CELEBRATING THE ANNIVERSARY OF TITLE IX

During the 2022-23 athletic year, the Southeastern Conference culminated a year-long celebration of the anniversary of Title IX, the landmark legislation enacted half a century ago that has had a dramatic and lasting impact on opportunities for women in collegiate athletics.

Under the banner of "50th Anniversary of Title IX: Creating Opportunities," the SEC's celebration included recognitions at Conference championship events, commemoration of achievements through online and social media channels, commemorative memorabilia and a collaboration with the SEC Network highlighting the advancement of women's sports.

On June 23, 1972, the Title IX of the Higher Education Act was passed as U.S. legislation. It was enacted to ensure "No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

The first Southeastern Conference title in a women's sport was awarded in 1979 and over the ensuing years SEC teams have won 118 national championships in all sports while thousands of young women have earned their college degrees on athletics scholarships.

The SEC launched [During the course of the year, every SEC team in every sport donned a commemorative pre-game warmup shirt on the first weekend of their conference season that featured a specially designed SEC-Title IX anniversary logo.](http://www.SECsports.com>TitleIX on its official website, a site that was updated throughout the year including a timeline of great moments in SEC women's sports history. The SEC's social media channels also celebrated the anniversary over the course of the anniversary year.</p></div><div data-bbox=)

The SEC created a one-minute video celebrating the anniversary, with narration by Hall of Fame basketball player Tamika Catchings, that was seen in arenas across the SEC and at all SEC championship events during the year as well as across the SEC's social media channels.

STUDENT-ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT AND ACHIEVEMENT

Student-Athlete Career Tour

Twenty-seven current and former SEC student-athletes participated in the seventh annual SEC Career Tour Nov. 29-Dec. 1 in Atlanta. It marked the sixth time student-athletes from each SEC university convened in Atlanta to participate in the career tour leading up to the SEC Football Championship Game. The event was held virtually in 2020.

The annual program allows student-athletes to connect with human resource recruiters and submit resumes for entry-level jobs, internships and gain valuable knowledge of professional branding.

The group visited the headquarters and met with executives at several corporations and organizations in the Atlanta area including Mercedes Benz Stadium, Cox Enterprises, KPMG, InterContinental Hotels Group (IHG), Mercedes Benz USA and Lockheed Martin.

SEC in NCAA's Top 10

Kentucky's Abby Steiner became the tenth SEC student-athlete in the six-year history of the NCAA's Top 10 Award to receive the prestigious honor. The award recognizes former student-athletes for their successes in competition, in the classroom and in the community. Steiner was honored at the 2023 NCAA Convention.

Steiner was a three-time NCAA Division I individual national champion and a member of Kentucky's 2022 NCAA outdoor 4x400-meter relay championship team. An 11-time first-team All-American, she also won The Bowerman as the national collegiate track and field athlete of the year.

A summa cum laude graduate, she was the 2022 SEC Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Steiner volunteered with God's Pantry, preparing lunches for children and interned with Kentucky BioMotion Research Lab.

NCAA Woman of the Year

Georgia distance runner Samantha Drop was among a group of 30 Woman of the Year honorees in 2022. Selected from 577 school nominees — a group that was then narrowed to 156 nominees at the conference level — the Top 30 honorees include 10 from each of the three NCAA divisions. Each honoree has demonstrated excellence in academics, athletics, community service and leadership.

Drop earned All-America honors in 2017 for cross country and holds four top-10 marks in Georgia track & field history. An eight-time All-Academic honoree, Drop was the SEC Women's Cross Country Scholar-Athlete of the Year. A four-year volunteer with Special Olympics at Georgia, Drop served as an executive board member and gymnastics coach.

SEC Among Honda Award Winners

South Carolina basketball standout Aliyah Boston was named the 2022 Collegiate Woman Athlete of the Year and presented with the prestigious Honda Cup in the month following the 2022 SEC Spring Meetings. The Honda Award is presented annually by the Collegiate Women's Sports Awards to the top women athletes in 12 NCAA-sanctioned sports and signifies "the best of the best in collegiate athletics."

Boston won in a class that featured two other SEC student-athletes, Florida gymnast Trinity Thomas and Kentucky track athlete Abby Steiner. Thomas is a 2023 candidate for the award that will be presented in June, having been named the Honda Sport Award winner for gymnastics for the second consecutive year.

