saw significant minutes as freshmen, sophomore Khadijah West and newcomers Nicole Bolt, McKinley Bostad and Katie Powell. This year's schedule is one of the toughest in recent years with 12 teams who reached the NCAA Tournament and five others, including WNIT Champion Rutgers, who advanced to postseason play.

AUBURN: The Tigers return four starters and eight letterwinners from last season's team that went 19-15 and advanced to the third round of the Women's NIT in coach Terri Williams-Flournoy's second season as head coach. Auburn welcomes five newcomers for the 2014-15 season. The 2014-15 Auburn women's basketball schedule includes home games against Tennessee, Alabama, Georgia, LSU, Florida, Marquette and others. The Tigers play a total of 15 games at Auburn Arena, seven of which are against teams that advanced to the postseason during the 2013-14 season.

FLORIDA: The Florida women's basketball team's 2014-15 schedule is highlighted by 16 games against 13 different teams that competed in the postseason last year. The Gators, who compiled a 20-13 record last season and reached the second round of the NCAA Championships, have earned a postseason berth in all seven years with Amanda Butler on the sideline. At least 13 of Florida's 16 Southeastern Conference games will be televised with the SEC Network launching this season. Three starters return including SEC All-Freshman Ronni Williams.

GEORGIA: The Georgia Lady Bulldogs return four starters – guards Shacobia Barbee and Erika Ford and forwards Krista Donald and Merritt Hempe – and six additional letterwinners from last season. In addition, six newcomers will join the Georgia roster – four freshmen and two transfers. The Georgia staff got a jump on preparations for the upcoming season during the Lady Bulldogs' 10-day, three-game exhibition tour of Italy in August. Georgia finished 20-12 a year ago, the 29th 20-win season in Andy Landers' 35 years at UGA. The Lady Bulldogs also earned their 31st all-time NCAA Tournament bid, second-most of any program in the nation. Georgia

has now appeared in each of the past 20 NCAA Tournaments. Landers enters 2014-15 within reach of two significant milestones. He has 843 victories at the University of Georgia (seven shy of 850) and 925 wins as a collegiate head coach (25 away from 950).

KENTUCKY: The Wildcats, who were ranked No. 6 in an early preseason poll by ESPN.com columnist Charlie Crème, returns seven letter winners from last season, including key players in Bria Goss (Chicago) and Jennifer O'Neill (Bronx, N.Y.), returning starting point guard junior Janee Thompson (Chicago) and sophomore guards Linnae Harper (Chicago) and Makayla Epps (Lebanon, Ky.). Adding depth to the post position are seniors Azia Bishop (Toledo, Ohio) and Jelléah Sidney (Queens Village, N.Y.). New additions to the roster this season include junior-college transfer and 6-foot-6 center Ivana Jakubcova (Bratislava, Slovakia), freshman shooting guard Jaycee Coe (Gainesboro, Tenn.), freshman forward/center Alexis Jennings (Madison, Ala.) and freshman center Alyssa Rice (Reynoldsburg, Ohio). Sophomore forward Kyvin Goodin-Rogers (Lebanon, Ky.) also will be available for action after sitting out last season with a pulmonary embolism.

LSU: LSU has secured three consecutive 20-plus win seasons and three NCAA Tournament appearances highlighted by back-to-back NCAA Sweet 16 trips under Nikki Caldwell. The Lady Tigers will have 20 of their 30 regular season games carried live on

television. LSU returns two starters from last season and welcomes six newcomers. LSU will look to Danielle Ballard and Raigyne Moncrief to ignite another great season.

OLE MISS: The Rebels enter the second year under head coach Matt Insell in 2014-15. After posting a 12-20, 2-12 record in the first season under the second-year head coach, Ole Miss returns the SEC's leading rebounder in senior forward Tia Falter (Ozark, Ala.) who averaged 9.4 rebounds per game a year ago. The Rebels will be tasked with replacing second-tam All-SEC player Valencia McFarland who averaged 17.4 points per game and closed her career with 1,655 career points becoming the 26th 1,000-point scorer in school history. Ole Miss welcomes eight new faces this season highlighted by local native Erika Sisk (Oxford, Miss.) who transferred back home after playing her freshman season at Murray State.

