#SEC Co-Champion; %SEC Tournament Champion

• The Southeastern Conference Baseball Tournament returns for the 25th consecutive time to the Hoover Metropolitan Complex in city of Hoover, Ala., May 23-28. The 2023 SEC Baseball Tournament will continue to feature 12 teams. Seeds 5-12 will meet in a single elimination format on the opening day of the tournament, followed by traditional double-elimination play Wednesday-Friday. The tournament will return to single elimination play on Saturday. A total of 17 games will be played throughout the tournament.

• The 12 teams are seeded 1-12 with the two divisional champions and top four seeds guaranteed opening-round byes, with the possibility of earning another later in the bracket. The tournament field will include the top teams from the SEC's Eastern and Western Divisions plus 10 at-large bids seeded 3-12 based on conference winning percentage.

• Tennessee won the SEC Tournament last year with an 8-5 victory over Florida in the championship game. The SEC Tournament champion has advanced to the College World Series 15 times in the last 29 seasons.

• Florida and Arkansas claimed the SEC regular season titles with conference records of 20-10. LSU was a half-game behind at 19-10, and Vanderbilt was 19-11.

• Nine SEC teams are ranked in the top-16 of the RPI through games of May 20: Kentucky (2), Arkansas (3), LSU (4), Florida (5), South Carolina (6), Vanderbilt (8), Alabama (12), Auburn (15) and Tennessee (16).

• This marked the first time nine SEC teams won at least 16 conference games.

• Nine SEC baseball teams are ranked in the top-25 of the major polls this week, including Florida (2), Arkansas (3), LSU (3), Vanderbilt (6), Tennessee (9), Auburn (13), Alabama (16), South Carolina (19) and Kentucky (21).

• The annual SEC baseball awards as voted on by the league's head coaches were announced on Monday. LSU's Dylan Crews was named SEC Player of the Year, LSU's Paul Skenes is the SEC Pitcher of the Year, Georgia's Charlie Condon is the SEC Freshman of the Year, Alabama's Andrew Pinckney and Georgia's Ben Anderson are the SEC Co-Scholar-Athlete of the Year, and Arkansas' Dave Van Horn was voted the SEC Coach of the Year.

• A total of 109 SEC baseball student-athletes are eligible to wear the SEC graduate patch on their uniforms, signifying that they have earned their college degrees.

• Four SEC coaches rank among the winningest active Division I coaches in the nation: Dave Van Horn (6th with 1,207 wins), Tim Corbin (11th with 987 wins), Mike Bianco (12th with 978 wins), and Jim Schlossnagle (18th with 890 wins).

• A total of 88 players formerly from SEC schools were named to MLB opening day rosters. No other conference had more than 52 players on opening day rosters.

• Total attendance for baseball games on SEC campuses this season is more than 2.7 million.