Graduate Patches

More than 1,300 student-athletes in all sports have worn the SEC Graduate Patch over the last three years. The SEC introduced the patch in 2016 for student-athletes who have graduated but have not exhausted their eligibility. The SEC logo patch on their uniforms is replaced with a special patch highlighting the word "Graduate" underneath the conference logo. The patch is similar in design for all conference schools, but is school-specific in color.

SEC Contribution To Professional Sports

The SEC continues to be a training ground for professional sports:

- NFL – The SEC had most active players of any conference in 2022 (369 on opening day rosters); and the most players drafted of any conference in 2023 (62) for the 17th straight year.
- NBA Playoffs – The SEC had more players in the NBA playoffs than any other conference (56).
- WNBA – The SEC has had the most No. 1 picks in the WNBA draft since it started in 1997 (8); 23 former players made 2022 WNBA rosters (second among conferences).
- MLB – The SEC had 88 players on opening day rosters – the most of any conference -- with at least 3 former players from each SEC school.

MEDIA, BUSINESS AND INNOVATION

Revenue Distribution

For the fiscal year that ended August 31, 2022, the SEC distributed \$721.8 million dollars to its 14 members, an average of \$49.9 million per institution.

The SEC provides superior support to its 14 member universities as a direct result of the revenue distributed through the Southeastern Conference. The SEC's conference-wide commitment to the student-athlete experience is profound and translates into exceptional instruction, training, equipment, academic counseling, medical care, mental health and wellness support and life-skills development.

In addition, revenues generated through SEC athletics often contribute in significant and unique ways to the academic missions of the 14 SEC universities. Past examples of how this revenue has had an impact outside athletics has included participation in the construction and renovation of academic facilities, support of academic

scholarship opportunities, funding of academic programs and direct transfers of funds to support academic budgets.

SEC Viewership Reigns Supreme

- The SEC was the most-watched conference in college football, with 42.5 billion minutes watched on all nationally rated linear networks
- For a fourth consecutive year in 2022, the SEC was the most-watched football conference on ESPN, averaging 3.3 million viewers. SEC games on ESPN were up +14% YOY and averaged +52% more viewers than any other conference on the network.
- SEC Network was the most-viewed college network for the sixth consecutive fall season and posted double-digit growth over 2021
- SEC Network and SEC Network+ both delivered double-digit growth in streaming metrics last fall
- LSU women's basketball won the 2023 NCAA Championship, taking part in the most-viewed women's college basketball game on record (9.9 million viewers) and most-viewed college basketball game (men's or women's) ever on ESPN platforms
- SEC men's basketball games on ESPN were up +2% year-over-year, averaging more than 1 million viewers per game.

Innovative Programming Pushes SEC Network to New Heights

- SEC Network achieved its gender equity goal across live events in the 2021-22 academic year and continues to program the network with parity as a north star, providing an equal platform to further the growth of all SEC sports
- SEC Network delivered nearly 1500 hours of original programming during the 2022-23 academic year
- Out of Pocket with Alyssa Lang and Andraya Carter is the only show across ESPN platforms hosted exclusively by two women
- SEC Network has now received more than a dozen Sports Emmy nominations thanks to two nods this year, including MegaCast coverage of the 2023 College Football Playoff National Championship
- ESPN/SEC Network reporter and host Andraya Carter earned the network's first commentator Sports Emmy nomination. Carter was nominated for the Sports Emmy for Personality/Emerging On-Air Talent.

SEC-ACC-ESPN Announce Basketball Challenges

The Southeastern Conference, Atlantic Coast Conference and ESPN in November announced the formation of the SEC/ACC Challenge for men's and women's basketball, which will begin as part of the 2023-24 season.

ACC and SEC teams will square off as part of the annual Challenge - one in men's basketball and one in women's basketball. Each one of the 28 games (30 starting in 2024-25) will be carried on an ESPN platform and each conference will host an equal number of home games.

Continued Innovation in Officiating

The SEC continued to pioneer innovation in officiating, adding official-to-official communication to expedite replay decisions in the sports of baseball and softball in 2023.

The new communications process comes on the heels of the SEC launching Collaborative Video Review in women's basketball and Centralized Video Review in softball games in 2022, becoming the first conference to use those processes in those sports as permitted by NCAA rules. The SEC now has five sports that operate Video Review out of the SEC Video Center in the Conference Office.