MISSISSIPPI STATE: Mississippi State enters the 2014-15 season looking to build on a thrilling 2013-14 campaign that saw the team claim a 22-14 record and advance to the quarterfinals of the WNUIT. The Bulldogs return five players who started 20 or more games a year ago and nearly 90 percent of the scoring from a squad that set the school record for points in a season. Two-time All-SEC selection and 2014 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year Martha Alwal is back for her final season following a junior campaign that saw her reach 1,000-career points after averaging a team high 14.9 ppg. Alwal enters the year the SEC active career leader in blocks (257) and double-doubles (31). Behind Alwal, MSU returns its next four top scorers from last season, including senior Kendra Grant who averaged 11.4 ppg and sophomore Breanna Richardson who scored at a 9.5 clip en route to claiming SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. In addition to a talented veteran group, coach Vic Schaefer's third Bulldog squad welcomes a Top 20 recruiting class that includes Parade All-American and high school basketball's No. 2 all-time scorer Victoria Vivians.

MISSOURI: Mizzou will face eight NCAA Tournament teams this season, and the Tigers will see an exciting non-conference slate before opening league play. The SEC Network has selected to air nine of Missouri's conference games, and the Tigers will also appear on Fox Sports on Feb. 12 at Alabama. The Tigers return four starters from last year's team that went 17-14.

SOUTH CAROLINA: Reigning SEC Champion South Carolina enters the 2014-15 season with the weight of expectations but the Gamecocks are up for the challenge with a roster laden with experienced veterans and elite newcomers. In her seventh season at South Carolina, head coach Dawn Staley returns all five starters from last season's title team and lost just two letterwinners from that

squad. Headlining the experienced lineup will be SEC Player of the Year Tiffany Mitchell, whose international experience over the summer has added depth and leadership to her game. Two-time All-SEC selection Aleighsa Welch looks to close out her career with another great season, and SEC All-Defensive Team selection Elema Ibiom is ready for a final assault on the blocked shots record book. Center Alaina Coates will be back to patrol the paint, and the SEC Freshman and Co-Sixth Player of the Year is not even considering the possibility of a sophomore slump. While marching to the program's first SEC title, Staley and her staff also added the nation's No. 2 signing class to this season's already stacked roster. The group includes a pair of top-10 signees in No. 1 A'ja Wilson and No. 7 Jatarie White and has worked tirelessly over the summer to make an immediate splash.

TENNESSEE: Year three of the Holly Warlick era commences with Tennessee rated No. 3 in the espnW Pre-Season Top 25. Eight of 10 letterwinners and four of five starters will hit the floor for a Lady Vol squad that finished 29-6 and won the program's 17th SEC Tournament title in 2013-14. Warlick's third edition welcomes back 70.7% of its points, 83.2% of its rebounds, 81.7% of its assists, 79.5% of its steals and 68.9% of its blocks from a year ago. First-team All-SEC and SEC Tournament MVP 6-3 center Isabelle Harrison (13.6 ppg., 9.3 rpg., 58% FG, 18 double-doubles) heads an experienced front court with her athletic 6-foot-3 frame. Other returning starters include 6-2 senior forward Cierra Burdick (8.7 ppg., 7.3 rpg.), 6-2 junior forward Bashaara Graves (9.3 ppg., 6.8 rpg.) and 5-7 senior point guard Ariel Massengale (12.5 ppg., 5.8 apg. in 19 games before injury). Other top returnees include 5-9 sophomore guard Andraya Carter (6.9 ppg., 2.7 rpg., 2.3 apg.), 5-11 sophomore guard Jordan Reynolds (3.8 ppg., 1.9 rpg., 1.8 apg.) and 6-2 junior forward Jasmine Jones (4.8 ppg., 3.5 rpg.), while top-ranked newcomers include 6-0 redshirt freshman guard Jannah Tucker (No. 8 signee in 2013) and 6-2 freshman guard/forward Jaime Nared (No. 6 in 2014).