The SEC has been a pioneer in collaborative and centralized video review. In baseball and softball, a Replay Official in the SEC Video Center reviews plays in SEC vs. SEC games and renders decisions that are communicated to the on-site umpire crew. In football, men's and women's basketball, replay officials in the Video Center collaborate with on-site officials to determine outcomes.

The SEC successfully implemented a collaborative replay process in the sport of football in 2016, and the Conference secured NCAA approval to implement a collaborative replay process in men's basketball the following year. The SEC began centralized replay in baseball, modeled after MLB's process, in 2019.

Leaders in Attendance

- For the 24th straight year, the SEC led every other conference in college football with the most fans in attendance per game with an average of 76,667. That marked an increase of 6.2% (4,472 per game).
- Five SEC programs experienced double-digit percentage increases in 2022. Ole Miss, Arkansas, Vanderbilt, Tennessee and Missouri all were up at least 10.8%.
- The SEC Football Championship Game attendance of 74,810 was the 27th consecutive sellout.
- The top three single-session crowds in SEC Soccer Tournament history were recorded at the 2022 event, capped off by 3,025 fans attending the championship match. The total attendance of 10,450 almost doubled the previous record (5,285 in 2009).
- SEC Baseball has led the nation in attendance 27 years in a row. Seven of the nation's top-10 attendance leaders in 2022 were from the SEC. Regular season attendance for games on SEC campuses surpassed the 2 million mark in 2023.

SEC Programming on Mental Health

Each year, the SEC convenes several meetings of its Student-Athlete Leadership Councils, and with regularity, each group regardless of sport has one consistent point of emphasis for the conference: Mental Health. In the SEC where "It Just Means More." – students-athletes have an additional message for their peers – "YOU Mean More." From Commissioner Greg Sankey and across all 14 campuses – the message has become one of the top priorities.

The SEC is teaming with the SEC Network to keep mental health top-of-mind with the theme of "YOU Mean More." The Network is developing interviews, vignettes and other impactful content to depict student-athletes explaining the importance of striving for positive mental health.

It Just Means More ... Than Sports

In the spring of 2023, the SEC launched a new phase of the "It Just Means More" campaign, focusing on the many benefits made available to student-athlete during and even after their college careers. The SEC launched two :30-second spots during March Madness focused on young basketball players aspiring to become college athletes. It was followed by similar PSAs focused on softball and baseball, and will continue into the fall.

The spots are voiced by SEC student-athletes. The basketball spots were voiced by Georgia's Jabri Abdur-Rahim and Kentucky's Nyah Leveretter. The softball spot was voiced by Auburn pitcher Bri Ellis and the baseball spot was voiced by Vanderbilt outfielder Enrique Bradford.

SEC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The Nation's Best Coaches

- Twelve of the current SEC coaches have led teams to the NCAA Tournament.
- Four SEC coaches have been head coaches in the Final Four with two winning national championships.
- Five current SEC coaches have both played and coached in the NCAA Tournament (Katie Abrahamson-Henderson, Kyra Elzy, Kellie Harper, Kim Mulkey and Dawn Staley).

The Nation's Best Players

- The SEC has had at least one student-athlete named as a First-Team All-America selection in each of the last 15 seasons.
- All-Americans were first named in women's basketball in 1975. Since that time, league schools have had 80 players named first-team a total of 167 times.
- The SEC has had 159 former players play in the WNBA.
- In this year's WNBA draft, a total of nine SEC women's basketball players were taken.
- Since the inaugural WNBA draft in 1997, the SEC has had 189 former players drafted for the professional league, including seven No. 1 picks.
- The SEC has had a first round pick every year except one (2014).

Postseason Success

- SEC teams have played in 31 of 41 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league. The next closest is the ACC with 19, Pac-12 with 18 and Big East with 17.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 42 of the 164 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee), 2008 (LSU, Tennessee), 2017 (Mississippi State, South Carolina).
- SEC teams have made 23 appearances in a nation-high 20 NCAA Championship games, winning 11 NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007, 2008); South Carolina (2017, 2022); LSU (2023).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists three times in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65); 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60); 2017 (South Carolina 67, Mississippi State 55).
- SEC teams have won 468 NCAA Tournament games against 249 losses (.653) for an average of 11.4 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 14 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in every year of NCAA Tournament history. All 14 members have advanced to the Sweet 16.
- The Southeastern Conference had nine teams earn bids to the 2016 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. This was the most SEC teams to receive bids to the NCAA tournament in conference history and the second time in NCAA history that one conference has sent nine teams to the tournament. The Big East did so in 2011.
- Until 2004, the SEC was the only conference to ever have eight teams receive NCAA bids. The league has achieved this feat five times, in 1999, 2002, 2012, 2014, 2017 and 2022.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading 14 times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004, 2009, 2013, 2014, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2023).
- In total, league schools have earned 263 bids to lead all conferences.