TEXAS A&M: The Aggies return 83% of its scoring from a team that made the program's third trip to the Elite Eight in 2013-14, and are led by a trio of standout junior guards. Courtney Walker, who was named an AP All-American in 2013-14, averaged 21.2 points per game during the SEC and NCAA Tournaments, is the Aggies' top returning scoring threat. Courtney Williams, named to the All-Lincoln Regional Team, returns after averaging 13.9 points per game a season ago. Jordan Jones will anchor both the Aggies' offense after finishing fourth nationally in assists per game, and defense, after being named SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year in 2013-14. Senior Achiri Ade, who finished second in the SEC in offensive rebounds, is the Aggies' other returning starter, with five-

star recruit Khaalia Hillsman battling with Jada Terry and Rachel Mitchell for the starting center position.

VANDERBILT: The Commodores, who have advanced to the NCAA Tournament for 15 consecutive seasons, enter the 2014-15 with optimism. Even in the absence of Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister -- who graduated last year as two of the most decorated players in team history -- the Vanderbilt roster is deep and talented. It is bolstered by the return of redshirt freshman Rebekah Dahlman, who missed most of last season after being diagnosed with a blood clot but is expected to be an impact player this season. Also, rising star Marqu'es Webb is primed for breakout season in her sophomore campaign. The Commodores expect to get plenty of production from a five-member freshman class that was rated among the top-10 in the nation by multiple publications. The group features Paris Kea, who helped the USA U-18 national team win a gold medal this summer, along with Khaléann and Audrey-Ann Caron-Goudreau, who are 6-3 twin sisters from Canada.

THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

"THE STANDARD OF EXCELLENCE"

The Southeastern Conference, with its storied 81-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of intercollegiate competition of any league in the country since its inception in 1933.

The 2013-14 academic year was another season to remember for the SEC as conference teams captured seven national titles and six national runner-up finishes. The SEC has won consecutive national championships in equestrian, men's golf, gymnastics and women's swimming and diving. Since 1990, the SEC has won 163 team national championships for an average of more than six per year.

Florida's second consecutive gymnastics national title was the fourth straight for the league and 198th overall. The Georgia equestrian team brought home the national title marking the 13th consecutive year that a team currently in the SEC captured the title. Alabama won its second consecutive national championship in the sport of men's golf. Georgia's women's swimming team captured its sixth national title and second in a row. The Florida softball team prevailed in an all SEC final to win its first championship and second for the league. Texas A&M won the league's 18th championship in women's outdoor track & field. Vanderbilt won the baseball title, the league's fourth in the last six years.

Overall, the SEC finished in the top two in nine of its 21 sponsored sports and in the top five in 13 of the 21 sports. Ten SEC teams participated in football postseason bowls with Auburn participating in the BCS Championship. Three men's basketball teams were invited to the NCAA Tournament and eight women's basketball teams were also invited to the NCAA Tournament. The SEC had 10 teams advance to postseason play in baseball with Ole Miss and Vanderbilt advancing to the College World Series. With 178 teams advancing to NCAA postseason competition, the SEC continued to solidify its place as the nation's premier conference.

In addition to the seven team championships, 71 SEC student-athletes garnered individual national championships, while 555 individuals were awarded with First-Team All-America Honors. Student-athletes around the league continued to excel in the classroom as well with more than 3,100 earning recognition on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

On the national all-sport level, all 14 SEC schools placed in the top 55 of the NACDA

Director's Cup rankings. Florida led the league with a second-place finish. Texas A&M placed 10th while Kentucky was 11th; Georgia finished 16th, Alabama 17th, LSU 24th, Arkansas 28th, Auburn 34th, South Carolina 35th, Tennessee 40th, Vanderbilt 45th, Missouri 46th, Mississippi State 52nd and Ole Miss 54th.

SECU

The Academic Initiative of the SEC

Using its SECU academic initiative, the Southeastern Conference sponsors, supports and promotes collaborative higher education programs and activities involving administrators, faculty and students at its member universities. SECU is led by the president or chancellor of each SEC university and is managed by the chief academic officer.

The goals of the SECU academic initiative include:

- Advancing the merit and reputation of SEC universities outside of the traditional SEC region;
- Highlighting the endeavors and achievements of SEC faculty and universities;
- Identifying and preparing future leaders for high-level service in academia;
- Increasing the amount and type of education abroad opportunities available to SEC students; and
- Providing opportunities for collaboration among SEC university personnel.

The current programs of the SECU academic initiative include:

- The SEC Academic Leadership Development Program seeks to identify, prepare and advance academic leaders for roles within SEC institutions and beyond. It has two components, a university-level program and two, three-day, SEC-wide workshops held on specified campuses for all participants.
- The SEC Faculty Achievement and Professor of the Year Awards recognize faculty with outstanding records in research and scholarship. There is one winner per campus and one overall winner for the Conference.
- The SEC Faculty Travel Grant Program is intended to enhance collaboration that stimulates scholarly initiatives between SEC

universities. The program offers faculty from each SEC university the opportunity to travel to other SEC universities to develop grant proposals and conduct research.

- The SEC College Tour occurs each spring, and administrators from all SEC universities participate in events intended to introduce SEC universities to students, parents and high school counselors from outside of the southeast region.
- The SEC Symposium is an academic conference-type event intended to address a scholarly issue in an area of strength represented by all SEC universities. Held in Atlanta, Georgia, this marquee event puts on display the research and innovation of SEC institutions for an audience of academicians, government officials, grant funding agents and other stakeholders.
- The SEC Cooperative Education Abroad Agreement provides opportunities for students from all SEC universities to access international programs offered at other SEC universities. And as part of a renewable agreement, Italian engineering students from the Politecnico di Torino (PdT) have the opportunity to enroll at SEC universities each fall, and engineering SEC students may study there the following spring.
- The SEC MBA Case Competition is an opportunity for SEC business schools to showcase their students' skills at solving simulated, real-world problems that cover the spectrum of business disciplines. The competition is held on one SEC campus and teams of four MBA students compete against other SEC teams, the best receiving various awards and recognition.
- The SEC Academic Collaboration Grant Program is intended to expand student-focused collaboration among SEC universities. The grant is awarded annually to one SEC institution to support joint activities involving all other SEC universities. Examples of collaborative activities include intra-conference competitions, graduate student recruiting fairs, undergraduate research initiatives, etc.

SEC MILESTONES

Dec. 22, 1894: In Atlanta, Dr. William L. Dudley of Vanderbilt presides over an organization meeting of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association: Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, Sewanee and Vanderbilt. Football formalized in 1869.

1893: Vanderbilt begins playing basketball at the Nashville YMCA two years after Naismith originated the game at Springfield (MA) College.

1895: SIAA organized track on conference level.

May 15, 1896: First conference championship meet (track) held at Vanderbilt.

1895: SIAA expands and adds Central, Clemson, Cumberland, Kentucky, LSU, Mercer, Ole Miss, Mississippi A&M (State), Nashville, Southeastern Presbyterian, Tennessee, Texas and Tulane.

1900: Eight of the 13 charter SEC members participating in track.

1920: SIAA encompasses 30 members.

Dec. 12-13, 1920: In Gainesville, Fla. Professor S.V. Sanford (Georgia) presides over newly formed Southern Conference (Alabama, Auburn, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi State, North Carolina, North Carolina State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Washington and Lee).

1922: Florida, LSU, Ole Miss, South Carolina, Tulane, Vanderbilt and Virginia Military join the Southern Conference.

1923: Sewanee joins the Southern Conference.

1928: Duke joins the Southern Conference.

Dec. 8-9, 1932: In Knoxville, Dr. Frank L. McVey (Kentucky) serves as president as the SEC is formed with 13 members of the Southern Conference located west and south of the Appalachian Mountains. The institutions

are: Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Sewanee, Tennessee, Tulane, Vanderbilt.

Feb. 16, 1933: Informal meeting of SEC school presidents, Birmingham, Ala.

Feb. 27, 1933: First full meeting, Atlanta, Ga.

1933: First SEC champions crowned in baseball, basketball, football and outdoor track.

Feb. 24 - 28, 1933: League's first basketball tournament in Atlanta, Ga.

Spring 1933: First NCAA Championship won by SEC school (LSU, men's track).