By The Numbers

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade. The SEC compiled a 144-38 (.791) non-conference record during the 2022-23 season.
- In regular season games, the SEC has compiled a 5849-1710 (.774) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150+ wins in 28 seasons and has recorded a non-conference winning percentage below .700 only once.
- SEC women's basketball set the all-time NCAA record for conference leaders in total attendance. A total of 1,146,341 fans passed through its turnstiles during home games and conference tournament action. Overall, the league has five of the Top 10 total attendance seasons.
- The SEC has led the nation in women's basketball average attendance for seven of the last eight seasons. • Since the SEC began to sponsor women's basketball in 1982, it has failed only five times to place at least four members in each of the final polls (the USA Today/ESPN poll began in 1986).
- Since the SEC began to sponsor women's basketball in 1982, it has failed only five times to place at least four members in each of the final polls (the USA Today/ESPN poll began in 1986).
- The most SEC teams in the final AP poll is seven, which the league has done four times (1996, 1997, 2003, and 2018).
- Overall, the league teams have been ranked every week except for the very first poll in 1976.
- The league has had the top three teams in the AP Poll twice. In week three in 2005 and in week eight in 1989.
- SEC schools have produced 45 Team USA Olympians since 1976, with 41 coming since the SEC began sponsoring women's basketball. In addition, seven have played for other countries in the Olympics.

Academics

- A total of 103 women's basketball students were named to the 2022-23 SEC Academic Honor Rolls for having a grade point average of 3.00 or above for either the preceding academic year or a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or above.
- The conference has had 36 women's basketball players named Academic All-American.
- Four Women's Basketball Academic All-America of the Year hail from the SEC. They are Candace Parker, UT (2007 & 2008); Aliyah Boston, SC (2021 & 2022).

- The Women's Basketball Leadership Council is one component of the SEC Student-Athlete Leadership Council. The others are the Men's Basketball Leadership Council and the Football Leadership Council.

SEC MILESTONE

- Dec. 8-9, 1932: In Knoxville, Dr. Frank L. McVey (Kentucky) serves as president as the SEC is formed with 13 members of the Southern Conference located west and south of the Appalachian Mountains. The institutions are: Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Sewanee, Tennessee, Tulane, Vanderbilt.
- Feb. 27, 1933: First full meeting, Atlanta, Ga.
- 1933: First SEC champions crowned in baseball, basketball, football and outdoor track.
- Feb. 24-28, 1933: League's first basketball tournament in Atlanta, Ga.
- Spring 1933: First NCAA Championship won by SEC school (LSU, men's track).
- 1935: League sponsors first men's team title for cross country.
- 1937: League sponsors first men's team title for golf and swimming.
- 1938: League sponsors first men's team title for tennis.
- 1940: In Jackson, Miss. the office of the commissioner is formed.
- August 21, 1940: Former Mississippi Governor Martin S. Conner named first SEC commissioner.
- Dec. 13, 1940: Sewanee withdraws from the SEC.
- Fall 1946: Secretary of the Conference Dean N.W. Dougherty (Tennessee) named acting SEC commissioner.
- 1948: Conference office moves to Birmingham, Ala.
- Feb. 21, 1948: Former LSU coach Bernie H. Moore named second SEC commissioner.
- 1948: Kentucky Wildcats bring home the first NCAA basketball title win by an SEC team.
- October 20, 1951: The Alabama-Tennessee football game in Birmingham's Legion Field becomes the first televised event in SEC history.
- 1952: University of Alabama Faculty Chairman of Athletics, Dr. Albert B. Moore, becomes first SEC representative to serve as NCAA president.
- 1957: League sponsors first men's team title for indoor track.
- June 1, 1964: Georgia Tech withdraws from the SEC.
- 1965: Kentucky football's Nat Northington becomes the first African-American athlete to receive an athletic scholarship at an SEC institution.
- 1966: A.M. (Tonto) Coleman named third SEC commissioner.
- June 1, 1966: Tulane withdraws from the SEC.
- August 1, 1972: Dr. H. Boyd McWhorter, Deans of Arts and Sciences at University of Georgia and secretary of the league, named fourth SEC commissioner.
- 1979-80: SEC championships for women's basketball, tennis and volleyball recognized.
- February 7, 1980: The SEC begins its first ever women's basketball tournament. Held in Knoxville, the first ever tournament game was played as Florida defeated Miss. State, 68-62. Four days later, Pat Head's Tennessee Lady Vols defeated Ole Miss, 85-71, in the championship game.
- 1980-81: SEC championships for women's golf, gymnastics, swimming and track and field added.
- March 26, 1982: The Tennessee Lady Vols become the first SEC team to reach the Women's Final Four. After beating Jackson State, Memphis State and Southern Cal to reach the Final Four, the Lady Vols lose to Louisiana Tech in the semifinals.
- April 1, 1983: Georgia becomes the first school to have both its men's and women's team reach the Final Four. Andy Landers' women defeated North Carolina, Indiana and Tennessee before losing to Southern California in the semifinals of the Final Four held in Norfolk, Va.
- September 1, 1984: Women's athletics come under the auspice of the SEC.
- March 26, 1986: The SEC and Jefferson-Pilot Teleproductions (JP Sports) sign a contract to televise basketball games on a syndicated basis throughout the region.
- September 15, 1986: Dr. Harvey W. Schiller, an Air Force colonel and faculty chair at the U.S. Air Force Academy named fifth SEC commissioner.
- March 29, 1987: Pat Summit's Lady Volunteers win their, and the SEC's, first ever national title when Tennessee defeats Louisiana Tech, 67-44, in Austin, Texas.
- April 1, 1988: Auburn and Tennessee reach the Final Four of the women's NCAA Basketball Tournament, marking the first time one conference had two teams in the final round. Louisiana Tech defeated the Lady Vols in the semifinals and nipped Joe Ciampi's Auburn Tigers, 56-54, in the championship game.
- April 2, 1989: Tennessee's and Auburn's women's basketball teams again reach the Final Four and this time both make it to the championship game where Pat Summit's Lady Vols defeat Joe Ciampi's Tigers, 76-60 for the national crown. It is the first time that the

same conference has two teams in the title tilt.

- January 10, 1990: Roy F. Kramer, Vanderbilt athletics director, named sixth SEC commissioner.
- 1990: University of Arkansas (11th member) and University of South Carolina (12th member) join the league (the two institutions participated in SEC championships for all sports except football during the 1991-92 academic year).
- 1993: SEC institutions adopt the Principles of Gender Equity recognizing that each school will provide at least two more women's intercollegiate programs than the number of men's.
- 1993: SEC championship for women's soccer added.
- November 7, 1993: Vanderbilt wins the first SEC soccer tournament championship with a 3-2 double overtime victory over Arkansas.
- March 1996: Georgia women basketball star, Saudia Roundtree wins the Naismith Award, given annually to the best player in the country. She is the first SEC athlete so honored.
- 1997: SEC championship for softball added.
- December 6, 1998: Florida wins the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer College Cup with a 1-0 victory over North Carolina.
- 1999: The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. The league has achieved this feat five times, in 1999, 2002, 2012, 2014, 2017 and 2022.
- June 2, 2002: Michael L. Slive, who served as Commissioner of Conference USA, appointed seventh SEC commissioner.
- February 23, 2005: SEC announced the formation of its Academic Consortium (now SEC Academic Relations) linking the academic resources of its member institutions.
- August 25, 2008: ESPN and the SEC announce a 15-year agreement beginning in 2009-10 through 2023-24. It is the longest national rights agreement in ESPN history.
- 2010: The league begins playing a 16-game conference schedule in women's basketball.
- June 2012: It's announced that the SEC will determine a league champion in equestrian beginning in the 2012-13 season. It becomes the 21st sport sponsored by the league.
- July 1, 2012: Texas A&M and Missouri officially join the league. Both schools will compete in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. Missouri will also compete in gymnastics, while TAMU will compete in equestrian.
- August 14, 2014 The SEC Network, a multi-platform network which will air SEC content 24/7 including more than 1,000 events in its first year, launches.
- June 1, 2015 Gregory A. Sankey becomes the SEC's eighth commissioner.
- 2016: The SEC sends nine teams to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. It's the most SEC teams to receive bids to the NCAA's in conference history and the second time in NCAA history that one conference has sent nine teams to the tournament.
- 2017: The SEC again had two teams in the NCAA Women's Final Four as South Carolina defeats Mississippi State, 67-55 for the Gamecocks first and the SEC's ninth National Title.
- 2019: A total of 1,009,427 fans passed through its turnstiles during home games and conference tournament action. It was the third time the league has hit the 1 million mark. The conference set the all-time attendance high for any conference with 1,108,511 fans in 2016.
- 2020: The NCAA canceled the Women's Final Four due to the COVID-19 global pandemic.
- April 24, 2021: Kentucky won its first NCAA title in women's volleyball with a 3-1 victory over Texas. The Wildcats became the first SEC program to win a National Title in volleyball.
- July 30, 2021 The SEC announced that the University of Oklahoma and the University of Texas will become members effective July 1, 2025, with competition to begin in all sports for the 2025-26 academic year.
- 2022: South Carolina won its second and the league's tenth national championship in women's basketball with a 64-49 win over Connecticut.
- 2023: LSU won its first and the SEC's 11th national championship in women's basketball with a 102-85 win over Iowa.