1935: League sponsors first men's team title for cross country.

1937: League sponsors first men's team title for golf and swimming.

1938: League sponsors first men's team title for tennis.

1940: In Jackson, Miss. the office of the commissioner is formed.

August 21, 1940: Former Mississippi Governor Martin S. Conner named first SEC commissioner.

Dec. 13, 1940: Sewanee withdraws from the SEC.

Fall 1946: Secretary of the Conference Dean N.W. Dougherty (Tennessee) named acting SEC commissioner.

1948: Conference office moves to Birmingham, Ala.

Feb. 21, 1948: Former LSU coach Bernie H. Moore named second SEC commissioner.

1948: Kentucky Wildcats bring home the first NCAA basketball title win by an SEC team.

October 20, 1951: The Alabama-Tennessee football game in Birmingham's Legion Field becomes the first televised event in SEC history.

1952: University of Alabama Faculty Chairman of Athletics, Dr. Albert B. Moore, becomes first SEC representative to serve as NCAA president.

1957: League sponsors first men's team title for indoor track.

June 1, 1964: Georgia Tech withdraws from the SEC.

1965: Kentucky football's Nat Northington becomes the first African-American athlete to receive an athletic scholarship at an SEC institution.

1966: A.M. (Tonto) Coleman named third SEC commissioner.

June 1, 1966: Tulane withdraws from the SEC.

1971: Dr. Earl M. Ramer, University of Tennessee faculty athletic representative, is second SEC official to serve as NCAA president.

August 1, 1972: Dr. H. Boyd McWhorter, Deans of Arts and Sciences at University of Georgia and secretary of the league, named fourth SEC commissioner.

1973: League distributes \$1.57 million in revenue to members.

1979-80: SEC championships for women's basketball, tennis and volleyball recognized.

February 7, 1980: The SEC begins its first ever women's basketball tournament. Held in Knoxville, the first ever tournament game was played as Florida defeated Miss. State, 68-62. Four days later, Pat Head's Tennessee Lady Vols defeated Ole Miss, 85-71, in the championship game.



1980-81: SEC championships for women's golf, gymnastics, swimming and track and field added.

March 26, 1982: The Tennessee Lady Vols become the first SEC team to reach the Women's Final Four. After beating Jackson State, Memphis State and Southern Cal to reach the Final Four, the Lady Vols lose to Louisiana Tech in the semifinals.

April 1, 1983: Georgia becomes the first school to have both its men's and women's team reach the Final Four. Andy Landers' women defeated North Carolina, Indiana and Tennessee before losing to Southern California in the semifinals of the Final Four held in Norfolk, Va.

September 1, 1984: Women's athletics come under the auspice of the SEC.

March 26, 1986: The SEC and Jefferson-Pilot Teleproductions (JP Sports) sign a contract to televise basketball games on a syndicated basis throughout the region.

1986: League distributes \$15 million in revenue to members.

September 15, 1986: Dr. Harvey W. Schiller, an Air Force colonel and faculty chair at the U.S. Air Force Academy named fifth SEC commissioner.

March 29, 1987: Pat Summitt's Lady Volunteers win their, and the SEC's, first ever national title when Tennessee defeats Louisiana Tech, 67-44, in Austin, Texas.

April 1, 1988: Auburn and Tennessee reach the Final Four of the women's NCAA Basketball Tournament, marking the first time one conference had two teams in the final round. Louisiana Tech defeated the Lady Vols in the semifinals and nipped Joe Ciampi's Auburn Tigers, 56-54, in the championship game.

April 2, 1989: Tennessee's and Auburn's women's basketball teams again reach the Final Four and this time both make it to the championship game where Pat Summitt's Lady Vols defeat Joe

Ciampi's Tigers, 76-60 for the national crown. It is the first time that the same conference has two teams in the title tilt.

January 10, 1990: Roy F. Kramer, Vanderbilt athletics director, named sixth SEC commissioner.

1990: University of Arkansas (11th member) and University of South Carolina (12th member) join the league (the two institutions participated in SEC championships for all sports except football during the 1991-92 academic year).