COMMISSIONER GREG SANKEY



**GREG SANKEY
COMMISSIONER
SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE**

Greg Sankey became the eighth Commissioner of the Southeastern Conference on June 1, 2015, and has successfully built upon the SEC's recognized success, strong foundations and rich traditions.

Sankey has effectively introduced change and innovation for the conference while respecting the institutional traditions that make the SEC unique. With an understanding of the highly competitive environment of college sports, he has fostered the collaborative

culture of the SEC that sets the conference apart and supports its continuing success.

Sankey brings a big picture approach to his position through continuing focus on a vision that positions the SEC to leverage its athletics success and reputation for a greater overall cultural and economic impact on the region, the nation and the world.

Sankey has built upon the foundation set in his first major address as the conference leader in 2015 when he stated, "Educating scholars and supporting champions provides the platform for developing leaders who will influence the world." His relentless focus on providing resources for student-athlete success continues to make the Southeastern Conference a leader in college athletics.

LEADERSHIP IN A CHALLENGING ENVIRONMENT

When the NCAA sought to navigate a changing landscape for college athletics, it called on Sankey to co-chair its Division I Transformation Committee, a body of college sports leaders tasked with addressing the most significant challenges in college athletics, to support student-athletes more effectively, and even reimagine the future of college sports.

And it was not the first time Sankey stepped forward at a crucial time for college sports. Sankey's leadership through the COVID-19 pandemic served the SEC well as the league prepared for a return to action in the fall of 2020. Sankey fostered a culture of collaboration among the leaders of the Conference in order to allow the SEC's 14 schools to move together through difficult and unprecedented decisions.

While the pandemic had a devastating effect on the finances of college athletics programs across the country, Sankey kept focus on the long-term financial vitality of the SEC. In 2020, Sankey and his team finalized a milestone 10-year agreement with the Walt Disney Company that grants ABC and ESPN exclusive broadcast rights to premier SEC football and basketball events beginning in 2024-25 and continuing through 2033-34.

Less than a year after the blockbuster agreement with Disney, the SEC made news again as Sankey ushered the University of Oklahoma and University of Texas through membership discussions and announced the two leading universities will join as members with the SEC's nationally prominent institutions continuing their participation in intercollegiate athletics.

Throughout his career, Sankey has established himself as an advocate for college athletes, creating a framework to provide young people in the Conference with challenging leadership opportunities and expanded resources to succeed at the highest levels of academic and competitive success. Student-athlete focused initiatives introduced under Sankey's leadership include:

- Creation of a leadership position in the SEC office for Student-Athlete Engagement, a role focused on offering college athletes the opportunity to participate in Conference leadership.
- Introduction of Student-Athlete Leadership Councils for Football, Men's Basketball and Women's Basketball which provide college athletes with enhanced opportunities to engage with campus leaders and Conference office staff.
- Introduction of a Student-Athlete Career Tour which provides groups of college athletes with opportunities to engage in career exploration with high level corporations and businesses in major metropolitan areas.
- Expansion of the college athlete role at the annual SEC Spring Meetings when student-athlete leaders participate in a robust agenda of interaction with administrators and coaches to provide their perspectives to Conference leaders.