1993: SEC institutions adopt the Principles of Gender Equity recognizing that each school will provide at least two more women's intercollegiate programs than the number of men's.

1993: SEC championship for women's soccer added.

November 7, 1993: Vanderbilt wins the first SEC soccer tournament championship with a 3-2 double overtime victory over Arkansas.

March 1996: Georgia women basketball star, Saudia Roundtree wins the Naismith Award, given annually to the best player in the country. She is the first SEC athlete so honored.

1997: SEC championship for softball added.

December 6, 1998: Florida wins the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer College Cup with a 1-0 victory over North Carolina.

1999: The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. The league matched the feat in 2002 and 2012.

June 2, 2002: Michael L. Slive, who served as Commissioner of Conference USA, appointed seventh SEC commissioner.

June 4: 2004: SEC Task Force on Compliance and Enforcement issues its report calling to have none of the league's schools on NCAA probation within the next five years. Report is unanimously accepted.

February 23, 2005: SEC announced the formation of its Academic Consortium (now SECU) linking the academic resources of its member institutions.

November 2007: A league record six teams receive invitations to compete in the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship.

August 25, 2008: ESPN and the SEC announce a 15-year agreement beginning in 2009-10 through 2023-24. It is the longest national rights agreement in ESPN history. ESPN entities (ESPN, ESPN on ABC, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Regional Television, ESPN360.com, ESPN Mobile TV, ESPN GamePlan, ESPN Full Court, ESPN International, ESPN Deportes, ESPN Classic) will carry more than 5,500 SEC events including football, men's and women's basketball, Olympic sports and SEC Championships.

November 2008: For the second consecutive season, a league record six teams receive invitations to compete in the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship.

2010: The league begins playing a 16-game conference schedule in women's basketball.

June 2012: It's announced that the SEC will determine a league champion in equestrian beginning in the 2012-13 season. It becomes the 21st sport sponsored by the league.

July 1, 2012: Texas A&M and Missouri officially join the league. Both schools will compete in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. Missouri will also compete in gymnastics, while TAMU will compete in equestrian.

June 2014 - League distributes \$309.6 million in revenue to its members. It is the highest total ever distributed in SEC history.

August 14, 2014 - The SEC Network, a multi-platform network which will air SEC content 24/7 including more than 1,000 events in its first year, launches.

SEC COMMISSIONER MIKE SLIVE

SEC MISSION STATEMENT

The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

As the seventh commissioner of the Southeastern Conference, Mike Slive has overseen perhaps the greatest era of success since the league was founded in 1933 while helping shape the landscape of college sports as a national leader in intercollegiate athletics.

Named to the post on July 2, 2002, the SEC has enjoyed unprecedented championship success under Slive's leadership. He led the adoption of a new and effective league-wide NCAA compliance initiative, engineered landmark television contracts including the launch of a conference network, and guided the conference through expansion, welcoming two new institutions.

The hallmark of this golden age of the SEC remains a remarkable seven consecutive Bowl Championship Series national titles in football. In all, the SEC has won 67 national championships in 15 of its 21 sponsored sports during Slive's tenure as SEC Commissioner.

His impact has been felt far beyond the footprint of the SEC. The founding commissioner of two conferences, he was also the founder of a law firm which assisted NCAA institutions in compliance matters, a Director of Athletics and a member of numerous leadership committees during the course of his career. More recently, Slive has helped craft the new College Football Playoff and is a leader in the historic effort to reorganize the NCAA for the purpose of creating a governance structure that provides maximum opportunities for student-athletes.

The league launched the SEC Network in August 2014, a national network that will bring more than 1000 events into the homes and to the mobile devices of college sports fans across the country. These agreements make the league the most widely distributed conference on television in the nation and also secure the financial health of the SEC and its member institutions for years to come.

Since Slive's arrival at the SEC in 2002, he has developed initiatives designed to maintain and improve the SEC's preeminent position in intercollegiate athletics, both on and off the fields of play.

These include:

- The SEC Task Force on Compliance and Enforcement which developed policies and procedures to assist league schools in NCAA and SEC matters. The task force issued its first report at the 2004 SEC Spring Meetings.
- SEC University (SECU), the conference's academic initiative. SECU was created in 2005 to increase academic cooperation across the league by linking the resources of the conference's member institutions.
- The SEC Minority Coaches Database, an annual compilation of names and biographical information of every minority head and assistant football coach on the Division I level which is distributed to every SEC school and every conference in Division I.
- An SEC Sportsmanship initiative consisting of policies and procedures designed to foster sportsmanship and prevent inappropriate fan behavior.

Since joining the SEC, Slive has served as coordinator of the Bowl Championship Series (2006-08) and served as chair of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee (2008-09). In 2002-03, Slive served on the Commission of Athletics Opportunity, established by the United States Secretary of Education to review the workings of Title IX. Slive served as chair of the National Letter of Intent Steering Committee. He served as president of the Collegiate Commissioners Association (CCA) from 2001-03, was also on the NCAA Management Council from 1997-2004 and is the former chair of the Board of Directors of NCAA Football USA.

Slive previously was the first commissioner of Conference USA from 1995-2002 and was the first commissioner of the Great Midwest Conference upon its founding in 1991.

A native of Utica, N.Y., Slive graduated from Dartmouth College with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1962. He earned a Juris Doctor from the University of Virginia Law School in 1965 and an LLM from the Georgetown University Law Center in 1966.

Slive and his wife of 46 years, Liz, have a daughter, Anna; son-in-law, Judd Harwood; and granddaughter, Abigail who is two years old.

SEC HEADQUARTERS

Almost 33 years after moving to Birmingham from Jackson, Miss., the SEC moved into its current headquarters on October 15, 1991.

The building is now named for Roy F. Kramer, the SEC's sixth commissioner who retired in July 2002. During his tenure as the league's commissioner, the SEC won 85 national championships and distributed more than \$654 million in revenue back to its member institutions.

The 30,000 square-foot building was provided by the city of Birmingham. It was designed to house the SEC staff and accommodate the needs of the various committees, coaches and administrative groups that meet on a regular basis.

From its headquarters, the SEC office

certifies the eligibility of all student-athletes, manages championship events, enhances academic opportunities for student-athletes, monitors NCAA and SEC compliance, coordinates officiation assignments, negotiates television contracts, distributes conference revenue, cultivates corporate sponsorships and coordinates media and public relations efforts.

In 2005, a state-of-the-art video command center was built inside the headquarters and named for the late Brad Davis, the SEC Associate Commissioner who was responsible for its development. Davis passed away on March 2, 2006.

The building also features a rotunda that highlights school banners, championship pedestals and two galleries displaying the member institutions.

ON WATCH ESPN

The SEC Network launched on August 14, 2014 and the following day aired its first live basketball event. From its inception the network has been committed to showcasing more Southeastern Conference men's and women's basketball nationwide than ever before. The introduction of the 24/7 conference network expanded coverage across television and digital platforms for every SEC basketball game to be available nationwide.

The women's games tipoff on SEC Network Sunday, Nov. 16, as Alabama host Duke at 8p.m. ET. It will mark the first of 96 women's games scheduled for television. It also marks the network's three-month anniversary.

Throughout the season, SEC Network's weekly game coverage will be highlighted by a doubleheader of men's basketball on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, a women's doubleheader every Thursday and a Women's Game of the Week on Mondays.



On Feb. 7, 1980, the first SEC women's basketball tournament began play. It ended four days later with Tennessee defeating Ole Miss for the title. Fast forward 32 years later and the SEC Tournament is still enjoying success and increased popularity.

Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001 the tournament has enjoyed many new sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012), Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015), Greenville, S.C. (2005) and Duluth, Ga. (2007, 2010, 2013, 2014).

This year the SEC Women's Basketball Tournament makes a return trip to Little Rock, Ark. and Verizon Arena.

The winner of the 13-game tournament will receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds and conference champion will be determined by the 16-game regular-season SEC schedule.

The 2015 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament will once again enjoy live television coverage. The SEC Network will televise all first, second and third round games. The semifinals will be aired on ESPNU for the fifth consecutive year, while the championship game will be televised on ESPN.

Public tickets for this year's event went on sale October 1 and can be purchased through the SEC website.