ADVANCING THE CONFERENCE

Sankey has been intentional and diligent in addressing issues critical to college athletics, with an emphasis on integrity, ethics, sportsmanship and diversity including:

- Development of updated Conference policies governing conduct expectations for student-athletes, including the adoption of a serious misconduct policy governing transfers that has served as a model for similar policies adopted by other conferences. The policy was later expanded to include all incoming prospective student-athletes.
- Creation of an SEC council, consisting of a diverse group of student-athletes, administrators, coaches and SEC staff, whose purpose is to identify resources and strategies that promote equal opportunity in intercollegiate athletics.
- Crafting a new SEC bylaw aimed at encouraging, facilitating and assisting member institutions in attracting and hiring individuals in historically underrepresented groups in leadership positions of their athletics programs.

Another priority under Sankey's leadership is growing exposure for the Conference and effectively publicizing success stories of the SEC. Strategies pursued to achieve this objective include:

- Ongoing collaboration with the SEC Network to create unique exposure opportunities for Conference universities, teams and student-athletes, including behind-the-scenes programming, expanding live championship coverage for Olympic Sports and other unique programming.
- Engagement with a national marketing agency to develop and maintain a comprehensive branding campaign. The theme – "It Just Means More" – communicates the history, legacy and overall positive impact the SEC has on its region, the nation and the world.
- Introduction of the SEC Graduate Patch, a logo placed on the uniforms in every sport to provide recognition of SEC student-athletes who have earned their undergraduate degree and are continuing their participation in intercollegiate athletics.

A CAREER IN COLLEGE ATHLETICS

On March 12, 2015, the Presidents and Chancellors of the SEC announced Greg Sankey would succeed Mike Slive as Commissioner of the SEC. Sankey, 59, first joined the SEC staff in 2002 as Associate Commissioner for Governance and later added supervision of the league's championships staff to his responsibilities. He was elevated to Executive Associate Commissioner and Chief Operating Officer for the league office in 2012, becoming responsible for the day-to-day operation of the SEC Office.

Before moving to the SEC, Sankey served as Commissioner of the Southland Conference for nearly seven years. He joined the Southland Conference staff in 1992 where he served as both assistant and associate commissioner before he was named its commissioner in 1996 at the age of 31.

Prior to his term at the Southland Conference, he was Director of Compliance and Academic Services at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, LA, as well as coach of the Demons' golf team. Before his tenure at Northwestern State, he was the Director of Intramural Sports at Utica College in upstate New York.

A native of Auburn, NY, Sankey earned his master's degree from Syracuse University and his undergraduate degree from the State University of New York College at Cortland. Sankey and his wife, Cathy, reside in Birmingham, AL, and have two adult daughters, Hannah (and her husband, Rod) and Moriah (and her husband, Austin).



Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001 the tournament has enjoyed many new sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2018, 2022), Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015), Duluth, Ga. (2007, 2010, 2013, 2014) and Jacksonville, Fla. (2016). Greenville, S.C. has served as the host for the past six years (2017-2023) and will again serve as host in 2024. The city also hosted in 2005.

The winner of the tournament receives the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

The event has helped set the stage for SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament, as 32 of the conference tournament champions have advanced to at least the Sweet 16. The SEC Tournament Champion has failed to win at least one NCAA Tournament game only twice.

Tennessee leads the league with 17 SEC Tournament titles. South Carolina is second with seven, Vanderbilt has six, while Auburn and Georgia, each have four. LSU has two with Kentucky, Mississippi State and Texas A&M having each won one SEC Tournament championship.

SEC Tournament Tie-Break Procedures

Teams will be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 in the SEC Women's Basketball Tournament bracket based upon the final regular season Conference standings. Teams that finished No. 1 through No. 4 in the final regular season standings shall receive firstand second-round byes and teams that finish No. 5 through No. 10 will receive first-round byes.

- Two-Team Tie:** The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:
 - Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
 - Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
 - Coin flip by the Commissioner.
- Three-Team Tie (or more):** Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
 - Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 – Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
 - Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
 - If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
 - If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

For the purpose of seeding, if an institution is precluded from participating in the tournament, such institution will automatically be seeded last. The No. 11 seed will then receive a bye. However, for the purpose of breaking ties, that team will remain
